Hawthorne Residents May Have to Step Up on Water Conservation

In the wake of California’s continuing drought that has reached record proportions coupled with Governor Jerry Brown’s recent executive order to reduce water consumption, Hawthorne residents may soon be asked to further conserve their own usage of the precious commodity. The new decree from Sacramento calls for a 25 percent reduction goal statewide, with final approval expected by May 5 followed by official implementation on June 1. However the State Water Resources Control Board indicated that this level won’t be applied evenly across California, but will depend on levels of conservation achieved (or not) by individual cities. Those cities whose residents made inroads in cutting water consumption will be “credited”, but those falling short in their efforts will have to conserve even more than the 25 percent overall target benchmark.

As it stands, required reduction ranges will fall between 10 and 35 percent and will be tied into a residential consumption allocation of 55 gallons per capita per day that meets basic indoor water use needs. Much of the overage is the result of landscape and irrigation watering, so curbing residential usage will be the State’s primary focus. Hawthorne customers use about 87 gallons of water per day on average, according to Public Works Director Arnie Shadbehr. This would put the city into a 20 percent conservation bracket. In contrast, a community with a residential average of over 165 gallons per day would need to cut usage by 35 percent, while those using less than 55 gallons would only have to conserve 10 percent. “Recent words from the State Water Resources Control Board have actually identified Hawthorne at a 16 percent conservation target,” Shadbehr said. “However, since two separate water utility companies operate within the boundary of Hawthorne and each has its own jurisdictional territory

as well as consumption statistics, it is not yet clear how that 16 percent target will be applied within each water utility customer-based jurisdiction in Hawthorne. We expect this to be clarified in early May.”

After adopting a resolution declaring a drought emergency, the Hawthorne City Council passed a water conservation ordinance last fall with restrictions on washing down paved surfaces such as sidewalks, driveways and patios except when necessary for safety or if there is a sanitation hazard; limiting landscape watering to before 10 a.m. or after 6 p.m. only; stopping water waste from runoff, low head drainage or overspray; and allowing only a hand-held hose equipped with a positive shut-off nozzle or bucket to water landscaped areas. Some other notable provisions include a requirement to repair all water leaks within five day of notification by the City, offer guests at lodging establishments the option of not laundering towel and linens daily, serve/refill water in restaurants only upon patron request, and use recirculated water to operate ornamental fountains.

The State mandate includes several key provisions not currently featured in Hawthorne’s ordinance, including restrictions on watering to no more than twice a week and not allowing water to be used for irrigation within 48 hours following measurable rainfall. The State will also prohibit watering of landscape medians with ornamental turf unless using recycled water, and will only allow drip irrigation or microspray for landscaping of newly constructed homes. And while the City does limit the hours during which residents may water their lawns, there is no per-station time limit to monitor the duration (not a State requirement at this point). “We will know more when the Water Board and Public Utilities Commission propose/adopt the specifics of the new regulations, which we expect to happen soon,” Shadbeher said of any imminent actions

by the City Council to revise the municipal code to address water consumption. “For now, the preliminary conservation targets for the City of Hawthorne system that we adopted last October should be covered by the existing ordinance.” The State’s emergency declaration also gives the City the right to fine individual offenders up to \$500 for violations.

While the State can also issue cease and desist orders and even impose fines of \$10,000 per day on the cities themselves for non-compliance, Shadbehr said he does not believe Hawthorne will be in danger of such extreme measures due to its strong conservation record. “Through various public works improvement projects over the past several years, we connected almost 90 percent of our parks and public landscaped area irrigation systems to reclaimed water lines,” he said. “Total consumption of reclaimed water in Hawthorne is also close to 41 million gallons annually.”

Meanwhile, Shadbehr advised residents to access information from their water utility company by referring to their water bills and contacting the toll-free number or checking the website address. Half of the Hawthorne customers are served by California Water Service Company and the other half by Golden State Water Company. Both agencies provide conservation tips as well as updates on available incentives and rebates. Among other residential programs, rebate possibilities exist for high-efficiency toilets and clothes washers, smart controllers that regulate sprinklers by sensing weather patterns, and turf removal—an increasingly popular option. Citizens may also find additional ideas on how to reduce water usage by 20 percent (30 gallons per day) via westbasin.org. Reducing outdoor watering results in the most dramatic savings, though practices such as washing only full loads of laundry and dishes, cutting shower times and turning off water while brushing teeth or shaving all add up. •

All that was left were the outside block walls of the building. We were blessed to find another building two blocks north on Prairie and we had our shop back open by mid-summer. This week’s riots just reminded us of how quickly things can happen and change for a model city like Baltimore and it certainly can happen any where, including Hawthorne.

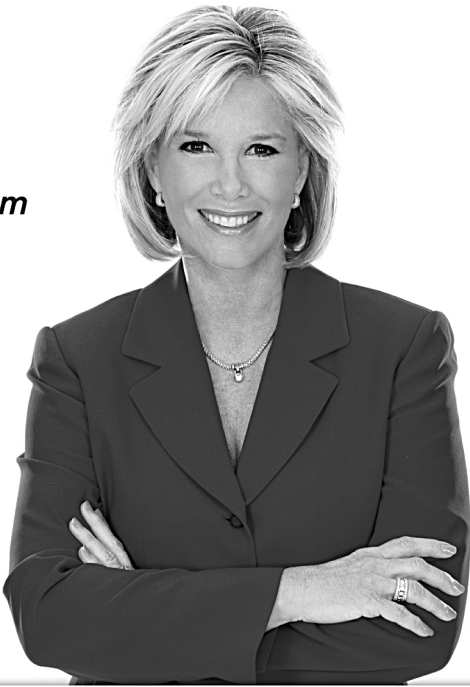

Perez Walkoff Hit Lifts Cougars

A walkoff single by Vanessa Perez helped Hawthorne High's softball team to a 4-3 win over Culver City in a key Ocean League game last Thursday at Hawthorne. With one out in the bottom of the seventh inning, Perez singled home Fa Leilua from second base that helped the Cougars even their league record to 2-2.

"It was a nice walk-off hit," Eduardo Perez, Hawthorne assistant coach to head mentor Jerry Contreras, said. "It will only make us better."

With one out in the bottom of the seventh, Leilua walked. Elizabeth Cortez, then, hit to the Culver City shortstop but her throw was dropped by its second baseman and both runners were safe. Perez then singled to right, bringing home Leilua.

The Centaurs were leading 3-2 entering the bottom of the fifth but Hawthorne (12-4 overall) tied the game when Natalie Rocha's sacrifice fly to left field brought home Leilua,

who began the inning by being hit by a pitch.

Culver, which is 5-6 overall and 2-2 in Ocean play, took an early 2-0 lead in the top of the first on a two-run double from Melody Rodriguez, but the Cougars quickly tied the game in the bottom of the inning on a two-run home run by Leilua. A run-scoring single from Sabrina Perez gave the Centaurs a 3-2 lead in the top of the third.

The winning pitcher for Hawthorne was Carrie Ludman, who came in the third inning in relief of starter Alyssa Casillas. Ludman pitched five innings allowing no runs on three hits. Casillas gave up all three runs (one earned) in two-plus innings for the Cougars.

At Hawthorne on April 21, the Cougars took a very good El Segundo team to nine innings before falling 3-1 in league play. Last Saturday, Hawthorne played in the El Segundo Tournament and began with a 12-10 victory over Village Christian from Sun Valley.

The Cougars got things going with five runs in the top of the first and led 12-5 entering the bottom of the sixth before Village

Christian made it close with five runs. The contest was marred by a combined total of 10 errors, three by Hawthorne and seven from Village Christian.

After visiting Ocean rival Lawndale last Tuesday, the Cougars will host Ocean power and defending CIF-Southern Section Division III champion Santa Monica in another key league game Friday at 3:15 p.m. Hawthorne plays in the El Segundo Tournament Saturday before resuming Ocean at home against Beverly Hills next Tuesday at 3:15 p.m.

LEUZINGER FALLS TO NORTH

Leuzinger High's softball team lost to North Torrance 11-3 in a Pioneer League game last Friday at Leuzinger. Amaya Eubanks sparked the Olympians by going three-for-three with two runs batted in. Abby Alexander sparked the Saxons, the top ranked team in the CIF-Southern Section Division IV, by going two-for-two and driving in four runs. Leuzinger fell to 4-10 overall and 0-4 in league.

BEVERLY HILLS SWEEPS HAWTHORNE

Hawthorne High's mostly young and inexperienced baseball team fell to 0-4 in the Ocean League by losing two games to Beverly Hills last week. At Beverly Hills on April 21, the Cougars lost to the Normans 3-2. At Hawthorne last Thursday, the Cougars lost to Beverly 7-1.

In the first game, Hawthorne began with a 2-0 lead in the top of the second but went scoreless the rest of the game. Learn About This Home Improvement That Can Save You Money

(BPT) - For many homeowners the biggest utility bill is electricity. Heating and cooling the home makes up nearly half of electricity costs, but the next biggest source is the water heater. Water heaters can account for up to 25 percent of total household energy use. Taking steps to improve the energy efficiency of a home with better insulation and more efficient furnaces and air conditioners can reduce energy costs significantly, as can making sure water heaters are operating properly.

However, purchasing a high efficiency water heater does little good if the environment in which it operates is not right. The main culprit in reducing the efficiency of water heaters is hard water. Nearly 90 percent of American homes have hard water which contains high levels of calcium and magnesium. These minerals cause scaling, a buildup that clogs waterlines and plumbing forcing appliances to work harder and operate less efficiently.

Hard water can reduce the efficiency of water heaters and increase electricity costs by as much as 48 percent according to the Battelle Memorial Institute.

The problem can be particularly severe with electric water heaters. These can accumulate up to 30 pounds of calcium carbonate, a rock-like scale, eventually damaging the heating element which will have to be replaced. The cost of hard water is not higher just because of reduced energy efficiency and higher electric bills; hard water also damages appliances like water heaters, dish washers, shower heads and faucets. These must be repaired and replaced more often as a result.

To determine if you have hard water, look for spots and scale build-up on fixtures. “A less obvious indication is the lack of that luxury feeling of a hot shower you get at a nice hotel,” says Michael Mecca of Performance Water Products. “That feeling is not because

of the nice towels and soaps. It’s because nice hotels use soft water not only for their guests’ benefit but also to protect their investments in boilers, piping and fixtures.”

Kitchens benefit from soft water as well because soft water is up to 12 times more effective at cleaning dishes than increasing the amount of detergent used. Researchers also found that for washing machines, the most important factor in removing stains from clothing was water softness. Reduction of water hardness was up to 100 times more effective at stain removal than increasing the detergent dose or washing with hotter water. In fact, soft water can reduce soap use by as much as half.

Many water treatment companies offer free tests to homeowners to measure the degree of hardness in the water and offer appropriate systems that fit. “Hardness in water can vary widely in some parts of the country and

pipe size, number of bathrooms, number of people in the house, types of showerheads and intended use all need to be considered for the right system,” says Mecca.

Looking Up

Earth-Size Telescope Expands to South Pole to See Black Holes in Detail

Astronomers building an Earth-size virtual telescope capable of photographing the event horizon of the black hole at the center of our Milky Way have extended their instrument to the bottom of the Earth—the South Pole—thanks to recent efforts by a team led by Dan Marrone of the University of Arizona.

Marrone, an assistant professor in the UA’s Department of Astronomy and Steward Observatory, and several colleagues flew to the National Science Foundation’s Amundsen-Scott South Pole Station in December to bring the South Pole Telescope, or SPT, into the largest virtual telescope ever built—the Event Horizon Telescope, or EHT. By combining telescopes across the Earth, the EHT will take the first detailed pictures of black holes.

The EHT is an array of radio telescopes connected using a technique known as very long baseline interferometry, or VLBI. Larger telescopes can make sharper observations, and interferometry allows multiple telescopes to act like a single telescope as large as the separation—or “baseline”—between them. “Now that we’ve done VLBI with the

SPT, the Event Horizon Telescope really does span the whole Earth, from the Submillimeter Telescope on Mount Graham in Arizona, to California, Hawaii, Chile, Mexico, Spain and the South Pole,” Marrone said. “The baselines to SPT give us two to three times more resolution than our past arrays, which is absolutely crucial to the goals of the EHT. To verify the existence of an event horizon, the ‘edge’ of a black hole, and more generally, to test Einstein’s theory of general relativity, we need a very detailed picture of a black hole. With the full EHT, we should

be able to do this.” The prime EHT target is the Milky Way’s black hole, known as Sagittarius A* (pronounced “A-star”). Even though it is 4 million times more massive than the Sun, it is tiny to the eyes of astronomers. Because it is smaller than Mercury’s orbit around the Sun, yet almost 26,000 light-years away, studying its event horizon in detail is equivalent to standing in California and reading the date on a penny in New York. With its unprecedented resolution, more than 1,000 times better than the Hubble Space

Telescope, the EHT will see swirling gas on its final plunge over the event horizon, never to regain contact with the rest of the universe. If the theory of general relativity is correct, the black hole itself will be invisible because not even light can escape its immense gravity.

First postulated by Albert Einstein’s general theory of relativity, the existence of black holes has since been supported by decades’ worth of astronomical observations. Most if not all galaxies are now believed to harbor a supermassive black hole at their center, and smaller ones formed from dying stars should be scattered among their stars. The Milky Way is known to be home to about 25 smallish black holes ranging from five to 10 times the Sun’s mass. But never has it been possible to directly observe and image one of these cosmic oddities.

Weighing 280 tons and standing 75 feet tall, the SPT sits at an elevation of 9,300 feet on the polar plateau at Amundsen-Scott, which is located at the geographic South Pole. The University of Chicago built SPT with funding and logistical support from the NSF’s Division of Polar Programs. The division manages the U.S. Antarctic Program, which coordinates all U.S. research on the southernmost continent. •

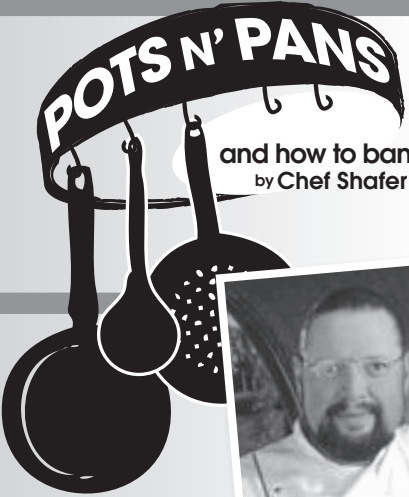

The best thing about this is that there is zero oil in it! •



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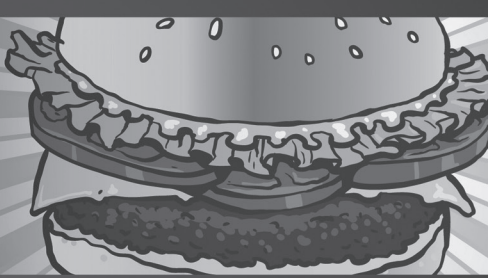
