El Segundo Police Reports Slight Crime Rise in 2014

After a 10-percent drop in 2013 compared to the prior year, Part 1 crimes rose slightly in El Segundo in 2014. The data showed an overall three percent increase in reported cases of the more serious offenses that include aggravated assault, rape, murder, robbery, arson, burglary, larceny theft and motor vehicle theft. Despite the uptick, the final numbers were still close to the lowest figures shown for these crimes in town over the past 45 years. Chief Mitch Tavera noted that the El Segundo Police Department has been “proactive” and implemented various tactical measures to address crime trends and make arrests before an offense occurs. That plus a regional effort to offset the continued impacts of AB 109--the prison realignment bill passed in 2011 that put the burden of supervising those sentenced for “triple-non” (non-violent, non-serious, non-sexual) offenses on counties instead of the State--has helped keep crime levels from spiking even more dramatically.

However, Tavera expressed concern about the recently passed Proposition 47 that reduced crimes such as narcotics and firearm possession as well as shoplifting to misdemeanors. “We’re seeing the effects right off the bat,” the Chief noted. “Previous felonies have been removed and turned into misdemeanors—and so we’re seeing repeat offenders who can no longer be put away in the State Penitentiary. They eventually make their way into El Segundo and neighboring cities and so we’re already experiencing a rise this year [the first two months of 2015] in burglaries, vehicle thefts and assaults. You add that to the fact that under AB109, prisoners are being released early from County jails due to overcrowding

and are under minimal supervision by parole or probation officers. They too will find their way to our city and the numbers bear this out because 92 percent of Part 1 arrestees are from outside El Segundo.” Tavera added that of those arrestees, 40 percent are on some form of government-supervised release.

At the last City Council meeting, Lieutenant Brian Evanski confirmed the trend of recent thefts and reported that officers had taken six people into custody over the previous two weeks. “The release of these prisoners [from State and County jails] is overwhelming to us now,” he said.

While the total Part 1 crimes in El Segundo increased from 581 reported incidents to 599, several categories stood out in particular as red flags. The number of burglaries rose from 143 in 2013 to 161 in 2014. Auto thefts were up from 52 to 72. Most glaringly, aggravated assaults swelled 67 percent from 18 to 30, and there were four rapes compared to none in 2013. Arson cases also doubled from six to 12, though seven of the incidents occurred during a one-week period in August at the hands of a female serial fire-setter who was arrested later that month. On the plus side,

Richmond Street Art Fair

There are some talented young Picassos in El Segundo! On the evening of February 18, families flocked into Richmond Street School (RSS) for the annual Art Fair. There was a beautiful display of art from students K-5, and it also serves as the annual fundraiser for the RSS art program, where families can buy the art of their student for \$15, beautifully matted in a black frame.

As I walked into the Art Fair Hall, I was overcome with a feeling of beauty, as colors and images greeted me. Beautifully displayed were the works of each grade. Each grade had a creative and well-executed theme. Kindergarten painted Owls in oil pastel. First

entire program would not work without parents volunteering. It is so inspiring to think that the parents understand the importance of visual arts, and all the work they do to provide it to young children.

The good news is that in 2013 the RSS School Site Council voted to use school funding to hire a consultant to develop a standards-based visual arts curriculum for 3rd-5th grades and work with those teachers and students to implement that art curriculum as well as coordinate parent art volunteers for all grades. The consultant, Dawn Von Flue, is a local artist, and former RSS parent

Urban citizens enjoy perks that they hardly stop and think about (unless fees go up), but that they would miss very much: street sweeping and garbage service, city water, lighting, police officers and firefighters. Most cities have those amenities; other perks might be city-specific and geared towards the community there. 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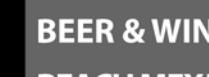

theft/larceny fell 11 percent (305 from 343) and robberies were down 21 percent (15 from 19). Also, there were again no homicides. "Seeing an increase in aggravated assaults—which includes domestic violence---as well as rape really concerns me," said Tavera. "It's also possible that we're seeing more people stepping forward and reporting such cases due to increased awareness and public education on these offenses."

Tavera confirmed that the Police Department is running a bit below its allotted number of sworn personnel (currently budgeted for 60)—adding to the challenges of deploying enough officers to combat rising crime. "We are starting to hire, but it takes quite a bit of time to go through the process of identifying, screening and ultimately bringing aboard proper personnel," he explained.

With the influx of criminals back on the streets, Tavera predicted that property crimes will continue to rise not just in El Segundo, but in every South Bay community. He urged citizens to be more cognizant and proactive to support the efforts of local law enforcement. "Call us if you see something suspicious and be sure to sign up and keep tabs on our social media such as Nixle and Facebook that provide alerts on crimes and arrests as well as important incidents such as street or lane closures." While social media remains a powerful tool for the department to disseminate information to the public, Evanski urged people not to use it to report a crime because there are no police personnel dedicated to monitoring Facebook posts on a continual basis. Citizens should instead call 9-1-1 or the public line (310-524-2200) with any information, he emphasized.

Tavera added that while El Segundo remains one of the safest communities in Southern California, residents should no longer take for granted that it's a place where you don't have to lock your doors. "Don't leave your house unattended and don't leave anything

open or unlocked," he said. "Also don't leave anything visible of value in your car or it will likely be gone. It's, 'Move it or lose it. . . .'"

The Police Department continues to rely on local residents and employees as its first line of eyes and ears. The Neighborhood Watch program (overseen by Crime Prevention Analyst Laurie Risk) is an integral part of that effort as it organizes citizens into small groups that learn crime prevention techniques and cover a set radius in and around their homes. An upcoming summer event at Library Park will promote the program with the goal of spurring more Neighborhood Watch groups to form. "Before that, we'll also hold another event to speak to the community about crime trends," Tavera said. "It's always a challenge to get out there and not just address crime, but to get in front of it. Our citizens are our best defense against crime."

Citizens can also call the Police Department to help resolve quality of life issues. The Community Lead Officer (CLO) program that re-launched in 2013 after a lengthy budget-related hiatus divides the city into two geographic areas, with the residential portion of El Segundo called West Command and the business district starting from Sepulveda known as East Command. Patrol Lieutenants Jeff Leyman (West) and Scott Doukakis (East) respond to calls that could run the gamut from complaints about noisy neighbors to stolen bicycles. Meanwhile, the always popular Coffee With a Cop allows citizens to get to know individual officers on a more casual basis. Future meet-ups will take place in the coming months in both the industrial and Downtown areas of El Segundo.

While being a bit short-handed, Tavera emphasized that his department continues to provide a tremendous level of service. "They do a great job listening and I am always impressed by how the officers respond to community needs, how much they want to help and be part of this wonderful town," he said. •

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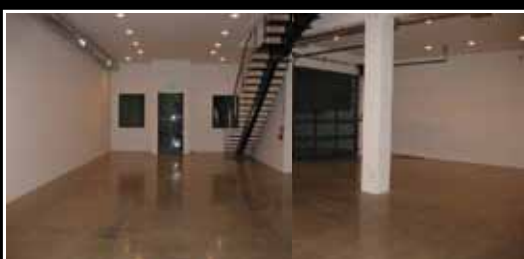

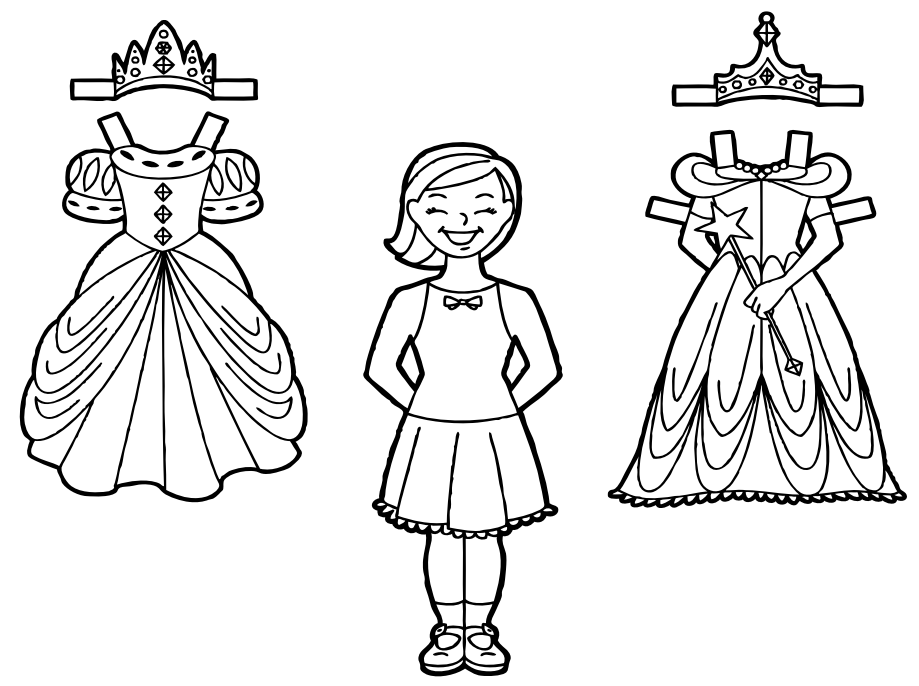

Agoura Hills parks and rec department. When she graduated, she began attending Northern Arizona University in Flagstaff, AZ. She initially was looking for a job in forestry, but realized that she didn't have the deep scientific interest or the desire to spend time in the deep woods. Her interest leaned toward what she called "learning to implement programs in a community where people get some benefit," a type of program known as municipal management.

Managing parks and recreation sites can be quite a lucrative business. For instance, people whose expertise is in the commercial side of Parks and Rec can end up with jobs at Disney parks or resorts like Sanibel Island in Florida. Petit interned at Sanibel Island, running a program that kept the children busy while parents were off at the spa, but by the end of the internship she realized that the commercial side of the business wasn't her focus either. Her interest was less in amusing day visitors as it was in building lasting programs to improve communities. She returned to Agoura Hills and worked in the Parks and Rec department as a recreation leader and camp director, and then was hired full-time as a community services coordinator.

After six years in Agoura Hills, and after having earned a masters degree in public policy and administration from Cal Lutheran, she applied for a job at El Segundo's parks and rec department and was hired as a recreation superintendent. She supervises a few direct employees, as well as a staff of part-time workers and volunteers. Her office is not on the top floor of a high-rise. It's in the middle of Rec Park, and she can look out the window and watch the fruits of her efforts: baseball players on the fields, babies taking their uncertain steps over the grass, walkers and joggers and bikers and scooter riders of all ages enjoying the paths and playground.

Petit admires the efforts that El Segundo city government has expended to offer so many services to residents. The city has augmented its budget with grants from county sales tax allocations and LA County parks loans, which help fill in fiscal gaps. In the lean years some programs have had to be cut, but the city still

invests in as many programs and events as it can. Petit oversees budget concerns, allocates resources to where they're most needed, attends city council meetings and works closely with the city management department to ensure that the department stays within budget but that the parks don't deteriorate from lack of upkeep. It's a matter of "finding the balance between wanting the parks to look good, and wanting them to be used to death." This balance involves constant juggling of each service, its budget and schedules, making sure that residents aren't disappointed or put out by lack of services.

But Petit enjoys the shifting aspects of the job, where every day is different and new challenges constantly present themselves. For instance, the Parks and Rec department is moving forward with an agreement to help fund a pool in Wiseburn school district. That project has been in the works for a long time, and will not be done for a long time more, but Petit looks forward to the day when the Plunge can be open longer to residents, when more swimming lessons can be offered. Other wish-list items for her would be replacing some of the older playground equipment to make it safer, and expanding parks programs to El Segundo Beach, since the city has jurisdiction over the sand area.

Petit is also trying to get the word out about El Segundo TV, which is based at the high school and televises city council meetings as well as producing 20-30 other shows such as "Your City, Your News" and "Business Matters." Found on AT&T on channel 99 and on Time Warner on channels 3 & 22, this local channel also has a Youtube page (ElSegundoTV) and Petit notes that it's a place to go for local programming, information about events happening in the community."

Petit loves being a Beach Cities resident, and enjoys getting out to talk to the people who use our parks system every day. "Sometimes I don't feel like it's a job," she says of the time she gets to spend at holiday events and with volunteers who love El Segundo's parks as much as she does. "It comes down to helping people and building relationships." •

Carol Pirsztuk, the CEO of the Ed! Foundation next gave a quick presentation about upcoming events, including the always popular "Guys Night Out," which will take place on Friday, March the 6th at the Beach City Baseball Academy. Activities include a poker tournament, blackjack tables, batting cages, Beach Mex tacos, and various available adult beverages.

Also on the upcoming Ed! calendar is the much-anticipated Gala that will be taking place on May 15th.

After a budget update from Chief Business Official Susan Aceves, the 95-minute meeting, with no discussion items on the agenda, rolled into the consent agenda portion of the gathering.

Items consented to included the approval of the Eagles' Nest summer school session, the special education extended year program, the approval to enter into a district-wide maintenance contract agreement to service security cameras, and the approval of a High School boys volleyball tournament slated to take place the weekend of March 13-14.

The Eagles' Nest preschool summer session will run from June 22 through July 17, and the bill-out at \$160 per week. The same time-frame is set for the District-wide special education extended year program.

The maintenance agreement with Network Integration Company Partners, Inc., is not to exceed \$15,000, and, according to District-provided notes, "the services will provide the District with onsite and/or virtual (remote access) to technical and mechanical resources that will assist in minimizing problems, improve performance and or/optimize the system."

After the acceptance of gifts, and the quick run-through of the mundane items on the action items list, the information pending action item was supposed to be addressed. The long-dormant District-owned 5.65 acreage deemed surplus, the Imperial School property, was to again be brought before the Board.

But the lengthy presentation about the history of the Imperial Street property, and possible current options, was moved to the top of the agenda.

Prior to the meeting, in an email response, Superintendent Melissa Moore had written that the Tuesday night information pending action would revolve around a presentation made by School District attorney Andreas Chialtas from the firm of Atkinson, Anddelson, Loya, Ruud and Romo .

Wrote Moore: "The Board is considering the sale of the Imperial State School property for the purpose of providing the District with an ongoing source of increased District revenue. Such revenue could be generated through the investment of a majority of the property sale proceeds. The District has been unsuccessful in their past efforts to obtain a ground lease and has expended resources on the 5.65 acre property which was deemed surplus many years ago."

"The item is placed on the information pending action in order to allow any interested parties to weigh-in with the Board on this issue. A recommendation in the form of an action item would be brought to the Board for vote on Tuesday, March 10. Should the Board choose to approve the item at that time, the timeline would begin regarding the "next steps."

"The Board is committed to seeking a resolution that results in an ongoing revenue stream."

Options that were presented by Chialtas seemed to favor a straight sale of the property, as opposed to the acreage lease options that had been bandied about and presented to the Board, at a not insignificant expense, for the past half-decade.

According to Chialtas' presentation, the District is more than \$750,000 in the hole with the non-movement on the surplus property.

Moore then quickly detailed the District's informational calendar, highlighted by the March 21st annual "Run for Education," heading towards the week-long Spring break that begins in late March.

Board reports followed, with Moore issuing her Superintendent's report, before Board President Jeanie Nishime closed the meeting.

The next regularly-scheduled Board meeting is slated for March 10. •
