Council Votes Unanimously To Join President Obama’s Initiative To Aid Youth

After a series of tense meetings, the first city council meeting of October began on a positive note.

Hawthorne became the fifth city in Los Angeles County to join President Barack Obama’s initiative to help young men of color and youth to achieve success during their school years and throughout life.

Mayor Pro Tem Olivia Valentine introduced a presentation by Human Resources Director David Roberts for President Obama’s ‘My Brother’s Keeper’ Initiative/Challenge.

“I could see myself in these young men,” Obama said in a video presentation about a program in Chicago that helped underprivileged men get help with school and learn life lessons. “The only difference was that I grew up in an environment that was a little bit more forgiving. I firmly believe that every child should have the same chances that I had.”

Obama signed a presidential memorandum to, “determine what we can do to help boys and young men of color. We’re committed to building on what works and we’re calling this My Brother’s Keeper,” Obama said.

“President Obama decided to get the private sector, the public sector, foundations and some great individuals and entrepreneurs and get them all involved to ensure that these young men can go on and be successful in life,” Magic Johnson, a participant in the project, said. “This is key for America, not just the black and brown community.”

On September 2014, President Obama issued a challenge to cities, towns, counties, and tribes across the country to try and become a part of the program.

The challenge encourages communities to implement a coherent cradle-to-college-to-career strategy and to improve the life outcomes of

all young people. The program also endeavors to help young people to reach their full potential, regardless of who they are, where they come from, or the circumstances to which they are born.

Nearly 200 mayors and tribal leaders along with county executives across 43 states have so far accepted the My Brother’s Keeper (MBK) Initiative.

Four cities within Los Angeles County have so far accepted the challenge and Valentine seeks to make Hawthorne the fifth to accept the challenge.

The MBK Initiative involves six key goals; to ensure all children enter school cognitively, physically, socially and emotionally ready, to ensure that all children read at grade level by 3rd grade, to ensure all youth graduate from high school, to ensure all youth complete post-secondary education or training, to ensure all youth out of school are employed, and finally to ensure all youth remain safe from violent crime.

“With these goals, there are a lot of questions, naturally,” Roberts said. “In order to initiate and help the MBK Initiative to flourish, community leaders can lay the groundwork in four steps. First would be to accept the President’s challenge which we can do under the direction of Council. Second, we need to convene a ‘Local Action Summit’ to build an MBK community which would consist of several leaders, not just from the public sector but from the private sector as well.”

“Specifically when we say community, we’re not just saying the city council step up and do their part, this is asking the city of Hawthorne to step up,” Roberts continued.

Roberts highlighted that Hawthorne Police Chief Robert Fager was eager to join the challenge and stood up at a local summit to

speak on the topic. Valentine and Mayor Chris Brown were also invited and attended the summit along with principals from Leuzinger and Hawthorne high schools.

“We’re not just talking about young men that are at risk, but we’re also speaking to pre-school children, elementary, junior high and both of the high schools,” Roberts said. “We’ll be reaching out to other teachers and constituents in the city. It is a large project, but it is one that can be successful and we can see the lives of our youth changed.”

The two other steps involve the local summit conducting a policy review and form recommendations for action and launch a plan of action.

“Right now, of our young men of color from the ages of 16 to 24, nearly 25 percent of them are what they call ‘disconnected,’” Roberts said. “What that means is they are either unemployed or not in school.”

Roberts said that the trickle-down effect of having that many people not employed would result in \$2.1 trillion of losses in the GDP from communities around the country.

Councilwoman Angie Reyes English brought up the question of what the city needs to do to participate in the program.

Roberts replied that there aren’t any finances that the city needs to provide. Instead, there is a possibility that the city could receive money to execute the program. Additionally, the city would need to provide a location for the community to meet such as the Memorial Center.

“It’s very important that we look at this as a project that we can use to help our children, especially with the achievement gap in California,” Alex Montero, a participant in the program, said. “We need to have some type of program like this in place that does not involve money. It involves participation, mentors, and tutoring so that children can succeed in life.”•

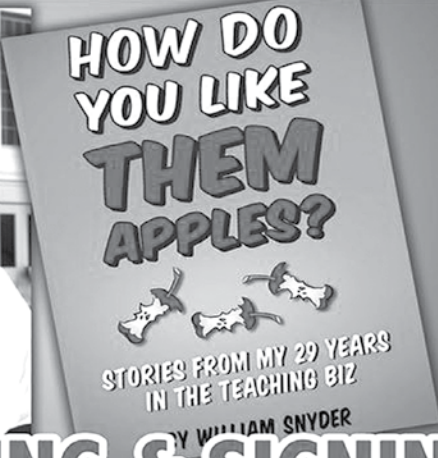

Morningside Rallies Past Peninsula in Bay Opener

Morningside High's football team is off to one of its best starts in decades at 6-0 overall and 1-0 in the Bay League after rallying for a 24-21 win over host Peninsula High last Friday in Rolling Hills Estates.

Playing without starting quarterback Jerome Rosebrough, head coach LaFayette Fletcher, who also was celebrating his birthday, went to Travion Magee. Magee had to get adjusted as a starter as he struggled at first as the Panthers, who are 2-4 overall and 0-1 in league, took a 14-0 lead early in the second quarter.

Magee finally got things going by midway in the second quarter as he finished the game, completing 17 of 34 passes for 382 yards, two touchdowns and one interception. Wide receiver Adarras Wilson scored the Monarchs' first TD on a 15-yard pass from Magee and, later in the second quarter, Jontrell Hogan ran 51 yards for a score as the Monarchs cut Peninsula's lead to 14-12.

The Panthers brought their lead back up to 21-12 when quarterback Daniel Schubert found Jack Grimes in the clear for a 77-yard touchdown play. Morningside, though, got within three points with 48 seconds before halftime when Jaylin Wright completed a 50-yard drive on a two-yard run into the end zone.

Monarchs finally took their first lead when Magee found Wright for a 47-yard TD play. Morningside sealed the game on an interception off Schubert with 2:45 left in the game. The Monarchs had a pair of key first downs to successfully run down the clock for their sixth win, already the most since their 2003 squad went 11-3 and made it to the CIF-Southern Section Northwest Division championship game before falling at Lompoc. That squad was also head coached by Fletcher, who was with Morningside's football program since the late 1980's before stepping down after the 2011 season, then returning to replace the departed Derwin Henderson, now head mentor at Long Beach Millikan.

"The Bay League is all tough," Fletcher said. "Peninsula did a real good job on us. I'm glad we pulled this game out. These kids are pretty happy to be 6-0. We had no spring football. We have no junior varsity or freshman team, so we have a lot of young players (on the varsity)."

Fletcher knows that the Bay League will be a tough road. The Monarchs will take their unbeaten record to Redondo, which is 5-1 overall and 1-0 in league after breezing past host Inglewood 37-13 last Friday at Coleman Field. Despite just a 34-player roster, the Sea Hawks

done well against a tough preseason schedule where their only loss was on September 25 against Mission Viejo (7-0 overall and 1-0 in the South Coast League), the top ranked team in the tough CIF-Southern Section West Valley Division and rated seventh in California, 35-16. Redondo is currently ranked third in the Southern Section Western Division and is led by the passing combination of quarterback Jacob Silvera and six-foot-five wide receiver Warren Jackson. The Sea Hawks' defense is led by returning first team all-Bay League end Cedric Muzick and linebacker Preston Faecher, who is another key receiver.

MURRAY LIFTS LAWNDALE OVER CULVER CITY

Lawndale High's football team had a shootout against host Culver City but it was dominating quarterback Chris Murray that helped the Cardinals top the Centaurs 48-41 in their Ocean League opener last Friday. Murray figured on six of Lawndale's seven touchdowns. He rushed for 250 yards and five TD's on 17 carries, and completed five of eight passes for 56 yards and one score. That touchdown was on a 28-yard pass to Jalen Walker.

Bryant Perkinson rushed for 168 yards and one TD on 13 carries. Perkinson, though, left in the third quarter due to cramps and an injured ankle. The Cardinals improved to 5-1 overall and 1-0 in league. Lawndale faces Santa Monica High, head coach Travis Clark's former team, at Santa Monica City College Friday at 7 p.m. The Vikings are off to their worst start since their 0-10 squad of 1992 at 0-6 after losing at Hawthorne 20-6 last Friday.

COUGARS GET FIRST WIN

After going 0-5 in non-league, Hawthorne High's football team is off to a good start after topping Santa Monica 20-6 last Friday at Hawthorne. Quarterback Marte Mapa scored a touchdown and passed for another in keying the Cougars (1-5, 1-0) to their first win of the season. Hawthorne will be seeking to begin league at 2-0 as it hosts Beverly Hills, which is 0-6 overall and 0-1 in Ocean play after a 35-6 loss to El Segundo last Friday,

Friday at 7 p.m.

LEUZINGER FALLS TO WEST

Leuzinger High's football team played host West Torrance tough before being worn down by the Warriors 41-20 in their Pioneer League opener last Friday. West surged to a 21-0 lead before the Olympians scored two TDs on passes by quarterback Malik Jackson to Andre Hunt (74 yards) and Earia Culpepper (nine yards). Adrian Galeria added a 36-yard touchdown run. He rushed for 100 yards on 14 carries.

"Coconut oil is a healthy saturated fat high in lauric, capric and caprylic acids which have antiviral and antifungal properties contributing to a healthy digestion," she says. "Coconut oil also contains medium-chain fatty acids that can aid in a healthy metabolism."

Try using coconut oil in baked goods or to replace other oils when sautéing or stir-frying. It's also a fantastic butter substitute on toast and other foods. •

NASA Orbiter Views Sites of Fiction Film’s Mars Landings

Based on press releases from NASA and the White House, provided by Bob Eklund

Images from a NASA Mars orbiter’s telescopic camera reveal details of real regions on Mars where the new Hollywood movie The Martian, places future astronaut adventures. The novel of the same name, originally self-published by Andy Weir in 2011, used actual locations on Mars for the landing sites for its “Ares 3” and “Ares 4” missions. The landing site for “Ares 3” is on a Martian plain named Acidalia Planitia. The base for the “Ares 4” mission was set inside a crater named Schiaparelli.

Views of these two sites, and other locations pertinent to the fictional story, are in the latest weekly release of images from the High Resolution Imaging Science Experiment (HiRISE) camera on NASA’s Mars Reconnaissance Orbiter. They are available online at http://uahirise.org/martian

Each observation by HiRISE covers an area of several square miles and shows details as

small as a desk. More than 39,000 of them have been taken since the Mars Reconnaissance Orbiter reached Mars in 2006. They are available online for anyone to explore, from the comfort of home, at http://hirise.lpl.arizona.edu.

all students in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) education to inspire students to pursue careers in science, technology, and innovation-driven disciplines.

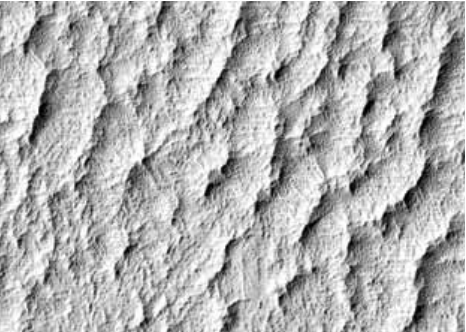

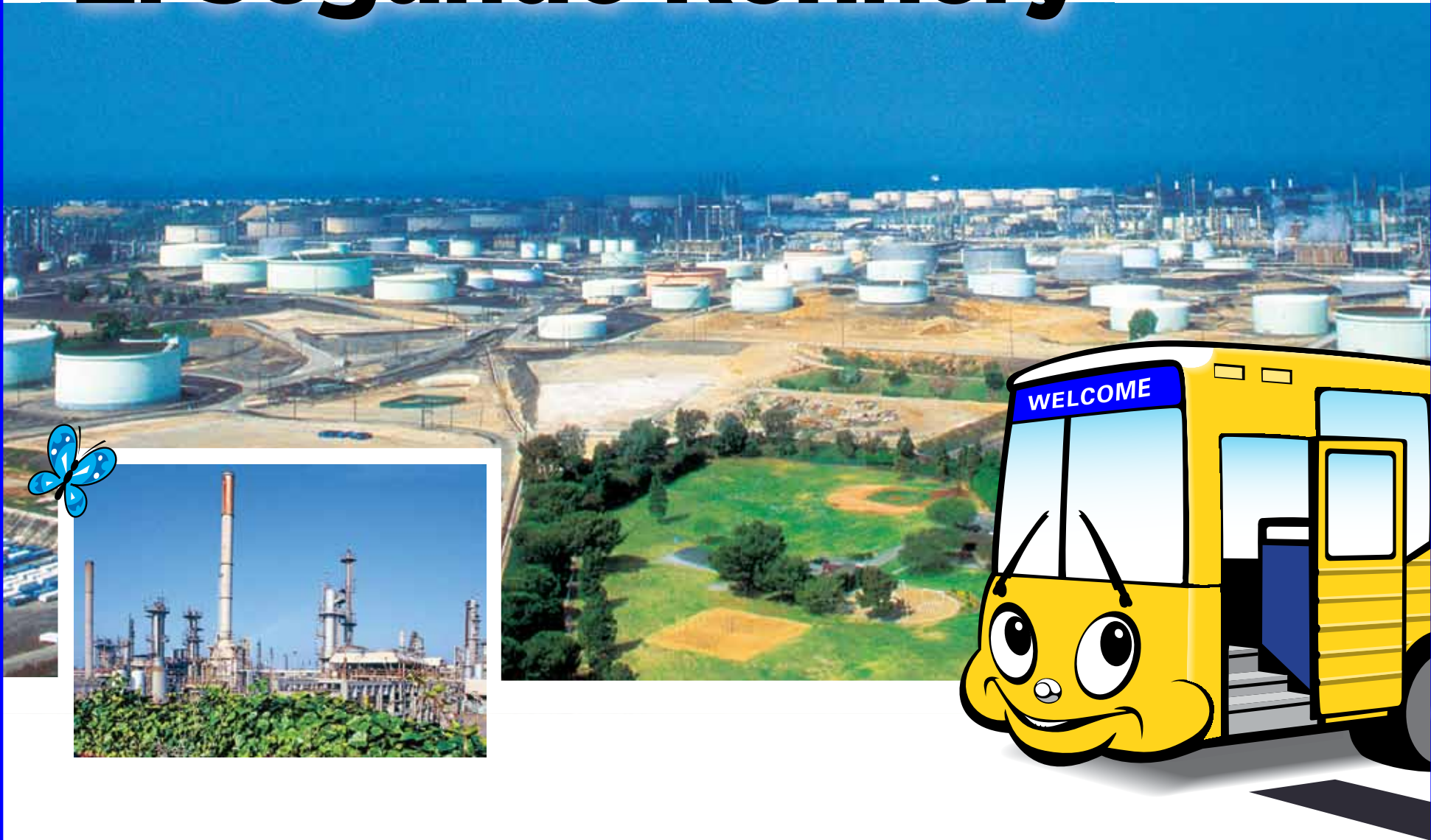
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
