District Leaders Upbeat as Students Return

Being able to hire more teachers, add new courses at the high school, and expand enrollment had the district leaders of El Segundo public schools glowing as the opening bell sounded on Aug. 20. With major improvements finished over the summer using Measure ES bond monies, the academic year underway took on a celebratory feeling at the district headquarters, according to Superintendent Jason Johnson.

“Enrollment is back up to its historic numbers, which were 3,500,” Johnson said. “The reason it went down was we lowered our enrollment numbers because of the construction during Measure ES to replace classrooms.”

Richmond Street saw the highest gain in student enrollment, adding 37 students for the 2026-27 academic year, according to district figures. Johnson points back to something that occurred during the pandemic for the gains at both two elementary schools (Center Street added 10 pupils).

A “COVID baby boom” has boosted the number of pre-kindergarten through first-graders entering El Segundo public schools, the superintendent said. Though district leaders didn’t plan for the bulge of three-, four-, and five-year-olds coming through the lower grades, they and staff have welcomed the surprise with open arms.

“It’s been very, very tight,” he added. “We’ve been blessed here in El Segundo to have steady enrollment. Most of our South Bay neighbors aren’t as lucky.”

The cause of declining enrollment outside is a combination of the high cost of living and a declining birth rate in California and nationally. What works in the district’s favor in keeping enrollment steady is the

public schools.

“That’s why I’m here,” Board of Education President Tracey Miller-Zareke told *the Herald*.

Enrollment at the four district campuses was: 1,191 students at the high school, a gain of 32; 831 middle-schoolers, up 36 from a year ago; 790 pupils at Center Street, up 10; 624 students at Richmond Street, for a gain of 37; and Arena High School figures fall between 24 and 36 per academic year.

Home-schooling is a non-starter for El Segundo parents, with zero students opting for the stay-at-home learning option. The boost in incoming students — mostly in the lower grades — and the addition of two bands and 10 high-school courses also created a need

for more teachers. The district went into hiring mode over the summer, making El Segundo the exception to the employment trend on South Bay campuses.

“It’s sad to see what’s happening in other school districts,” Miller-Zarneke admitted.

Ditto for the city’s enrollment growth, which Johnson calls an outlier in an era of declining enrollment across Southern California school districts. “El Segundo’s current and historic numbers are definitely a feel-good story,” he added. Johnson, the board members, and district staff have scrambled to make room for the baby boom between late 2021 and mid-2023, when the U.S. health officials declared the pandemic over.

In Limbo by Deb JJ Lee

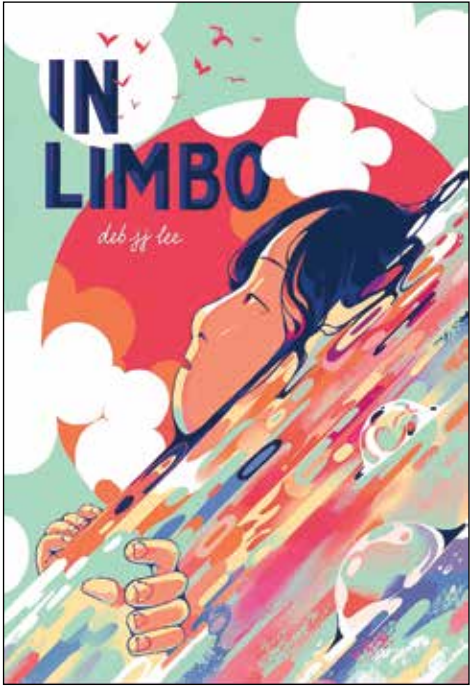
In Limbo by Deb JJ Lee is a YA graphic memoir that takes place during Deb's high school years. It has gorgeous illustrations drawn in blue grey scale and is a Young Adult Literacy Award Honor book. The book describes Deb's high school years and her mental health battles. If you have any triggers with suicide or physical and mental abuse, this isn't the book for you. Deborah's real name is Jung Jin, but she goes by Deborah or Deb in school. In Limbo is an apt title for the book because Deb always feels like she is in-between. Because she is Korean and lives in New Jersey, she feels like she is neither Korean nor American. Deb also is in between her mother's expectations of her and the reality that Deb is not a brilliant student. Deb is also in between the desire to be a musician and the desire to be an artist. She floats through school and feels disconnected from friends, peers and family, especially her mother, who swings from supportive to volatile.

The book starts off with Deb entering 9th grade. All her friends are in orchestra, so she hangs out with them in the band room. It is her safe space, where she can be herself with her friends and not worry about being bullied or harassed by other students. Although Deb loves playing the violin, she discovers that art is her passion and quits

Orchestra to focus on art. Sophomore year brings a lot of change for Deb: she has a new group of friends, a new passion and no longer must take violin or Korean lessons. Deb takes art lessons instead in New York City and starts to hang out there a lot when her friendships with others end. Deb is best friends with Kate, but when Kate gets a boyfriend sophomore year, their friendship wanes. At first Deb is really sad, but then becomes friends with Quinn. She is the opposite of Deb: smart, confident and really outgoing.

Deb starts to do everything with Quinn and is really happy at first. When Quinn starts to branch out and hang out with different friends junior and senior year, Deb begins to spiral. Her mental health issues intensify, and she needs help. The therapist her mom sends her to helps Deb build pillars so if one collapses, she can lean on the others to still be successful. Deb doesn't have a great relationship with her mom but has a great one with her dad. The book takes us to the end of Deb's senior year and her journey to Korea.

Does Deb find herself in Korea? Is she finally whole instead of being in-between? What happened to Deb that made her mother realize she needed to go to therapy? Read the book to find out! I really enjoyed reading this book. You get to know Deb not only through the story, but through the illustrations as well. The story and the illustrations paint a vivid portrait of Deb's life and her feelings. Water Polo Team Has Experience for a Winning Formula

The El Segundo High School water polo program, you could argue, is one of the school’s top athletic programs. The El Segundo High School water polo program, which includes both boys and girls teams, is certainly the most decorated athletic program in school history. Between the two programs, the boys’ team has won thirty-nine league titles and has made fifty CIF playoff tournament appearances. The Eagles’ last title came in 2023 when the boys completed their historic (32-0) undefeated season run by sweeping through the CIF Southern Section playoffs and defeating Canyon (Anaheim) 15-7 for the program’s fourteenth CIF title. That 2023 team is the only El Segundo High School team to win an unblemished CIF championship.

The Eagles have been preparing for the 2026 season under the watchful eye of head coach Nila Ward. Starting her eighth season, she says the team has been concentrating hard: “The boys are coming off an intense preseason schedule with two weeks of two-a-days, including scrimmages with Olu (Orange Lutheran) and Glendale, and a fun ocean practice in the Redondo Harbor.”

So which returners will make an impact and lead the team? Senior Austin Miller will lead the team as a strong center committed to playing Division 1 water polo at UC Davis next year. He is big, strong, and experienced,

and his team will depend on him on offense to score goals and draw defense to open up his teammates. On defense, junior goalie Luke Griffiths will have a big impact on the team’s success. He comes off a starting sophomore campaign and a strong club season, and is smart, quick, and incredibly good at frustrating opposing shooters. Luke and Austin were last season’s Co-MVPs and will be looked upon to help guide their teammates through the season.

The Eagles are loaded with depth. According to Coach Ward, “We have a large group of returning varsity players who are hungry to step up and fill roles this year. The team will rely on the depth of having so many experienced players, and we have a plan to have a fast subbing rotation, aiming to tire out opponents with waves of fresh attackers.”

Coach Ward added, “These kids have all been training hard in the offseason, and we are really excited to see them make the team their own: Senior Ethan Smith, Juniors Augie Holt, Joshua Rhyu, Mikey Lambert, Austin Lane & Reid Chrisman, Sophomores Bryson Duffaut and Johnny Amaral.”

New to the varsity squad are junior Cristian Ramirez and sophomores Ryder Leach and Lochlan Aussem. “These guys made big strides in the offseason and have been working hard to earn their spots with the Varsity group. We’re looking forward to seeing them continue to grow and contribute at the next level,” said

Coach Ward.

This season’s schedule is no easy one. The Eagles will compete against some of the top programs in the South Bay when they face Santa Monica, Palos Verdes, Culver City, Redondo, and Mira Costa in Bay League action. In non-league action, the Eagles are entered in four high-profile tournaments, including the Long Beach Tournament (last weekend), the Villa Park Classic, the South Bay Henry Stuart Tournament, and the Ocean View Tournament. Each tournament features perennial powerhouse programs.

Coach Ward said, “We’ve entered into four tournaments this year, which are great ways to see lots of growth in a short amount of time. Our team has set a goal of winning a tournament, with eyes on getting our name back on the perpetual trophy for the Henry Stuart South Bay Tournament.”

Expectations are high, but Coach Ward is guarded with optimism. “I want to see this team get better every practice and every game. This group of kids has been biding their time to play big minutes and become big contributors, and I’m excited to see what they do with the opportunity in front of them.” She adds that the sky is the limit for how far this group can go. “We have a great base of water polo knowledge and experience, and a deep bench of kids that will all be trusted to compete. We expect to see this team come

together, win as many games as we can, and become stronger and more confident as the season progresses.” Coach Ward is already excited for the postseason to see how much progress will be made between now and then! “We have big goals for this crew!”

The Eagles will be competitive and have plenty of motivation, but they will be playing with a heavy heart. Former four-year standout Max Hale was tragically killed during training as a PFC in the C Co, 1st Battalion, 75th Ranger Regiment.

Max was a standout four-year varsity letterman, winning multiple team MVP awards, as well as All-League MVP/MOP and All-CIF recognitions. Max was a captain of the 2023 undefeated CIF Championship-winning team. He currently holds school records for most career goals, single-game goals, career hat tricks, single-season assists, and most career offensive points. He graduated from ESHS in 2024.

Coach Ward summed up her thoughts by paying tribute to Max. “We hope to carry on the memory of Max Hale and the energy he brought to the game. We want our athletes to work relentlessly hard, be fearless, excellent teammates, and most importantly- have fun playing the game we love.”

Flag Team Starting Strong

evaded the Warriors' defense and ran it in from 25 yards away. The Eagles scored the clincher with a touchdown pass to Brooke Engelhardt, who got free in the end zone. Sara Fara caught the extra point pass, and the Eagles won 13-0.

A Guide to Growing Thriving Plants Indoors

Choose the Right Plants

Not all houseplants are created equal, and the first step toward a flourishing indoor garden is picking plants that align with your home's conditions. Provide Adequate Light

If natural sunlight is limited where you live, consider grow lights that mimic the sun's spectrum and help plants keep their color and strong growth without plenty of daylight.

Avoid Overwatering

Too much water can lead to root rot and is one of the most common mistakes even the most experienced gardeners make. Rather than watering on a strict schedule, check the soil first. If the top inch is dry, it's usually time to give your plant a drink. Add warm or room-temperature water until you see moisture come out of the pot's drainage holes then let the soil dry before watering again.

Consider the Soil, Pot and Growth Space

Use a high-quality potting mix designed for indoor plants along with pots featuring proper drainage. If you prefer decorative planters without holes, consider placing your plant in a smaller pot inside the decorative one to ensure proper drainage. As plants grow, they may need repotted to give their roots room to spread and continue healthy growth.

Nourish Plants During the Growing Season

Plants use more nutrients in spring and summer, so feed them with a balanced, diluted fertilizer every 4-6 weeks during active months. In fall and winter, most indoor plants grow more slowly and need less feeding. Also remember to regularly prune dead or yellowing leaves to help plants focus on new growth.

Fortunately, high blood pressure is highly treatable and manageable through a combination of lifestyle changes and, when necessary, medication. Unfortunately, it often appears without symptoms, putting people at risk of stroke, heart failure, kidney disease, and death, without them even knowing it.

“High blood pressure is sometimes called the silent killer,” said Dr. Jennifer Ziemianin, chief medical officer for HealthSpring. “But we’re not going to be quiet about it. We want older adults to know about the risks and take action to manage hypertension.”

The first step is to get your blood pressure checked. The American Heart Association recommends adults get their blood pressure checked at least once a year. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, high blood pressure is an upper reading of 130 or above or a lower reading of 80 or above.

If your blood pressure is high, you should check it regularly using an automatic, upper arm cuff-style monitor. These monitors are widely available, affordable and easy to use. You can ask your doctor for tips if needed.

Although hypertension generally can’t be cured, it can be effectively managed through a variety of measures, Ziemianin said, including the following:

Exercise. Moderate activity, such as brisk walking or swimming, can lower high blood pressure. Always talk with your doctor before starting an exercise plan. If you belong to a Medicare Advantage (MA) plan, you may have access to a fitness program at no extra cost to you.

Eat a heart-healthy diet. Having a higher body mass index is a risk factor for hypertension. That’s why it’s important to eat a balanced diet, including vegetables, fruits,

grains, protein, dairy and oils.

Cut down on salt. As you get older, the body becomes more sensitive to salt. Too much salt can increase your blood pressure. Limit the amount of salt in your diet by choosing low-sodium seasonings when preparing meals.

Drink less alcohol. Even moderate alcohol use can increase your blood pressure. The American Health Associations recommends no more than two drinks per day for men and one drink per day for women.

Quit smoking or don’t start. Smoking increases your risk for high blood pressure, heart disease, stroke, and other health problems. It’s never too late to quit. If you have a Medicare plan, you have access to counseling services to help you quit. Additionally, a Medicare Part D plan may cover medications to help you stop smoking.

Manage stress. Stress can increase your blood pressure. Medicare and MA plans cover counseling services, including telehealth in some cases, to help you cope with stress.

Talk to your doctor about medication. There are several medications available to help lower your blood pressure. You may need to try several types or combinations before you find a plan that works for you. Once you find the right plan, always take your medication as prescribed. If cost is an issue, an MA plan with drug coverage, or a standalone drug plan, helps pay for most blood pressure medications.

“Lowering blood pressure, even a small amount, can make a big difference,” Ziemianin said. “That’s why it’s so critical for you to identify high blood pressure early and then work very closely with your primary care physician to develop a plan for managing your hypertension so you can live a longer, healthier life.”

Musical instruction has been added for fifth-graders at Richmond and Center Street schools. Both campuses have new principals. Sean Brandlin, who served as assistant principal, takes over as principal at Richmond, and Dr. Mike Bosler takes over at Center Street. They replaced Rose Ahrens and Carie Oulashian, respectively, both of whom moved into positions at the district headquarters.

The high school added 10 courses for students returning to campus after their nine-week summer break, including computer science with artificial intelligence (AI) available through the Southern California Regional Occupational Center. Robotics, media design, and information and communication technology will be taught, along with AP Finance and Art History, and sports medicine.

“We haven’t seen growth like this in forever, since I’ve been here,” Miller-Zarneke said. The bond measure and the El Segundo voters who approved it by an overwhelming majority in 2018 deserve some of the credit, along with the El Segundo Education Foundation, or ED!, that donated \$2 million last year alone to plug funding gaps in local public schools. That support makes the school district’s stretch goals possible.

“It’s really a credit to our education foundation,” Superintendent Johnson said. “That’s an investment from the community and businesses to have these types of programs that are cutting-edge.”

At the middle school, district leaders are excited about adding AVID, a program already offered at the high school that encourages

local students to pursue college educations and careers that might seem out of reach to some. There is also adding a new business course offering that connects to the business pathway for ninth through 12th grades. Another startup on the middle campus is Project Lead the Way, which is a curriculum introduced nationwide in grades 4th through 12th to boost interest and proficiency in science, technology, engineering, and biomedicine. Some landscaping work has the Center Street campus looking better, too.

The visual and arts programs for grades K-5 have been protected, and “if anything, we’ve expanded” for 2026-27, according to Johnson. The addition of band at the elementary campuses is part of that commitment to the arts. Richmond and Center Street youngsters can now learn to sing, perform, and play musical instruments.

The Eagles Nest preschool on the east side of the high school was expanded to include two-year-olds and also reopened in August. Improvements to Arena High School allowed students who prefer the flexibility and one-on-one support of teachers to return to classrooms after the summer break ended in August.

School board members officially dedicated the expanded Eagles Nest preschool and remodeled district offices in a ceremony on Aug. 25. The event marked the end of Measure ES projects, though \$2 million remains to tackle less-glamorous upgrades to electrical, plumbing, and sewer systems, Johnson said. •
