Lifelong Musician Dayton Borders Makes Triumphant Return to El Segundo

Peering out at the packed house lined with family and treasured old friends cheering him on, Dayton Borders had every reason to let his emotions get the best of him. After all, it had been over 20 years since his last gig in El Segundo. But ultimately, professionalism kicked in, and he entertained the Old Town Patio audience for three hours, jumping across a variety of musical genres while bouncing back and forth between guitar and keyboards. The afternoon proved to be a resounding success. It provided Borders with an opportunity to come full circle, reconnect with his roots and reflect upon a varied and lengthy career that launched in the South Bay and included many interesting stops along the way.

Dayton Mark Borders was a child when his mother drove the family across the country in a '57 Chevy Bel Air in the mid-1960s. She landed a job at a tool factory, began dating the owner, and the crew moved into a house on Penn Street with a horse living in the garage at one point. He matriculated through the local school system and made a number of pals he still keeps in touch with to this day. He was heavily into sports as a teen. "I remember riding in packs on our bicycles picking up friends along the way while increasing our numbers as we went," he recalled. "We eventually ended up at Rec Park or Standard field carrying our baseball gear for our games, or somewhere by the forbidden railroad tracks ominously known as Devils Path."

Yet the literal key to Borders' future sat right in his living room. "There was a piano in the house, and I loved making up melodies," he said. That early interest in music led him to take classical piano lessons at the age of seven. Due to his natural talent and keen ear, he could memorize pieces while

pretending to sightread. "I did not fool my teacher though with my embellishments," he noted. "Somehow a little honky tonk was getting mixed in with the Beethoven. She then introduced me to [ragtime composer] Scott Joplin. She was a great teacher."

However, one pivotal evening cemented Borders' career aspirations. Lying under the covers with his flashlight, he had his little red plastic radio tuned to the AM radio station KDAY, listening to legendary DJ Wolfman Jack spin some tunes. An Elvis Presley song called "Don't Cry, Daddy" began to play, and that was when everything changed. "It crushed me knowing my dad was in Vietnam," he said. "I was sobbing. My mom heard me and came in the room and asked what was wrong. When I told her about the song, she

Condo Tenants Sweat Out AC Delays

(Editor's note: This is an update of an article the Herald published on March 19.)

The residents of the two-story Oak Park Condominium complex near east Oak and Main streets aren't sure they'll get their LAX-funded air-conditioning systems, however, they haven't lost hope — or their cool. Their project is stuck in a holding pattern, unable to move forward until the parties agree on where a new transformer goes.

The homeowner association has not applied for the permits, but knows from speaking with the city's Community Development Director Michael Allen that the plan for Edison's transformer to be placed in front of the property and facing the high school violates the set-back requirement spelled out in the building code.

"Yes, we are down but, by no means, out," Janet Hodgman said in early August. Though one of the HOA board members "threw in the towel" on the air-conditioning and heating upgrades, Hodgman and others haven't given up asking for a meeting with all four parties represented, hoping it will break the impasse and green light the costly improvements the condo board signed up when it signed a contract with LAWA's RSI office.

The delay came to light in mid-March when Hodgman and other owners spoke at a City Council meeting and laid out their case for why the building-permit office should issue a variance for high-voltage equipment closer than 10 feet to the property line. An Edison project manager recommended the

Overall, this short read was extremely satisfying, and I recommend if you enjoyed Remarkably Bright Creatures or The Borrowed Life of Frederick Fife.

asked if I would like to go see Elvis. I said yes, and she took me to the Forum, and that was it. There was Elvis in a big white jumpsuit coming out onto the stage. He opened his mouth and began to sing with this beautiful voice, and I got goosebumps, and at the same time a lady to the right of us passed out. Then a couple of seconds later, a lady to the left of us passed out. I looked at my mom and said, ‘That’s what I want to do.’” Of course, he meant pursuing a life in music (not passing out).

From then on, it was all about singing and playing. Well, except for a stint working

for El Segundo Recreation and Parks taking care of the trees and grounds. Always an avid sportsman, he additionally studied and trained in martial arts for many years. “I taught martial arts for the City and even had a dinosaur-based art class for kids,” he said.

Borders hit the ground running as a working musician, performing with several bands and eventually touring in a multitude of states and countries where he had the chance to experience different ways of life and visit locales he might not have otherwise seen. Among the highlights, his touring combo TNT was an opening act for the famed East LA band Los Lobos. He also sang and played with John Denver and worked with notable artists such as former Yes and Moody Blues keyboardist Patrick Moraz, Crosby, Stills, Nash & Young drummer Dallas Taylor, and The Cure founding drummer Lol Tolhurst. “I also did a lot of session work and co-writing and produced with all kinds of electro/acoustic artists, even with some heavy metal bands,” he added. “I have many pieces that ended up on shows and/or films.”

Borders’ most successful collaboration came with singer Patty Holley in the band Izon Eden. They targeted the casino market and hit pay dirt, performing at venues from San Diego to Temecula before graduating to the Las Vegas circuit. “We opened for many acts, including The Family Stone, The Temptations, Sha Na Ma, The Kingsmen and Ambrosia,” he said. “One time, the agent said our crowd had gone over 5,000 people. We did this for 20 years.”

As is the case with any longtime performer, not every gig is a winner. Playing in a group called The Men in the 1990s, Borders and company auditioned at a Torrance dive joint one mid-afternoon. “There was one angry

man with his head in his hands sitting at the bar,” he said. “We played one song, and the guy yelled, ‘I’ll give you 50 bucks to shut up and get the hell out of here!’ I looked at my boys and then looked at the man. I said, ‘I’ll take the 50 bucks.’ He handed me the money, and we packed up. We called our friends to come meet us at the rehearsal studio, set up again, and had a jam party. The beer was furnished by an angry old man.”

Blessed with a baritone voice that can reach the utter depths of the bass range with the ability to hit high ranges as needed, Borders became a multi-instrumentalist over the years to the point that he is completely self-sufficient when performing solo. At the Old Town Patio, he explained that he is a “studio nerd” who spends hours creating his own backing tracks so he can play along with those in live settings. This allows him the flexibility to add drums and textures to get the crowd on their feet, especially when he unexpectedly follows up a Johnny Cash nugget with an ‘80s dance hit. The setlist is all over the map, and that keeps Borders and his listeners on their toes. In addition to Elvis and Cash, his influences include the likes of The Beatles, Bob Dylan, Deep Purple, Elton John, early Genesis and The Who, among others. But he is not stuck in any one era and remains open to trying just about anything that fits his style, which is hard to describe but involves adding a slight Country edge to the proceedings. The years of practice and fine-tuning ultimately paid dividends. “I would say that many hours on your instrument for many years undoubtedly widens your capabilities,” he said. “I’m able to play and sing songs that I may not have attempted years earlier.”

While playing mainly covers at gigs, Borders also mixes in a few originals. His studio

know-how allows him to produce music that sounds full and complete. “I get more requests for original music as time goes on,” he was pleased to report. “I am being told more and more that I am on people’s playlists and that is very cool.” One particular tune, “Driving To Las Vegas,” gets the most consistent and enthusiastic response. At the Old Town Patio, the friend who adamantly persuaded him to record it was in the audience and was happy to hear it again. “In songwriting, I seem to have a much wider view of situations and empathy for different people from different walks of life.”

While still residing in El Segundo, Borders was married and is dad to three grown daughters. But in 2004, he decided to move to Big Bear partially because he loved the mountains and it had a comforting small-town vibe that felt familiar to his upbringing. It was also a convenient spot between San Diego and Las Vegas where Izon Eden traveled the bulk of the year. “I always dreamt of having a little studio and making music up there,” he said. “Izon Eden was getting more steady work in Big Bear at taverns and city events. We mixed that in with our casino shows for many years. Eventually Covid canceled our casino contracts, and I started doing more solo work very close to home there. It was time to focus on songwriting and producing.”

It was also time to finally consider a return to El Segundo. One of Borders’ daughters thought it would be fun for him to play in his hometown again after such a long time away. Back in the day, he held a regular slot at the “Old” Stick & Stein, but he didn’t know where he could find a booking in 2026. A few helpful connections paved the way. “Turns out her friend owns a place with kind of a cowboy vibe at the end of Richmond Street,” he said of the Old Town Patio. “Also turns out her friend and his brother were probably old students of mine. And to top it off, their dad is an old classmate and El Segundo High School buddy of mine. This is small town America at its best.”

The gig went well enough that Borders got invited back and will return to the venue on Sunday, August 30 for a second go-around. The arrangement also works out perfectly since he comes to town every few weeks anyway to visit his three grandkids.

As for the future, Borders plans to sing and play until he drops. “I don’t really have a choice,” he said. “I am always hearing something in my head. I wake up and hum gravelly-voiced ideas into my phone. I hear somebody talking in a conversation and think, ‘That sentence is a song.’ It is ongoing and persistent. When I am working on a new original, it loops over and over for days in my head until it is done. Being a musician is a gift I don’t take for granted.” •

location in front of the building, which at least one other multi-family dwelling nearby was permitted to do, they argued.

Hodgman suspects that aesthetics are behind his office's opposition to allowing Edison to install a transformer and a metal cover over a ground-based transformer in front of the East Oak Avenue property.

"I felt this whole concept of setback was unfair when there are a thousand metal boxes and poles all over this down and several that violate setback rules. When setback is for aesthetics, that does not supersede the need for electricity," she said recently.

"Yes, we could start the permit process for windows only, but according to LAWA that precludes us from pursuing the AC at all. We need AC to be able to close the windows. We need the windows closed to prevent the sound and pollution, solve the mosquito problem for our owners, and the smells from the refinery and the sewage plant," she added.

Hodgman is pushing for a meeting where Allen sits down in the room with representatives from Edison, the HOA, and the airport's RSI program. The contract the property owners signed with LAWA's RSI program stipulated work on the project must begin by August 2027, giving the parties ample time to find a solution that breaks the deadlock before the contract is voided and the condo project is dead.

Allen thinks there might be a misunderstanding about his department's role. Under the LAWA-RSI contract, the applicant isn't the homeowner association, he told the Herald. It's LAWA that must come to an agreement with Edison about the transformer. The city's role is limited to issuing the construction permits.

This isn't the first time a soundproofing program project has run into code problems, according to Allen. An older apartment complex on west Imperial agreed to lose two parking spaces to comply with the setback requirement in the city's building code. Allen lists four options available to the Oak Avenue HOA.

- Mounting a transformer on the ground, 10 feet from the property line and building.
- Hanging transformer buckets on the pole at the street.
- Placing Edison's equipment underground in a vault.
- Piggybacking on an existing ground transformer next door.

The last possibility would tie into an existing electrical transformer used by the apartment complex next door. However, the property owners have been unavailable to meet to discuss letting the East Oak Street condos piggyback on the neighboring electrical equipment. It could be modified to power both buildings.

Allen has communicated the option to the couple who own the apartment building, but setting up a meeting has proven difficult. The couple have told Allen they're busy, worrying Hodgman they won't agree to it.

"This is perhaps (that) they don't want us to be part of their solution," she said. It's possible that LAWA could assert itself and pressure the apartment owners to come to the table or risk losing 12 air-conditioning units that paid for by LAWA's residential soundproofing program. LAWA did not respond to the Herald's request for comment.

Hodman says there are issues that need to be answered about whether the property owners control the equipment or the utility company. "Who maintains it and who has the right to use the transformer as part of the SCE TD (transmission and distribution) map?"

The airport-area's new Edison rep wasn't able to make a July 29 meeting between Allen and a condo board rep, and Allen is trying

to schedule another meeting soon to go over the electrical-power options. Clearing away the red tape keeping the LAWA improvement project at 123 Oak Avenue in limbo is his goal, he said.

"It's my understanding that the property owner covers the upfront costs for any service extensions/equipment modifications (such as an upgraded pad-mounted transformer) that is required to meet the increased load. In this case, since this work is part of the LAWA RSI program, these costs would be burdened by LAWA," he said.

The tenants' frustration is relatable, considering the heat as of late. El Segundo hit 80 degrees or higher nine times since mid-July, according to AccuWeather. The heat and humidity continue in August, hitting the 80-degree mark three times in the first nine days, according to the weather-reporting website. A 10-day forecast shows El Segundo's heat index reaching 84 degrees starting on Sunday and continuing into the week.

"We are caught between this rock and a hard place in this literal power struggle," Hodgman told the Herald. •

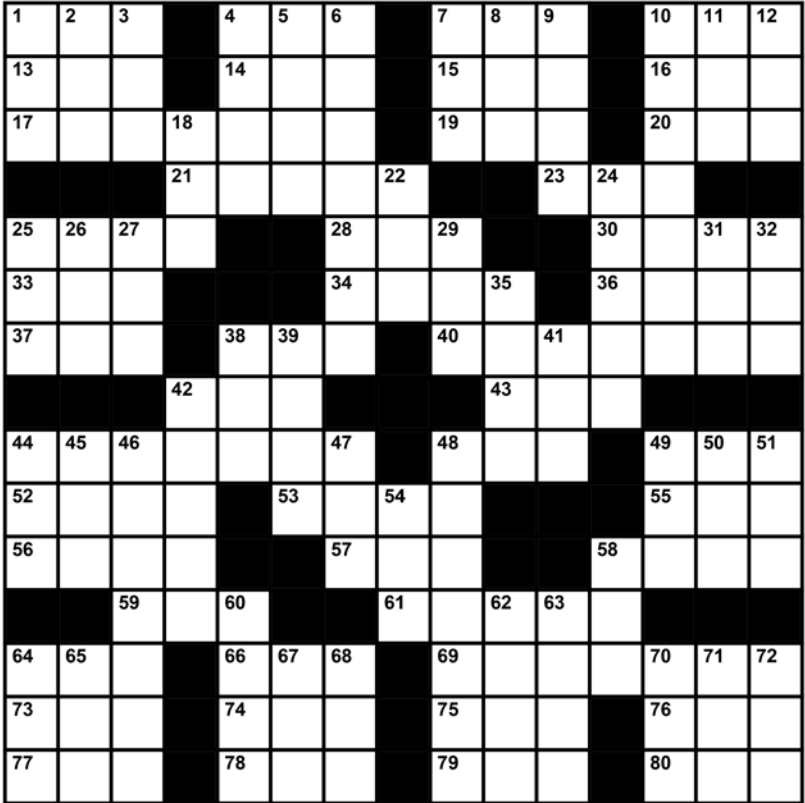
DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN:

California's Urban Water Management Planning Act requires the update of Urban Water Management Plans (UWMP) every five (5) years. The UWMP outlines how the City will meet current and projected water demands within its service area, with emphasis on water conservation and the continued use of imported and recycled water to provide its customers a reliable, high quality supply of water. The City of El Segundo has prepared its 2026 Urban Water Management Plan update and is hosting a public hearing for its adoption.

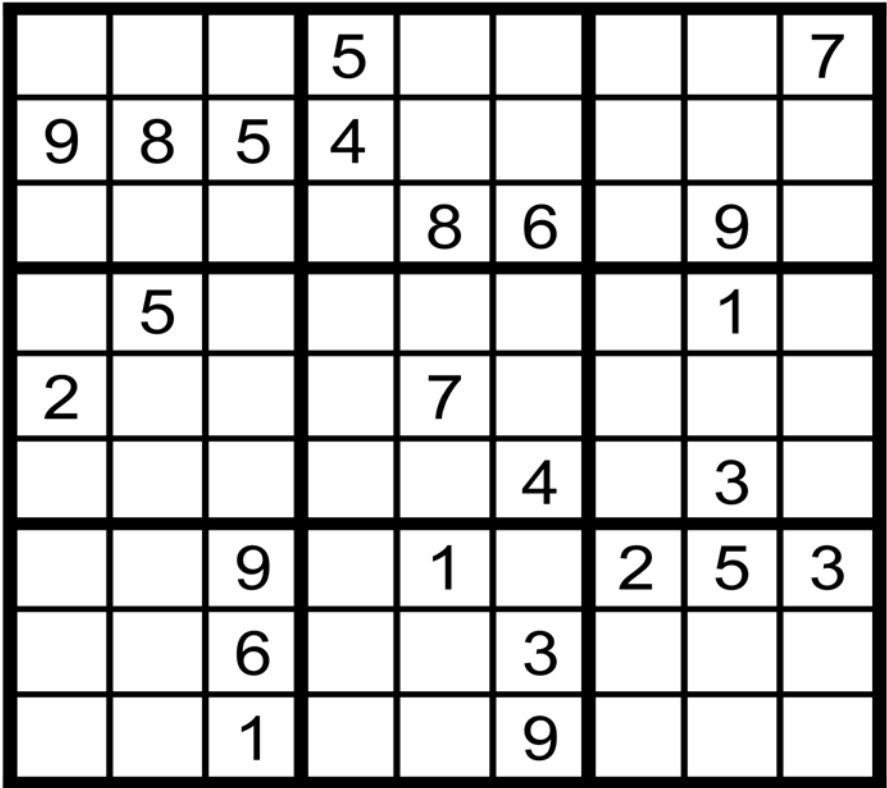

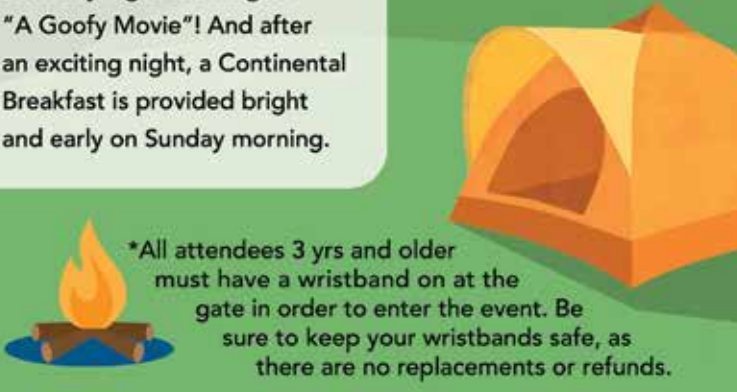
