Council Approval for Lakers Facility a Slam Dunk

During Tuesday night's meeting, the entire El Segundo City Council expressed its support for the Los Angeles Lakers' plan to build a new corporate headquarters and training complex at Campus El Segundo. The two-story, roughly 120,000-square foot facility at 710 N. Nash Street will also include an exhibition venue for the Los Angeles D-Fenders NBA Development League team.

Several members from the Lakers' executive team spoke on Tuesday, including Chief Operating Officer Tim Harris who outlined the basketball franchise's vision for its new home. He explained that the Lakers were "nomadic" prior to 1999 in that they practiced wherever they could arrange court time. Realizing the need for a stable practice space, the team moved into HealthSouth (now Toyota Sports Center) at 555 N. Nash in 2000. While he described the shared venue as perfect at that time, Harris noted that "what has become acceptable for a training facility has changed." In addition to the ability to provide improved amenities for players, the Lakers also see the new facility as a "second home" vital for branding and recruiting. "We looked in one place—the City of El Segundo," Harris said of the team's search for its own building. The Lakers hope to complete the project by the spring of 2017.

Project architect Jim Renne (Rossetti) displayed renderings of both the exterior and interior designs for the multi-functional facility. Among the features will be separate entries for the players/staff and the public

attending D-Fenders games, signage integrated into the façade of the building, plus video boards displaying game highlights and Laker-related information. Inside amenities will include a lobby, locker rooms, lounge, practice court, courtyard and even a barber.

The project necessitates several Council approvals (to be finalized in two weeks)—including a revision of the uses allowed under the Corporate Campus Specific Plan, allowances for the new type of signage (with limitations built in on the degree of illumination and number of sponsors visible to the public at any one time), and parking considerations. The Lakers assured City staff that the project's 276 parking spots will be more than ample and that daytime demand (212 spaces based on current usage) will not overlap evening/weekend parking (209 spaces).

Meanwhile, the facility will also be scaled down from the most recently approved "2013 Revised Project" footprint for the Corporate Campus. With 133,000 square feet of combined office, athletic training facilities and the D-Fenders venue, the Lakers' project is 81,340 square feet smaller than what is allowed. Additionally, the estimated 1,260 car trips will fall 1,083 below the maximum permitted 2,343. Staff indicated that the project will pose no new or additional impacts.

Harris also emphasized that the Lakers will continue to support the community and mentioned the team's pledges to commit \$250,000 to El Segundo's new aquatic facility construction and to assist William Yarroll in the Special Olympics Games Host City effort.

Councilmember Marie Fellhauer lauded the project's design as well as the positive economic benefits, saying that "it will only add to the character of El Segundo." Councilmember Dave Atkinson noted that the venue will make El Segundo "more of a destination city." Mayor Suzanne Fuentes praised the Lakers, calling them a "class organization." She added that she hoped the team would consider including a retail component at the facility in the future.

Also on Tuesday, the Council agreed to amend the City's informal bidding procedures for certain public projects—especially smaller ones that need attention but don't qualify as emergencies—to allow work to get done more quickly than what is now possible under the code. With the change (allowed by the State), the City Manager will now have the authority to approve projects of up to \$45,000—rather than the previous \$10,000 limit—without requiring cumbersome formal bidding and Council approval. To illustrate the value of the alternate bidding procedure, Public Works Director Stephanie Katsouleas used the example of an elevator repair at the Joslyn Center—an \$8,000, one-day job that ultimately took several months to complete because of requirements to draft the specifications, advertise and bid out the project, approve award of the contract, execute the contract, and accept the project as complete. Under the new system, the same job would only take a couple of weeks from start to finish, thereby reducing staff time

and allowing more flexibility. Katsouleas noted that 11 of 15 capital projects in 2014 would have fallen under the alternate bidding procedure. She also cited examples of project types that could qualify—including repairs to curbs and gutters, ADA ramps, lighting, HVAC, roofs, windows, valves, plumbing and more. “It allows staff to complete projects in a fraction of the time...and better serves

“I don’t think \$30,000 buys us much,” she said, adding that it is very constraining for projects to take months and months.

Though requiring Council approval, projects between \$45,000 and \$175,000 will allow informal bidding procedures in which the City can utilize a predetermined list of qualified vendors (rather than be forced to reach out to the entire market). Projects

the public,” she said.

While ultimately approving the move, Mayor Pro Tem Carl Jacobson expressed his preference to cap the City Manager’s approval authority at \$25,000 out of concern for public transparency. Fellhauer pointed out that the projects in question were already approved and really didn’t need to go back to the Council. Fuentes indicated that she was comfortable with the \$45,000 threshold.

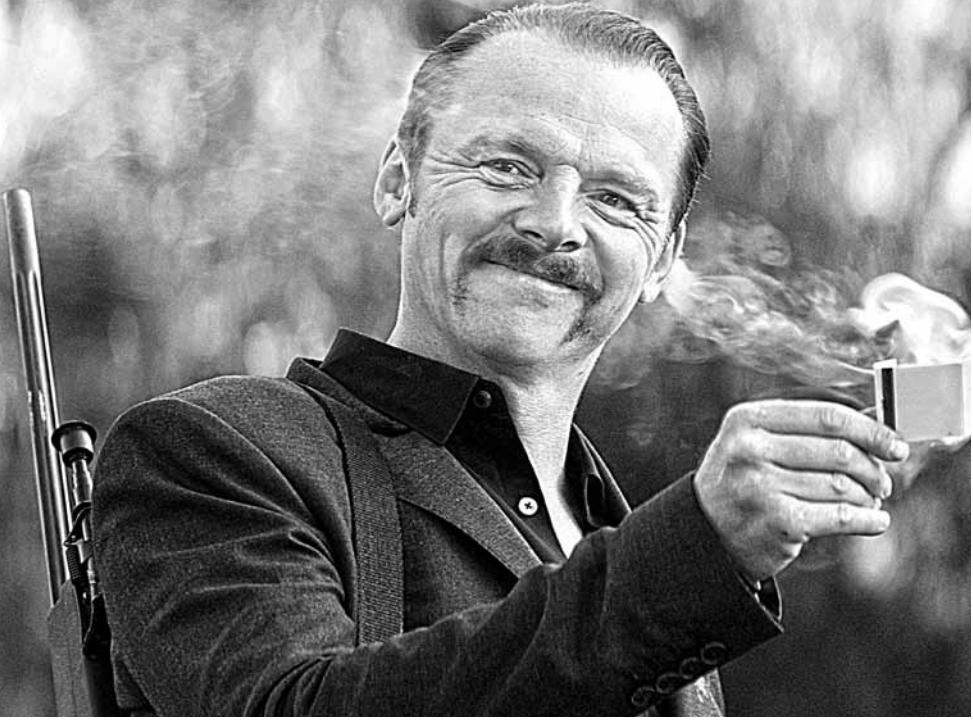
Film Review

Kill Me Three Times is a Humorous,
Self-Referential Thrill Ride

Kriv Stender's *Kill Me Three Times* is a very interesting take on the classic botched murder storyline. Screenwriter James McFarland infuses this thriller with a sense of self-referential farce, with Simon Pegg's (*Shaun of the Dead*) British wit-fueled performance

could win a beauty contest, but far more impressive and important is that both of them gave powerful and unique performances as displeased and unfaithful romantic partners. In fact, both Palmer's and Bragga's characters are so strong that they help to make clear a distinct choice in a reversal of traditional

as the cherry on top. However – don't be fooled by this casting choice. While Pegg strings a comedic thread through most of his films, *Kill Me Three Times* is an exciting "who's gonna get it next?" type of film, and his comedy serves well as a way of greasing the wheels for this action flick to maintain the audience's focus.

Another aspect that helps keep this focus is the use of colored lighting through neon lights, shades, and other movie magic cheats for source light. Stender's fellow Australian cinematographer Geoffrey Simpson takes a cue from classic '70s Grindhouse films to create a postmodern aesthetic that reminds viewers that they are watching a movie, not real life. It is a simple concept, but in order for the violence not to be taken as truly grotesque, they must remember this truth: Simpson's use of his on-screen stylizations is key in allowing the audience to accept the hijinks of murder, maybe even with a laugh or two.

Simpson also takes advantage of a beautiful Australian backdrop to set the story. The gorgeous isolated island setting is established early in the film, however – the catch is that, besides the people involved in murder (this includes being a killer, victim or extortionist), there seems to be no one else around. Who knew that such ugly crimes and motivations would look so great with a sunny beach paradise behind it?

Speaking of looking good, the cast does just that. Both Teresa Palmer and Alice Bragga

gender roles seen in most action flick shoot-em-up's, which is made even more explicit by the very emotionally erratic and sensitive performances of Sullivan Stapleton and Callan Murphy. This gender reversal makes for a much more interesting action story than the traditional male-driven noir stories.

Stenders addresses his playing with traditional character roles to be a direct distinction of the film's postmodern style. *Kill Me Three Times* plays upon peoples' past film experiences by referencing classic film styles and characters, such as the crooked tough cop and the femme fatale. While the film also adds new dynamics to the traditional nihilistic tale of murders gone wrong, and by choosing a plot template that is so deeply rooted in chance, its goal of creating a new version seems reachable.

However, while the film has style and entertainment value, it lacks enough of a signifier to really stick to an audience's palate for very long. There aren't any overly-memorable action moments or trademark lines or catchphrases that fuels the film here. Nor are there any moments of outrageous comedy or snappy one-liners to steal and use on your friends later. It's still fun to watch though, and while it remains a very technically proficient film, it most likely won't be on people's top ten list in a month or so. But for a film whose influences are so entertaining, perhaps the film is doing just what it was meant to do after all. •

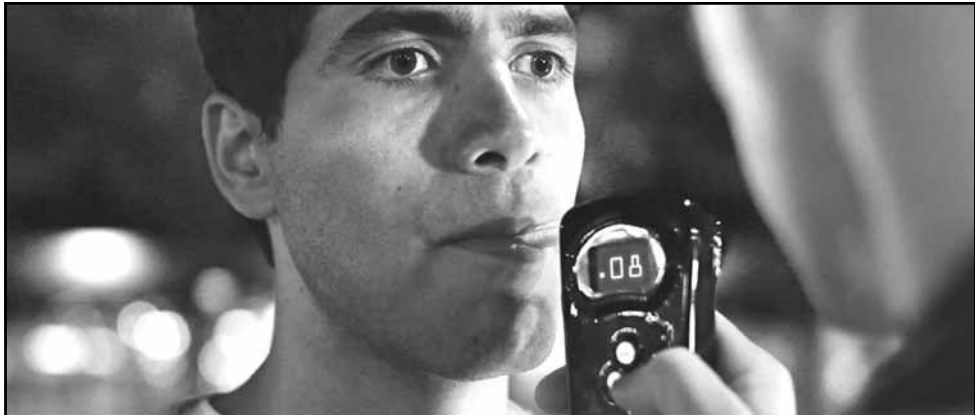

Historic Call to Action Not Over Yet

Tuesday, March 31 was one of our lesser-celebrated holidays; it was Cesar Chavez Day. I still remember the day that he died. My mom and I were driving home, she had just picked my up from school, and we were listening to the radio. It's hard to recall what was being played that April afternoon in 1993 on KLOVE, but what is clear is that we were crossing over the railroad tracks on Eucalyptus and Florence Avenue when the music stopped and the breaking news was broadcast. At the time, I knew what the average middle-school kid might know about the farm worker turned civil rights leader: he led boycotts, had support from Robert Kennedy and wanted better wages, working conditions and the right to unionize for farm workers.

As a teen that meant little to me but by the time high school ended, his struggle made sense; it was noble and a worthy endeavor for him to take. Sadly, after I graduated high school, much like today, Chavez's fight is far from over. The abuse of workers in the fields continues and the working conditions are still horrific. Many field workers today are underpaid, overworked, exposed to cancerous chemicals and in many cases the women are victims of sexual assault. And no, these aren't isolated incidents as legitimate news organizations such as NPR have reported and documented said abuse. It is worth noting that there are still groups of people dedicated to improving the working

and living conditions for farm workers, but the challenges are great and the fight far from over.

I didn't grow up in a family of farmworkers. The immigrants in my family worked in the service industry and in construction; however, they knew what it was like to work long and hard hours for not the best pay. As a result, they always stood in solidarity for those less fortunate than us. So when Chavez died, I knew it was a big loss but didn't grasp the significance of his death. Today, thanks to the humanity in my parents, I can see beyond Chavez's death and appreciate the goals he had in life. Furthermore, his death is a reminder to me that the fight he took on in the 1960s and 1970s is still relevant today.

It's common practice to honor people who made an impact on society by designating a day to pay tribute. If we want to honor the man's legacy, we should apply at least a fraction of Chavez's humanity to those around us that are in a world of hurt and struggle and stand up for them. If we see an injustice, no matter how small, we should act to correct it. We don't have to start a nationwide boycott, nor do we have to take down any corporate entity to make a difference. Let's just take the time to care for our neighbors much like Chavez did decades ago. Chavez made a choice, as did the thousands of people who supported him, and that decision was to help others. What better way to honor the human spirit than by emulating such kindness? •



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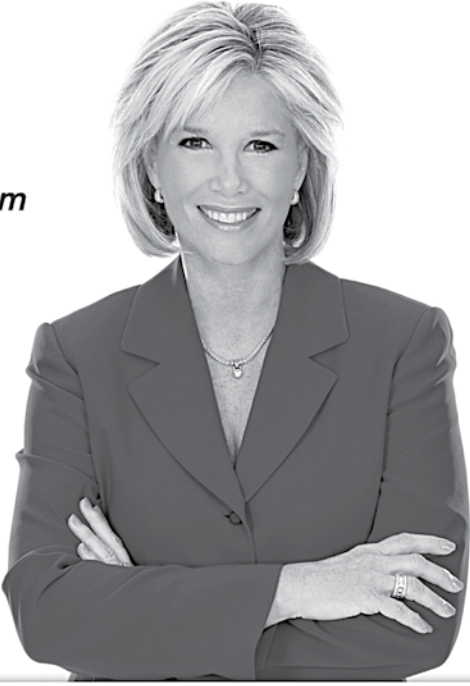

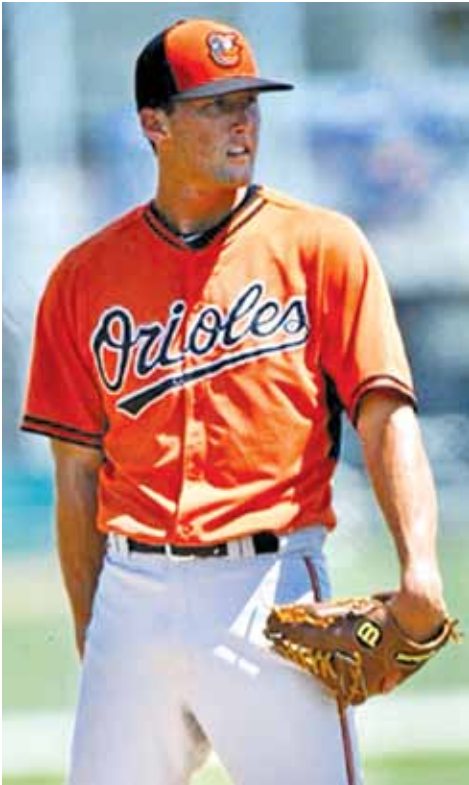

As an example, Fuentes pointed out that families living at Fort McArthur are located within LA Unified and have to "jump through hoops" to get their kids permitted to attend a different district. "Supporting these families by affording them with education choices for their children must be a top priority if we are to retain this talent as well as the high quality caliber of the bases here," the letter from AB 306 originator Assemblymember David Hadley reads. "In particular, Los Angeles Air Force Base continues to be plagued by this education choice (or sometimes seen as a lack thereof) issue that faces the military members who work at the Base." While the bill would provide military families flexibility, the districts would still have veto power to decline a given student's enrollment.

Presentations on Tuesday included proclamations for April 29, 2015 as Denim Day to encourage people to wear jeans in order to draw attention to the fact that rape and sexual assault are inexcusable and remain serious issues in our society; and April 2015 as "DMV/Donate Life California Month" to encourage Californians to check "yes" and approve donation of their organs and tissues when applying for or renewing their driver's licenses. Regarding the latter, Donate Life Ambassador Rachel Greenberg told the Council that her late husband (who died unexpectedly from a brain hemorrhage) had signed up with the DMV as a donor and ultimately helped 89 people between the ages of 19 and 92. The youngest received

a portion of Mr. Greenberg's spine and can now walk. The oldest received his corneas and now has restored vision.

The Council also recognized the El Segundo AYSO Girls U12 All Star Team that captured the Western States championship in Lake Forrest on March 22 with a 7-2 victory. Each of the team members was present along with head coach Kate O'Riley and assistant coach Rick Mack. The players included Leah Abitante, Abigail Agnew, Ashley Alvarado, Sarah Bedoyan, Lidia Cicchini, Marlee Johson, Elizabeth Jade Kapoor, Peyton Lubs, Marcela Martinez, Victoria Mora, Madelyn O'Riley and Trinity Parascandola (who also led the Pledge of Allegiance to kick off the meeting).

In a presentation, Senior Librarian Julie Todd described activities planned for National Library Week from April 12-18 with the theme "Unlimited Possibilities @Your Library." She reported that posters will be displayed in local business windows along Main Street to raise awareness. Todd also thanked Chevron for a \$5,000 donation to fund books for the Adult Literacy Program and provide shelving in an unused walk-in closet to create a storytime storage area. Finally, she asked residents to put June 7 on their calendars for the annual Author Fair that will incorporate a food theme this year. •
