Stirring Black History Month Presentation Highlights City Council Meeting

Black History Month took center stage to open last week’s Hawthorne City Council meeting as Donzaleigh Abernathy, the daughter of Civil Rights leader Ralph David Abernathy, gave a presentation. “When my dad died, I wanted to write about [him]...and I found that in writing about my father, I had to write about Martin Luther King who I knew as Uncle Martin who blessed me as a baby and who was my godfather,” Abernathy said. “Then I realized as I was writing about my dad and Uncle Martin, that I was writing about the history of black people in America and even more importantly than that, it was the history of America.”

Abernathy presented a stirring slideshow of images that included Dr. King as well as other images from the Civil Rights Movement. “We were not allowed to try on clothing in the department stores because of antiquated rules and laws of segregation,” Abernathy said of a picture showing her dad and King in the process of being arrested.

Before the Civil Rights Movement was even a flicker of an idea, Abernathy talked about Abraham Lincoln passing the 13th Amendment that abolished slavery. “It was a controversial thing,” Abernathy said of the amendment. “In 1865, in Massachusetts, they passed the first Public Accommodations Act and the reason I mention that is because the laws changed and they took away all of these things.”

In 1866, the Civil Rights Act was created and essentially guaranteed equal rights to all people who were born in the United States, except for those who were Native American. The following year, Congress passed the Reconstruction Act which allowed each state to decide if people would have the right to vote. “It wouldn’t be until the 15th Amendment was passed in 1870

that we actually did gain the right to vote,” Abernathy said. “And then Reconstruction came to an end and we lost those rights. It would take my dad and Martin Luther King to come again to make America live up to the principles

for which this country was founded.”

After showing a picture of her dad and King in jail, Abernathy said they all went to Washington because “people were demonstrating in the streets, much like how they are demonstrating in the streets today.” It was during that march when King gave his iconic “I Have a Dream” speech. “In 1963, it was illegal for me to be married to my husband,” Abernathy said of the words in King’s speech. “And here we were fighting for something as basic as integrated schools. Something that we take for granted today.”

Abernathy said that after that speech, the KKK was so angered by it that “they placed a bomb in the 16th Street Baptist Church where five little girls had gone into the bathroom – Carole Denise McNair, Cynthia Wesley, Carole Robertson, Addie Mae Collins, and Sarah Collins.” Sarah was the only girl to survive the bombing, but was blinded in one eye and had 21 pieces of glass embedded into her face. The explosion, which was set off by 15 sticks of dynamite on a timer, blew a hole measuring seven feet in diameter in the rear wall of the church and a crater five feet wide and two feet deep in the basement.

“Because these girls had died, it was imperative that they had to pass the second Civil Rights Bill,” Abernathy said. “Right after that on November 22, they killed our president, John F. Kennedy, because of his stand on Civil Rights. Martin Luther King would say, ‘You have got to be willing to die for something in order for other people to go free,’ and my dad used to say, ‘If we die, our blood will cry out from the earth for freedom.’” Abernathy continued to talk about voting rights and Civil Rights activist Amelia Boynton who helped organize black voter registration in Selma.

Councilwoman Olivia Valentine, who helped introduce Abernathy before the presentation, said that it was “history taught so passionately that any student would love history after hearing it.” Valentine added that what she took away from the presentation was “how interdependent all the communities are and depend upon each other.”

Councilman Nilo Michelin, who teaches history, said, “Their struggle is just as important today with everything that is going on as it was back then.” Mayor Pro Tem Hadir Awad echoed Valentine’s sentiments about inclusion. “Dr. King did quite a bit—not just for his own people—but for the rest of the nation. Without him and his movement, half of us wouldn’t be in this room today,” Awad said. “I wouldn’t be sitting where I’m sitting today. I can’t begin to speak for the number of things he’s done not only for his generation, but mine--and if you think if this never happened, where would we be? It’s scary, but it’s also beautiful because you can see that with a voice and with a leader, you can do anything and you can change anything.”

Awad added that even though “things look a little shaky, we’re looking for our next leader to come out and unite everyone. Hopefully this will light a new fire into everyone...” •

SoCalGas to Install New Pipeline in El Segundo, Manhattan Beach and Hawthorne

Southern California Gas Co.(SoCalGas) announced last week that work to install a new 2.8-mile natural gas transmission pipeline in the cities of El Segundo, Manhattan Beach and Hawthorne would begin in the week of February 20. The project will enhance the reliability of SoCalGas’ natural gas pipeline system that serves homes, businesses and critical facilities in the region.

The excavation and pipeline installation work will begin in northwest downtown Manhattan Beach on Highland Avenue and extend along Highland to Rosecrans Avenue, then east along Rosecrans to the intersection of South Aviation Boulevard and 33rd Street in Hawthorne. SoCalGas crews have already installed 700 feet of the new pipeline from Highland Avenue to Alma Avenue and along Highland Avenue to about 39th Street and will not work in that area again.

Installation of the remainder of the pipeline will be conducted in several locations, with one crew working during the day and a second crew at night. The project is expected to continue through May 29, weather and other factors permitting. While crews work on each section, commuters should expect temporary lane closures and parking restrictions.

Lane reductions will be marked with traffic cones and be in effect during work hours, Monday through Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. on Highland and Rosecrans west of Sepulveda Boulevard. Construction on Rosecrans, east of Sepulveda, and along South Aviation, will be carried out at night, from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m. weekdays.

People passing by the work site may see excavation, equipment, vehicles and traffic control signage. Drivers should adhere to all traffic safety measures while driving past the construction zone. The nearby community may also hear some work-related noise and notice an occasional natural gas odor when final connections to the system are made.

SoCalGas strives to provide continuous service of natural gas to its customers while the construction work continues. Customers should not expect any interruptions in their natural gas service. If that changes, affected customers who may experience a temporary interruption in their natural gas service will be notified by SoCalGas directly. Customers with questions or concerns about the construction work may call SoCalGas’ Customer Contact Center 24-hours a day, seven-days a week at 800-427-2200. •

Post All-Star Break Questions Loom for Lakers

There are two ways to look at the regular season that the Los Angeles Lakers have put together so far. If you are a realist, then you look at their 19-39 record heading into the All-Star Break, shrug your shoulders and say, “Well, at least they’re better than last year.” If you’re a real fanatic of the team, though, and hold extreme and irrational beliefs, as the definition of the word suggests, then you might expect the Lakers to be competing for the playoffs already. Living in Los Angeles isn’t easy, and neither is being a bad Lakers team that resides just steps away from Hollywood and is still ranked second on a list of value franchises inside of the NBA. For that reason alone, the Lakers have a lot of work to do after the All-Star Game that has easily distanced itself from most of the players and personnel within the organization.

If, as a fan, you’ve come into this year expecting the Lakers to make it into the playoffs, it is time to change your reality. The Lakers are one of the youngest teams in the league--but despite their inexperience, there is still a lot to look forward to as long as expectations can be tempered. As the team drops further and further out of contention in the Western Conference, the opportunity for the Lakers’ young guns to play will become even greater. No, that’s not just D’Angelo Russell and Brandon Ingram either. A season that is lost should also mean increased playing time for youngsters who have the potential to make an impact in coming seasons like Ivica Zubac, Larry Nance, Jr. and maybe even Tarik Black. Along with that should come more time on the pine for Luol Deng and Timofey Mozgov, who both hit the lottery when Lakers GM Mitch Kupchak and/or part-owner Jim Buss decided that they would be good additions to the team.

If D’Angelo Russell is ever going to be a top-flight point guard in the league, the post-All-Star Break stretch run should finally see the 20-year-old come into his own. With virtually no pressure on his shoulders when he takes the court each night, it shouldn’t be a stretch to want to see Russell average close to 20 points, seven assists and six rebounds each night. Likewise, 19-year-old Brandon Ingram’s playing time should go up as the youngster transitions into a league with an 82-game schedule and professionals who all weigh over 200 pounds (unlike his 6’9”, 190-pound stature). Ingram needs to gain endurance if he ever wishes to make it back to

All-Star Weekend, only next time as a starter. Despite the team’s inability to, well, be good...the Lakers still give their fans something to root for every night. Yes, a 137-101 loss to the Phoenix Suns--a team that owns the worst record in the Western Conference--last Wednesday night does stand out like a sore thumb, but therein lies the point. It would be much more difficult to be a fan of the Dallas Mavericks, for instance, who will likely miss the playoffs this season yet still receive a draft pick that is outside of the top 6-10 overall. Laker fans, on the other hand, can root for their team to lose every single game while still being somewhat competitive. That gives the Lakers the best chance to receive its top-three protected pick in what is sure to be a loaded draft this summer. The basketball season is one that is long and trying and will eventually wind up with a rematch of a rematch when the Golden State Warriors take on the Cleveland Cavaliers in the NBA Finals. At least Laker fans can still root for something on a nightly basis as they hope that their team tanks it all the way to the bottom of the standings.

I’m not saying that the Lakers lost to Phoenix on purpose, but wouldn’t nine days off sound better than just eight? Either way, if Los Angeles is looking to bolster its future odds of being competitive, then the team must look at trading away semi-valuable assets this year. The combo guard has consistently kept the Lakers competitive in games that they clearly should have lost this season, jeopardizing the team’s shot at an even better draft pick. So, all is good in La La Land, right? The Lakers have already won more games than all of last season and still have a decent shot at a very formidable draft pick. It can’t get much better than that. There is still a lot of work to do on a team that is still years away from competing in a league that only features two dominant teams. As long as the Lakers and their fans remain patient, lose some games and steer clear of any future Timofey Mozgov singings, their moment will come in due time. •

Lawndale Soccer Carries Momentum into Playoffs

It has been a long road toward success for head coach Angel Mendez and his Lawndale High School boys’ soccer squad. A team that is full of young and talented players, Lawndale didn’t really start clicking until more than halfway through the season. As is usually the case with young teams, chemistry takes time to formulate. Once the Cardinals found it, though, there was no looking back. Last Thursday afternoon, Lawndale continued moving forward as it took on the Garden Grove Argonauts in the first round of the CIF Southern Section Division IV playoffs. An electric offense by the young players who have sparked the Cardinals all season long carried Lawndale to a 3-1 victory and into a matchup against Cathedral City in the second round of the playoffs this week.

The Cardinals’ success late in the season has been thanks in large part to the play of sophomore forward Mario Perez. Perez was back at it again for Lawndale against the Argonauts as he led his team to a 1-1 tie at the halftime break. That’s when the Cardinals buckled down on defense behind goalkeeper Carlos Barrera. Despite allowing a goal early on in the first half, Barrera and Lawndale were nearly flawless in the second half. A good defense always leads to production on the offensive end. Two more goals for the young, yet experienced Cardinals offense late in the game wound up being the difference as Lawndale cruised to a two-goal win in the first round matchup against the Argonauts. Perez came away with player of the game honors--not only securing one of the team’s three goals on the afternoon, but also notching an assist as well. Junior forward Eduardo Casillas also put up one goal and an assist in the victory. Sophomore midfielder Anthony Canseco rounded out the scoring with a goal of his own.

A roster that sports one freshman and eight sophomores is now heading into the second round of the playoffs with a full head of steam. “I’ve been telling the guys, ‘It’s not how you start--it’s where you start and where you end,’” Mendez explained of his Lawndale team. The Cardinals may not have begun the season with a start that would have made it into the record books, but they have now officially turned their season around. They have not lost a game since the month of January. If it were up to Mendez, he would keep it that way until the beginning of next season. Lawndale’s quest for a CIF championship continues this week as the Cardinals take on

the Cathedral City Lions (16-6-3, 8-4). The Lions notched a 3-1 victory against Patriot in the first round of the playoffs last week.

HAWTHORNE HIGH

The Hawthorne Cougars soccer team basically switched spots with the Lawndale Cardinals once their sophomore forward and team MVP Oskar Gomez was lost for the season with a torn ligament. The Hawthorne offense clearly took a hit once Gomez was lost to injury, as the team was only able to manage two goals in the final four games of the regular season. Gomez himself was able to score 10 goals in just eight games before he was lost for the year, and Hawthorne’s season went off the deep end in the process.

With Gomez healthy and strong, Hawthorne was on a roll and scoring goals like almost no other team in the Ocean League. The Cougars were 7-2-4 and at the time looked to be on pace to challenge the Culver City Centaurs for first place in the division. Once Gomez went down, however, Hawthorne lost four league games in a row and eventually wound up with a 3-6-1 record in Ocean League play. The Cougars eventually lost two of their last three games of the regular season, including the finale against the Lawndale Cardinals, to drop to 11-9-6 on the season and fall to fifth place within their division. Despite the team’s inability to finish out the season strong, the saving grace for head coach Yuri Najarro and the rest of the Hawthorne Cougars is that Gomez will be back next season and will surely be ready to lead his team to an Ocean League title.

INGLEWOOD HIGH

The Inglewood High School soccer team ended the regular season after finally acquiring a much-coveted victory in the team’s third-to-last game against the Morningside Monarchs. While Inglewood’s overall record of 0-13-1 certainly suggests that the team had a rough season, to say the least, Morningside was unable to win a game all year long. The Monarchs did, however, force a tie against Inglewood in the second-to-last game of the year when the Sentinels battled back from behind and scored two goals in the second half to force the 3-3 split decision. Inglewood was able to avoid a last place finish in the Bay League standings with its victory over Morningside. The team’s one victory matched the win total from one season ago as head coach Clemente Gonzalez heads into an offseason that he certainly hopes will bring improvement heading into next year. •

IF YOU ARE A CREDITOR or a contingent creditor of the decedent, you must file your claim with the court and mail a copy to the personal representative appointed by the court within the later of either (1) four months from the date of first issuance of letters to a general personal representative, as defined in section 58(b) of the California Probate Code, or (2) 60 days from the date of mailing or personal delivery to you of a notice under section 9052 of the California Probate Code.
OTHER CALIFORNIA statutes and legal authority may affect your rights as a creditor. You may want to consult with an attorney knowledgeable in California law.
YOU MAY EXAMINE the file kept by the court. If you are a person interested in the estate, you may file with the court a formal Request for Special Notice (form DE-154) of the filing of an inventory and appraisal of estate assets or of any petition or account as provided in Probate Code section 1250. A Request for Special Notice form is available from the court clerk.

New Relief for Knee Pain May Be on the Horizon

(BPT) - Innovations in modern medicine have brought many artificial joints and bionic body parts to patients. Although these devices have been used for years, a prosthetic replacement for the meniscus - the tissue pad located between the thigh and shin bones - is not yet available. Now two clinical trials underway across the U.S. may help make the "artificial meniscus" a reality, providing a new treatment option for millions of Americans with persistent knee pain caused by injured or deteriorated meniscus.

The meniscus is highly vulnerable to tearing, both from physical activity and excess weight. Once damaged, it has a very limited ability to heal. More than 1 million partial meniscectomies to remove or repair a torn meniscus are performed in the U.S. every year - about the same as the total number of hip and knee replacement surgeries combined. However, many patients still experience persistent knee pain following meniscus surgery.

New York area volunteer firefighter Tracy Cullum was diagnosed with a meniscus tear eight years ago, when the 42-year-old mother of two was experiencing a constant ache and the inability to put any weight on her left leg. Although she underwent a partial meniscectomy to treat the tear, her knee pain became progressively worse and resulted in a constant limp while walking.

"I went from working out seven days a week to having to stop any exercise activities,"



Cullum says. "And my work as a part-time volunteer firefighter was challenging, since it was difficult to move any equipment and my mobility was compromised when responding to an emergency scene."

With her activity severely limited, Cullum sought out options to treat her persistent knee pain and discovered that a hospital near her home town is participating in the clinical trial of the NUsurface Meniscus Implant - the first "artificial meniscus" designed to replace the damaged one for patients like Cullum with

persistent knee pain due to injured or deteriorated meniscus cartilage.

"There are limited options for patients who experience persistent knee pain following meniscus surgery," says Dr. Richard Alfred, orthopedic surgeon at Capital Region Orthopaedic Associates and VENUS study investigator. "It is our hope that the NUsurface implant alleviates pain in these patients, allowing them to return to their previous levels of activity."

Cullum received the implant in July 2016 through a small incision in her knee. She

completed a six-week rehabilitation program, and she has now returned to daily leisure activities like hot yoga and her work as a volunteer firefighter.

"In the six months before receiving the NUsurface Meniscus Implant, my knee pain had peaked to where I had a constant dull ache and a limp while walking," Cullum says. "Now my range of motion is improving, and I am ecstatic to be able to resume one of my favorite activities - volunteering together with my husband and children at our local fire department."

The NUsurface Meniscus Implant, made of medical-grade plastic, is an investigational device that is inserted into the knee in a minimally invasive procedure through a small incision. It has been used in Europe since 2008 and Israel since 2011.

"It is important to note that NUsurface is an investigational device that is limited by United States law to investigational use," Dr. Alfred says. "Responses to the NUsurface can and do vary with each patient, so those interested in the trial should discuss their individual situations with a clinical trial physician."

To be eligible for the clinical studies, you must be between the ages of 30 and 75, have pain after medial meniscus surgery and have had meniscus surgery at least six months ago. To find a study site near you, visit www.activeimplants.com/kneepaintrial. •
