Training Exercises Keep Local Fire Personnel on Their Toes

Just in case anyone noticed some smoke emanating from the refinery around the middle of last month, there was nothing to worry about. It was all planned. The controlled flames were part of a joint exercise between the El Segundo, Manhattan Beach and Chevron fire departments and constitute just one example of how multiple agencies in the area collaborate to stay on top of their game when it comes time to respond to actual incidents. “The culture of El Segundo, as well as nearby departments, is that training is always a top priority,” Division Chief “C” Platoon Casey Snow, who heads the training division for El Segundo Fire Department (ESFD), said. “It’s the best way we can prepare to be effective. This philosophy is ingrained in us from our hiring date and even before.”

ESFD participates in an automatic aid program that encompasses Chevron and LA County, as well as the cities of Los Angeles, Manhattan Beach, Redondo Beach, and Torrance. When a major call for service occurs here and overwhelms local resources beyond what personnel can handle, outside units will deploy to El Segundo to assist. This also includes law enforcement agencies. “We will also be automatically dispatched to help in those other cities if we receive a request to do so,” Snow noted. Under a separate mutual aid arrangement, El Segundo firefighters will also travel to locations throughout California as needed.

Snow stressed the importance of making the training events as realistic as possible. Earlier in the spring, the Manhattan Beach Fire Department invited ESFD to participate in a rare simulation of a residential fire in which people were trapped on the second floor of a two-story home. “Our engine was

assigned to attack flames on the first floor while also conducting search and rescue for victims,” Snow said. “This was important because it allowed us to train on an actual structure rather than using props.”

The departments typically won’t know if a home might be available for such an exercise until the very last minute. “We work with local realtors to keep us informed about possible opportunities,” Snow explained. “When the chance arises, we always take advantage.” In the case of the Manhattan Beach residence, the homeowner’s contractor offered use of the property before its ultimate demolition. Both departments sent two engines to the residence, and about 25 personnel took part.

To make an exercise realistic, ESFD often uses smoke machines, as it did for a major drill last year at El Segundo High School. The campus simulated a multi-casualty incident using actual people as volunteers. Dummies may be employed when humans are not available or feasible in these operations.

Often, ESFD will train for a certain type of event and, sure enough, end up going out on a real-life call soon after under very similar conditions. “A basic call can expand in our minds and become a ‘what if’ game, and that turns into another training opportunity,” Snow explained.

To prepare for a wild or brush fire scenario, ESFD personnel may set up shop at a park or open expanse with grass and practice deploying a hose line, creating a shelter, and running through various assignments to prepare for an inevitable major event, given California’s past and recent history. This training was especially important when El Segundo units assisted during the devastating blazes that scorched the Pacific Palisades and Altadena areas early last year.

After each exercise, the department conducts a deep dive into how communications proceeded during the event. “We evaluate if everyone was on the same page as far as instruction and command,” Snow said. “You get a feel for how quickly a person is rescued. At the same time, you have to balance responding and protecting your own city and getting your training in. If an emergency occurs during training, we have crew who can break off. It’s like Murphy’s Law, where we seem to get calls where one of our units has to go off to an emergency and then return to the training.”

Snow pointed out that new ESFD members must graduate from the fire academy before their start date. Then, once on board, they go through a one-year probationary period, with extensive training as a key component of their daily routine. Currently, the department, when fully staffed, employs 43 personnel who work in three-day shifts that stagger so that 14 (plus the fire chief) are on duty daily. All disciplines within the organization, from emergency medical to firefighting to search and rescue, participate in an average of two hours of training per day. “We have a training cadre comprised of our members from all different ranks with an annual plan that spells out what we do daily and quarterly,” Chief Snow said. “Being in charge of the training is a mix of everything I’ve learned. Some of it is mandated by the State and OSHA [Occupational Safety and Health Administration], and then we have additional programs through our organization. Some of our members also go to outside agencies and get certifications to become instructors.” The overall training additionally includes succession planning. Members will play the

Celina grew up in rural Puerto Rico and even as a young girl she would help her mother who appears to have suffered dementia. At night, Celina’s mom would wander off into the sugarcane fields, and Celina would find her and lead her back to her bed. Eventually, when Celina’s mom passes away, she moves in with her much older and stricter sister. Celina helped her sister as well by working out of her home and wanted to make their home feel special by bringing

in wildflowers she picked. Celina was always making friends and would be a listening ear to those who were lonely. An example being an elderly neighbor she noticed on her walks home from school. Eventually, this neighbor would wait for her every school day so that they could have a chat. When Celina was seventeen, she decided to leave Puerto Rico and join the U.S. Army during World War II. She was stationed in New York City and was dazzled by all the sights and sounds and decided to make New York City home. Celina went on to study and become a nurse since she loved helping others. She would help not just patients at the hospital but her neighbors and friends as well. At the end of her life, many loved ones were right by her side caring for her and spending time with her, which shows just how much Celina meant to them. roles of those ranked above them so they can learn and advance when opportunities for promotion arise.

Meanwhile, Snow and staff convene at the end of each year to evaluate the effectiveness of the training effort and fine-tune it for the future. “We are always looking to improve, and we create a new plan for the following year based on our evaluations that is posted on our website, elsegundofd.gov,” he said. “The focus is to be ready for any kind of

incident that could happen in El Segundo and throughout the state if a mutual aid situation occurs. We have to be well-rounded enough to deal with anything that comes our way.”

Coming up next on the calendar is a multi-agency exercise in a commercial high-rise, which presents its own challenges. Regardless, the department aims to be ready. “It’s an ongoing process,” Snow said. “We are never going to be fully trained, but we will continue to get better through our experiences...” •

Athletes Honored for Male and Female Athlete of the Year

With the 2025-26 school year officially in the books, plenty of year-end awards, scholarships, and recognitions were distributed. Included were the Harvey Hazeltime Male Athlete of the Year Award and the Debbie Landreth Female Athlete of the Year Award. It takes a special person to stand out as the best at a sport. Couple that with excellence in the classroom, and you have a recipe for 'Athlete of the Year'. This year, Cooper Albano was named the Harvey Hazeltime Award winner, while Kalista McMillon was named the Debbie Landreth Award recipient.

Harvey Hazeltime Award

The Harvey Hazeltime Award Male Athlete of

the Year Award was named after the school's first athletic coach. Mr. Hazeltime was the coach for all sports beginning in 1927, the year El Segundo High School opened its doors. Mr. Hazeltime coached football, basketball, baseball, and track. At that time, they were the only sports offered at ESHS. He was also a math teacher, and upon his retirement in 1960, the El Segundo High School Football field was named in his honor.

To further honor Hazeltime and what he meant to the school, an award for the best senior male athlete was formed and presented for the first time in 1960. Over the next sixty-six years, a total of 77 athletes were named Harvey Hazeltime Athlete of the Year. The winner, or,

during some years, winners, were selected based on excellence in a sport or sports, their good standing, their academic performance, and their leadership. This perpetual award recognizes a male senior athlete who has excelled in athletics (50%), in the classroom (25%), and as a leader among their peers (25%).

The first honorees in 1960 were a pair of extraordinary athletes. Pete Beathard was an outstanding quarterback who later played in the old AFL, and Bob Flynn was a gifted baseball player who played professionally. They were selected and formed the foundation for being named the Harvey Hazeltime Award winner, as the best school's athlete. Sixty-six years later, it continues to resonate

today as a prestigious award.

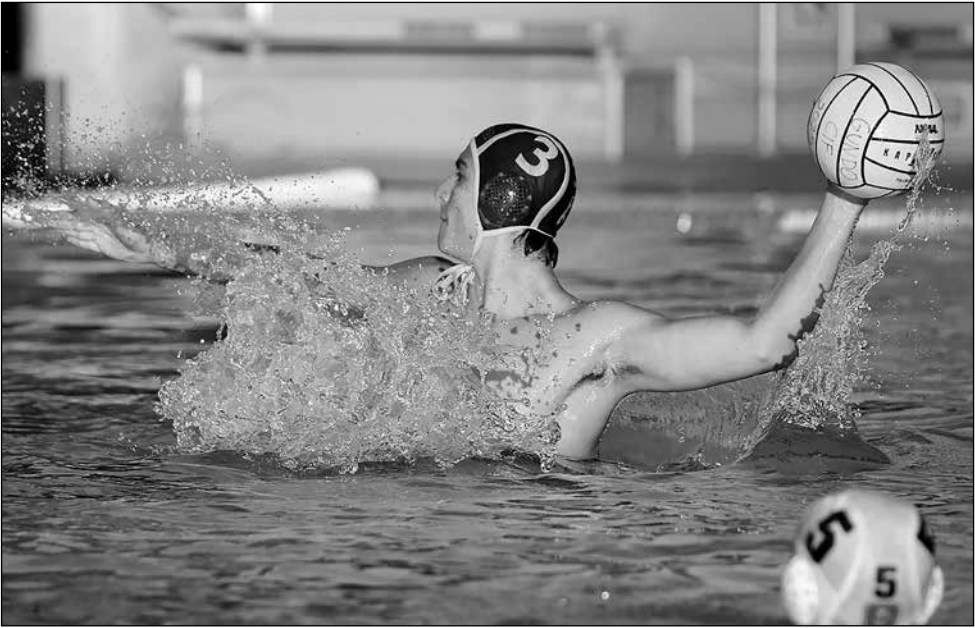
Looking back at the winner's names and you'll find fifteen who played professionally, five who were Olympians, a father, Jim Puffer (1968), and his son, Jon Puffer (1997), and four sets of brothers.

This year's winner, Cooper Albano, is a well-decorated water polo player. But his accolades in the pool are only half the story. His brilliance in the classroom earned him Academic All-American honors in 2023. In his sophomore year (2023), he was also named to the All-Pioneer League, All-South Bay, and All-CIF Division 3 teams. In his junior year, he earned All-Pioneer League

Directions

and All-CIF Division 1 team honors. As a senior, Cooper was named the Offensive Player of the Year in the Bay League and first team All-CIF Division 2. He capped a brilliant high school career by being named an Academic All-American.

In 2023, he helped his team to an undefeated CIF championship season, the only undefeated CIF championship season in school history. In his ESHS career, he helped lead the Eagles to a record of 92-27 and sits in the school record books as the third all-time in goals and points scored and second all-time in assists.

Cooper will study Finance at Wagner College (Staten Island, New York) in the fall.

Debbie Landreth Award

Debbie was the first premier female athlete in the era of competitive girls’ sports. She

Kalista was a starter on the basketball team for three years, where she led the Eagles in rebounds and was selected to the All-Ocean League. She was named to the All-Tournament team in the Artesia Tournament and the team’s Girls’ Basketball Eagle Award.

She is a four-year starter on the lacrosse team, has earned numerous honors, and is an All-America nominee. Kalista helped the Eagles to consecutive CIF Division 2 Lacrosse championship appearances and win the 2026 title. Kalista was named to three

All-Ocean League First teams, including the Ocean League’s MVP, as a junior. She was named to the All-Area First team twice and selected to two All-CIF first teams.

If that weren’t enough, Kalista was involved in the school choir as a Section Leader and Finance Director, and was a part-time youth coach.

Kalista will study Sports Management at the University of Colorado, Colorado Springs, and play lacrosse for the Mountain Lions. She says her favorite memory is playing for a CIF Southern Section title twice and winning her senior year.

Kalista thanked her mother and father for their passionate support throughout her journey, her coaches for providing her guidance, and her amazing teammates, whom she can call her family. •

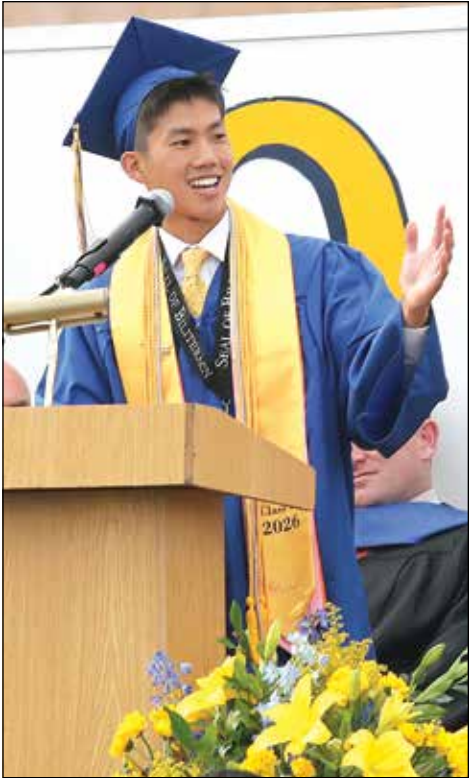

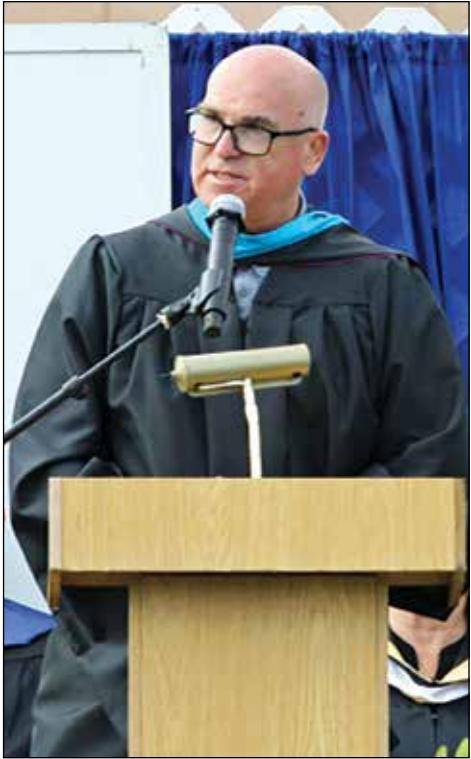

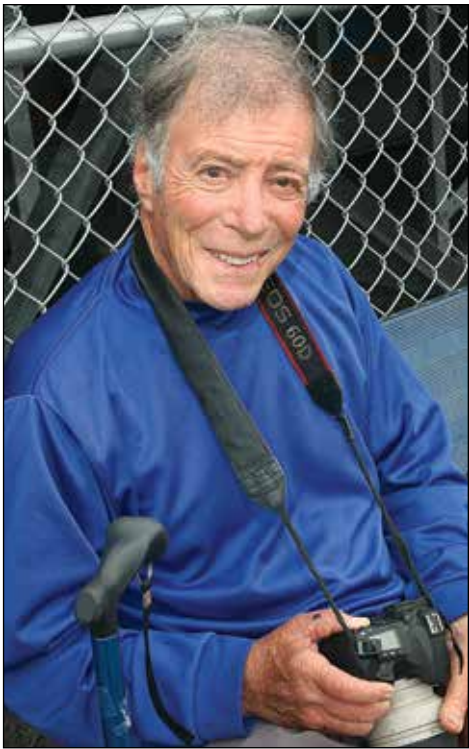

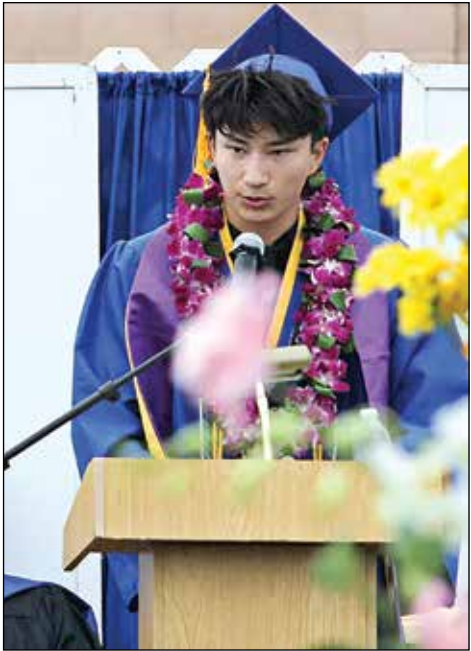
