HR Director Rebecca Redyk Joins the Administrative Team at El Segundo City Hall

I was trying to leverage the voluminous Google info on the internet and find out about a Hollywood- manufactured movie that spotlighted the daily ins and outs of a Human Resources department. A possible hook for this story. And I kept getting directed to the 2011 film “Moneyball,” which starred Brad Pitt and chronicled the rise of the cheap-on-the-dime Oakland A’s major league baseball team, spotlighting the 2002 season. The book was published in the following year and details how the A’s brain-trust built their somewhat amazingly successful team, wholeheartedly embracing the input of their HR/analytics department.

Well, Irvine resident Rebecca Redyk is not tasked with improving a baseball roster. Still, she is tasked with guiding a cohesive and successful team of employees in El Segundo as the city’s new Director of Human Resources.

Redyk, who received her Bachelor of Science degree in business administration from the University of Southern California, comes to town after a 20-year stint working for the City of Newport Beach, rising to the position of Human Resources Manager in 2015. Before her tenure in Newport Beach, Redyk worked for the City of Cerritos for three years, conquering roles as an HR resources recruiter and personnel administrator.

When Redyk was selected for the HR Director post, El Segundo City Manager Scott Mitnick was confident the selectors had made the correct choice. “The entire Executive Team is excited to welcome Rebecca as a key member of the City’s leadership team,” Mitnick said at the time. “Her diverse background and level of experience make her the ideal choice to lead the Human Resources Department.” More from Mitnick in a bit.

For her part, Redyk was eager to embrace a new challenge in her career pathway. “As the City’s new Human Resources Director, I am excited to bring my expertise and energy to the executive leadership team to support the City Council, employees, and the community,” Redyk said at the time she was selected. “I look forward to working closely with the City Manager and executive team to improve services further and accomplish the strategic plan goals.”

Added Mitnick at the time of the Redyk selection: “The City of El Segundo strives for excellence in all aspects of municipal government. With Ms. Redyk’s experience and expertise, she will bring the necessary skills and traits required to succeed in our

Certified Arborist Santos Haro Cares for El Segundo Trees

Walking the streets of El Segundo, the city shines in shades of green, with saplings and decades-old trees alike lining every pathway and park. There are over six thousand trees in El Segundo and more than thirty species in this small ten-mile area. So who takes care of them all?

Santos Haro is one of two certified arborists working for the parks department in El Segundo. His work is dedicated totally to the forest of El Segundo. Whether it be an inspection, removal, trimming, or evaluation, his job is to help the citizens of El Segundo by ensuring the health of our trees.

To be a certified arborist is to know all things tree. One must keep up their

certification by taking several educational units every year and pass a rigorous exam meant to test their knowledge. Asked if he could blindly identify any tree in the area, Haro says, “No problem.”

Originally from Culver City, Haro worked summers alongside his brother for his father’s landscaping business, which his father owned for over fifty years.

“I learned the trade from working with my dad,” says Haro, “but it wasn’t until I started working in a nursery that I started to familiarize myself with names of trees and plants.” Though his title is specifically with trees, he says that he wears many hats working in a parks department, so

‘Street Gang: How We Got to Sesame Street’ Review: What the TV Taught

Big Bird, Bert & Ernie, Kermit the Frog and Cookie Monster are as timeless today as they were when they debuted on “Sesame Street” in 1969. But what I didn't know about these lovable muppets was the incredible story behind the seminal children's TV show's creation, which the new documentary *Street Gang: How We Got to Sesame Street* reveals. The road that was taken by televi-

changed the culture and has been cherished by children still to this day. Whether you do or don't know much about the show, *Street Gang: How We Got to Sesame Street* (based on the New York Times Bestselling Novel) should be required watching to see how art and altruism can go together to change the world for the better.

At 1 hour and 47 minutes, *Street Gang* centers around the radical reason of why the

sion producers and educators to create this one-of-a-kind children's program was radical, as they set out to create an education show that would answer: what if a show loved kids instead of sold to them? Could TV help kids? Could it be used to teach?

This became “Sesame Street,” which

show was created: as a way to help teach basic education skills such as reading and counting to impoverished inner-city Black and minority children at a time when nothing like it had been done. It was a daring notion, and the doc introduces the main people

behind the show's development such as Joan Cooney. The female television producer who was responsible for putting the show on the air, Cooney shares how she worked with the Federal Government's Office of Education to create the "Children's TV Workshop," a group of educators and TV producers that would create an entirely new style of children's educational show.

The biggest debt that *Street Gang* wishes to pay here is to Jon Stone, who we learn was the visionary and central force for what "Sesame Street" the show would become. Motivated by the disillusionment that the Vietnam War placed on the country, as well as a disgusted response to overt consumerism in children's TV shows, Stone was not only responsible for pioneering "Sesame Street"'s mix of education and entertainment, but for its daring decision to set the show in a gritty New York street environment (versus a fantasyland or suburban setting which was more popular), with the intent to relate to the Black and minority kids that they wished to connect with.

There were multiple moments throughout *Street Gang: How We Got to Sesame Street* in which I was emotionally affected. Whether it was me genuinely laughing over brilliant puppeteering skits (at one point in time in entertainment, the only two shows on air that had comedy writers were "The Tonight Show with Johnny Carson" and "Sesame Street"), or

politically enlightened, or emotionally moved, the doc spans a wide emotional range. Seeing then-musical composer Joe Raposo—who wrote the show's original songs and music—reminisce over writing Kermit's famous ballad "It's Not Easy Being Green," or seeing special guest star Jesse Jackson get a huge set full of kids to chant "I am somebody, I can change the world" made my eyes water. Beyond its bold artistic achievements, *Street Gang* also serves as a love letter and reminder to artists and educators everywhere, that with fearless creativity and a good heart, you can create something that can change the world.

organization right away and over the long run. She will be a great fit.”

Redyk grew up in San Diego and moved to the Los Angeles area to attend USC. While attending college, she nabbed a job in Redondo Beach, working for the retailer Nordstrom, which led to her living in the South Bay “for a long time.” She later relocated to Orange County, an area she has called home for more than 20 years. But, she said, “I am very familiar with the South Bay and working here.” She said she likes the El Segundo environs, citing the “beautiful high school,” located just down the street from her new Main Street office and the closely located recreational facilities. Also pointing out that, “just a few blocks away, you have the Fortune 500 companies. It is a good mix.”

Commenting on her tenure with the City of Newport Beach, Redyk said that one of the projects she spearheaded was a program to codify and update what she terms “the cities core values.” She also was instrumental in creating a recruitment video for the City. She noted that her bosses in Newport Beach allowed her to brainstorm and create innovative, out-of-the-box programs that mirrored the strategies implemented by successful businesses in the private sector. Like the Oakland A’s management did.

Of her employee recruitment montage, Redyk said that “I am very proud of that video,” mentioning how it implemented the core values of Newport Beach city administrators and the “organization as a whole.” Expect Redyk to produce a similar recruitment video for the City of El Segundo, something that “will highlight the employees, and that will help us to attract similar talent. There are a lot of projects that I would like to do here,” she said,

Redyk said that she pursued the El Segundo HR opening “looking to meet my career goal of becoming a Director” when she forwarded her cover letter and resume to Mitnick in mid-November of 2020.

She finds El Segundo a different city than Newport Beach, citing that while Newport Beach is “more residential,” El Segundo mixes residential with the Fortune 500 companies that call our town home. “Being a smaller (city) agency, you can make a big impact, to make a difference, to improve things, and streamline them. I have a lot of experience working with and implementing technology projects to improve efficiencies and to make things faster and easier,” she said, citing the frenzied pace and standards that 2021 businesses, whether in the private sector or on the governmental level, are expected to achieve.

Redyk said that she became aware of the El Segundo HR opening when it was posted by an executive recruiter, who she had worked with in the past. Multiple Zoom interviews then took place, not only with the recruiter, but with panels tasked to fill the position. Her final interview was with Mitnick, which she must have aced, because she landed her coveted job.

A couple of months ensconced into her new job responsibilities, Redyk says that work-wise, “there is an always a lot going on, and a lot to get done.” She said she had enjoyed meeting with Chamber of Commerce representatives and members and that after the lockdown abates, she is looking forward to attending Chamber events in person, because that is where you “get to engage with the community and meet people. That’s fun.”

Few current profiles would be complete without touching on how the pandemic has shaped an HR Director’s job responsibilities. Redyk cited “all of the legislation that has been enacted,” noting that new policies and procedures must be implemented “very, very quickly,” which is anathema to most governmental agencies, who tend to move somewhat slowly in normal times. Akin to the movement of a glacier.

Redyk said that 2021 HR programs must be “nimble” to implement policies and programs, ensure they follow new laws and statutes and provide the most up-to-date information possible to employees. She also cited the increased reliance on technology in the business sector, noting telecalls and the advent of a more significant chunk of employees working from home. The pandemic, she said, has forced HR departments to increase their focus on the health and well-being of their employees. “Mental health, self-care, those type of things, are really important,” she said. “Everyone has their challenges with work, but people have families...and you need to be sensitive to that. Now, work has come into the home. Juggling all of the priorities is challenging to employees.”

She said that the best part of her job is the “ability to make a change and impact the organization. It is hard work, you have to put in the time, but at the end of the day, it is all worth it.”

Here is an excerpt from Redyk’s cover letter sent to Mitnick when she applied for her new job in the Winter of 2020:

“I am comfortable working in a complex organization with high expectations from the governing body and its residents. I take pride in providing the “best in class” level of customer service to internal and external customers while building strong working relationships. I believe that I have the attributes you are seeking in the Human Resources Director.”

Apparently, so did Mitnick. So now that Mitnick has worked with Redyk for more than two months, what does he think of her initial toils for the City? “She brings over two decades of progressively responsible human resources experience to the table,” he emailed. “During her first two months with the City of El Segundo, Rebecca has already added value. For example, she has had to resolve several difficult personnel issues and has begun to lay the foundation for a stronger future.

“Her extensive experience in working with police and fire labor groups in Newport Beach in particular,” Mitnick added, “will help us greatly. El Segundo is at an important pivotal time concerning personnel and labor relations issues, and Rebecca is the right person to guide us through this. She is well-respected in the local government profession in general and by her peers and colleagues. We have high hopes for her here in El Segundo.”

Joe Lillio, the cities Director of Finance, emailed that Redyk has proven to be a “dedicated professional, very knowledgeable in the HR field, (a) great addition to the City’s executive team, has implemented numerous operational changes in HR and the City that have resulted in internal customer service improvements, operational efficiencies, and business process improvements. (She is) very knowledgeable in the federal and state laws and regulations that govern employee rights and benefits, very personable, (has) great leadership skills, and excellent business acumen.
