TopGolf and City Council Move Closer to Lakes Remodel Agreement

As has been the case recently, the TopGolf issue again took center stage during Tuesday night's El Segundo City Council meeting with the latest updates revealed on the ongoing negotiations to finalize the due diligence agreement connected with leasing the driving range portion of The Lakes at El Segundo. City Attorney Mark Hensley characterized discussions over the last two weeks as "fruitful," with some progress made in two key areas. A potential sticking point presented at the August 4 meeting, TopGolf previously indicated that it would not be willing to be the guarantor (entity that pays for someone else's debt in the event of default) for the construction of the course and initial seven-year operational period—but would rather bring in a new guarantor of "equal financial strength."

Hensley reported that TopGolf has now agreed to be the guarantor for the construction—deemed the riskiest portion of the project while the course is torn up. But the company explained that for accounting purposes, it must use a subsidiary (that will need to be capitalized) as guarantor for the seven-year operational period. The City will bring in a consultant to review and confirm the financial strength of the entities.

TopGolf presented the City with an either/or option on offering discounted pricing (fees commensurate with other public ranges in the area) for patrons who just want to hit balls or warm up in the early morning hours: The deal would be open to El Segundo residents only from 6 a.m. to noon, or to all users regardless of where they live from 6 a.m. to 9 a.m. Councilmember Marie Fellhauer was adamant that only El Segundo residents ought to receive the discount, stating that the City has been

subsidizing out-of-town golfers at The Lakes for many years and that the situation has to stop. "Our responsibility is to protect our residents," she maintained. Though he admitted the 6 to 9 a.m. window was too narrow, Councilmember Mike Dugan explained that the suggestion to open the discount to all users came from the City's Golf Course Subcommittee since only 10 to 15 percent of The Lakes customers come from El Segundo. He argued that expanding the discount to all users provides an opportunity to "practice golf without participating in the TopGolf adventure." The rest of the Council agreed with Fellhauer's position.

Councilmember Dave Atkinson lamented that it has taken so long to resolve TopGolf, though he applauded Dugan for "getting us a better deal." He pointed to the financial benefits of annual lease dollars as well as revenues eventually coming in from alcoholic beverage sales. "I don't understand why this is such a hassle," he said, urging the City to simply move forward instead of continuing to go back and forth. Hensley indicated that the item will come back to the Council sometime next month with final tweaking and a potential vote to follow soon thereafter.

Davis and DeRosa Physical Therapy Expands Their Presence on Main Street

Davis and DeRosa Physical Therapy, Inc., moved into their current 325 Main Street location in 2005, doubling their square footage to 2,000 square feet. A few months ago, the practice once again expanded when they took over the adjacent space, previously occupied by Touch Institute. The addition more than doubled their space again.

Troy Davis and Chris DeRosa moved to El Segundo in 2003 when they occupied an office in the 300 block of Richmond Street with their introductory practice of physical therapy. Until Davis and DeRosa Physical Therapy, Inc., there had not been an office dedicated solely to physical therapy (PT).

"Back in 2003 we were just so happy to be in El Segundo," said DeRosa, "and then we moved to Main Street in 2005. We saw an increase in patients as our visibility

made people more aware of our practice."

As Chris said during a previous interview, "Moving to Main Street was like moving up to the 'big kids' table!" Both Davis and DeRosa live in town and Chris can often be seen walking the practice's "watchdog," Jackson, down Main Street. (The practice's previous popular "watchdog," Caffrey, passed away six and a half years ago.)

The PT partnership began after each of them left two separate private PT companies, seeing the need for a practice right here in El Segundo. At the time they opened their practice, the timing was right -- personally, professionally, and economically -- for downtown El Segundo.

Chris DeRosa, a native New Yorker, born and raised in the borough of Queens, holds a degree in exercise physiology

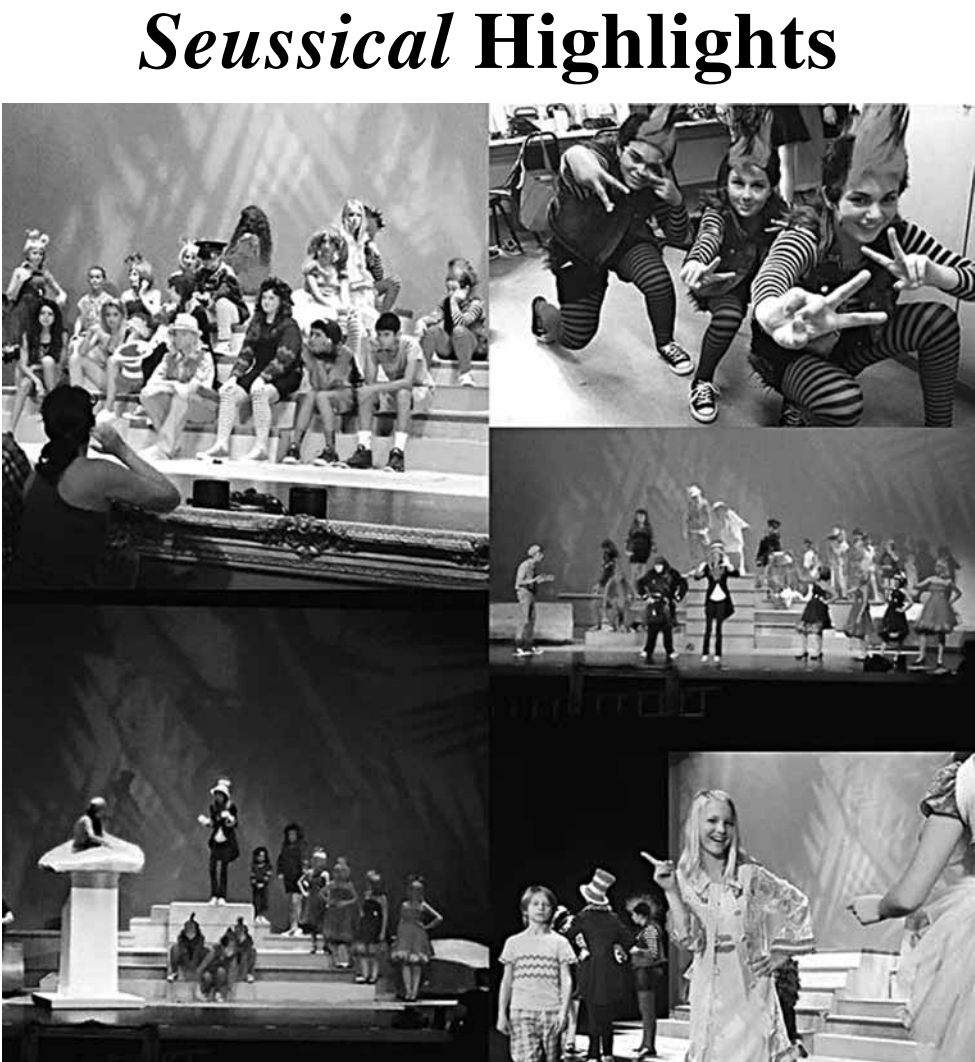

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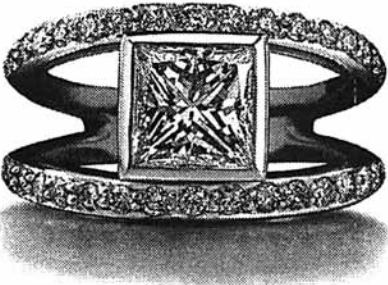
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Film Review

Shaun the Sheep Movie Rivals Inside Out for 2015's Best Animated Feature (Thus Far)

It's August. If summer was just a weekend, this month would obviously be Sunday – everybody was working for the weekend, but now they're scrambling back for the weekdays. The cinema's release slate is merely a reaction to this; the freshness of the summer movie season is becoming stale, and fall awards season that follows is hotly anticipated. August is the in-between that sometimes produces modest hits but also a lot of releases that are forgotten since audiences are preoccupied with societal transitions such as a new school year. While much of the film discussion this past week has been pointing and laughing and opining at what went wrong with Fantastic Four, a worthy film has fallen through the cracks at the U.S. box office despite

for compelling solo stories, but not the case with Shaun. He's dastardly, fun, and above all lovable in the vein of Bugs Bunny or Rocky & Bullwinkle. The rest of the flock doesn't really have the same level of personality, except for the adorable youngling.

The new film is a short but sweet delight, and the key to its charm is its absolute simplicity. That's not to say the film is minimalist, per se; Aardman's signature stop-motion animation has never looked better or more detailed. But one example of the skillful straightforwardness is the taciturn sound design, in which the characters only speak gibberish. A bizarre creative choice that somehow works - demonstrating how unnecessary words are in such a medium as inherently visual and ornate as the animated

a wide release. It's a treat from the UK, who are seriously on a roll when it comes to family films recently between this and Paddington.

Shaun the Sheep Movie reminds me of a film school application, namely the one at the establishment I studied at. In it, an applicant must contain a short film that adequately conveys him or her, but without any words whatsoever. Sounds hard, but every student application I saw just made it look easy. So does the cartoon in question, which exists in the absence of any formal spoken language.

The plot involves the titular character and his flock planning a great escape from their farm lifestyle – one they actually enjoy, but nonetheless grow fatigued of. However, while their escape is ultimately successful, it comes as a catch-22: their farmer... and just go with this... is accidentally flung into town, develops amnesia, and becomes a hipster barber. The flock of sheep then adapt to urban life while attempting to recover their old master – all while evading the vicious animal control specialist.

Shaun himself is a classic cartoon character. He originally appeared in the 1995 Wallace and Gromit short A Close Shave, but the film is actually more directly related to the TV series of the same name. The danger of a spinoff is that certain characters sometimes don't make

feature. Furthermore, the humor and jokes are quick and ruthlessly funny - but always good-natured. It's about as hilarious as Trainwreck is, but without resorting to the ribald. It's refreshing to laugh so hearty. So much of what works in Shaun the Sheep could adequately be regressed to "less is more," but that wouldn't do justice to how clever the gags are here.

Also, a special mention goes to Tim Wheeler of the band Ash. His original song "Feels Like Summer" is a much better song than most that get nominated for Globes and Oscars. Not like it will help its chances, but it's an irresistible power pop tune that serves a sweetly diegetic purpose within the story. Just wait until you hear it performed by "The Baa Baa Shop Quintet."

This is a welcome return to form for Aardman Studios, even if the creative visionaries behind the studio's greatest achievements, Peter Lord and Nick Park, are only executive producer here. Co-directors Richard Starzak and Mark Burton have crafted a vivid ride that holds its own against the company's best animated features, Chicken Run and The Curse of the Were Rabbit. Just like with Pixar, Aardman made 2015 a time to put themselves back on the map and make their best contribution to the world in years.

Shaun the Sheep Movie is now playing in theaters. •

Eagles Complete Historical Year

With the 2015-16 school year set to start next week this last look at last season's Eagles' historical year concluded with a couple of firsts for the school and another successful 20 plus win season for the softball team as well as another great showing by the swim team. A new record setting performance by the girls' relay track team and the first league title in school history by the boys' lacrosse team made this a record setting year for the Eagles.

Softball

The Eagles were disseminated with injuries to key players but that didn't deter this talented team from persevering in the face of adversity. Even with so many distractions the team started out 15-4 and wound up winning the Best of the West Tournament defeating Orange Lutheran, who was (16-0) and ranked No. 8 in the USA Super 25 national softball rankings at the time. They backed that win up by defeating St Bonaventure, the eventual CIF-SS Division 5 champions,

in the finals. The Eagles completed a sweep of the El Segundo Tournament by defeating City Section perennial powerhouse San Pedro 5-2 and then knocking of Port of L.A. 4-0 in the final.

The Eagles could not unseat Santa Monica for the Ocean League title and entered the CIF-SS playoffs needing a wild card win just to get into the playoffs. They defeated Woodcrest Christian 14-1, South El Monte 5-3 and North Torrance 5-2 in an epic battle to advance to the quarterfinals against Ramona.

Against Ramona the Eagles misfortunes undid them and their season came to an end with a 4-3 loss. Shannon Brooker and Monique Benjamin allowed only unearned runs in their 10-inning loss to the Rams. The Eagle's only scoring came in one inning. Sierra Kessler scored from second on an infield single by Emily Skulick and Emma Burner doubled and scored during a three-run fourth inning for the Eagles which finished (24-8) overall.

Don't Forget About Baseball

With everyone so ramped up about football lately, it becomes easy to forget about a sport that has been going on since early April. It's even easier to forget about the game of baseball in Los Angeles when one of the biggest cable providers in the city, Time Warner, refuses to sell the Dodgers channel to any other provider at a decent price. All that aside, however, a 162-game season can sort of have the tendency to drag on. Don't forget about baseball. Not only do the Dodgers remain in first place and have a great shot at a deep playoff drive, but Clayton Kershaw and Zack Greinke are also battling each other for the Cy Young award.

When it comes to the month of August and baseball season, you pretty much know what you're getting. For instance, everyone knows that the St. Louis Cardinals are going to be a playoff team and everyone knows that the Philadelphia Phillies are not. Just like those two things, we also know that the Dodgers

and their two aces, Kershaw and Greinke, don't give up many runs.

To this day, Kershaw and Greinke have made 48 combined starts in the regular season. 42 of those starts have been what the baseball world calls "quality starts." Think about that for a second. That's about 90 percent of their starts. No other set of teammates have ever piled up a set of quality starts like that in baseball history. That includes Greg Maddux and Tom Glavine. That includes Curt Schilling and Randy Johnson. That includes Sandy Koufax and Claude Osteen.

Needless to say, what you're seeing this year (or trying to see) is unprecedented history from these two Dodgers starting pitchers. Greinke, himself, is on pace to have one of the greatest seasons pitched by a pitcher ever. As of today, his 1.58 ERA leads the entire league. His 0.86 WHIP (walks and hits to innings pitched) also leads the league. At 13-2 on the season, he may not have the most wins in the entire league, but having only lost two games in a season is a pretty remarkable feat in itself as that record looks as if it will only get better as the season nears its close. Greinke is unbeaten in his last 11 starts, has 21 quality starts to his name, and his last loss came on June 13 against the San Diego Padres. He has yet to exit a game before the sixth inning and has given up more than two runs in a game just four times all season long. Clearly, a bright and shiny Cy Young trophy (and a hefty pay day next year) is on Greinke's mind.

The only thing that will keep Greinke from that trophy that he's set his eyes on, however, is his very own teammate, Clayton Kershaw. Kershaw's season may not have started off in an absolutely remarkable fashion, but he has a tendency to pick things up as the year goes on. That is precisely what he has been doing. Kershaw is now the Major League leader in strikeouts and the NL leader in innings pitched and strikeouts-per-nine-innings rate. Since the month of May, Kershaw has allowed less hits than Greinke, less runs than Greinke, has walked less batters, struck out more, has a lower ERA, a lower WHIP, and has one more complete game. Uh oh, Zack.

While Kershaw is certainly gaining ground on his rotation mate, the question is if there is enough season left to catch him. Before his last start of the season against the Oakland Athletics on Tuesday, Kershaw owned a 0.92 WHIP, a 2.39 ERA, and a 10-6 record. Clearly, those numbers aren't as good as Greinke's, listed above, but the three-time NL Cy Young Award winner and 2014 NL MVP is only getting better and better. With only about 40 games left in the regular season, Kershaw has approximately eight or nine more starts left in him to try to make a case for the award for the fourth time in his already illustrious career. Don't expect Greinke to just roll over and let him have it, though.

Yes, football season is just around the corner. But before you fall too deep into the Tom Brady, Peyton Manning hype, make sure you don't forget about baseball. Our very own Los Angeles Dodgers are making a run at the World Series with what is stacking up to be the best 1-2 punch in the starting rotation in the history of the game. The competition for the Cy Young Award is a healthy one between the two pitchers and will only serve to make one another better. When it comes to baseball in October, there are no two guys I'd rather have at the top of my rotation than Zack Greinke and Clayton Kershaw. We'll see if it's enough to finally bring home the first World Series championship to L.A. since the 1988 season. •

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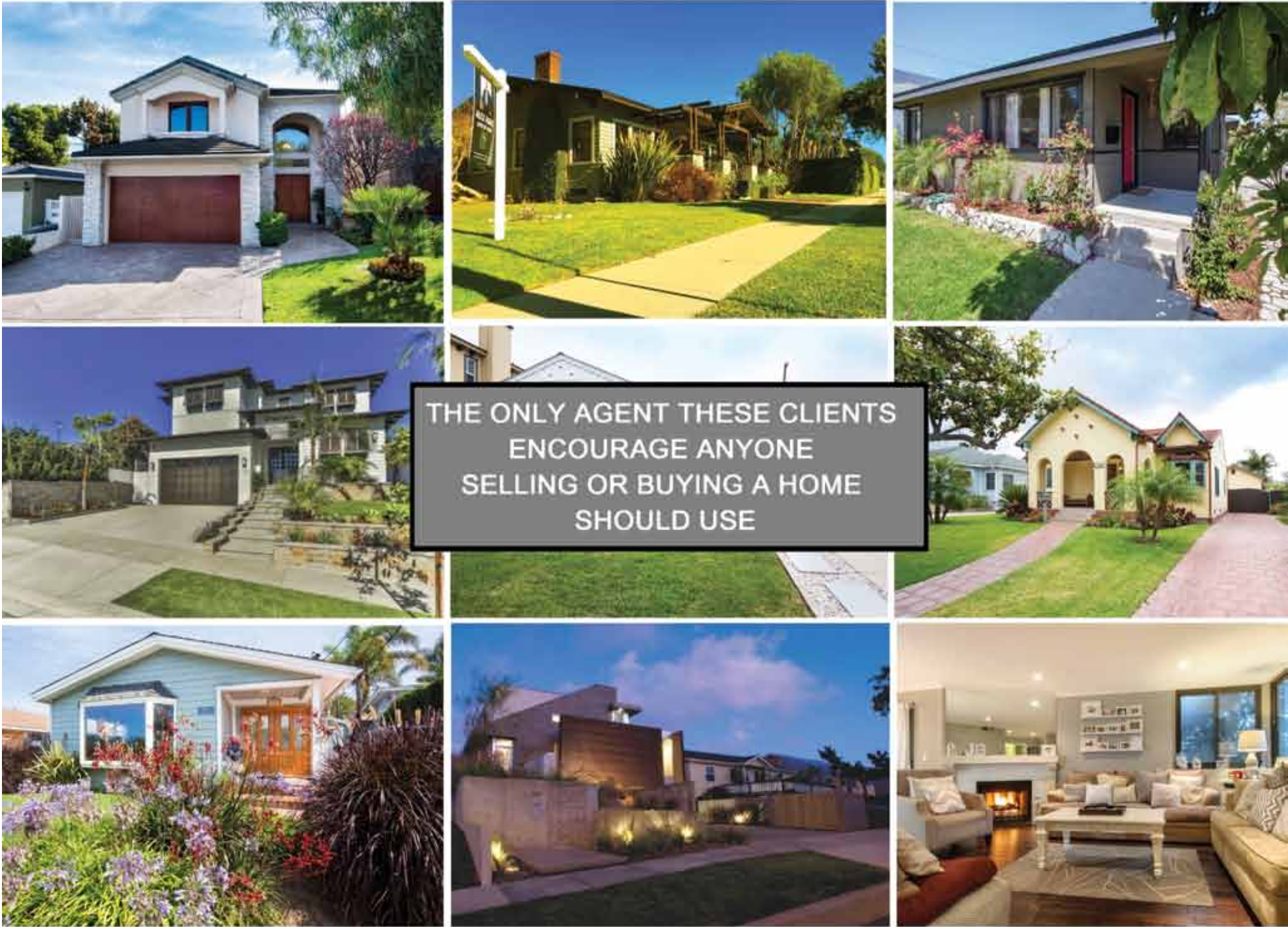

Tuesday’s meeting also included a video montage showcasing highlights of El Segundo’s recent host town activities when it welcomed athletes and coaches from Barbados and Macedonia participating in the Special Olympics. “We took athletes as though they were living in town and our own,” Atkinson said, adding that despite several snags along the way including not having any buses secured just days before the contingent arrived, “we just got it done.” The visitors went to the Lakers and Kings facility, Automobile Driving Museum, Old Town Music Hall, and the beach, among other stops. According to Mayor Suzanne Fuentes, the athletes from landlocked Macedonia were so excited to see the ocean that they went rushing in despite standing orders to stay out

of the water. Chief Mitch Tavera officially announced the retirement of police canine Arthur after eight years of service. The now nine-and-a-half-year-old Czechoslovakian Malinois was at the podium with his long-time handler Officer Chris Cameron. Highlights of the partnership included 110 suspect searches, 24 suspect finds and subsequent apprehensions, 292 narcotic and article searches resulting in seizure of over \$10 million in illicit cash and proceeds, and 37 public demonstrations. “He is no longer fit for duty—he just got old,” Tavera said. Arthur will continue to live with Cameron, who will purchase the dog from the City for \$1. Meanwhile, the Council also met the new team of Officer Alex Leavitt and his partner

Roxy—the first-ever female dog to serve on the El Segundo Police Canine Unit. A representative from LA Sanitation announced the upcoming Hyperion Outfall Maintenance project scheduled between September 21 and October 26. Crews will replace the effluent (outflow) pumping plant header for the five-mile pipe. During the construction period, Hyperion will divert effluent to its one-mile pipe (that is only otherwise used during emergencies). The process will include extensive environmental monitoring with testing for chemicals, toxicity and pollutants. Those interested in information can call a 24/7 hotline at 424-259-3708. West Basin Water District 4 Director Scott Houston provided an update on the agency’s

turf removal program--reporting that funding has run out for the \$3 per square foot rebate program, but those who signed up and are in the queue will still be able to take advantage of the extra dollar. The regular rebate is \$2 per square foot, but West Basin received \$300,000 in grant monies in June to up the incentive. Among other points, Houston touched upon the severity of California’s historic drought that is now in its fourth year and resulted in Governor Brown’s mandate to reduce consumption statewide by 25 percent. He noted that West Basin will seek Prop 1 grant opportunities in the areas of water reliability and recycled water and that the agency hopes to rely less on Colorado River water and wants to double local supplies over the next five years. •

When It Comes To Arthritis, Better Education Often Leads To Better Diagnoses

(BPT) - Rachele Crow, of Chesterfield, Michigan, is living proof that autoimmune and rheumatic diseases can affect people of any age. She first sought help for painful joints as a 19-year-old college student, but received a confusing diagnosis of osteoarthritis, something typically associated with older adults. Unsatisfied with her diagnosis, she actively searched for more information about her condition and found support via an online group who understood her symptoms and questioned her initial diagnosis.

“When I was diagnosed with arthritis, I looked for support and, thankfully, found CreakyJoints,” Rachele says. “Communicating with other patients educated me about my disease and pushed me to ask good questions of and seek a better diagnosis from my doctor. Once we realized that what we first thought was osteoarthritis was actually related to inflammatory arthritis, it allowed us to better address my treatment. When you join CreakyJoints, you find a community who understands what you are going through and I’m grateful that I tapped into all that firsthand knowledge.”

Inflammatory arthritis is an autoimmune illness that causes your body’s immune system to start attacking tissues instead of germs, virus or other foreign substances, which can cause pain, stiffness, joint damage and many other complications due to widespread inflammation. It can occur at any age and is more common in women than men. Ten years following her initial



diagnosis, Rachele faces numerous challenges managing her inflammatory arthritis, but this mother and former special education teacher is combating her diseases just as she faces other challenges in her life - by continually seeking out education, and supporting others in the way she was supported by the non-profit CreakyJoints community, herself.

In fact, now Rachele is focused on expanding the influence of patients in health care by serving as a CreakyJoints Patient Governor to support the development and launch of a new patient-led research project called Arthritis Power. Arthritis Power is the first ever patient led, patient-centered research database for arthritis, and it is a collaborative effort between researchers at the University of Alabama at Birmingham and CreakyJoints that is supported by the Patient-Centered Outcomes Research Institute (PCORI), a nonprofit, nongovernmental

organization created by Congress in the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act of 2010.

Offering 21st Century-style convenience and mobility, Arthritis Power data will be collected using a smart phone, laptop, desktop or tablet where there is an internet connection. As patients track their symptoms over time - a convenient way of self-monitoring changes in fatigue, pain and physical activity - they are also securely donating their data. This information will be used by universities, research facilities, physicians and others to better understand how patients measure treatment success and satisfaction, to compare treatments, identify new treatments and, perhaps, find elusive cures.

Usually patients with RA or other musculoskeletal conditions learn about opportunities to participate in research, such as clinical trials, from their doctor. Arthritis Power will proactively offer a variety of

clinical trial opportunities and patients can decide when and how to participate.

“Patient-centered clinical research means that the research questions being asked are important to patients to help them make informed healthcare decisions,” says Louis Tharp, Executive Director of CreakyJoints and its parent organization, Global Healthy Living Foundation. “Though it’s called Arthritis Power, we’re also seeking people living with arthritis and other related bone, muscle, skin or joint conditions, such as fibromyalgia, lupus, psoriasis and many others. The more people who join and share their data, the more powerful the registry will be!”

It is the idea of learning from real patient experiences that most excites Rachele about the future of arthritis treatment. “Patient-led research, like Arthritis Power, is important because patients can express how research will directly impact their lives. But in addition to advancing arthritis research, what I particularly like about the application is that I can access my personal data and send progress reports to my physician, which means we can discuss my ups and downs during check-ups. I anticipate this will make for very productive conversations.”

from Adelphi University. Initially not sure of a career goal, he took basic courses. Then, he saw the film *Regarding Henry*, starring Harrison Ford, following the long recovery of Ford's character, a victim of a gunshot wound to the brain who undergoes extensive physical therapies to relearn all the basics of walking, feeding himself, brushing his teeth and hair, etc. "That film really inspired me to go into physical science. I saw how that meant I could work with people, but not in a job that was business-based. I began to volunteer as a PT aide at Jamaica Hospital in Queens, and that was it. I immediately knew my career choice!" recalled DeRosa.

After college, Chris worked in various PT clinics in New York, gaining experience until he was accepted into a PT program at Robert Gordon University in Aberdeen, Scotland, a program accredited by the American Physical Therapy Association, the governing body of all licensed physical therapists in the United States.

Meanwhile, Troy Davis, raised in Long Beach, California, graduated from California State University at Long Beach where he majored in PT. Davis' mom is a nurse, and he was always interested in how the human body works, how it is capable of restoring itself, how muscles function. PT seemed a natural choice for him. Davis enrolled in the PT program at Robert Gordon University in Aberdeen, Scotland.

After graduation in Scotland, their PT careers started in NYC at Faxton Hospital, each gaining experience in both inpatient and outpatient physical therapy. Both of them returned to California following acceptance into the Credentialled Advance Manual Therapy Residency Program at Kaiser Permanente Medical Center, which only accepts two therapists per year. The

techniques of Pilates. Our practice is unique on several levels," said DeRosa. "Our patients stay with the same therapist for their treatment cycles, or at least that is the goal. We treat our patients on a 45-minute appointment cycle, and between the seven therapists we see approximately 60 to 75 patients a day.

"With the changes and challenges in medical reimbursement and medical coverage, since we opened our practice, as well as the open policy that exists now, we see a trend of self-referral, instead of PT being recommended by a medical doctor. People are taking control of their own preventative care. Insurance does not require a physician referral, so our patient base has grown. We needed a larger space.

"We encourage our patients to communicate what is going on and we work very closely, physical therapist to patient, to determine together the best course of treatment. People are not used to having that direct access, although it is becoming more the norm now that people are relating to the changes in health care," continued DeRosa.

"We work with our patients on a financial level. Some insurance companies now have a higher co-payment and less reimbursement for PT, but some others are treating PT just like any other treatment and reimbursements are fair. It all balances out, but we want to focus on the patient and their treatment, first.

"Our success is based on our customer service and our fantastic team of employees. Our Physical Therapists are highly trained and personable, but most of all, compassionate. We want to make every patient feel comfortable from the minute they are greeted by an amazing Front Desk staff until they leave after a quality treatment. Everyone who seeks treatment at Davis and DeRosa can be assured that when their treatment is completed they will be moving correctly and their constraints will be lessened because we want the patient to get better, quickly."

When Davis and DeRosa moved to the Main Street location, they added lots of equipment, including treadmills and upper and lower body bikes. Also used is a progress tracking system, "HUR," whereby measurements and treatment history is recorded, treatment progress is tracked, noting whether increasing or decreasing or not changing treatment is needed, until the PT has been completed.

"Since we opened in 2003, we have been so blessed to have the community support we get," DeRosa remarked. "In turn, we support El Segundo wherever we can. The Run for Education, the Wellness Fair, Little League, AYSO Soccer, Volleyball, Football, just about anywhere we can help out, we will. We have a program where high school students who are interested in PT can come in and work as interns, observing our therapists and get a pretty good handle on PT and how a PT clinic works.

"We have plans to have a Group Fitness, Balance, and Pilates program within the next year. Our goal is to continue to be the neighborhood PT place here on Main Street, in El Segundo, where everyone who enters knows this is a happy place to come, and get great results for your ailment," concluded Chris DeRosa.
