ES Resident Shows his Collection of Over Six-Hundred Model Cars

"I could own all the cars of my dreams...if I got them in miniature size." Car enthusiast and hobbyist Patrick Strong is a lifelong collector of diecast model cars, the owner of the online diecast business Model Citizen, and a long-time resident of El Segundo. He is also the organizer of Diecast Cars & Coffee, an annual meetup and sales event for model car fans everywhere, hosted right here in El Segundo. Originally from El Paso, Texas, Strong says he was not only a car fan, but had a collector mentality from an early age. Despite his parents having no background in motor vehicles and not particularly being surrounded by car culture, he began curating the collection of his favorite automobiles at age six, starting with Hot Wheels and Matchbox Cars.

"Models are popular among car enthusiasts because they allow us to collect our dream garage, our dream collection, without spending millions of dollars," says Strong. Diecasting is the process of pouring (typically) molten zinc alloy into a mold to produce a specific shape. In this case, the mold is a perfectly scaled miniature car.

As Strong grew, so did his collection. His Hot Wheels gave way to better quality, precision-built models. After earning a degree in theater and professionally acting on the East Coast, he moved out to Los Angeles, where he began working in the music industry. All the while, his collection expanded.

As for El Segundo, Strong says he landed here because he "fell in love with a Manhattan Beach native," and they decided on El Segundo to settle down and raise their kids. "We're here for the schools more than anything, and as a small business owner, I appreciate how easy El Segundo makes it to do business," he explains. More than that, El Segundo has its own history with cars.

In the 1940s, the Nash Car Company had a production facility in El Segundo that manufactured race cars. In the 1960s, Shelby American, Inc. was headquartered in the city. After that, several specialty race car shops operated out of El Segundo, making it at one time the race car building capital of the west. So why not collect real cars?

"I think that model car are popular among car enthusiasts in general for two reasons. Number one, they allow us to communicate with other enthusiasts. I can show you what kind of cars that I like without saying a word," he says. By showing a fellow enthusiast his collection, they're able to immediately see what kind of

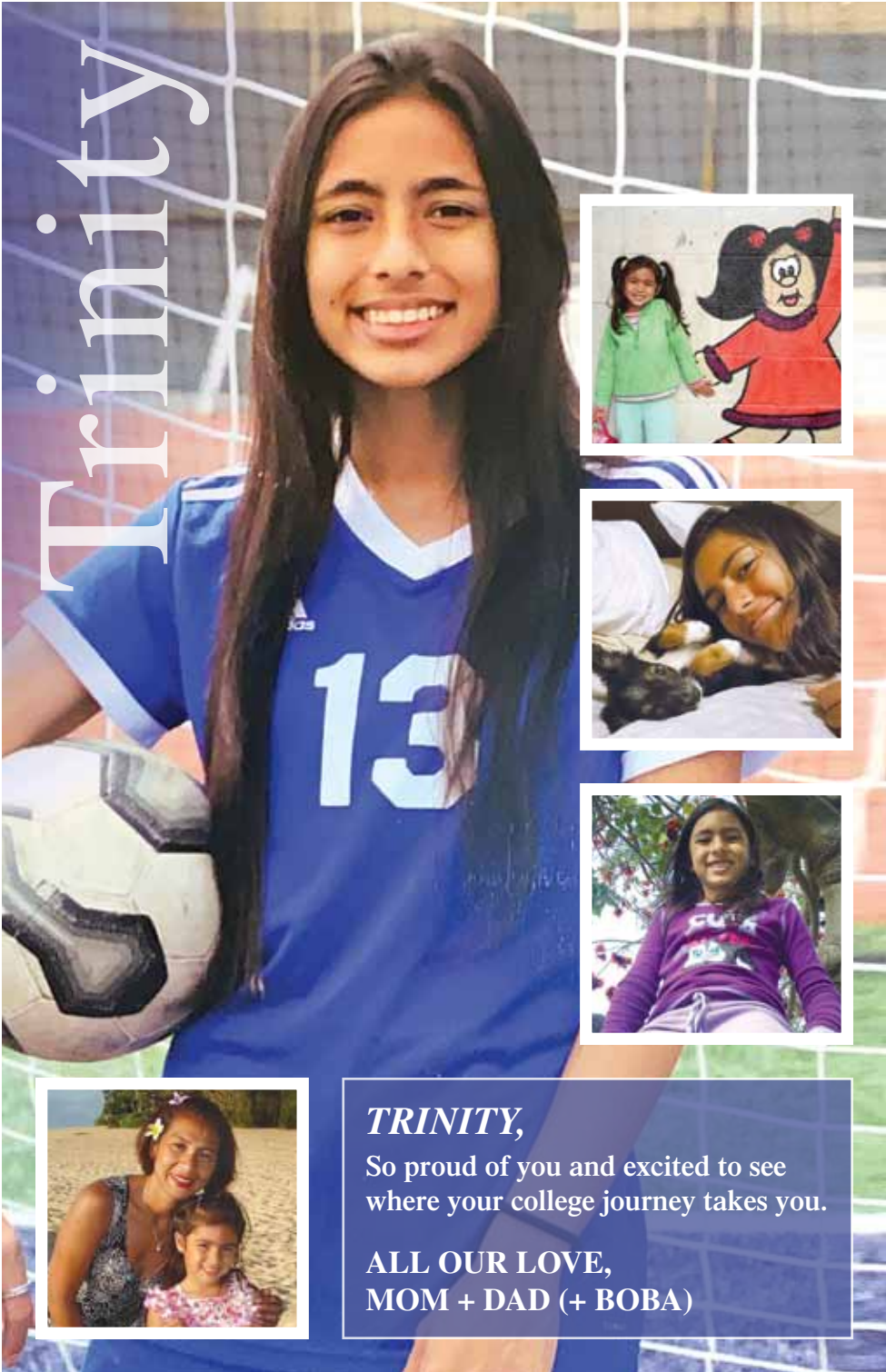

you travel East on Grand Avenue after making a turn from Vista Del Mar or while traipsing to or from the beach as we fast-forward to the summer of 2021. Hopefully, as the pandemic continues to abate, this will be the new Endless Summer for fortunate beach residents like us.

Suzanne Fuentes, the long-time member of the El Segundo City Council, helped facilitate Van Hamersveld's induction into the ESHS Hall-of-Fame and his selection to design the DWP tank mural. The tank mural unveiling took place in April of 2018, after what Fuentes described as a "warp-speed" design and installation process, and was attended not only by

Eagles Have Historic Season

The El Segundo High School’s girl’s soccer and lacrosse teams, as well as the boy’s basketball team, made historic runs this season. The soccer team won its first CIF Southern Section championship and advanced to its first CIF Southern California Regional championship. The lacrosse team won the program’s first league championship and advanced to the first ever CIF Southern Section Division 2 playoffs. The swim team qualified eight swimmers and did well at the CIF finals.

Soccer Team Establishes Itself During Historic Run

When the referee sounded the whistle ending the CIF Southern California Regional Championship game, the agony and tears streaming down the faces of the El Segundo Eagles were evident. The Eagles had just been defeated by San Dimas 5-2, the very same team they had defeated 2-1 in the CIF Southern Section Division 4 Championship game.

The road to the CIF Southern California Regional Championship game started with a matchup with Escondido’s Classical Academy.

The game was a defensive-minded affair; the Eagles prevailed 1-0. The Caimans came into the game 23-3 and had an 18-game win streak on their way to capturing the CIF San Diego Section Division IV Championship. The Caimans defense has been stellar all season long, having given up just 21 goals. El Segundo pressured deep, but Caiman goalie Isabella Trask and her back line thwarted eleven shots on goal in the first half alone.

The second half was much of the same, but the teams held their stout defense intact. The game was scoreless and went into the two-minute stoppage time. The Eagles reversed the field and found their opportunity well into stoppage time. Ciera ‘Kiki’ Doggett received a pass from Chelsie Charles from the touchline and scored the game’s only goal.

The Eagles advanced to the semi-finals to face the Exeter Monarchs, the CIF Central Section Division IV champions. The Monarchs made the 190-mile trip only to make the return trip even longer when the Eagles defeated them 4-0.

cars he’s most interested in.

The second reason, he says, is because model cars are a more affordable way to collect such an expensive item. “You know, we’re not all Jay Leno,” he laughs, “We don’t have the funding or the space to assemble a collection of a hundred real cars, but we can, through diecast models, approximate that experience.”

As for his collection, Strong estimates that he has about six or seven hundred models in his possession at this time. The cars that attract him the most tend to be Porsches and classic Japanese cars.

For the last five years, he has emceed an event called the Japanese Classic Car Show

question. Why does anyone have an enthusiasm for what they do? I have asked myself this question countless times: why am I a car guy?” His answer? Cars found him when he was young, and he’s been interested ever since.

Strong describes collecting as an innate drive to acquire and curate. Your items, he says, tell a story. About history, about achievement, and about you. A collection, be it model cars or Pokémon cards, tells the world your tastes and interests and shows how much you love it.

Interested in starting your own model car collection? Strong has some advice. First, he recommends narrowing down and focusing on what you want to collect. Is it a certain

in Long Beach, which is the largest show for vintage Japanese cars in North America. He also participates in an event called Radwood, which takes place all over the country, and invites guests to celebrate the culture of the 80s and 90s, both in culture and in cars.

A couple of years ago, lamenting with a fellow car enthusiast from Northern California about the lack of model car events in the wake of so many real car events, Strong decided to make his own. The first Diecast Cars & Coffee was hosted in El Segundo, just before the pandemic, at the Automobile Driving Museum. Though Covid threw off plans for 2021, Strong plans to bring it back for 2022. The event hosted vendors, collectors, and enthusiasts alike, who all gathered to buy, trade, compare, and enjoy all things model cars.

Asked where his enthusiasm for such a niche hobby comes from, Strong says, “That is the

type, brand, or era of a car? Secondly, he warns you to be realistic about your space. Miniature though they are, a sizable collection can take up space quickly. Finally, he says to never buy a model car thinking that you’re going to make money on it. As his collection has grown, he’s focused less on quantity and more on quality, buying more precise models that are more specific to his interests.

Currently, Strong drives a 1989 Toyota Cargo Van, about which he says, “It’s one of those things—very few people would know that it’s cool. But the people who know that it’s cool, they really know it’s cool.” Had he the option, his dream car would be a 1973 Porsche 911 RS 2.7, often considered one of the best road cars of all time.

Strong hopes to grow his business, expand his event, and continue to get to know the car enthusiast community of El Segundo and Southern California. •

In Breaking Boundaries, David Attenborough Begs Us To Trust Science, Again

Sir David Attenborough is back with another troubling but ultimately inspiring documentary about the climate crisis and how we must, must, believe the science if we are to stop hurling towards total irreversible destruction. Not a light watch, but a necessary one. Directed by John Clay, *Breaking Boundaries: The Science of Our Planet*, now streaming on Netflix, is another important addition to the Attenborough school of life.

There can never be too many climate crisis documentaries. Why? Because we haven’t solved the problem yet. Until then, I expect to see more films focused on this universally important issue with each one getting more serious than the next. In *Breaking Boundaries*, most of the information is relayed to us by world-renowned scientist Professor Johan Rockström. Throughout its 75-minute runtime, the film takes us on a journey of discovery of the 9 planetary boundaries we must maintain to keep our planet thriving at optimum capacity and protect Earth’s life support system. It feels like more of a scare tactic approach than a whimsical visual journey but maybe

cold, hard facts are what some people need to truly pay attention.

If you’re expecting another Attenborough film with animals galore, you may be disappointed with *Breaking Boundaries*. Instead of primates, director Jon Clay focuses more on the people who have studied and researched the Earth’s ecosystem for years. Interviews with scientists and scholars are conducted in a stereotypical talking heads style, and almost half of the film feels comprised of computer-generated graphics and TED-talk charts. We do see evidence of global warming in nature; from melting ice caps in Greenland to burned carcasses of animals in Australia’s forests, there are still plenty of shocking imagery to absorb here.

Typically, Attenborough documentaries are so impactful because of the stunning visuals that act alongside the narration. However, *Breaking Boundaries* lacks the imagery we’ve come to expect from past films and almost makes it seem like this would have been a good podcast instead. The facts are terrifying: We’ve already lost about 20% of the Amazon,

Once again, El Segundo’s offense pressured the goal in the first half with ten shots on goal, including five saves by the Monarch’s Sam Holcomb. The game went to the second half scoreless, but it didn’t take long for El Segundo to strike. In the 3rd minute, freshman phenom Bella Munoz crossed one to make it 1-0. In the 16th minute, Munoz was in the right spot on a rebound strike attempt by Ciera Doggett. She slid the ball in for a 2-0 El Segundo lead. Later on, Chelsie Charles used a strong leg attempt that was too much for the Monarch’s goalie to handle and score. With the Eagles leading 3-0, they reversed the field as time was winding down. Savannah Schartz took advantage of an opening and powered in a goal from twenty yards away for the final score.

The win propelled the Eagles into their first CIF Southern California Regional Championship game against San Dimas. However, in a year of firsts for the Eagles, winning the Regional would not be one of theirs to enjoy. El Segundo’s early lead disappeared when San Dimas scored five unanswered goals and defeated the Eagles 5-2.

El Segundo came out with energy, knowing they could play with the Division’s top-ranked team and had delivered San Dimas their only loss of the year. The Eagles capitalized on their vigor and pressure by scoring the game’s

Head coach Skip Jones was proud of his shorthanded team that was playing without starters, midfielder Michaela Turner and standout defender Charlie Gerson. Both were away at a club showcase in North Carolina. The what-ifs they were there will always be up for debate. “We weren’t supposed to get as far as we did, let alone win a CIF championship. We were a third-place team and

hard-fought 71-67 win over the Norco Cougars. It was the program’s second-longest winning streak behind the 34 games the 1966-67 team won. The Eagles advanced to the CIF Southern Section Division 3A quarter-finals to face the top-seeded Shalhevet Firehawks.

The Firehawks play their home games in a diminutive setting that the school most likely uses the venue as an auditorium. The

the 2021 advanced to the CIF Southern Section Division 2 championship meet held at picturesque Santa Margarita High School. The girl’s team, which finished in the top third of the 47 teams competing, was represented by (senior) Gabriela Crother-Collardo and a trio of freshmen, including Molly Beetner, Emery Arnold, and Maya Viramontes. The boy’s team, which finished fourth overall, was led by (senior) Hirota Inoki, (junior) Ranier Reczer, (sophomore) Alexander Cole, and (freshman) Taisei Saito.

The girls’ team competed in the 200-yard and 400-yard freestyle relay. Individually Emery Arnold competed in the 50-yard freestyle, and Gabriela Crother-Collardo swam in the 200-yard freestyle races. On the boys’ side, they swam in the 200-yard and 400-yard freestyle relay, which the Eagles won. Individually Alexander Cole won the 200-yard freestyle in 1:39.54 and was third in the 50-yard freestyle race, and he anchored the winning 400-yard freestyle relay race. Taisei Saito finished fifth in the grueling individual medley that includes the butterfly, backstroke, breaststroke, and freestyle in that order, and he had a respectable finish in the 100-yard backstroke. Hirota Inoki swam in the 50-yard and 100-yard freestyle races. His 21.42 was good for sixth and less than a second from winning the race.

first goal. The Eagles’ direct approach sent junior forward Chelsie Charles and freshman forward Bella Munoz into striking distances. It paid off with a give-and-go by Charles to Munoz, who powered one inside the right post for the game’s first goal in the 18th minute.

It was 2-0 in the 30th minute when Ciera Doggett found her way within several defenders mulling over a slow-rolling loose ball. As San Dimas goalkeeper Madison Morris reached for the ball, Doggett gave the ball a nudge that slowly rolled into the goal. From there San Dimas, behind the play of UCLA-bound midfielder Ally Lemos, scored the next five goals to claim the closest thing to a state championship.

were underdogs throughout this playoff run.” Very few teams that have finished third in league play go on to win a CIF championship or play in the State Regional championship game of any sport. No doubt this soccer team’s members will walk the halls this last week of school, as Rock Stars as the school’s only CIF champions for the 2020-21 year.

Eagles End a History-Making Season

The boy’s basketball team made a statement when they rolled through the Pioneer League with an unblemished 10-0 record. It was the first undefeated league campaign for the Eagles in fifty-four years. They improved their season record to 13-0 with their

Firehawks start one player over six foot, don’t particularly look imposing or athletic, but looks can be deceiving. Though less than 200 fans were comfortably sitting in the stands on the sides, the decibels were off the charts. With a loud, encouraging fan base at a fever pitch, the Firehawks fed off their energy and enthusiasm and controlled the game. There seemed to be a home court benefit for the host team, and the Eagles may have bowed to their advantage and fell 67-52.

The Eagles and Firehawks matched each other basket for basket in the first quarter at a frenzied pace. The Firehawks then had their biggest quarter of the game by outscoring the Eagles 26-13. Avaraham Halbert scored 17 of his team’s 26 points, including connecting on five of seven three-pointers.

In the third quarter, the Eagles had plenty of opportunities to make up a double-digit deficit, but they failed to connect on their outside game. The Eagles would make an uncharacteristic 14 percent from beyond the three-point line while their counterparts made over half of their attempts.

Early in the fourth quarter El Segundo fell behind by as many as 21 points but closed the gap to just nine points with four minutes remaining. The Firehawks held off the Eagles and went on to shatter their hopes of an undefeated season and hand El Segundo their first loss of the year. CJ Hardy, who made 12-13 free throws, ended his high school career with a game-high 29 points. In three playoff games, he averaged 34 points.

Eagle Swimmers Do Well at CIF Finals

El Segundo’s storied swim program can be traced back to the 1950s. Eight members of

Girl’s Lacrosse Loses to Corona Del Mar

The Eagles, behind the scoring punch of Syd Moeller and Grace Bonney, brought home the program’s first girl’s lacrosse league championship. They advanced to the first-ever CIF Southern Section Division 2 playoffs. Their first-round victory over Woodbridge (Irvine) catapulted them into the quarter-finals against second the seeded Corona Del Mar Sea Kings. The Eagles fell behind early on and fell to one of Orange County’s elite programs 13-8.

The Sea Kings demonstrated why they were seeded so high. With just 18 seconds into the game, Kate Kittleson found an opening and fired a shot into the net for a goal. Later on, with El Segundo trailing 2-0, the Eagles found the goal after pressuring Sea King goalie Eleanor Spotts. Teagan Meyer fired an overhand into the net off a rebound to give the Eagles their first goal. A little more than a minute later, Meyer scored the equalizer on an assist from Maya Jaeger to make it 2-2. The Sea Kings outscored the Eagles the rest of the half 5-0 to make it 7-2.

El Segundo fell behind 11-2 before the Eagles made a run. Grace Bonney scored from inside, followed by Syd Moeller’s crossing goal set up by Jaeger. Bonney’s second goal made it 11-5. Moeller would score her team’s final three goals, including one with 38 seconds left to make the final score 13-8.

The Eagles made a valiant effort from the opening to the final horn against their toughest opponent of the year. Nevertheless, it was a great season that saw the Eagles win a league title and win 13 games, both firsts for the program. •

local residents but also a veritable "Who's Who" of surfing.

Fuentes said that Van Hamersveld's artwork "provides a beautiful entrance to El Segundo. Seeing John Van Hamersveld's vibrant art installation," Fuentes said, "always makes me smile!"

Van Hamersveld marveled at his induction into the ESHS Hall-Fame, mentioning that when he saw his portrait gracing a school campus wall, he could not help but think that selected Hall-of-Famers usually were athletes, like baseballers the Brett Brothers or Scott McGregor, or maybe scientists (must admit those inductees' names were unfamiliar to me), not graphic artists.

Van Hamersveld also happens to be the talented man who designed the splashy poster for the still iconic 60's surf film, the Endless Summer. And, oh, by the way, he is credited with designing album covers, more than 300, for a few bands that you may have heard of, while he worked for Capitol Records in the mid-ish sixties as head of design/art director.

How did Van Hamersveld score the gig at Capitol Records? He said that at the time, his Endless Summer poster, which is featured in the Smithsonian, was "selling like hotcakes" in college campus bookstores and the like, and that he was invited to meet with a bigwig at Capitol Records. Van Hamersveld took his poster to the meeting, and the record executive made the (incorrect) assumption that Van Hamersveld also designed album covers.

Not quite, but Van Hamersveld said that he "didn't say a word" to correct the exec's false assumption and gladly accepted his nearly immediate job offer. This led to Van Hamersveld designing a boatload of more than 300 splashy, and oft-times, psychedelic album covers, including artwork and or promotional posters for the vinyl efforts of the Beatles, Rolling Stones, KISS, Grateful Dead, Blondie, the Beach Boys, Jimi Hendrix, and Jefferson Airplane. And he also (presumably) received a paycheck for his artistic work that graced publications like Esquire, Billboard, and the rock bible, Rolling Stone.

Van Hamersveld related that he was selected to design the artwork for the cover of the Beatles Magical Mystery Tour album. He said that the accompanying MMT film bombed, but that the album was not so shockingly, phenomenally successful. "That was my success there," he reminisced.

Van Hamersveld said that the "most unique" cover that he designed was for the Rolling Stones "Exile on Main Street" album, adding that his renderings that graced the old vinyl records allowed him to be "paid really well."

After finishing his tenure at Capitol Records, Van Hamersveld took advantage of burgeoning entrepreneurial opportunities that were blossoming some 50 years ago. Large record stores were starting to make their imprints in suburban concrete jungles, and, as luck would have it, flashy vinyl record jacket covers were a great way for stores to catch the eye (and open the wallets) of music aficionados.

On a personal aside, it is great to see the

Van Hamersveld started working to promote the artistry of album covers, leveraging the increasing media opportunities that were available during that timeframe. Down the road, he would take a teaching job at the same CalArts Institute where he had studied in the early '60s. Revisiting his old school, Van Hamersveld said, allowed him to network with a new era of creative minds and transition seamlessly into the new art scene.

Van Hamersveld, who will be turning 80 in September, continued plying his trade and was commissioned to design the official poster and 360-foot mural that promoted the 1984 Summer Olympics, which took place in Los Angeles. Among other creative endeavors, he has also designed the logo and a few of the buildings for the Fatburger chain, noting that he was again "well paid" designing the Fatburger trademark and multiple brick-and-mortar buildings for the successful hamburger chain.

Back to the beginnings of a creative genius, Van Hamersveld was born and raised in Baltimore, Maryland. His father was an aeronautical engineer, part of a team that was asked to relocate to California. After spending a year in Westchester, the family moved in 1951 to Lunada Bay. Because there was no high school, at the time, located anywhere near his home, and Redondo Beach Unified High School was booked to the gills, Van Hamersveld ended up making the commute to attend ESHS, which allowed him to become familiar with the gnarly waves that grace our portion of the Pacific Ocean.

Post-graduation, and as a part of the early 60's South Bay surfing scene (Van Hamersfeld credits local surfing legends Dave Velzy and Hap Jacobs as two of his heroes), he ended up designing a surfing magazine that caught the eye of a publishing rival. Van Hamersveld was coerced to come and work for the rival, and

artistic world were detailed in a renowned 11-minute short film, "Crazy World, Ain't It," the title of which is a Van Hamersveld catch phrase. The film visits with artists and scholars, who refer to Van Hamersveld as "a man of a different mind" and laud him as an artist who takes risks, not worrying about a possible rejection of his creative endeavors. It is worth spending a few minutes of your time to view.

At one point, the avid surfer Van Hamersveld said that he has not surfed in three decades. He said that it was in the early '90s that he started to hear about the rampant pollution that was fouling the oceans, and he decided that he would rather keep his surfboard, and himself, out of the still somewhat blue water.

When asked what hobbies he currently embraces, Van Hamersveld offered that he was too busy working and creating to invest too much time in other pursuits. So, as you near your 80th birthday, he was asked any thoughts of slowing down, of retiring?

"No reason to," he said. "I am too busy, working like a madman, trying to get it all done," though he did somewhat recant the madman's choice of words in a later interview. "Each day is an invention," he said. "You wake up, and there is something to do. You create something, and someone likes it, and you make more of (it). It is the process that I go through every day."

Van Hamersveld's Endless Summer has, fortuitously, lasted for more than fifty years. Shaka, brah! •

air pollution kills over 7 million people every year and takes 3 years off of every human's life expectancy, etc. Not the most reassuring statements. Attenborough doesn't leave us on a doom and gloom note and instead offers us some simple solutions that we can easily implement into our daily lives. A couple of takeaways to help reduce carbon emissions are to plant more trees and eat more plant-based foods, less red meat. These are cost-effective and achievable and can truly save the planet.

“It's a remarkable time to be alive,” he exclaims despite all the worrying news he just shared. If Sir David Attenborough – Earth's #1 loyalist – can still find reasons to be optimistic about our planet's future, then we should too. The facts may be scary, unsettling, and overwhelming but by taking small action steps, including educating yourself and others

by watching nature documentaries on Netflix, we can begin to create global change. •
