Board Approves Balanced Budget; Discussed a Math Placement Protocol for Students

The Wiseburn Board of Trustees ended the fiscal year with a cautious look to the future, approving yesterday, with unanimous support, a balanced budget for school year 2016-17.

In a narrative memo detailing budget highlights, prepared by Chief Business Officer Dave Wilson, it is projected that the District will end the 2015-16 year “with a net increase to the General Fund of approximately \$1.6 million. This is mainly due to the \$1.3 million in one-time State Mandate revenue, the \$188,000 in the one-time “Educator Effectiveness” grant, as well as the unspent revenue the District has set aside for future increases to the STRS contribution.”

The budget reflects increased expenditures for CalSTRS (California State Teachers Retirement System) and PERS (Public Employees Retirement System), and will continue to do so for several years, as the district must keep pace with the state’s mandate (AB 1469) to close the unfunded projected retirement liability. The district paid STRS rate will continue to increase by 1.85 percent, until it reaches the mandate of 19.10 percent, in 2020.

Wilson noted that 85 percent of the budget is set for employee costs.

Other expenditures reflected in the narrative include addition special staff positions including five full-time speech pathologists and six assistant speech pathologists; a counselor, a reading intervention specialist and a security aide at Dana, all full-time positions.

With the Governors May revise now confirmed, Wiseburn is assured of an increase in state funding. This includes both an overall

1.3 percent increase from last year, in Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF) revenue. This increase, approximately \$255,000, includes nearly \$195,000 in “supplemental” grants, monies that are specifically mandated for the educational needs of targeted students, namely low-income and foster youth and English language learners.

Also confirmed as of the May revise, Wiseburn can count \$575,000 in one-time revenues for discretionary expenses.

Superintendent Tom Johnstone said the coming years will need cautious financial planning. “The really robust (funding) of the last four years is over. There won’t be a 4 percent salary increase, like last year.”

Board President Israel Mora said he would like to, at some point, approach the budget from a zero-based formula. “It’s Joanne’s (Kaneda, board member and clerk) suggestion; we just take one year and start from zero,” Mora said. Zero-based budgeting is a method to attempt building an ideal budget from scratch.

The board discussed a math placement protocol for students throughout the district. A first reading of the potential policy is focused on flexibility in determining when students are moved through upper level math courses. Regarding the policy, Johnstone said, “The thinking behind it starts with the end in mind.” The board hopes to develop an articulation process that will have the “highest likelihood of success” for each student, Johnstone said.

Board Member Roger Banuelos requested the board receive placement results no later than October. That way, once students have been tested and placed in math classes, the board will have the data necessary to begin tracking the best pathway for each student

to advance through algebra, calculus, and geometry.

Johnstone noted that previously, students have been assigned classes without a “long view” toward acquisition of cumulative math skills. Aptitude and advanced placement will be factored into the new protocol, so students are tracking successfully toward graduation within set math goals.

“Parents need to have that long view,” Board Member Neil Goldman said, “when planning schedules for their high school students.”

Action items on agenda included 21 change orders on the Wiseburn High School construction project. All were approved unanimously. Approval also was unanimous to accept the lowest bidder to paint at Cabrillo Elementary over the summer.

Approval was unanimous for general fiscal items, including agreements and contracts with PowerSchool, Athens Water Services, CARS and DRG Computers. Consent items 1-11 were acted on in one vote, as is usual, with full approval for several stipends, conference attendance, additional hours, service agreements and temporary employees.

Personnel items were approved unanimously; there were two resignations; two transfers; eight approvals or ratifications of employment, including that of Director of Facilities Planning Vince Madsen. A job description and salary schedule were set for a District Technology Technician.

The next regular meeting of the Wiseburn School Board will take place Thursday, July 14 at 6 p.m. Additionally, the board will meet only once in August. The board will resume its regular twice-monthly meeting schedule in September. •

2. Fuel your Machine
“I like to tell people to think of nutrition as fuel for the body; without the correct fuel, the engine and components can’t work correctly,” says Johnson. “The most critical nutrients that boomers don’t get enough of are supergreens and omega-3s. We know we all need to eat more green veggies, but did you know that up to 91 percent of the American population is deficient in omega-3s?”

He recommends every Boomer get 1,500 mg of EPA and DHA each day, such as 1 tablespoon of Nordic Naturals Arctic Cod Liver Oil Orange Flavor. It’s a high-quality

fish oil that offers an easy, safe way to add omega-3s to the diet. As for supergreens, he recommends spirulina and chlorella (types of algae), and frozen wheatgrass.

“The benefits of exercise are endless, but the underdog benefit is how it makes us feel and think,” says Johnson. “You should move your body if you want to stay sharp and happy.”

Find an exercise program you enjoy, he suggests. “Exercise is the fountain of youth, but you shouldn’t do something you don’t like. Make sure you move your body daily. If you are looking for suggestions, think about hiring a trainer to learn a set program. I think focusing on form and technique over intensity is the first step.”

5. Schedule Regular Maintenance Checks
“Play offense instead of defense with your health,” says Johnson. “Modern medicine is better than ever at early detection and treatment.”

The key is to focus on prevention. “Use annual doctor visits to screen, ask questions and monitor your risk factors. Remember, you can only get good answers if you ask good questions,” he says.

Finally, Johnson reminds people that anti-aging doesn’t exist. “We are all aging - the key is to age well. This means to aspire to quality of life. We all have motivators in our life: kids, grandkids, spouses, careers, passions, etc. Without your health, none of these can be enjoyed to the fullest.” •

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Grilled Flank Steak with Grapes and Stilton

Makes 6 servings

Ingredients

- 1 flank steak (2 pounds)
- kosher salt
- freshly ground black pepper
- 1 1/2 tablespoons red wine vinegar
- 1 tablespoon chopped shallot
- 1/4 teaspoon Dijon mustard
- 1/4 cup extra-virgin olive oil
- 2 bunches (8 cups) watercress, trimmed
- 1/2 cup crumbled Stilton or other blue cheese
- 2 cups red California grapes, halved

Preparation

1. Heat grill to high and oil grates.
2. Sprinkle steak with salt and pepper.
3. In small blender or food processor, combine vinegar, shallot, mustard and olive oil to make dressing. Season with salt and pepper, and puree until smooth.
4. Grill steak until it reaches 130 F for medium-rare, about 6-7 minutes per side. Transfer to cutting board and let rest 5 minutes.
5. In large bowl, combine watercress, salt, pepper and enough dressing to coat. Thinly slice steak across the grain and transfer to platter. Top with watercress, Stilton and grapes, and serve with additional dressing.
