City Council Okays Next Phase of Underground Tunnel Project

Elon Musk’s The Boring Company got a unanimous thumbs up from the Hawthorne City Council Tuesday evening to move forward with the underground tunnel project running along 120th Street. The next phase of the test tunnel that runs underneath 120th Street from Crenshaw Boulevard to Prairie Avenue involves the construction of an offshoot spur that leads to an electric vehicle elevator that rises into a garage on a property that SpaceX has purchased at 3834 West 119th Place.

“The purpose of the tunnel is to test the concept of a zero-emission, alternative transportation system,” Planning Director Brian James said. “The Boring Company has acquired a home and they want to build a spur and test elevator into the garage. The purpose of that is to further test the capabilities of the system.”

The elevator and garage would not be for public use, but rather for The Boring Company’s private research and development purposes. “The tunnel is about 45-feet deep and the proposal is to take a short spur off of that test tunnel and run that in to a closed elevator shaft -- and inside that shaft is a 10-foot by 20-foot car lift that would reach the surface inside a closed garage that’s about 975 square feet,” James said.

James added that the property would also have an 8-foot-tall block wall surrounding it as well as fencing and 24-hour surveillance with support from the Hawthorne Police Department, if necessary. The home that is on the property will also undergo remodeling before being rented out to tenants.

“I just want to note that with the garage, the wall, the fence and the placement of the garage behind the home, the test elevator will not be visible on the property,” James said.

“The elevator itself is pretty simple. They’ve actually already built one on the Crenshaw side of the tunnel on SpaceX property. It sounds like a garage door opener, so it’s very quiet.”

The operational plan for the property will permit a maximum of four onsite employees. Additionally there can only be a maximum of five residents living in the house on a 1-year leasing term.

Testing hours on the site will run from 9 a.m. to 7 p.m. Monday through Saturday, while construction hours are set from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday. The City of Hawthorne permits construction in residential areas until 7 p.m., so the project is currently well within the mandated cut-off time.

Additionally, as a means of controlling traffic on 119th Place, cars will not be able to enter into the garage. The only entrance will be from the original Crenshaw side of the tunnel and will only be for residents of the property.

While the ordinances to move forward received unanimous approval, it wasn’t without a number of questions. Councilwoman Angie Reyes English first questioned The Boring Company representatives about the purchase and relocation of the cabinet business that was formerly located on 120th and Prairie. The business was purchased by The Boring Company and is currently in the process of relocating.

“We’re not exactly sure where they relocated,” The Boring Company representative said. “I know that based on conversations that we’ve had with them that they’re awaiting some necessary permits but will be reopening soon.”

English also asked that the hours of operation be moved back from 7 p.m. to 6 p.m. “We worked with City staff to set up what we

described as testing hours to ensure that we are creating structure to the process,” the Boring company representative said. “There’s not really a direct answer except that we thought that those seemed like reasonable hour to allow for testing. That was the recommendation from City staff and we worked with them to ensure those hours were reasonable.”

English had some concerns with the security plan that involves the use of Hawthorne police personnel if necessary. “The concerns I have with the security plan involve our Hawthorne Police Department and I have an issue with liability,” she said. “You’re talking about not trying to grab the attention of folks in the community, but at the same time you’re asking for police on the outside to secure the property and there is going to be a curiosity factor that comes with that.”

The Boring Company said that the Hawthorne Police Department’s role would be to review the security plan rather than provide it. The company said it would be responsible for securing the site.

Community outreach was also one of English’s concerns with the project -- specifically the sense that everything is being rushed. “It is how we do things. Sometimes it seems rushed, but really what we want to do is show proof of concept and show success as quickly as possible,” The Boring Company representative said. “We’re not asking to short-circuit any processes and we’re certainly not asking step around anything in the process. Yes, we do move fast at SpaceX and The Boring Company. We are trying to revolutionize transportation and don’t want to get bogged down...and want to show to potential investors, other cities, our employees and the public in general that we want to and will succeed.” •



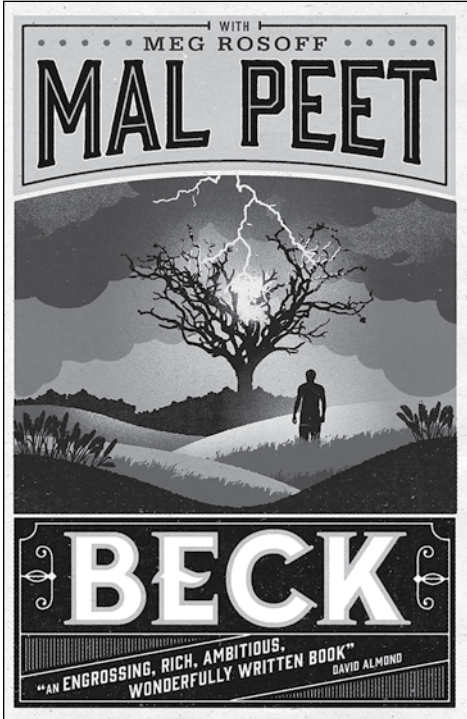

Check It Out

Beck Renders Readers Haunted and Hopeful at the Same Time

The leaves shiver and fall and a gentle wind circulates through Inglewood. It's autumn and the perfect season to nestle up under an oak and lose yourself in a good book. And I've got

just the book to chase away those post-summer blues. Let's delve right in and get all roused with reverie for leisurely literature again.

Beck by Mal Peet is wholesale heartrending and a host to many narrative highs and lows. This historical novel follows Beck, a young orphan vagabond traveling across the continent during the Depression, as he struggles with the racial inequalities of the era and the hardships of life on the road. It's a story propelled by well-wrought emotions, fully-realized characters and a protagonist who embodies determination in the face of abject desolation.

The plot will pitch your wellbeing through the emotional wringer. Beck undergoes tremendous trials and tribulations and, willingly or not, finds his resolve and character hardened by it. Hunger and discrimination are constant companions with him throughout his travels, but he manages to find solace by novel's end. Circumstance and chance batter the boy incessantly, but he learns to persevere. He ekes his way from one harrowing situation to the next. Survival becomes a knack despite some gut-wrenching close calls. Beck finds himself testing the very limits of luck with his constant freight-hopping, illicit hardscrabble careers, and

irreverent denunciation of authority.

The writer is adept at conjuring vivid paragraphs of description. We're transported from the gloomy docks of Liverpool to the frigid tundras of Canada to the desolate amber prairies of rural America. It's a story that spans many lands and locales. Displacement and social decline are strong themes page after page. It's a Dorothea Lange portrait writ large across the page -- bleak and howling gray. But embedded in the nigh nothingness of descriptive deprivation and famine, we catch sight of lyrical glimmers of poetry with soothing and sorely sought sustenance for the soul. Scattered are easily-missed, microscopically-mentioned mementos that remind readers of the beauty in disconsolate environs. Though seemingly barren and unforgiving, we must make an earnest effort to dust off the dolorous to find the shoots of green hope dormant underfoot.

It's a challenging book, dark and sublime in its devastating portrayal of chronic indigence. This is not your usual Young Adult fare that strikes all the conventional plot points and culminates in a tidy, saccharine ending. This tale expects more from readers. It prods and poses difficult questions regarding race, class and an outsider's waning place in the world. It's a book that has the courage to not opt for the easy answers and presses you to find comfort in a lack of resolution or sense of closure.

The long and short of it: *Beck* is fine reading. Stark and powerful in its craft of storytelling. It's a thick borsch of *The Grapes of Wrath*, *Angela's Ashes* and *Great Expectations*. This is a tale as steadfast, unsettling and mosaic-like as America itself. So brandish that thumb and hitchhike a ride on this rich and harrowing literary odyssey. It's a ride that's sure to be itinerant and eye-opening. •

Hermosa Beach, 1986. Although it was two years before I was born, the nostalgia of coconut sunscreen and bright neon activewear is timeless for any South Bay native -- myself included. Director Bill Kiely and writer Dave Harris bring this feeling of endless summer to the big screen this Friday in the coming-

plant in exchange for information about his stolen bike. Every experience that Minnesota goes through leads up to one moment -- meeting a man known by the locals as The Rock God (Peter Stormare). of-age comedy *Age of Summer*, which is both a story about teenage self-discovery and a love letter to the beautiful beaches of Southern California.

Doug Mills (Percy Hynes-White), who goes by the nickname Minnesota, is a teenage transplant from Chicago who finds himself in Hermosa Beach after his family was forced to relocate. His awkwardness isn't lost on his peers. His scrawny build and boyish features make him an easy target for more mature kids, who steal his rare and expensive bicycle and flaunt relationships with girls in his face. However, things begin to look up for Minnesota when he makes the cut as a junior lifeguard -- a coveted opportunity among the locals. In order to secure his position on the team, he must complete a week of boot camp put on by the intimidating Australian tough guy Tony (Diarmaid Murtagh). Here begins Minnesota's summer of learning as his perseverance is tested both psychically and mentally.

The exercises are tough, but the bonds that Minnesota begins to build with the other kids in the group, including the scene-stealing Woods (Jake Ryan) and his love interest Brooke (Charlotte Sabina), slowly give him the confidence to live authentically. Of course, his journey of self-discovery isn't without hiccups. His friendship with Woods is tested when Minnesota starts hanging out with the "cool" kids, and his moral compass drifts when he steals a marijuana

welcomed premonition.

There are many things to enjoy about *Age of Summer*, but those who are familiar with the South Bay communities and Hermosa Beach in particular may get even more from this hometown indie film than the average viewer. There are a few Easter eggs that are sure to make any local smile...like a cameo of The Beach Reporter newspaper and the missing boy "Davie Harris," whose name sounds awfully similar to the film's writer, Dave Harris. A sweet nod to childhood, *Age of Summer* is ultimately enjoyable and charming.

Inglewood Up for Most Business-Friendly City Award

Inglewood is among three finalists for the Most Business-Friendly City award for 2018 presented annually by the Los Angeles Economic Development Corporation. The cities of Inglewood, Rosemead and Whittier are finalists for the population 50,000-and-over category. The winner will be announced Nov. 8 at the Eddy Awards ceremony.

A panel of judges selected the finalists based on economic development efforts within the cities and commitment to creating good jobs, the LAEDC said in a release. Competitive tax rates and fees for businesses and economic incentives for attracting and retaining companies were also considered.

"The City of Inglewood creates a business-friendly environment because of high prioritization of the Mayor and City Council to establish an attentive, responsive and accessible

relationship with entities choosing to do business in the city," the LAEDC said in an announcement. Suspect Arrested in Inglewood Homicide Case

On Sunday, Sept. 2 at 0258 hours, a homicide occurred in the 600 Blk. of West Venice Way in Inglewood. On Wednesday, Sept. 5, Inglewood Police Homicide Detectives arrested Maurice Ledon Marshall, 41 years, of Los Angeles. Marshall was found at an Inglewood motel and was detained without incident by a combined force from the Inglewood Police Department Special Enforcement Team and the Los Angeles County DA Special Response Team.

Marshall was subsequently booked into the Inglewood City Jail charged with felony murder. Information in the case suggests the suspect killed the victim after

a domestic incident.

On Friday, Sept. 7, the case was presented to the Los Angeles County District Attorney for filing consideration. The District Attorney filed multiple felony charges against Defendant Marshall including Murder and drug offenses. His bail has been set at \$3,035,000.00 (YA098848).

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The Jewelry Source Welcomes New Staff, Celebrates a Milestone

Make customer service priority number one. Don't skimp on quality. Adapt to changing times. Never rest on your laurels. Those are some basic mantras taken to heart by Brenda Newman, who next year will celebrate the 35th anniversary of her Main Street mainstay The Jewelry Source. The El Segundo High School alum has seen many retailer neighbors come and go over the years. At one time the new kid on the block, she can now say she owns one of the longest-standing stores in Downtown El Segundo. "I can't believe how the time has passed," she said. "But I still love what I do and plan to be here for many years to come." This is true in more than one respect. Newman also lives in the unit upstairs. Downtown El Segundo is truly her stomping ground.

The Jewelry Source first opened in 1984 in a humble hallway on Grand Avenue smaller than the average-size bedroom. Newman and partner Roanne Mahony began selling beads out of the space. The two eventually settled at 337 Main and expanded their operations. The business grew and built a loyal following by providing quality merchandise, craftsmanship and personalized customer service. The formula worked. The Jewelry Source reported triple-digit growth virtually every year, even through recessionary times. It continues to thrive despite the advent of malls and Amazon.

Seeing the technological writing on the wall and recognizing the need to embrace it, Newman computer-automated the business in 2004 as a way to streamline customer communication. She added 800 square feet to build a state-of-the-art workshop and accommodate a laser welder. She adopted an interactive online diamond database as well as Counter Sketch software for 3D jewelry design, and developed an active social media presence.

Yet despite the commitment to be tech-savvy and keep up with the times, Newman emphasizes that it still comes down to the people. As such, she looks to her staff as extensions of herself. "Our main focus has always been trust and transparency and providing a quality product for a fair price to our clients," Newman said. "Excellent customer service is vital and even

though we now live in a digital world, the need for hands-on, live, one-on-one personal service is more important than ever."

almost 35 years that we are just getting started," she said. "I feel like Cher sometimes. Each day is a new challenge and we are constantly reinventing ourselves."

Asked to name a few highlights since opening the store, Newman was quick to mention a special project (in conjunction with Douglas Mortuary) restoring jewelry pulled from the victims of the Pennsylvania crash on Sept. 11, 2001. She did similar work after a 2006 air tragedy in Lexington, Kentucky. "It was so meaningful for us to be able to play a small, but important role in helping the survivors," Newman said. The Jewelry Source additionally hosts a fundraiser every other year to benefit El Segundo Auxiliary Children's Hospital Los Angeles. The most recent event took place on June 23. Newman also enjoys her diamond-hunting trips to Antwerp, Belgium. But once again, it comes down to the people. "Just interacting with customers in general is a highlight in itself, working closely with them to create that perfect custom design and seeing their smiles when everything is done," Newman said.

While the store will indeed turn 35 next year, Newman noted that it's a bit early to celebrate that particular milestone. "That's because we have to recognize 34 first," she explained. To do so, The Jewelry Source will hold a storewide blowout sale from Sept. 25 to Sept. 29. "For us, this is *the* sale. The whole store is marked -- with the exception of custom/special designs and loose diamonds -- and there will be some deep discounts. So it's best to come early and take advantage of the deals while they are still available."

Newman remains heavily involved with the local community as a Planning Commissioner during an especially active time for commercial projects. She sits on the boards of the El Segundo Education Foundation and El Segundo Chamber of Commerce (which named her Citizen of the Year for 2018), and is a member of the Downtown Beautification Committee. "It's true that El Segundo is changing, but we still offer the kind of small-town, close-knit environment that you can't find elsewhere," she said. "I can't imagine living or working anywhere else." •

OSIRIS-REx Captures First Glimpse Of Asteroid Bennu

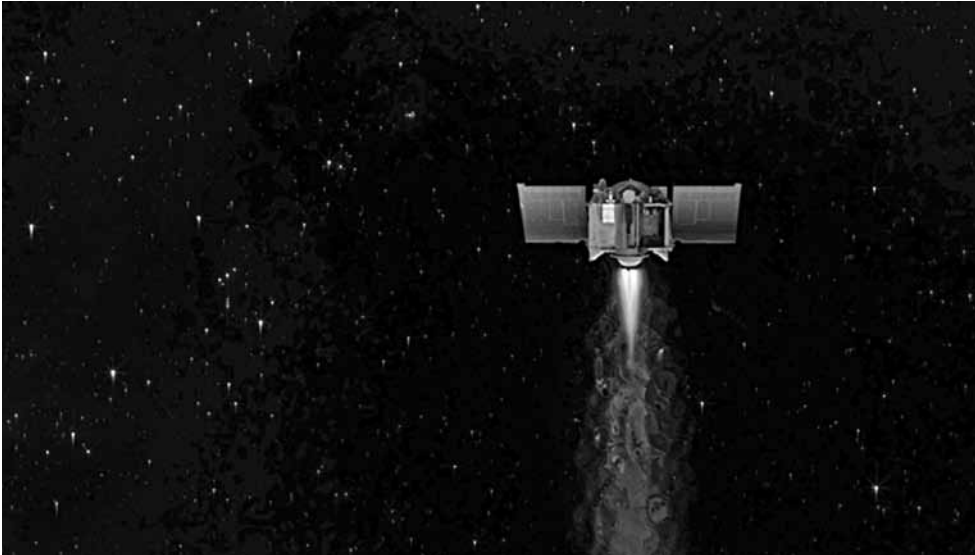

After an almost two-year journey through space, NASA’s asteroid sampling spacecraft, OSIRIS-REx, caught its first glimpse of asteroid Bennu last week and began the final approach toward its target. On Aug. 17, the spacecraft’s PolyCam camera obtained the image from a distance of 1.4 million miles. Led by the University of Arizona’s Lunar and Planetary Laboratory, OSIRIS-REx is NASA’s first mission to visit a near-Earth asteroid, survey the surface, collect a sample and deliver it safely back to Earth. The spacecraft has traveled approximately 1.1 billion miles since its Sept. 8, 2016 launch, and is scheduled to arrive at Bennu on Dec. 3. “Now that OSIRIS-REx is close enough to observe Bennu, the mission team will spend the next few months learning as much as possible about Bennu’s size, shape, surface features and surroundings before the spacecraft arrives at the asteroid,” said Dante Lauretta, OSIRIS-REx principal investigator and professor of planetary science at the UA. “After spending so long planning for this moment, I can’t wait to see what Bennu reveals to us.” To boost itself onto Bennu’s orbital plane, OSIRIS-REx performed a slingshot maneuver, or gravity assist, around Earth 11 months ago. The craft is now zipping along at

almost 32,000 mph relative to Earth, while catching up with Bennu at a little over 1,200 mph relative to the asteroid. The image was acquired using PolyCam, one of three cameras, all developed at the UA, that together comprise the OSIRIS-REx Camera Suite, OCAMS for short. As OSIRIS-REx approaches the asteroid, the spacecraft will use its science instruments to gather information about Bennu and prepare for arrival. In addition to the OCAMS camera suite, the spacecraft’s science payload includes the OTES thermal spectrometer, the

OVIRS visible and infrared spectrometer, the OLA laser altimeter and the REXIS X-ray spectrometer. During the mission’s approach phase, OSIRIS-REx will:

- Regularly observe the area around the asteroid to search for dust plumes and natural satellites, and study Bennu’s light and spectral properties
- Execute a series of four asteroid approach maneuvers, beginning on Oct. 1, slowing the spacecraft to match Bennu’s speed and trajectory

- Jettison the protective cover of the spacecraft’s sampling arm in mid-October and subsequently extend and image the arm for the first time in flight
- Use OCAMS to reveal the asteroid’s overall shape in late October and begin detecting Bennu’s surface features in mid-November.

After arrival at Bennu, the spacecraft will spend the first month performing flybys of Bennu’s north pole, equator and south pole, at distances ranging between 11.8 and 4.4 miles from the asteroid. These maneuvers will allow for the first direct measurement of Bennu’s mass, as well as close-up observations of the surface. These trajectories will also provide the mission’s navigation team with experience navigating near the asteroid. “Bennu’s low gravity provides a unique challenge for the mission,” said Rich Burns, OSIRIS-REx project manager at NASA’s Goddard Space Flight Center in Greenbelt, Maryland. “At roughly 0.3 mile in diameter, Bennu will be the smallest object that any spacecraft has ever orbited.” The spacecraft will extensively survey the asteroid before the mission team identifies two possible sample sites. Sample collection is scheduled for early July 2020, and the spacecraft will head back toward Earth before ejecting the Sample Return Capsule for landing in the Utah desert in September 2023. •
