Vargas, English Tout Clean Power Alliance and Apprenticeships

In a meeting that lasted just under an hour, the Hawthorne City Council blitzed through a number of resolutions while Mayor Alex Vargas and Councilmember Angie Reyes English provided updates to out-of-state conferences they attended last week. Among the resolutions the Council unanimously approved were a three-way stop sign at the intersection of Isis and Wiseburn Avenue, the establishment of an on-street parking space at 4181 Broadway Ave. for exclusive use of physically handicapped persons, and official support of California Bill AB2758.

Councilmember Olivia Valentine took a moment to state how AB2758 would particularly help encourage minority-owned small business growth in the city. The bill offers income tax credits to qualified small businesses.

A Hamilton Project report cited that the average loan amount for minority-owned businesses was \$9,300 compared to \$20,500 for non-minority owned businesses. California receives just over 50 percent of all U.S. venture capital. Only 1 percent of those funds go to African-American and Hispanic-owned businesses. AB 2758 aims to fix the inequity in financing by prioritizing investments directed toward minority-owned businesses.

Vargas and English also spoke at length about encouraging people to join and begin apprenticeships. “There a lot of different apprentice programs that are available,” English said of the conference she attended in New York. “I’m working with Los Angeles World Airports [LAWA] with regards to an apprentice program that they have for those that are interested in the construction jobs that are coming to LAX with the people mover and all the synergy that is happening there

building out LAX.”

English added that it was important for the City of Hawthorne to work hand-in-hand with El Camino College in helping students find a skill that can ultimately lead to a career. “We’re falling short with a lot of skills that folks need such as nurses, doctors, social workers, apprentice construction work,” she said. “We need to just be sure that Hawthorne is providing this information for its residents.” Information for career development and apprenticeship programs will be going up on the City of Hawthorne website soon.

English also spoke about the Clean Power Alliance (CPA), of which she is the representative for the City. “Clean Power Alliance is who we are now in the City of Hawthorne and we’re going to be forming a community advisory committee for those that are interested,” she said. “It’s an opportunity for constituents in our city to participate.” Those interested in being a part of the community advisory committee can apply at the City Clerk’s office.

Clean Power Alliance is a non-profit organization that Hawthorne joined back in December 2017. “Our city is working hand-in-hand with the Clean Power Alliance to [ensure] that we are procuring energy at a lower cost,” English explained. “There is going to be a roll-out of invoices that are going to be going out to the community here in Hawthorne sometime in July that speaks to who Clean Power Alliance is and what we’re ultimately doing with renewable energy.”

Vargas also commented on the CPA, saying that “this is a decision that we made to be able to save the community money. There’s a big effort that took place to get here and pretty soon it is going to be marketed and everyone is going to understand what is going to happen.”

English added that the estimated population for Hawthorne for 2017-2018 saw a growth of 1 percent. According to the website Suburban Stats, Hawthorne is now home to 84,293 people at last count. Of that total, 52 percent of the population or 44,572 residents are Hispanic.

Vargas attended the National Association of Latino Elected Officials (NALEO) Work Force Development Institute in New York with English. “One of the big topics that occurred at this meeting was basically saying that people who go to college sometimes have a hard time getting jobs,” Vargas said. “The alternate form of employment is the trades with labor jobs and such. Those are more rewarding except that the labor unions membership is going down.”

Vargas used the hotels that are being built across the street from City Hall as an example. “I had a discussion with one of the foreman and we have our union workers, but it was hard to get people to work on this project because we don’t have a lot of rosters to go and pick from because there’s not a lot of people,” he said. “We want to hire union people for different things here in government, but there’s not enough people -- so we need to encourage that and let people know that college doesn’t always necessarily have to be the main goal. There are trade union jobs out there that pay even more than a college degree.”

With Mother’s Day coming up, the Council also sent out greetings -- including Vargas, who spoke about the holiday. “I want to congratulate all the wonderful mothers for all the work that they do for their wonderful families and all the sacrifices that they give for us,” he said. “It’s kind of towards our latter years that we as adults can appreciate what our mothers did for us. Thank you to all the mothers...” •

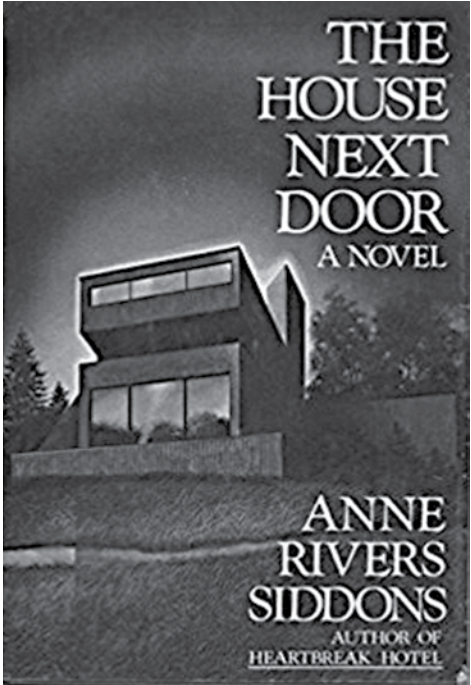


Check It Out

The House Next Door by Anne Rivers Siddons

This particular book review is a perfect example of one of the many services our library offers the community: Interlibrary loans! If you are looking for a certain book that we do not have, we can try to locate it in another library. I have taken advantage of this service

This book has been on my “to-read” list for a long time. In his analysis of horror, *Danse Macabre*, Stephen King considered *The House Next Door* to be the best example of the New American Gothic. The author Anne Rivers Siddons was raised in Georgia and is mostly known for writing sweeping tales of plantation life as well as more modern Southern high society. *The House Next Door*, published in 1978, early in her novel-writing career, is certainly much different from her other works.

Colquitt Kennedy is happily married to Walter and enjoys their lifestyle of understated wealth and privilege. Walter is a partner in an ad agency and Col does public relations work. They are contented until the wooded lot next door is sold and it becomes clear that a house will be built. The trees will be eradicated and the peace and quiet that they have known is threatened.

What a twist the author puts in the oft-told tale of the haunted house! This brand-new structure is completed and sounds like a Frank Lloyd Wright-inspired wood and glass artwork mingling naturally with the wildlife and picturesque creek running through both backyards.

Not your average dilapidated mansion. There is a somewhat parallel story being told --- not only of a malevolent building, but also of the morals and customs in the old and new moneyed classes in the Atlanta suburbs -- lives that are caught up in the whirl of country clubs, dinner parties and drinks on the patio, island vacation homes and intrigue among the neighbors.

Enter the Harrelsons. Young marrieds Buddy and Pie hired architect Kim Dougherty to design something that would basically “freak out” her traditional-minded father. The result is beyond anyone’s expectations. Soon everyone is struck by its beauty and curious to see inside. After the couple move in, they decide to have a housewarming party and invite neighbors and work colleagues. I don’t think you will be surprised when I reveal that something bad happens.

Before you know it, new owners Buck and Anita Sheehan are ensconced and after escalating harrowing incidents involving relatives and neighbor Virginia, the house is on the market again.

By the time the Greenes and their young daughter take possession of the “possessed” property, hardly a year has passed. Death, betrayals and scandals have been previously attached to the house, but the worst is yet to come.

The next door neighbors, the Kennedys, are truly horrified by what is happening and struggle to comprehend who or what is at work here. Perhaps it’s just a string of terrible bad luck that is affecting the house’s inhabitants, like others suggest. But what if it’s something else?

Film Review

Avengers: Infinity War Sets the Stage for an Epic Series Finale

The Marvel Cinematic Universe began in 2008 with the introduction of *Iron Man*, where the focus of the film was building their universe with the cornerstone quote, “I am Iron Man.” Today, for the 10-year anniversary of the MCU, *Avengers: Infinity War* tackles a far more complex theme as it pits the universe’s greatest heroes against their most feared villain. The latest installment packs more superheroes in its 24 frames per second than any other superhero movie to date, and promises to tie together 10 years of storytelling. The heartbreak begins with Loki’s (Tom Hiddleston)

That sacrifice is viewed as randomly having half of the population in the galaxy cease to exist so that the limited natural resources may renew and the population can better themselves -- an ideology reminiscent of Sir Francis Galton’s theory of eugenics where people with “fit” traits were encouraged to reproduce, while those with “undesirable” traits faced forced sterilization. So begins Thanos’ journey with the Infinity Gauntlet to collect all six Infinity Stones and thus bring balance to the universe on a grand and cosmic scale. As he continues to collect one after the other, our superheroes are hit with a grim realization that evil not only may, but could win.

foreboding sentiment, “I assure you, brother, the sun will shine on us again.”

With such a star-studded cast of larger-than-life heroes with egos to match -- Robert Downey, Jr.’s Iron Man, Benedict Cumberbatch’s Dr. Strange, Chris Pratt’s Peter Quill, Chris Hemsworth’s Thor, Chris Evans’ Captain America and many more -- the question is posed, can the movie really give its hungry fans the rich storyline that can be guaranteed when each hero has his own franchise? The answer is an absolute and resounding yes! Christopher Markus and Stephen McFeely craft a screenplay that expertly delivers a compelling journey for every superhero, while directors Anthony and Joe Russo marry the anticipated Marvel humor with the darkness and tragedy to which the trailers allude.

The climax will catch any Marvel fan off guard and leave them with far more questions than answers in this beautifully devastating precursor to the final Avengers movie, set to come out in April 2019. You can bet that every viewer will watch this film over and over to find clues and hidden Easter eggs in order to see what could be in store for our champions. Be sure to stay through the credits, as there is a scene that doesn’t give too many answers but offers some insight into possibilities for the MCU that will have fans debating what it all means...until the next installment.

Avengers: Infinity War is rated PG-13 for intense sequences of sci-fi violence and action throughout, language and some crude references. 149 minutes. Now playing in theaters everywhere. •

Tragedy is the backbone of each hero’s storyline as their journey to defeat the villainous Thanos has each of them answer one essential question: What does it cost to be a hero in a world where there are no easy answers? The dreadful foreboding from Thanos at the film’s open sets the tone and foreshadows the loss that each hero will have to endure as they fail to balance their personal persona with their heroic one.

We are finally introduced to Thanos (Josh Brolin), who until this movie has been a mysterious figure. We knew he meant trouble, but were not aware the extent his power would have on the entire MCU. Thanos believes that his actions are intended to be merciful and that in order to sustain life, there must be balance that can only be achieved through sacrifice.

Wiseburn School Board Honors Retirees, Approves Dana Principal

Tuesday evening’s meeting of the Wiseburn Unified School District (WUSD) School Board was bereft of special presentations, but did honor four retiring educators, as well as cement the selection of Kiana Brede as the new principal at Dana Middle School.

The Board passed resolutions honoring retirees Terry Johnstone, Juan de Anza Elementary first grade teacher, who has worked for the District for 32 years; Anza fifth grade teacher Stacy Bellante, leaving the WUSD after 22 years; Gabrielle Becker Irvin, a Dana Middle School sixth grade teacher who will retire after 19 years of service; and Anza kindergarten teacher Barbara Borel, feted for her 17 years of service to Wiseburn students. The resolutions will be presented to the teachers at their retirement parties later this month.

Prior to the meeting, Bellante emailed, “It has been an honor and a privilege to work for the Wiseburn School District for the past

22 years. It has been like a second family to me! I will truly miss all the fantastic teachers and school members, as well as the many students and parents that I have gotten to know over the years. I am very proud of being a part of this wonderful community!”

Borel emailed, “Teaching in Wiseburn has been a wonderful experience for me. Working with the teachers at Anza has been like working with family. (OK, that can go either way!). It’s a good thing! I have loved my students and their families. I will miss them.”

The meeting, normally held on the second Thursday of each month, was bumped up because retiring Superintendent Tom Johnstone was heading to Illinois Wednesday morning to witness his daughter’s graduation from Loyola University, Chicago.

Brede, currently the assistant principal at Dana Middle School, was formally announced as the new principal, succeeding Blake Silvers, who has been selected to take over for as Wiseburn’s new superintendent.

Prior to the meeting, Johnstone spoke of the attributes that led to the selection of Brede. He noted key leadership roles she has filled at Dana, citing a “very dynamic team of educators” working at the school. “The leadership function has spread throughout the school,” Johnstone said. He noted some of the WUSD mentors that Brede has worked with as she honed her leadership skills, saying that the hire-from-within is “a vote of confidence for the direction in which the school is going.”

Silvers said that “it is exciting that the systems that are in place right now will continue, seamlessly, with someone who has been raised through and helped define the systems,” and to continue the progress that has been made at Dana to educate the students and prepare them for their high school years. Johnstone, citing the benefit of hiring a principal acutely familiar with the Wiseburn educational credo, posited that “the ship is moving in the right direction.”

In a letter recently sent to the Wiseburn community, Silvers penned that, after reviewing a “litany of applications,” Brede was selected. He noted that he was “proud of Kiana’s contributions to the community as a teacher leader and as an administrator. She is a talented and strong educator who is committed to our school and our district. Her strength as an educational leader and her compassion and advocacy for all stakeholders will serve us well in the years to come.”

Johnstone also mentioned prior to the meeting that there were now eight teacher openings for the 2018/19 school year, with five at Anza and three at Dana. In a district the size of Wiseburn, having that many slots available is an anomaly. “Bizarre,” is how Silvers phrased it.

The first order of business Tuesday evening during the 85-minute meeting featured the Board hearing from three members of the public who passionately addressed their concerns about the ever-evolving District Child Development Center offerings -- specifically the pre-school and after-school programs that will be tended in the future.

After hearing the parental concerns, Board President JoAnne Kaneda spoke, saying that she and her colleagues understand parental needs in the current fiscal environment, with the necessity in many households to have both parents working. “We do take this [issue] seriously,” she said. “It’s tough. We understand the need in the community. We also understand the responsibility that we have as a school board, first and foremost, to provide an education for the families that live in our district.”

Prior to the recognition of the retiring teachers, Board members and administrators presented their reports, with member Neil Goldman noting how the WUSD has now embraced a paperless method of compiling each meeting agenda. Israel Mora marveled about recent 3-D printing accomplishments he witnessed from third graders at Anza Elementary; and members Nelson Martinez and Roger Banuelos thanked parents in the community for their attendance at the meeting and their input regarding the pre-school and after-school programs.

During his comments, Johnstone mentioned the May 3 trip to the Disneyland Hotel to see Burnett Elementary recognized as a California Distinguished School; the Burnett spring concert that took place on May 4, which, he said “always makes you feel good” and featured the synergy of visual arts and music; and the upcoming open houses calendared as the school year winds down.

After the retirees received their due, the Board then tackled agenda action items, among them the approval of the outside bleachers for the aquatics center; an increase in the funding for needed material testing and inspection services for the ongoing Phase II construction that is steaming ahead; and an increase in the money needed to pay for additional soils and geological testing and inspection as construction continues for the Douglas Street aquatics center, gym and soccer field.

Johnstone said that while the initial hope was for Phase II of the multi-million-dollar construction project to be completed in March of 2018, weather constraints and other unforeseen issues pushed back the time-frame --- but that “all is moving in the right direction.”

Typically, the Wiseburn School Board convenes on the second and fourth Thursdays of most in-school months, but with the May calendar boasting five Thursdays, the next regularly scheduled meeting has been slated for May 31. This will not conflict with planned festivities at the District’s final open houses of the school year. •
