Postponed Hearing Caps Wild Week

El Segundo just went through one of the most eventful weeks ever. Peaceful demonstrations took place on its streets and corners. A new emergency briefly overshadowed the COVID-19 situation. Local restaurant dining rooms reopened. Within days, they were shutting down early because of a countywide curfew to curb rioting.

And because of George Floyd's tragic death caught on videotape, El Segundo residents told their own stories about being singled out by police because of their race.

A 6 p.m. curfew went into effect for El Segundo on Tuesday, June 2 - the same day the City Council was supposed to meet and hold a public hearing about 5G wireless technology. The hearing couldn't be held without violating the curfew, so city officials decided to reconvene the council the following afternoon, June 3.

The 5G presentation had special significance. It became the first public hearing ever in El Segundo to be conducted virtually - in an empty council chamber with the members watching and listening from a safe distance in the era of COVID-19.

Before the council heard about plans to build the sprawling wifi network across the city, officials first addressed the Black Lives Matter protests in El Segundo. When the council meeting began, approximately 85 demonstrators stood on the City Hall plaza. The sign-carrying crowd walked across the city, calling for justice and an end to racism, before ending back at City Hall for the rare afternoon council session.

At the urging of City Manager Scott Mitnick, a half-dozen people went inside the council

chambers and talked about racially tinged experiences with El Segundo police and residents. A father told a story about his 17-year-old African-American son being pulled out of a group of teammates by police officers and questioned for going door-to-door, asking for contributions for the El Segundo High School basketball program.

Cecil Brown, a five-year resident who is African-American, said the incident involving his son and five patrol officers happened three years ago. Five teammates were knocking on doors at twilight, asking for contributions for the basketball program, according to Brown. Five police cars arrived, and officers immediately pulled Brown's 6-foot, 3-inch

tall son out of the group and asked what he was doing, the father said.

"That was his first interaction with the police department," Cecil Brown said, adding his son is afraid to do anything like that now. The young man's mother fears for her son's life when he leaves the house, Brown said. "You may not understand that fear, but it's real."

Brown spoke up, so the City Council members understood "what we go through, as people of color, in this town," he said. While he complimented the quality of the schools and said security is strong within the city limits, Brown said some police behavior

I'm a music lover. And a father. And a son. And a voter. A husband. Brother. Grandson. Uncle. Cousin. Person. Citizen. Friend. Acquaintance. Reader. Hiker. Camper. Tennis player. Baseball player. Employee. Boss. Writer. Sports fan. Student. Teacher. Coach. Producer. Consumer. Therapist. Angeleno. New Orleanian. Dreamer. These are just some of my identities - some of the many hats I wear and have worn. I will certainly wear more in the future. No doubt you wear just as many hats as I do. If you can, please take a moment and write all of yours down. I suspect you will notice that not all hats are treated equally. Think of meeting someone new. Sophia Zago's Journey

Graduation from high school is the culmination of 13 years of schooling that started in kindergarten. Had the pandemic not shutdown our country, Friday night some 300 or so El Segundo high school seniors would have proudly walked through the highly decorated arches on their way to their seats.

The Pomp and Circumstance march would have serenaded the class of 2020 seniors, and speeches would've filled the air with remarks from school officials and students. One of those students would've been Sophia Zago. She would have flashed her signature smile as she strolled up to receive her diploma in front of thousands of well-wishers in the stands celebrating all the seniors. Instead, the outstanding cross country and track star will celebrate at home with her family and a select few friends.

Sophia is one of those people that has always felt the journey was the success, not the destination. She believes that focusing on the journey shines the light on what a person can get out of trying to reach one's goals. Her journey through the last 13 years has been a ride she wouldn't have missed. "I love going to school and seeing my friends between classes."

Sophia's senior year was marred by a pandemic that closed her school and all but ruined her final year of high school. She says it was a challenge not seeing her friends, but that didn't break her spirit or her friends, according to her. "I think the most challenging part about not attending school has been not seeing my friends, teachers, and teammates daily. I think I will miss my

teammates the most because I have spent the most time with them throughout the last four years."

With school a big part of Sophia's life, she says her favorite class is Medical Innovations, the last class on the Biomedical Pathway. This is another one of Sophia's footsteps she is taking along the way to becoming a highly successful person long after she graduates. She plans on attending the University of California, Irvine this fall and join a good friend and former Eagle teammate Nikki Fulcomer on the cross country team. "My major is in biological sciences, and I will be competing on their cross country and track teams as well."

Sophia is a great student, but she is one of the school's top female cross country and track athletes. She has been a three-year varsity letterman for the Eagles in both XC and Track. She is the school record holder in the three mile, 800m, and was a member of the 4x800 and 4x1600 school records teams. She is one of only three of the school's distance female runners to advance to the CIF finals; James Matlosz and Nikki Fulcomer are the others. She was the co-captain of the XC and Track program this past season. She helped lead the XC girl's team to their best overall team time finish at the state meet having helped them to a podium finish in 2018. Sophia leaves with the top five times in all distances for both XC and Track programs. She helped the Eagles secure their first girl's track league title in 2019. She is a remarkable talent that still has a lot left in the tank to help UCI this coming season. She admits

that running for the Anteaters will be a challenge, but she's ready to embrace that next chapter in her life.

Along her journey, Sophia has met many people who have influenced her and help guide her along the way. There was one person she pointed out who made the most significant impact on her, and she wanted to thank. "The biggest influence in my life has been my cross country and track coach, Marcos Bolanos. He is also my Economics/ Political Behavior teacher. He believed in my athletic abilities and constantly pushed me past my boundaries to help me reach my goals."

Sophia was an athlete well before she got to high school. She participated in many different sports when she was younger and always enjoyed the running aspect the most. In middle school, she started running cross country training and absolutely loved it, so she decided to continue to run for her high school team.

She's run in so many races over the past four years, but her favorite meet might be the CIF Southern Section Prelims her sophomore

year. In that race, she broke the school record in the 800m. The other meet she remembers is the Irvine Distance Carnival, "because it's a fast track and such a fun event for the whole team to PR."

Sofia has many immediate goals set in place, and one of them is to continue her training for cross country and be one of the team's top seven runners in the fall. She said, "I want to tackle my first collegiate 6K at UC Irvine and try chopping off time from my 5K."

In the long term, Sophia will embrace her journey at the collegiate level both in the classroom and competing for the Anteaters. "I hope to place at the Big West Conference Championships and continue running through graduate school and beyond."

As Sophia continues her drive towards her purpose, she knows the rewards will outweigh the challenges it took to get to her objective. She wanted to congratulate all the seniors graduating and said that this wasn't their final destination. The journey has merely just begun. •

toward people of color - including his other children - has bothered him.

Resident Paula Lee talked about an incident that happened to her husband, who is Asian. “When we moved to town, my husband was followed around town for several days,” she said. “I can start to understand what the black people in El Segundo go through.”

As a parent of biracial children, she sought to raise awareness about the taunting her family experiences. The behavior is subtle, she said, but her children definitely feel it. “I don’t even think the people of El Segundo think they (her children) are being treated differently because of the color of their skin,” Lee said.

Natasha Lee, who is a student at El Segundo High School, discussed how upset she was that a woman was videotaped removing Black Lives Matter posters along Main Street in the downtown area. The posters encouraged residents to support the campaign for equality. The Herald has reviewed the videotape, posted on Instagram by user 2mercury7. In the footage, a woman is seen pulling a flier from a light post in the 400 block of Main Street. The video was shared on social media, the same day that protesters peacefully walked down Grand Avenue and Main Street to support Black Lives Matter.

The woman in the video was identified as Claire Maxwell, the sister of Councilwoman Carol Pirsztuk. Pirsztuk addressed the incident at the council meeting, saying her sister admitted it was wrong to remove the Black Lives Matter fliers. The city’s code-compliance department should have been contacted, the councilwoman said.

Pirsztuk then read a statement in which she expressed sadness for the “senseless, tragic death” in Minneapolis of George Floyd. The City Council and the police department respect diversity and promote inclusion, her statement said. The councilwoman agreed with Cecil Brown. The community will need to work harder in the future on the issues raised by the protesters. “We are open and committed to work with the community, and grow and improve,” Pirsztuk pledged.

She encouraged young people to keep speaking up for racial equality for people of color while insisting that killings and targeting of African-Americans be stopped. “We do want change for our community,” she added.

Mayor Drew Boyles spoke with the protesters and came away impressed with their message and commitment to stopping violent encounters between police and African-Americans. “It was a humbling experience to be in the midst of so many passionate members of our society,” the mayor said while acknowledging prejudice and racial bias still exists in El Segundo. He has witnessed changes though in his 25 years here.

“We have work to do,” the mayor said, ticking off a number of initiatives for promoting the call to help people of color to feel safe and thrive in the community. The mayor credited a local high school student with articulating several promising solutions and said he is listening. One idea: more funding for the Arts and Culture Committee.

El Segundo could make diversity a bigger priority in budget discussions and policy decisions, Boyles suggested. The goal could be added to the city’s strategic planning document, too.

Police Chief Bill Whelan praised the El Segundo demonstrators who alerted the city about planned protests and avoided the ugly scenes in Los Angeles and Santa Monica. “I couldn’t be more proud of our community how they came together to voice their concerns peacefully,” he said.

The chief made a rare admission: Law-enforcement in U.S. cities has a racist history. Whelan has witnessed racist behavior in his police career, which led him to research and write a paper about the friction between officers and Africans-Americans, he said. Though municipal police and sheriff’s departments have tried to address the practices with

diversity training, “it hasn’t been enough,” the chief said.

Whelan called George Floyd’s death “unfathomable” that police officers could watch a man die and not render aid.

“There’s a lot of pain out there,” he said after receiving hundreds of emails from people.

A deeper conversation has begun in U.S. communities, he believes. The El Segundo protesters asked city officials and the residents to think about how their actions, attitudes and silence perpetuates racism in America. And the chief and the council are listening.

“I don’t think we’re going to move forward by pointing fingers at the police department and saying that you have racist cops,” Chief Whelan said. “We certainly will do everything we can to fix that. But I think as a community, we need to acknowledge the responsibility is on all of us to fix this.”

Now, about the 5G wireless hearing: Because of COVID-19 restrictions on public events and crowds, the open hearing took place in an empty council chamber. Council members watched Planning Manager Greg McLain’s presentation via the Internet.

The council heard what the technology can do, why El Segundo needs to build a 5G wireless network and the options in the design and placement of the antennas around the city.

In the public hearing about bringing 5G wireless signal to El Segundo, Planning Manager Greg McLain explained the new-generation wifi is required of cities by the federal government. The council has some latitude in the design and appearance of the 5G network. The plan is to attach antennas on utility poles throughout the city and conceal the equipment under spherical covers, McLain explained.

5G signal is weaker than the current 4G and doesn’t travel as far, so more antennas are needed to minimize any “dead zones” once carriers build their 5G networks. The technology is integral to self-driving cars and digital health devices that relay a patient’s medical data in real-time. No one addressed the council during the virtual public hearing, which capped the wild week at City Hall.

Two local emergency orders were in effect simultaneously. A revised COVID-19 order allowed restaurants and retailers to reopen if they maintained social distancing. It also encouraged residents to come out and support local businesses. But, last week’s curfew - aimed at halting street violence and clashes between police and Black Lives Matter protesters in Greater Los Angeles - ordered people to be home by dinner time.

The nightly curfew has been lifted. El Segundo is considering closing Richmond Street to boost restaurant and retail foot traffic so businesses can reopen. Council members Lance Giroux and Carol Pirsztuk urged the city manager and planners to act quickly on behalf of local businesses coming back from a three-month shutdown. •

prison. He is a young father who supports his girlfriend and daughter and is determined to make up for lost time. Set in Oakland, CA, flashbacks reveal the last day in Oscar’s life, in which he became swept up in an altercation with police that ended in a senseless tragedy.

Raoul Peck’s documentary uses the words of late-author James Baldwin to tell the story of race in modern America.
