Scott Houston Spills About Plans for Desalination

Clean water that keeps people, parks and pets hydrated is a convenience that's easy to take for granted. Scott Houston knows better, though. He's coming off a yearlong term as president of the West Basin Board of Directors, which is responsible for keeping water flowing to about 1 million customers. Not everyone needs the same type of water, so the district makes 40 million gallons and five brands of the recycled stuff daily.

There are residential customers, business parks, parks, light industries and manufacturers at the end of the pipelines. The rainstorms that moved through the South Bay last week after almost no precipitation since January brought much-needed rain. But, the snowpack in the high Sierras is what water officials, including Houston, watch closely. California lacks storage when it does rain, but snowpack is natural storage that keeps the rivers and streams flowing year-round in good years. That often gets overlooked down in the low-lying urban areas.

The representative for El Segundo, Del Aire, Wiseburn and Lennox favors a proposed desalination plant along the coast in El Segundo. The idea isn't a new one. Removing salt from ocean water has been discussed at the South Bay's Metropolitan Water District for nearly as long as West Basin has been around. The district's elected leaders kicked around the idea of purifying the ocean water off the coast back in 1947, according to Houston. Push came to shove nearly 70 years later, as the population grew and competition grew for the state water from

the Colorado River and Northern California. The environmental-review process to build a desalination plant in the district boundaries was completed in 2019, and Houston voted to accept it.

The issue came up before the board in November, when four members voted to approve the EIR and to move forward on the permitting and regulatory steps - which are considerable. Carol Kwan, who represents the beach cities and Torrance, cast the lone no vote. Houston calls the issue his toughest call yet. The water district, which acts as a wholesaler to cities and areas of the county, buys imported state water and recycles 40 million gallons per day at its El Segundo plant. Pumping the groundwater in the basin is not an option. The rights to that water

belong to El Segundo, but not to West Basin.

"I believe it is imperative that we explore every water supply option we have in order to make an informed decision that makes sense for our ratepayers in the communities we serve," Houston said. His district stretches from El Segundo to Malibu and includes Marina del Rey, Culver City and West Hollywood. The assumption is that the population will continue to grow. So will the competition for state water pulled from the Colorado River and stored in the annual snowpack in the Sierra Nevadas.

The desalination plant doesn't have a start date for construction. The project will need to secure permits to build and operate at the site between El Segundo and El Porto. The costs

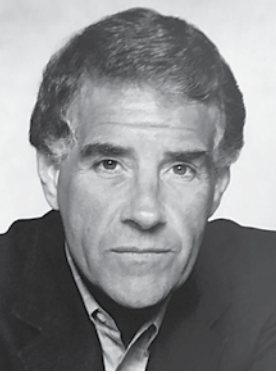
In Memoriam

Dr. Paul De Sena, professor of counselor education for 53 years and a member of the Faculty Senate at Loyola Marymount University, died on March 14, 2020 at the age of 83. He was born in Waterbury, Connecticut on August 31, 1936.

The renown of LMU School of Education’s counseling program was built on the transformative work of Professor De Sena. He began his impactful career at LMU in 1966 as an assistant professor of counselor education after serving as a professor and administrator at John Carroll University, Pennsylvania State University, Ohio University, and the Berlin Connecticut School District. He was promoted to associate professor in 1969, then professor in 1976. He served as chair of the Department of Education, as coordinator of LMU’s Counselor Education Program, and co-ordinator of the School Psychology Program.

Professor De Sena was an example of civic engagement. He served as a consulting school psychologist for the El Segundo School District from 1979-92; was a consultant to the state Department of Education Adult School Counseling Academy; and since 1992 was a consultant for the Wiseburn School District in El Segundo.

He was highly respected in his field and a distinguished scholar. Professor De Sena was a nationally Certified School Psychologist and credentialed school counselor and K-12 teacher; he was the president of the California Association for Counselor Educators and Supervisors; he was former president of the California Association for Specialists



in Group Work; and he served on the board for the California Coalition for Counselor Licensure, which was successful in bringing licensure for professional counselors to California in 2009. He served on the executive council and the educational foundation board of the California Counseling Association and was on the governing board of the California Association of School Counselors.

Professor De Sena received the LMU Rains Award for Excellence in Service in 2014, was presented the H.B. McDaniel Award by the California Association for Counseling and Development, and a year later he was given the Clarion Modell Distinguished Service Award. He was the first person to win both awards. He was also awarded the California Adult School Counselors Association Service Award, the Outstanding Mentorship Award by the Western Association for Counselor Educators and Supervisors, and the Outstanding Service Award by the California Association for Counseling and Development.

In his long professional career, Dr. De Sena touched many lives and made a lasting impression on everyone who entered his circle of influence. He was a great presenter and a wonderful teacher, loved by generations of students. Paul De Sena will be missed by many. Paul De Sena was survived by his wife Margarita De Sena, her daughters Flora and Elina, brother Philip De Sena, sister Marie Tutolo and her husband Leonard, many nieces and nephews. A celebration of Professor De Sena’s life will be held at a later date. •



Film Review

Stream Netflix’s Musical Short *Anima*, a Dream For These Modern Times

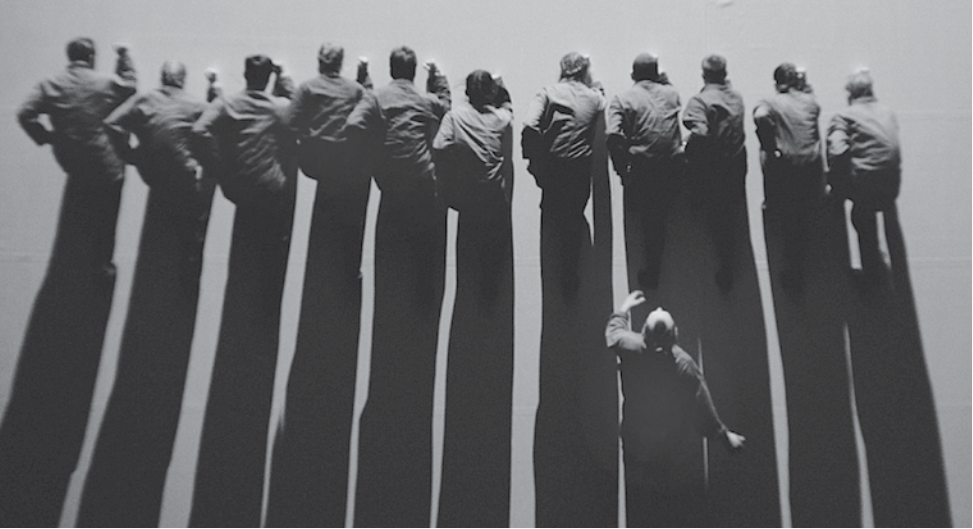

While movie theaters remain closed through this ongoing period of social-distancing, we can look to the abundance of films that are available to watch across all streaming platforms (though do support your local cinema through the purchase of gift cards, if you can).

For this week’s review, I want to take the opportunity to recommend something that is currently available to stream, yet is something that you may have yet to see or even have added to your queue. But at only fifteen minutes long (did I mention that it’s a short?), you should feel comforted to know that you won’t

through a mechanized, spiritless life. The amazing choreography (by Damien Jalet) sees a host of dancers envelope Yorke throughout the piece (with Yorke evoking Buster Keaton-like comedy), and blend movements that are a battle between the soulessly dazed and the spiritually awakened.

I don’t intend nor wish to hide the fact that I am also a fan of both Yorke and *Anima*’s filmmaker, Paul Thomas Anderson (if you need a further recommendation of a film to see, make sure you’ve seen the rest of Anderson’s films including *The Master* and *Phantom Thread*). Beyond the film’s other artistic credits (with

be outside of your comfort zone for too long. Now streaming on Netflix, *Anima* is a musical short film from Radiohead lead singer Thom Yorke and filmmaker Paul Thoms Anderson. Where one could liken *Anima* to an extended music video, *Anima* really does operate as a short film. Ambitiously abstract and conceptual in nature (the film touts itself as a “mind-bending visual piece”), *Anima* is a loosely narrative story of an unnamed man (Yorke) who, amidst the dream-inducing drudgery of working-class life, finds a woman (Dajana Roncione) only to lose her, and attempts to find her again through obstacles and oppressive forces.

I’m not exactly sure why *Anima* feels like the right film to recommend this week, given the state of everything right now. But as I think through it more, I find that a few things leap out at me since I’ve recently watched it than when it first started streaming last year (I first saw it at an advanced screening at an IMAX theater). Quite simply, the thematic undertones of *Anima* dramatize how, through the society we’ve created and actively participate in, that we have grown to sleepwalk

of construction will be passed along to the ratepayers, which is another reason for some opposition to adding desalination to the local freshwater mix. Residential and commercial water rates would need to increase - and rate increases are always unpopular.

Five conditions would need to be met for the desalination plant to become a reality at the El Segundo site. Permits need to be issued by agencies and cities, including El Segundo, the California Coastal Commission, the State Lands Commission, California Department of Fish and Wildlife, and the Los Angeles County Regional Water Quality Control Board. Then, cost estimates would need to be verified, and a financial plan for the desalination project be created and approved by the board. Then, a cost-benefit analysis would be done to give decision-makers and the public an accurate picture of the pros and cons of adding to the freshwater supply with purified saltwater. Lastly, the project design and construction contracts and expectations would need to be drawn up and approved.

Finding an adequate supply of water for a million customers takes flexibility, or as Houston calls it “a balanced approach” to water-supply management. Through their activities, from recycling to conservation and water-bottle refilling stations, West Basin’s elected leaders and their general manager are trying to reduce dependence on state water supplies. There is a natural supply below grounds, but that must be managed carefully, too.

Overpumping the aquifer, especially in periods of drought and below-average rainfall, allows seawater to intrude. Though West Basin holds no pumping rights, some of the recycled water it makes daily (called designer waters) is used to hold back seawater intrusion in the West Coast Groundwater Basin. The clay-lined natural storage is 160 square miles and is found below the surface from Inglewood to Santa Monica.

For those unfamiliar with “designer water,” it’s not bottled and sold in stores. “Designer” refers to the types of treatment that recaptured water undergoes to become clean and usable again. Injection back into the aquifer is one destination. Refinery cooling towers and boiler fees are another. The recycling facility churns out irrigation water that moves through purple-colored pipes that service parks, golf courses and business parks.

When talking about clean water for urban and industry, the term acre-foot is the standard measure that officials use. One acre-foot equals nearly 326,000 gallons. Today, that amount serves three typical Southern California households for one year. Water jargon is fascinating, and Houston is a fountain of information about water storage, flow rates, and even what makes tap water taste funny. Hint: it’s not the water itself.

While admitting to being a big fan of drinking tap water, he’s heard the complaints from

the people at the end of the line that water from the tap isn’t to their liking. Houston says that the pipes running through a city or community are responsible for that taste, which makes both young and old avoid taking a sip from the tap. Older homes and apartment buildings will experience the same taste, he says. The drinking water - even if it has some taste issues - is safe and regularly tested to meet state requirements.

A rumor was circulating on social media right before the new year that Californians were about to get slammed with draconian water restrictions for themselves and their households. A household would be limited to 55 gallons of water - not enough to take a shower and wash a load of laundry on the same day. That caused some panic and anger among Californians who wondered why they just heard about it one week before the daily caps took effect. To which Houston says, ignore what you may have read.

Those social-media posts are more fiction than fact. No person or homeowner will be subjected to an indoor water-efficiency standard of a mere 55 gallons per person, per day. The burden of reducing consumption statewide is on water districts and retailers, like West Basin MWD, which sells imported and recycled water to 17 cities along the coast.

“The confusion is based on the passage of legislation SB 606 and AB 1668 in 2018, which updated California’s previous water use efficiency laws,” Houston explained. Lawmakers did adopt long-term standards aimed at making the water supply go further. The targets and how to reach them are being decided, ahead of a 2022 deadline.

No individual or property owner will be penalized for exceeding 55 gallons a day, though, according to Houston. State officials expect the municipal water districts and agencies to make the reductions across their entire service areas. While it’s a bit confusing to the average consumer how the new targets can be accomplished without strict water-rationing, Houston says the cringe-worthy daily water limit is realistic.

If customers adopt new water-saving technology and install higher-efficiency devices throughout their homes, indoor water use could fall by as much as 35 percent. Admittedly a best-case scenario, conservation-conscious individuals and couples could get by on 40 gallons a day, according to research by the Water Education Foundation. “Substantial indoor and outdoor conservation potential exists in the single-family sector,” the group believes.

El Segundo consumers used 85 gallons daily in September, and slightly less in December when the consumption rate dipped to 78 gallons per person, according to urban data from the Pacific Institute. Inglewood customers averaged 97 gallons in the summer and 80 during December when the weather turned cool and wet. •

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The California Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) has issued an emergency permit to Raytheon for onsite treatment of expired chemicals. The items to be treated are six 1-pint containers Divinyl Benzene / Polystyrene. The items are stored at Raytheon located at 2000 E. El Segundo Blvd, El Segundo, CA 90245.

Clean Harbors Environmental Services has been contracted to conduct this treatment. The chemical is potentially reactive and unsafe for transport in its present state. The treatment involves the addition of liquid solution to the container to stabilize the chemical and will take place in an exclusion zone near the storage location. Once the chemical is treated, it will be transported offsite for proper management. DTSC has determined that the chemical poses an imminent and substantial endangerment to human health and the environment if not properly managed. Therefore, an emergency permit should be issued. This Emergency Permit is effective from January 23, 2020 through March 24, 2020. The Emergency Permit includes measures to minimize any adverse impact to the community and the environment.

CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT (CEQA): DTSC has determined that the issuance of this permit is exempt from the requirements of CEQA and has filed a Notice of Exemption (NOE) with the State Clearinghouse.
