No Worries: LAX Passengers Can See What They've Been Missing

The people who reunite passengers and their property at Los Angeles International Airport have a soft spot for teddy bears that miss their flights. LAX rolled out a new system on Dec. 13 that makes it easier to reunite plush buddies with their kids. Starting on National Lost and Found Day, the airport began posting online images of the 5,000 to 7,000 personal items that get left behind every month. That's enough cuddly bears, luggage, coats and electronics to fill a huge warehouse.

Running LAX's lost and found is a huge job, so the people responsible looked at the reunification process and decided there was room for improvement. That responsibility falls on the airport's police force, which now photographs the new arrivals into lost and found department. The eclectic inventory includes big and small bears, a chainsaw and surfboards.

The new system doesn't just give property away to anyone, however. It asks for some proof, especially for expensive electronic devices, like a password that authorities can use to verify ownership. A little technology is going a long way at the airport, where 230 items per day are left at TSA checkpoints, at restaurants, restrooms or passenger-waiting areas.

The browsing feature streamlines the process of filing a claim for a beloved stuffed animal or a computer, according to Barbara Yamamoto, who is Director of Guest Experience and Innovation, Los Angeles World Airports. There's a large Mickey Mouse on

the warehouse shelves. Nearby are backpacks, duffle bags and a small fleet of strollers.

The new claims system at FlyLAX.com lets anyone search through found items from the airport. Owners may file a claim immediately, however, airport officials request as much information as possible about where an item was misplaced, the date, time and a description. It helps to be able to provide unique characteristics to the property officers.

Once claims processors verify the claim and confirm a match, they will notify the owners who can pick up their property at LAX or arrange to have it shipped to them.

The most common items that wind up in the LAX Lost and Found are laptops and

tablets, belts, wallets and clothing. Someone left a big-screen television, which is at the warehouse. Another person left one shoe. A large teddy bear is patiently waiting, too.

Airport police will be on the lookout for eyeglasses, keys and identification cards that go missing. Watches and jewelry, shoes, clothing items and bicycles also make the list. It takes between three and four days for items to post to the LAX Lost and Found site. It also includes links to the airlines and rental car agencies, too. The Lost and Found Department collects and processes items found anywhere on airport property, with a few exceptions.

Film Review

1917 is a Triumph, Unlike Anything You’ve Ever Seen

Much like the young soldiers in the film, director Sam Mendes set out on a seemingly impossible mission: create a feature-length WWI film in a single take. That’s 119 minutes of real-time conflict and non-stop adrenaline rush, in one take. Not only is *1917*’s mere existence already a success, but it’s also one of the most technically proficient, emotionally compelling, and jaw-dropping goliaths of a war film that I’ve ever seen. Set in the desolate trenches behind British lines, *1917*, now playing in theaters, will undeniably rank side by side with some of the best war films of all time.

Often, the individual faces of soldiers are lost amongst a sea of thousands of uniformed troops; *1917* puts a face to two brave young

men who were willing to sacrifice all they had to save the lives of others. On April 6th, 1917, Privates Schofield (George MacKay) and Blake (Dean-Charles Chapman) are selected for a potentially deadly mission. They are to deliver a time-sensitive and life-saving message to their neighboring battalion troop of 1,600 men ordering them to cease their scheduled attack against the Germans. The attack, it turns out, would be an ambush, killing the British soldiers, including Private Blake’s older brother. Schofield and Blake only have until dawn the next morning to relay the news, and so begins the race against the clock, the Germans, and the pan’s labyrinth of battlefield death traps they’ll encounter along the way.

Technically speaking, *1917* is no doubt a cinematic feat, and the same can be said on screen with much praise belonging to George MacKay. As the lead in what is likely one of the most challenging films of any actor’s career, he carries *1917* with strength and a certain sweetness. His performance is astounding, both physically and emotionally. Dean-Charles Chapman equally commands the screen as a desperate young soldier who will do whatever it takes to help his brother. Andrew Scott, Benedict Cumberbatch, and Richard Madden also contribute their talents, rounding out a powerhouse ensemble cast.

What’s equally as impressive as the film itself is the credits, which run almost 10 minutes. The thousands of names that scroll across the screen are a sharp reminder of the amount of work, time, money, and passion that goes into making a film, especially one of this size and caliber. Highlighted in the thousands of names are frequent Mendes-collaborators, including cinematographer Richard Deakins (*Skyfall*) and composer Thomas Newman (*American Beauty*). Their contributions to *1917* make the film what it is: unforgettable.

There have been a handful of war films this year, *A Hidden Life*, *Jojo Rabbit*, and *Midway*,

all telling specific stories of life on the outskirts or battlefields of their respective wars. While powerful in their own way, nothing holds a candle to the brute force imagery that *1917* pulls off. Based on the audible “wows” from the audience and minutes-long applause as the credits rolled during my press screening, it looks like Mendes and company will be a frontrunner in the battle for Best Picture this awards season. •

A run at a CIF title in softball and track and plenty of cheers and tears will be remembered that will last for reunions to come

Little League International Tournament

The Eighth Annual Beach City Baseball Academy International Tournament was won for the seventh time in eight tries by a Little League team from Kitasuna, Japan. The team, which is made up of 12-year-olds from a Kitasuna baseball academy, demonstrated why their successful history had included three Little League World Series titles in the past seven years. Kitasuna rolled through the tournament by defeating the Torrance Samurai 12-1, the South Bay Pony from Manhattan Beach 8-0, the Torrance Tsunami 5-0 and the Beach City Red team 12-0.

El Segundo Little League's Successful Season

The 2019 El Segundo Little League closed its books and schedule by crowning champions in the AA, AAA and Major Divisions after 105 days of baseball at Brett Field. The El Segundo Little League wrapped up its sixty-fifth season with Championship Saturday that crowned the league champions in the Double-A, Triple-A and Major divisions. The day started with the Double-A game between the Lake Monsters and the Thunder, and it continued with the Cardinals facing the Dodgers in the Triple-A game and ended with the Dodgers taking on the Angels.

Before each game, the singing of our National Anthem was sung a cappella style by three of our community's finest singers ranging in age from 5 to 19 years old. The

biggest fan base of the day was the Double-A game, with over 300 people in the stands and lining the outfield fence. The large crowd didn't deter 5-year old Charlotte Groendal. She not only nailed each note but brought tears and goosebumps to an appreciative crowd with her innocence of the perfectly sung rendition.

Ryder Leach RBI single helped lead the Thunder to a 4-3 win over the Lake Monsters. The Thunder wasn't pegged to advance to the championship game because they were the fifth-seeded team out of seven teams, but they persevered.

In the Triple-A championship game, Chase Mattoon's hitting and pitching led the Cardinals to a 9-7 win over the Dodgers. There were excitement, drama and a near comeback, but the Cardinals held off the Dodgers.

The Dodgers held on for 5-3 win to capture their second Major Division title in three years. RJ Puffer is a hard-throwing right-hander with good control. He lifted his team to the title by starting and going two innings of no-hit ball while striking out four. His two-run home run in the third inning gave the Dodgers a 2-0 lead and they held on for the win.

All-Star action saw the 12s lose to Manhattan Beach in the finals of the District 36 Tournament. The 11s fell twice to West L.A. Little League 4-0 in the opening round and 11-7 in the elimination game. The 10s entered the Section 4 tournament on a roll fresh off their District 36 championship. ESLL and Torrance met for the Section 4 title with the winner advancing to the Little League Southern California championship tournament. Since Torrance was undefeated, ESLL would need to win two games to advance. El Segundo won a thrilling controversy-filled first game 7-6 but fell in the championship game 10-5.

Girl's Lacrosse

The ESHS girl's lacrosse team earned the program's first league title when they upset nationally ranked Downey on a tie-breaking

goal by Grace Bonney. Bonney recovered the ball and scored after a blocked shot by Morgan Wood. Wood had tied the game with under a minute left with her 6th goal, and Bonney scored the game-winner with seconds remaining to pull off the upset.

Seven players received all-league honors, including Wood, who was named Offensive Player of the Year for the second consecutive year.

Baseball, Softball and Swim Team All-Stars

Named to the 50th Annual South Bay All-Star team for seniors were Benny Casillas, Cameron Dornblaser, Ethan Burner, Matt Romero and Quinn Kirsten

Named to the 27th Annual South Bay All-Star Game for seniors was Adri Hebert, Audrey Butler, Kaela Little, Julia Chavez and Kaili Reitano. Reitano was the only Eagle named to the All-CIF Southern Section Division 4 team.

The All South Bay Swim Teams were announced and junior sensation Dylan Chen was named to the 50 free and 100 freestyle teams. Sophomore standout Gabriela Crother-Collago was named to the 500 freestyle team.

ESGS Has Successful Season

The El Segundo Girl's Softball season came to an end. The league capped another strong year through the participation of nearly 200 girls representing the 6u-14u age divisions. Championship Saturday was a huge success crowning three division champions. The 8u division saw the Baby Sharks upset Blue Dolphins, the division's undefeated top seed, 10-2. In the 10u division, the Thunder Crabs finished off their undefeated season with a win over the Riptides. The 12u division saw another thrilling end between the Tsunamis and the Eels. The Tsunamis held on for a 6-5 win.

In all-star action 14u division, El Segundo competed at the Western Nationals in Redding, CA. In the 12u division, El Segundo

advanced to the Western National Tournament in Medford, Oregon. Both teams did well against some of the top teams representing Hawaii, Idaho, Washington, Montana, Oregon and California.

Babe Ruth League Completed its 64th Year

The Stars, who had the best record in league play, completed their championship season by defeating the Oaks 7-2. It gave the Stars their nineteenth league title and the first for manager Kiko Martinez.

The El Segundo Babe Ruth League All-Stars competed at the State Tournament, but both the 14s and 15s were eliminated. The 13s advanced to the Pacific Southwest Tournament. It was a remarkable run for El Segundo that was close to being the ninth El Segundo Babe Ruth League all-star team to advance to a World Series. The team hit well and was led by Lucas Bonham (.480, 9 RBIs), Max Martinez (.462, 6 RBIs), Cruz Ochoa (.429, 6 RBIs), Dylan Immel and Dylan Alcala (.357). On the mound, Immel led the team with a 4-1 record, a 2.33 ERA with 13 strikeouts. Martinez ended with a 2-0 record and a 1.75 ERA with 19 strikeouts.

Five members from the 1969 Babe Ruth World Series Championship team, including Scott McGregor, Ed Carroll, Jeff Tidwell, Stewart Swiggum and Steve Curtis returned to this year's Babe Ruth World Series in Bismarck, North Dakota, to commemorate the 1969 World Series winners.

ESIHA Crowns Summer Champions

The El Segundo In-Line Hockey Association crowned champions in three divisions. The Mite, Squirt and Pee Wee Divisions played for the right to place the champion's names on a replica of the Stanley Cup. The White Knights defeated the Chiefs 9-3 in the Mite Division. In the Squirt Division, the tightest and most exciting game of the day, the

LAX isn't responsible for anything left on an airplane, at the U.S. Customs and Border Protection, or at rental car companies. Capt. Michael Scolaro who runs the Lost and Found office says that airport police make every effort to reunite owners with their property. Those efforts will be enhanced greatly by the addition of the online LAX Lost and Found, he predicted.

Computer access to the recovered property and claims-filing paperwork streamlines the process for guests and the airport police personnel. Recovered items are kept for at least 90 days before being sent to the City of Los Angeles' auction site, or donated to the Salvation Army or Goodwill. LAX maintains one of the largest and busiest airport Lost and Found departments in the country. Staff recover as many as 230 items per day from the airport's nine terminals.

Anyone who's lost something at LAX can save time by going online to search for it and file a claim. Then, visit the Lost and Found office at 5600 W. Century Blvd. Monday through Friday between 8 a.m. and 3 p.m. The station's number is (424) 646-5678.

The lost and found system is a bit tricky to navigate, so go to lawa.v2.crowdfind.com/public/#/lax/new-claim and use the pull-down menu to streamline the process. Identify what was lost at the airport, and the web site displays the items matching the description.

The FlyLAX web site recommends the following steps to take:

- Contact your airline first about lost suitcases or other items.
- Call U.S. Customs for lost passports at (310) 665-4560.
- You submit a general claim if you cannot find your item on the website. •

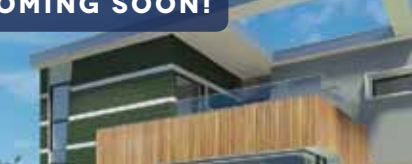

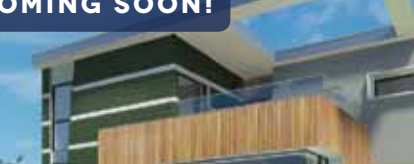

Classic Kings edged the Unknowns 6-5. In the Pee-Wee Championship, the Blueberries had too much offense for the USC Bruins. Henry Kress, who scored six goals and had two assists, led his team to a 10-3 win.

Boy's Water Polo

The El Segundo High School boy's water polo team has a storied history. With 13 CIF championships to the program's credit and countless league championships, including this season's Ocean League title, they reached the CIF Southern Section quarter-finals this season. Kalan Smith, who was named to the All-CIF team, helped lead the Eagles to a 21-8 record. In the quarter-final game, which was filled with fouls and exclusions, the Eagles gave up five goals playing shorthanded and fell 14-10 to eventual CIF champions J. Serra.

Girls Tennis

After winning an Ocean League title, the Lady Eagles advanced to the CIF Southern Section playoffs. Head coach Kirby Onaga announced he is stepping down after guiding the Eagles for the past 15 seasons. In that time the Eagles have won Ocean League and Pioneer League titles and have advanced to the CIF playoffs. This season he helped guide the girl's team to the CIF Southern Section semi-finals where they were defeated by Notre Dame.

Football

The Eagles finished 4-6 and faced seven teams that reached the CIF playoffs, including defeating South Torrance, which won a CIF title. Though the Eagles didn't make a playoff appearance, they did have seven players honored on the All-Ocean League team.

It also marked an end of a coaching era when Steve Shevlin announced he was stepping down as head coach. For the past 26 seasons, Coach Shevlin has guided the football program, the longest in school history. While coaching and mentoring an estimated 537

players, his teams established school records for consecutive CIF-Southern Section playoff appearances (7), league championships under one coach (6), quarter-final appearances (7), one semi-final (tied with Steve Newell) and Finals appearance (1).

Cross Country Teams Continued Their Success

For the first time in school history, El Segundo hosted a non-league meet and the Ocean League finals. Both the boy's and girl's teams had another successful season and were touted as the quickest in school history.

The Ocean League cross country finals were held at Rec Park. The boy's team came up two points short of capturing an Ocean League title. Arend Verfaillie finished second overall in 14:43 and in the process, shattered the 41-year-old school record. The girl's team won their sixth consecutive league title, a school record. Sophia Zago's 17:31 paced the course and set a new school record. James Matlosz pushed her teammate with a 17:39, which is good for the third all-time best in school history.

Both squads were qualified for the California CIF State Cross Country Championships. Both girls and boys teams finished in the top ten and set team time records making them the fastest teams at the state meet in school history.

Four-year legend Arend Verfaillie paced the Eagles with the second-fastest time in school history with a 16:07 effort. Sophia Zago and James Matlosz finished 1-2 for the Eagles in their last XC race together as an Eagle. Zago finished 18:46 while James Matlosz finished in a time of 18:50.

It was a great year for sports in our community that we'll be reminiscing and reliving for years to come. Now it's on to a new year and a new decade. On behalf of the El Segundo Herald here's hoping that you have a prosperous, safe and enjoyable new year. •
