## Water Tank Mural Gets an Update as Its Artist Continues to Thrive

In the late 1950s, teenager John Van Hamersveld would take the beach route in his Volkswagen Beetle from his home in Palos Verdes, turn right onto Grand Avenue, then head to Main Street, and on to El Segundo High School, where he attended classes. Little could he imagine back then that his life story would be on full display along that same route on Grand some 67-odd years later. Van Hamersveld, who became both a South Bay surfing legend and a world-renowned artist, designed the giant mural on the Los Angeles Department of Water and Power (LADWP) tank in 2018 to beautify what had long been a public eyesore. However, the 510-foot art piece eventually began to show wear and tear and is now undergoing a renovation that is expected to extend its lifespan greatly. "LADWP, eight years later, has decided to redo it," Van Hamersveld explained. "The color was a bit diffused, so over those years it started to turn white. The new pieces have been designed to hold the colors using a different printing process and cabling. Also, the environmental people told us we needed water-based ink instead of oil." LADWP recently replaced the public-facing panels (15 of the 51 total) as an interim measure. "We are currently working on replacing all remaining panels," LADWP indicated in a statement to the Herald. "We can provide additional information at a later date on our timeline as we work out the contracting process in accordance with our purchasing guidelines."

The revitalized tank will incorporate all the original art, as the images are digitally stored and cannot be painted directly onto the structure. "From my end, the technology was to get the files to print, and their side was to get a mesh they could print on and hang," Van Hamersveld said. As an artist, he

started out in old-school fashion, visualizing the piece in his mind and making sketches before creating computer collages. The theme incorporates bright surf waves and aviation imagery as well as his beloved VW to capture the essence of both his own life and El Segundo's history. Van Hamersveld dedicated the mural to the surf heroes and major influences of his youth, Hap Jacobs (who crafted the then-teen's first board) and Dale Velzy. Van Hamersveld treasures his memories of the duo. "I used to go to a shop in Venice, drink wine, smoke Camels, and watch them build surfboards," he said.

Meanwhile, back in the 1950s, the PV area had yet to establish its own high schools, so students were bused to Narbonne or El Segundo. Van Hamersveld was one of several accomplished swimmers brought in to learn under legendary coach Urho Saari. Under Saari's tutelage, over 30 El Segundo athletes participated in various Olympic swimming

and water polo competitions over the years. Van Hamersveld may have possessed the talent to become one of those, but ultimately had different ideas. "I didn't like going back and forth in the climate being wet, so I quit and went surfing instead," he said. He quickly immersed himself in that culture. His exploits on the board recently earned him induction into the Hermosa Beach Surfers Hall of Fame, following similar honors in Huntington Beach. He also became a top-flight skier at 18 and even moved to Aspen for six months, but dropped that pursuit after a few too many bumps and bruises.

Yet Van Hamersveld's main claim to fame was not in the pool or on the slopes. "My mother was an artist, and when I was 13, she moved me into her studio and set up a bed there," he recalled. "I also looked at El Segundo High as a studio where I did my art. I was a dyslexic student, pitiful and non-academic."

## Eagles Having a Playoff Season

The spring high school sports regular season is officially over. Some sports have already started their CIF Southern Section playoffs, and the remaining ones are starting this week. Both baseball and softball teams had completed their regular seasons and were waiting for the CIF pairings to be announced.

### Baseball Team Goes Long Ball in Finale

The Eagles hosted Pioneer League foe South Torrance, but this time it was in the finals of the fifty-sixth El Segundo Tournament. It was the last regular-season game for these two teams before the CIF playoffs. The Eagles played long ball, hitting four home runs and two doubles in their 18-5 win over the Spartans. The Eagles have put up some video game numbers this season, and it continued against the Spartans. They scored in each of the five innings they batted and pounded out fifteen hits.

In the first inning, Logan Brooks unloaded on a 2-1 fastball. He sent the ball high over

the second fence into the Tot Lot park, hitting one of the slides. It marked Logan's eleventh homerun of the season and gave his team a 2-0 lead. The Spartans evened the score in their half of the second inning on the strength of two hits and a walk. But the Eagles exploded for their most productive inning this season when they scored eight runs. Colton Ksieski had a run-scoring double, and Jaiden Rico's RBI single made it 4-2. Austin Holman's double scored Rico. Chase Mattoon singled to left field and Brooks drew a walk to load the bases. Lincoln Quaintance stepped to the plate and promptly deposited a fastball over the centerfield fence 380 feet away for a grand slam.

The Eagles, leading 10-3 in the third inning, scored four runs, highlighted by Mattoon and Quaintance, who each hit home runs to extend the score to 14-3. The Eagles would score one run in the fourth inning and three more runs in the fifth inning before the Spartans threw in the towel after they hit in the sixth inning of the 18-5 final score.

Lincoln Quaintance had one of his best days offensively, going three-for-four with two home runs, six RBIs, and scoring three times. Logan Brooks had three hits, increasing his season batting average to .500. His two RBIs give him 50 on the season, ranking him third in the state. Chase Mattoon had another brilliant game with two hits, including hitting his eleventh homerun on the season, two RBIs, and scored three times. Jaiden Rico had two hits and drove in five runs.

On defense, the Eagles turned two double plays that helped support starter Declan McRoberts. The freshman gave up two earned runs on five hits and earned his staff's leading eighth win.

The Eagles will need their video game-like offensive stats during their CIF Southern Section Division 2 playoff run. They open the playoffs today on the road to face the fourth-seeded Gahr Gladiators at 3 p.m.

### Softball Loses Tiebreaker but Playoff Bound

The Eagle played a tiebreaker Bay League game to determine league placement. They lost to North Torrance 3-1 but still finished with a .500 overall record, making them eligible for postseason consideration. When the pairings were revealed, the Eagles were awarded an at-large berth and will travel to Huntington Beach on Friday to face the Edison Chargers at 3:00 p.m. A win would send them into the second round on Saturday.

### Girls Lacrosse Dominates to Advance to CIF Finals

The Eagles traveled to Norco to face the Roosevelt Mustangs in the CIF Southern Section Division 2 semi-finals. The long trip didn't deter

the Eagles from dominating from the opening face-off to the final buzzer. The Eagles used a poised offense and an overwhelming defense to defeat the Mustangs 14-3.

El Segundo scored their first three goals in the first four minutes of the first quarter before Roosevelt responded with a goal of their own. Kalista McMillon's cross shot made it 5-1 before the end of the quarter.

In the second quarter, the Eagles' patient offense paid off for goals by Tessa Tipton, who scored twice, and McMillon, whose goal midway through the period made it 8-1. Riley Clinton's passing was instrumental in guiding each score.

The third period was played with the Eagles controlling the field of play. McMillon got off an uncontested attempt to make it 9-2, and Clinton found an opening to score to make it 10-2. In the fourth period, the Mustangs' frustration over losing got the better of them, and play became a bit more heated. But the Eagles were classy and allowed the officials to control the contest. Lailah Guzman took a penalty shot and buried it into the net for a 12-3 lead. The Eagles would score two more goals and run away with the win. In the process, they punched their ticket to their second consecutive CIF Championship game.

The Eagles (12-4) will face the Huntington Beach Oilers (14-8), the Sunset League champions, at Fred Kelly Stadium, 3920 E. Spring Street, Orange, on Friday at 8:30 p.m.

### El Segundo High School Girls Swimming and Diving Earn CIF Division 2 Team Title

Led by Head Coach Tyler Contarsy and Assistant Coach Katrina Kistler, this was the second CIF title for the girls and first since 2008. Sophomore diver Reilly Stebbins kicked things off in Mission Viejo on April 30th with a 2nd place finish in the diving competition. The swimming competition took place on Friday, May 8th, at Mount San Antonio College in Walnut, CA.

El Segundo senior Sora Koike, who is committed to swim at UCLA, swam to 2nd place in the girls' 200 free (1:48.22, a new school record and high school All-American). She followed that up with a 3rd place finish in the 500 free (4:54.98, high school All-American). Sora also set new school records in the 50 freestyle (22.86) and 100 free (50.30), leading off both relays (both HS All-American).

Senior Ava Bao swam to 13th place in the girls' 50 free (24.60). She followed that up with 11th place in the 100 free (53.47), providing valuable points for the team.

Sophomore Eryn Arnold claimed victories in the 200 IM (1:59.77) and 100 fly (53.25). Both were new school records and HS All-American.

El Segundo also won the girls' 200 freestyle relay with the team of Sora Koike (22.86), Eryn Arnold (23.19), Ava Bao (24.41), and freshman Paige Hale (25.25), swimming 1:35.71 to touch two seconds ahead of 2nd place La Canada. (Also, a new school record and High School All-American).

Going into the final event, the El Segundo girls team was just four points ahead of La Canada, so the whole meet came down to which team took home the trophy in the 400 freestyle relay.

The 400 freestyle relay was a back-and-forth battle between La Canada and El Segundo. Sora Koike led off in 50.30, putting the girls just behind La Canada. Eryn Arnold was next, pulling ahead with a split of 50.32, followed by Ava Bao, who split 53.41 and kept the lead despite La Canada inching closer. Paige Hale anchored the relay and held off a late surge by La Canada to win the race by .03 seconds. The win gave El Segundo the overall meet title. (Their time of 3:28.84 was also a new school record and High School All-American). •

## Check It Out

### *The Memory Palace: True Short Stories of the Past* by Nate DiMeo

History has a major influence on all of us. I think many people in this country, do not know (or can't remember) our own American history. The times in which we are living constantly bombard us with the 24/7 information cycle. The Past is important, informing our Present and our Future, if we would just pay attention. But social media, Artificial Intelligence, micro movies and reels, marches and protests, spiraling costs of utilities, medical bills and rent ... all of that gets in the way.

In *The Memory Palace* author Nate DiMeo has humanized history by telling non-chronological tales that, to quote the book jacket "[...] conjure lost moments and forgotten figures who are calling out across time to be remembered." "For sixteen years, Nate DiMeo has written, produced, and hosted *The Memory Palace*, a podcast of short, narrative essays put to music that conjure lost moments and forgotten figures from America's past or find strange, new magic in the familiar," from the author's website.

The reader is encouraged to start reading anywhere, since the stories are not in any sort of order. In an interview on the website *Indy Week*, author DiMeo explains why the randomness of the stories selected is precisely the point. "You open [the book] up and are not expecting to laugh, and suddenly you are, or you're not expecting to cry, and suddenly you are—a book that could sneak up on you. Books used to do that all the time as a kid, and they stopped doing that when you're an adult. I wanted to bring a little bit of that back."

Here are a few examples: "Crazy Bet" describes Northern sympathizer Elizabeth Van Lew, who lived in Confederate Richmond, Virginia during the Civil War. Neighbors thought she was always strange: She talked to herself, freed her slaves (and then paid them when they elected to stay with her and her widowed mother), and soon stopped keeping up her appearance - brushing her hair or mending her clothes. Turns out she was a spy for the North and used her servants to pass messages to Northern soldiers and also to prisoners held in nearby Libby Prison. It seems her act of portraying lunacy is disputed, however. But it sure is an entertaining yarn!

Have you ever heard of a solar camera? You can see a photograph of one in this book as well as the story behind that picture. There's also a nifty resolution (see what I did there?) that introduces us to Edward Emerson Barnard, an astronomer and author whose early

examples of astrophotography were hailed as "... an astounding technical achievement in the photography community ..."

Robert Smalls was a former slave who became a much-lauded hero for the Union during the Civil War when he decided to "take" the ship the Planter. Robert piloted the ship to move Confederate soldiers and supplies up the South Carolina coast in a "side job" (slaves had "side jobs"?). Once he sailed the ship into Northern territory, Robert became a sailor for the United States military. Time passed. He was elected to Congress (5 terms!) Ultimately, Robert was able to buy the plantation where his mother had been born a slave.

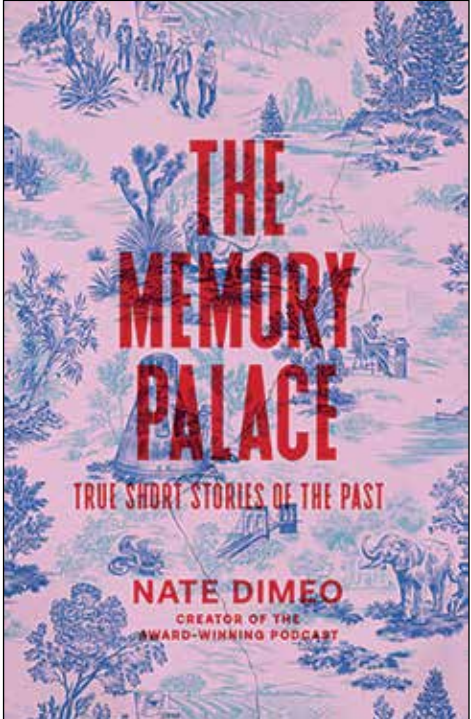
And why don't we know about Betty Robinson, the high school girl who won a gold medal in track in the 1928 Olympics? She had a nearly fatal accident but somehow, she almost literally came back from the dead to win another medal as a member of the 4 x 100 meter relay team in Berlin in 1936! I hope someone in the film community reads this book so we can someday see a movie about her!

In his introduction in the book, ("A Welcome"), the author explains, "Something moved me once. That's how all these stories begin for me. Some historical something, some fact or anecdote, came into my day [...] and changed it." DiMeo includes many coincidences and little ironies, factoids and asides which give extra insight or may just cause a reader to grin or maybe brush away a tear. Maybe these accounts of historical "somethings" can remind us that history doesn't have to seem dry and boring. Maybe they can revive the wonder of the Past.

## Film Review

### *A Life on Our Planet* Review: We Need to Listen to David Attenborough, Our Future Depends on It

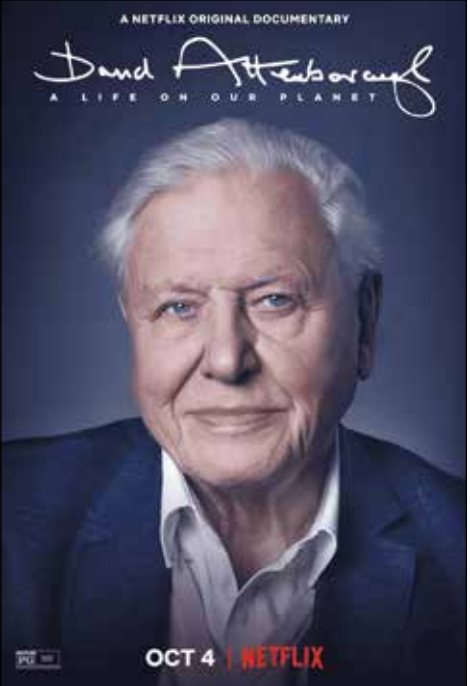
One of my most treasured items of clothing is a thin white t-shirt with the name "Sir David Attenborough" in all caps plastered across the chest. I bought it second-hand from a sustainable fashion brand, something I think Sir Attenborough would approve of. Not only is this shirt one of the softest tops I've ever worn (and a casual flex for fellow nature film nerds), but it is a statement that says I love our planet, I believe in science, and when a worldwide hero and qualified leader tells us we're in trouble, I listen.

His voice is iconic. His message is clear: climate change is ruining our beautiful planet. 100-year-old David Attenborough has dedicated his entire life to studying and protecting the natural world, and he describes many life-changing moments in the Netflix documentary *David Attenborough: A Life on Our Planet*, directed by Alastair Fothergill and Jonathan Hughes and now streaming on Netflix. The places he visited as a young twenty-something that were once teeming with

lush jungles, ice-capped mountains, and free-roaming wildlife have become more skeletal every day. This visibly drastic difference is enough to bring a grown man, and definitely a 30-something film critic, to tears.

But it's not all doom and gloom; Sir David Attenborough is confident that by following his calls to action, we can slow, stop, and then reverse the damage we're doing to our planet. We can start by choosing solar over fossil fuel, reducing farm space to let the natural land grow, and incorporating more plant-based meals into our diets.

Attenborough attests that this film is his witness statement and vision for the future. We are so lucky to have him exist in our lifetime and share his knowledge with us. Increased awareness of climate change and sustainability will hopefully inspire future Attenboroughs, so let's do our part to cultivate an environment for them to thrive and carry on the message of our planet's hero. •

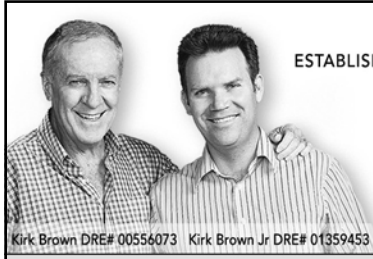

John Van Hamersveld at work in his studio. Photos by Alida Post. I had two art classes in high school, and I was the teacher’s pet with my own room. My mother used to sell my paintings.”

To foster his burgeoning talents, Van Hamersveld attended the Art Center College of Design. By his early 20s, he had already landed a job with Capitol Records. His first major assignment was to create what would become the iconic poster for the renowned surf film *Endless Summer*. For that job, he earned the paltry sum of \$150, but it was an important launching pad that led to his promotion to head of design at Capital in 1965. From there, he became the go-to guy for rock and pop album covers, creating about 300 of those between 1967 and 1980. The list includes such notable classics as The Rolling Stones *Exile on Main Street* and The Beatles *Magical Mystery Tour*. Van Hamersveld calls *Exile* his favorite, and he had the

chance to collaborate with Mick Jagger on the design. That 1972 cover was especially influential. “It was so ugly to normal people in the industry, but to the kids it became a style with punk graphics,” he said. “John Lydon [aka Johnny Rotten from The Sex Pistols] told me this.” Though he enjoyed working with Jagger, he preferred not to deal directly with the musicians as a rule, since it was less productive. “I would meet with the managers, and the manager always told the band to shut up,” he said.

With the advent of CDs, album art essentially went away, and videos became all the rage. So Van Hamersveld adapted by branching into graphic design to promote products like surfwear. In the 2000s, he turned his attention to murals and has never been busier, as he admits to “working around the clock” even at the age of 84. His business manager, agent, and also wife, Alida Post, a former New York art dealer who met him in 2001, said she now has no other clients. “John takes up all my time,” she said. Among other recent highlights, the Fullerton Museum Center hosted a three-month career retrospective of his art. In addition to album covers, the exhibit featured posters, drawings, paintings, and digital compositions.

One can find some of Van Hamersveld’s large-scale works at neighboring locations such as San Pedro’s Cabrillo Marine Aquarium, the Manhattan Beach Art Center, and beside the Underground Pub and Grill in Hermosa. For the 1984 Olympics, he hand-painted a 360-foot-long mural that wraps around the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum. He said he would welcome the opportunity to create something new when the Games come back to LA in 2028. “A mural is like a big t-shirt,” Van Hamersveld related. “Alida

and I were called to work in Las Vegas on a 1,500-foot by 100-foot screen, and that’s where the murals really got going and led to what I did in El Segundo. I had to make collages to suspend on this dome rolling over and above the heads of people.”

The original idea to transform the El Segundo water tank came when local resident and business owner Jimmy DeSisto approached then-Mayor Pro Tem Drew Boyles about improving its appearance. LADWP officials supported the idea of an art piece, and Van Hamersveld had received a request to produce a local mural after his induction into the El Segundo High School Hall of Fame. He was the obvious choice.“We sat down with LADWP and had discussions with people on what they liked,” he said. “The first designs were simple, and they wanted more of a collage. So I went to town with waves that go around the tank and also a band of symbols like a gallery on the panels.”

“The refresh of John Van Hamersveld’s iconic mural is more than a restoration; it’s a reaffirmation of El Segundo’s identity at the intersection of art, culture, and surf history,” Councilmember Boyles said. “From Van Hamersveld’s global influence on surf and pop culture to our own roots as a coastal community, this project reflects the creative energy that defines El Segundo. It’s a place where water towers become canvases, where local students grow into world-class artists, and where culture is both preserved and pushed forward. We’re also grateful to the Los Angeles Department of Water and Power for their continued partnership in helping bring this vision to life.”

Mayor Chris Pimentel added, “John Van Hamersveld grew up right here in El Segundo, drove these streets, and carried the energy of

this community into a career that shaped the visual identity of Los Angeles and beyond. His current work with FIFA and LA Tourism for the World Cup at LAX greets millions of visitors, and his legendary Endless Summer imagery helped define an era. To have his 510-foot mural overlooking Grand Avenue that is now being renewed just in time for the World Cup is a reminder that El Segundo has always been a place where innovation, artistry, and hometown pride meet.”

In trying to describe where he gets his inspiration, Van Hamerseld elaborated, “It’s like you are living in two different worlds. The unconscious is the creative, and the conscious is more like driving a car. I am mostly unconscious. The collage that goes around the tank is like a dream. The patterns are like what has been going on in my mind...” •
