El Segundo Architect Frank Glynn Still Sailing Forward

Those of a certain age may remember the musician Christopher Cross and his top-selling vinyl ditty single, *Sailing*, which rose to the top of the music charts, inexplicably, more than 40 years ago? Well, I am of that "certain age," and remember immediately switching the dial on my little transistor radio when the Cross tune was played, ad nauseum, by KHJ or some other commercial-filled Los Angeles AM radio station.

"Sailing takes me away to where I've always heard it could be just a dream and the wind to carry me. And soon I will be free," were some of the, at least to me, cheesy lyrics.

While the tune *"Sailing"* may not have been my cup of tea---back then, I was probably favoring the obviously superior lyrics of Aerosmith or KISS, --- it turns out that the competitive sport of sailing, and the friends and connections made, ended up guiding El Segundo architect Frank Glynn, originally from Dublin, Ireland, to the friendly confines of El Segundo.

Glynn, the design principal and founder of SAGA Architecture, has blueprinted office, residential, and retail buildings in El Segundo and other environs for more than three decades. One Glynn design, a Bel Air mansion, sold for a cool \$17-or-so million.

Shari Wilson is trusting Glynn to build her new residence in town. After talking to multiple people, Wilson said that she selected Glynn to be her architect because he was "honoring the things that we wanted, was not pushy at all...he was really easy to talk to and got our vision. He wanted to make our vision come to life. I could not have asked for a better architect; he has nailed it for us."

But the El Segundo resident is much more than a successful architect. He gives back to the community; he has served as

the El Segundo Rotary Club president, is currently the chairperson of the El Segundo Education Foundation (Ed!), and is also in his second stint as a member of the school district's Facilities Advisory Committee.

El Segundo Unified School District (ESUSD) Superintendent Melissa Moore values Glynn's contributions to the community. She emailed that "Glynn is not only a talented architect, but a community leader, serving as Chair of the Education Foundation and serving on the Facility Advisory Committee. He is committed to making a difference in the lives of ESUSD students by leveraging his expertise as a leader and volunteer. His contributions," she continued, "are thoughtful,

Bee Question Lands Before Council

A proposal to take garden-variety honey bees off the nuisance list created some buzz at Tuesday’s City Council meeting. After a back-and-forth discussion about relaxing the current prohibition on non-commercial beekeeping in El Segundo backyards, the council members remained open to the idea.

Keeping beehives on properties zoned R-1 isn’t currently allowed in El Segundo, so the council would need to agree to change El Segundo’s zoning laws. The Planning Commission gave the environmentally-friendly proposal a thumbs-up earlier this year before sending it to the council.

Tuesday night’s public hearing and discussion centered primarily on how backyard beekeeping would be regulated and enforced if neighbors complained about bees coming from an adjacent property. The suggested change requires any property owner keeping beehives to keep no more than three hives and to place them in the backyard. El Segundo apiarists must register their hives and follow the state’s guidelines.

By de-listing honeybees from the nuisance list, El Segundo would join the cities of Santa Monica, Long Beach, and Los Angeles who’ve made it possible in recent years for urban

dwellers to do something about the declining bee population. Three-fourths of the world’s flowering plants depend on pollinators, such as bees and birds, to reproduce, according to the National Resources Conservation Service within the U.S. Department of Agriculture. It also notes on its website that bees are dying off at an alarming rate.

Councilman Scot Nicol sought assurances that any complaints from residents would be addressed by city employees first before being referred to the county. Councilwoman Carol Pirsztuk wanted to know more about the county’s beekeeping regulations before the issue comes up for a final vote at the next council meeting.

Any aggressive or defensive behavior by honeybees kept on El Segundo R-1 zoned properties would trigger a call to Los Angeles County inspectors. The change in its zoning laws leaves it up to beehive hobbyists to follow best practices, and it doesn’t micromanage the activity, Public Works Director Elias Sassoon explained. As currently written, beehives could not be kept in side yards, rooftops, or in apartment buildings or condominiums.

Urban beekeeping is gaining popularity, and several organizations and clubs exist to provide training in the identification of bee species and best practices. Notably, the Los Angeles County Beekeepers Association posts information on its website. So does the Los Angeles County Agricultural Commissioner’s Office, which encourages the practice of urban beekeeping. It notes that a bee colony is a “complex” insect community that requires continual maintenance to remain safe and free of disease and invaders.

Because El Segundo’s zoning code is a permissive document, any activity not specifically mentioned being legal is automatically forbidden within city limits. No city-issued permit or license will be required for backyard hives if the change is made.

California is home to 1,500 species of bees, with the European honeybee being most common, according to the county agricultural commissioner. A national strategy to promote pollinator health - created in 2015 - is behind the increased interest in the insects and making habitats for bees in urban settings. According to the experts, European honeybees are gentle creatures and only sting if they are threatened, attacked or get stepped on.

While saying maybe to urban beekeeping, the City Council signaled its willingness to issue pension-obligation bonds to pay down what El Segundo owes the state. The council agreed to hire J.P. Morgan and Stifel, Nicolaus & Company to underwrite the sale of the bonds, a move that addresses the City Council’s chief financial concern.

Getting started with one of these actions could lead to hundreds of dollars of savings on a high-efficiency washing machine, a free rain barrel valued at approximately \$100, incentives to replace grass and invaluable educational opportunities.

This season the league has conformed to a society that has been changed due to the pandemic. Kids are resilient though and adapt better than we, as adults, do, in many cases. Players will be required to wear masks while playing, and they will actively social distance themselves while not playing. There won't be a snack bar open, and the public restrooms

To open the season, the Dodgers and Padres played on a cool Monday night. They played in front of a nice crowd of family and friends eager to watch a baseball game in person and cheer on the innocence of kids playing. The play was as you might expect a first game to be, but never-the-less fun to watch these kids playing their hearts out.

The Padres scored three first-inning runs on their way to a 14-1 win over the Dodgers. Dylan Stenberg had a two-run triple and scored on a wild pitch. The Padres opened up the game with an eight-run second inning. Tyler Brooke had a run-scoring single, Gio Blanco knocked in two runs with a single up the middle, and the Padres took advantage of four walks and an error. The Dodgers scored their only run in the third when Jordan Slavens tripled and scored on a wild pitch. The Padres would tack on three more runs in the third inning, highlighted by Tate Vincent's two-run RBI single.

With a 15-game season condensed into six

weeks, the teams are playing their games on Mondays, Wednesdays and Saturdays. The Dodgers faced the Orioles and fell to the league favorites 11-6 in the first game last Saturday. The Orioles scored two first-inning runs highlighted by a run-scoring single by Sebastian Gomez.

The Dodgers tied the game in the third inning when Carson Puffer had an RBI single to make it 2-1, and Hawk Sanders walked with the bases loaded to tie the game at 2-2. The Dodgers went on to score four more runs sparked by Gavin Pate's RBI single to take a 6-2 lead..

The Orioles offense showed their mettle by scoring two runs in the third inning on Xavier Gomez's double and then opened up the game in the later innings. Kyle Cantu had

an RBI double to right field, and Camden Quaintance hit the league's first home run of the young season, and the Orioles came away with the win.

In the second game, the Padres defeated the Giants 11-5. In the second inning Luke Griffiths' RBI single scored Gio Blanco, and Ethan Friedberg walked, forcing a run in. Mikey Lambert drove in two runs with a single, and Ollie Brown drove in another run to open a 6-0 lead, and the Padres went on for the win.

Lady Eagles Open Refreshed Gym with a Pair of Wins

During the school shutdown, it gave the school an opportunity to remodel both gyms at the high school. With new bleachers, a refreshed floor, new lighting, and new auxiliary baskets that retract, the Eagles opened their season with an exciting 45-41 win over the Palos Verdes Sea Kings.

The debt swap could save El Segundo \$61 million by eliminating interest charges that CalPERS levies on local governments that carry unfunded pension liability.

According to the council item, the underwriters will develop a marketing plan for rating agencies and investors and launch the sale of pension-obligation bonds for investors to buy. Underwriters will be paid up to \$325,000 for their services under the terms of the contract approved Tuesday.

In Other Council Actions:

- A midyear budget review revealed El Segundo received an unexpected bump in revenues since October. City revenues were nearly \$1.7 million higher than projected. Despite the slightly higher-than-projected income, El Segundo lost almost \$3 million in bed tax in the past six months during the economic shutdown caused by COVID-19. And next year, the city is facing a \$9 million structural deficit that could require further spending cuts, early retirement offers, and leaving vacant positions unfilled for another year.
- The Wiseburn Aquatics Center ran a sizable deficit from 2019 to 2020, prompting Councilman Lance Giroux to call for changes in how the facility is managed and promoted. Despite the pool being reserved nearly year-round, the center ran a \$350,000 deficit in the last fiscal year. "We need to figure out how to hit a reset button and figure out how to make that - if not profitable - come really, really close to breaking even," Giroux said Tuesday. Wiseburn is an aquatics center, not a local pool, and "we need to start running it that way," Giroux said. Booking outside swim events would generate more money and reduce pool time given to residents, teams, and clubs.
- They decided to earmark the money from

the lease with TopGolf for the city-owned golf property on Pacific Coast Highway to pay CalPERS for unfunded liabilities. The council adopted a policy directing 60 to 70 percent of the ground-lease income for pension payments to CalPERS, and the rest to rebuild the Equipment Replacement Fund. Once the fund is replenished, the income will be spent on capital improvements.

- Mayor Drew Boyles announced Kevin Maggay's appointment to the Planning Commission. His term will run through June 2023. Ryan Baldino and Brenda Newman were reappointed to three-year terms, ending on June 30, 2024.
- The Economic Development Advisory Council will be retired and replaced by a non-profit entity. The El Segundo Economic Development Corporation will continue to advise City Hall on policies and outreach to attract and retain businesses. Deputy City Manager Barbara Voss thanked all current and former EDAC members for their participation on the council, which boasts as many as 19 active members at a time.
- There are plans for upcoming cultural and arts programs, including a Festival of Holidays at Civic Plaza. Christmas, Hanukkah, Kwanzaa, and possibly three more winter holidays would be celebrated through food, music, lights, and a tree lighting. Also, an all-new program called TEDx El Segundo would invite influential people to speak. The city's Arts and Culture Advisory Committee envisions an after-school arts program, more public art and displays in the outdoor dining corridor along Main and Richmond Streets, and a poet laureate program. The new initiatives drew praise from some council members and will need budget approval before the Arts and Culture Committee schedules them.

and his tireless support has been greatly valued during the extraordinary times we faced.”

Tracey Miller-Zarnecke is currently the president of the ESUSD school board. She emailed that “Frank is so generous with his time and talent: he has long been a wonderful collaborator on the El Segundo Education Foundation board and serving as its Chair now, he stands as a proven team builder and leader. Frank also adds tremendous value to the Facilities Advisory Committee from his professional perspective, contributing to thoughtful conversations from his background as an architect, but also with his firsthand knowledge of our campuses based on years of being an engaged parent.”

Glynn, who grew up one of ten children, moved to El Segundo in 1995. An avid sailor, Glynn said that he first ventured across the pond to America to compete in a sailing world championship in the fine environs of Gulfport, Mississippi. A well-worn path, right, for most coming to the United States? Dublin, Ireland, to some waterway in Mississippi?

As part of the Irish sailing contingent competing in 1983, Glynn said he “asked around” Biloxi to get information on local architects. He soon befriended a local architect who quickly hired Glynn; he then returned to Ireland to corral the necessary paperwork to return to the States and continue his American adventure in Mississippi. Glynn remembered that there were not too many Irishman who had settled in Biloxi, but, as luck would have it, shockingly, at a St. Patrick’s Day gathering, he was able to network with fellow Gulf Coast Irishmen, and probably, hoist a Guinness pint or two in celebration.

After nine months or so of living in Biloxi, Glynn said he knew that his visa was good for 18 months and had decided that he “did not want to spend all 18 months in Biloxi,” (who would?), so he investigated making a quick change of residency, thinking of relocating in Boston, a long-time bastion of Irish folk. But

at that point, one of his architecture co-workers said, “Why don’t you go to Los Angeles? I know some people there.” Glynn acquiesced, and his very amenable colleague drove with Glynn from Biloxi to the City of the Angels, nearly 2,000 miles away, through the states of Texas, Arizona, and New Mexico if you drive straight from point A to point B, which I doubt that they did.

Glynn said that his colleague introduced him to a few folks in the architectural field in LA, then his buddy hopped on a plane back to Mississippi. At that point, Glynn was offered an architectural job on Beverly Boulevard. He “bounced around,” he said, working for different firms, and in 1989, decided to “start my own little business...and it is still a little business, but I have been gainfully employed, ever since.”

So, his pathway led from Dublin to Biloxi to Los Angeles to El Segundo. Glynn said that, as the avid competitive sailor that he was, and still is, he was looking for a sailing club to join upon his arrival in LA. He was pointed in the direction of Marina Del Rey’s California Yacht Club. He said that he “Met some nice people,” and later was asked to skipper larger boats. One of the people who Glynn skippered for was El Segundo resident Alex Benson, whose mother was a realtor, and one might assume that the attributes of an El Segundo residency for Glynn were presumably touted.

Glynn was, at the time, living in Hollywood with his wife, Susan. Glynn said that he and Susan would travel south on the weekends, knocking on doors in El Segundo, asking anyone brave enough to answer the knock, were they interested in selling their home? Finally, with the help of a local realtor, the Glynn’s were able to purchase a home in El Segundo, albeit one that needed a bit of work.

One day while he was tending to his backyard overgrowth, Glynn said that his neighbor peaked over the fence, and after some initial chit-chat, suggested that Glynn join the El Segundo Rotary

Club, which he did. Glynn is still a member. It turns out his neighbors were the creators and owners of the Blue Butterfly Coffee Company, and when they secured a spot-on Main St. for a brick-and-mortar store, they prevailed upon Glynn to help them redesign a space that had once been a dental office.

Glynn said that while he has experience designing multiple buildings, “I love designing houses. Every site is completely different. Every house has different opportunities and different challenges. Every client has different life experiences and different tastes.” Glynn said that he tries to “bring together” all facets of what is important to a client and utilize his experience to create a domicile that is “perfect for the client.”

Some of the “perfect for the client” residences include that Bel Air property that sold, Glynn said, for \$17 million, as well as other residences in El Segundo and in neighboring Manhattan Beach.

But Glynn and his firm do not just design buildings locally. He has also drawn a paycheck from working in India. Which, he said, all comes back to sailing. Glynn said that he befriended a fellow sailor of Indian descent, whose parents would occasionally visit the Los Angeles area. On a drive down to San Diego to prepare for a sailing event, Glynn’s friend asked if he would have an interest in doing some work in India. His first thought, Glynn said, was, “no,” but the friend put together more information on possible projects in India, and Glynn, in 1993, was invited to tour a possible project site in Southern India. It turns out that Glynn, through his sailing contacts, was soon designing business campuses and like-facilities for a well-heeled man who was considered the father of the Indian software industry, the head-honcho of TATA Consultancy Services.

“I was thrilled with the opportunity,” Glynn said of his initial chance to work in India. Although traipsing around India in 1993 was

a bit of a culture shock for the Irishman. He said that back nearly three decades ago when he traveled the country, “I was the only person who looked like me. And there were a billion people who (did) not look like me.” Maybe a slight exaggeration, but that did not deter Glynn, who posits that he has been back to India more than 50 times, designing much more grandiose projects than his first business campus during his initial foray into the architectural world of India.

Back to El Segundo. Glynn is about nine months into his two-year commitment to serve as the Ed! Foundation chair. He said that the foundation is plugging ahead with their fundraising efforts, and looking forward to, hopefully, hosting their annual Ed! Foundation Gala at Chevron Park sometime in September.

He continues to lend his expertise to the ESUSD Facilities Advisory Committee, as they utilize the monies (\$92 million) from bond measure ES that El Segundo voters passed a few years ago to upgrade current District facilities and break ground on new projects.

Glynn is also looking forward to, hopefully, resuming his competitive sailing career, depending on the vagaries of the fallout from the COVID-19 epidemic. An avid runner, Glynn shared that he has completed 23 marathons and has embarked on an alphabetical running quest: he is halfway through running a marathon in locations A-Z; the next marathon highlighted on his calendar is set to take place in Newport News, Rhode Island, which will remove the N from his checklist.

“Well, it’s not far down to paradise, at least it’s not for me,” were the opening lyrics of the Cross song. “And if the wind is right, you can sail away and find tranquility. Oh, the canvas can do miracles, just you wait and see. Believe me.”

It seems that Frank Glynn, the Dubliner who settled in El Segundo via a pit-stop in Biloxi, Mississippi, has found his tranquility. •

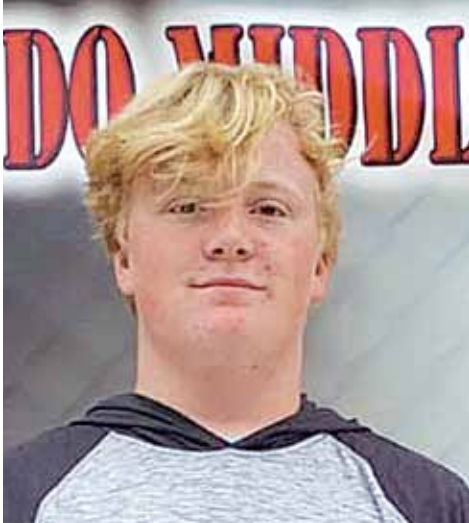
As you may or may not already know, for the El Segundo Middle School, 8th graders are required to complete a Community Project. Due to the current pandemic, our options for the Community Project have been very
