ESHS Has Active Shooter Training

It is a grim reality of our culture that sadly has not gone away. Active shooter incidents continue to plague society, claiming countless lives and bringing unthinkable grief to the families, friends, and communities impacted. Last month's horrific tragedy during a morning Mass at Annunciation Catholic School in Minneapolis left two children, ages 8 and 10, dead while injuring 21 others (including 18 children).

According to the FBI, 24 such events occurred in 2024 in 19 states at locations that included the categories of open space, commerce, government, houses of worship, and education. While overall active shooter incidents have decreased in recent years, the events in Minnesota act as a harsh reminder that complacency is never an option.

El Segundo has thankfully never experienced an active shooter incident and intends to keep that record spotless. As part of the longstanding effort to remain cognizant and well-prepared, the El Segundo Police Department (ESPD) last month conducted its largest active shooting training event ever—a full-scale exercise at El Segundo High School (ESHS). The two-day program (August 9 and 11) also engaged assistance from the El Segundo Fire Department (ESFD), Hawthorne Police Department, and Manhattan Beach Police Department.

All told, the training was a major success, according to ESPD Investigative Lieutenant Michael Sistoni, who managed the proceedings. His role, he explained, was to ensure the team created “real-world scenarios” to be confident in their abilities to respond to these incidents and communicate effectively with collaborating agencies. “The training never stops, and the team is constantly planning the next critical training event,” Sistoni said. He

wasn't kidding. The program actually started 25 years ago, but ESPD only recently began to incorporate large-scale casualties with multiple mutual aid agencies involved in the simulations. “It took nine months of planning, dedication, and commitment,” Sistoni noted of last month's training originally set for January 2025 but delayed due to ESPD and ESFD deployments during the Palisades and Eaton wildfires. “All the details were thought out and set in motion. We used explorers from the Los Angeles Police Department and the Los Angeles Sheriff's Department to recreate students running from classrooms out onto campus. Creating a real-world incident has an actual traumatic and stressful effect on the officers. This is a proven training method that helped us identify areas where we can benefit from additional training. It was such a success that we have neighboring cities asking for our assistance in establishing their active shooter program.”

A vital component of law enforcement, active shooter training prepares officers to respond to potentially the most time-sensitive and highest-stakes incidents they may ever encounter in their careers. “The primary goals of this training are to minimize response time through rapid deployment and tactics,” Sistoni explained. “We must maximize officer safety and effectiveness through coordinated tactical procedures and ultimately stop the threat as quickly as possible to prevent further casualties.” These cases require officers to move immediately towards the sound of gunfire rather than traditional methods of securing a perimeter and calling for backup. The training helps establish muscle memory to bolster quick decision-making and speedy and precise reaction time while under extreme duress. “The ultimate goal is to save as many lives as possible by rapidly neutralizing the threat and providing immediate medical care to victims,” Sistoni

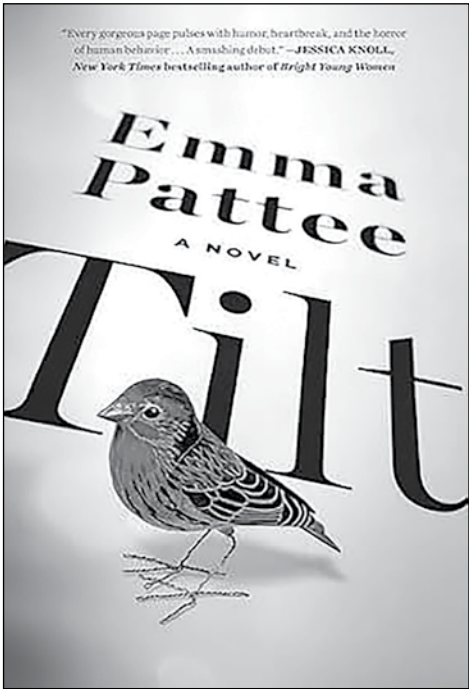

Experience to Lead a
Strong Volleyball Team

The El Segundo High School girls’ volleyball team is filled with experience and depth. Head coach Natasha Nguyen, in her eighth season, says this could be a fun season for the Eagles with strong preparation and leadership leading up to the start of the season. Along with Natasha, guiding the Eagles is Ashley Clark, who was promoted to assistant varsity coach from the frosh/soph team midway through last season. Natasha says the team prepared with two weeks of summer training, including an early preseason match versus local St. Mary’s to test their chemistry and run different lineups.

According to Natasha, they have, “Maybe our strongest year of returners to date. Our seniors are led by impact players Macy Ludwig (committed to Cal Poly SLO Women’s Beach Volleyball) and Sarina Waite. Senior Alexis Yew also brings leadership to the team and sets the tone for our solid senior class.”

The junior class is the deepest and now most experienced players as a whole: Lundin Leitch, Sydney Neely (committed to CSUN Women’s Volleyball), Joslyn McCarthy, Amelie Rudnick, Catherine Reed, and Isla

McCullough (out with ACL injury). “We are excited to see the chemistry these student-athletes have built together in their third season together.”

Who are the others who will give the team its depth? Sophomores Kate Summers and Ella Ward bookend the returners with their experience and a freshman learning curve out of the way. “We are looking forward to seeing them take on bigger roles this season, both physically and mentally,” according to Natasha.

Who are the newcomers who could make an immediate impact? Freshman Sienna Mattoon has already been tested and is showing glimpses of the type of player she can become on the court. She’s comfortable competing at a high level. Natasha says, “As she adjusts to the speed and her new teammates, we expect her to do big things for the Eagles both defensively and offensively. There’s definitely potential for leadership in her years to come as well.”

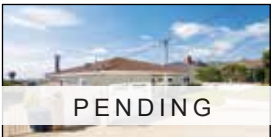

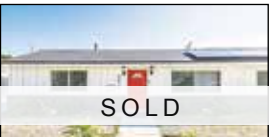

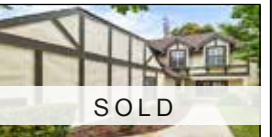

Football Eagles Improve to 3-0 with Latest Win

The Eagle’s latest 41-7 win over the Don

Lugo Conquistadores looked impressive in their third consecutive lopsided victory to start the season. It was another complete game for the offense, which amassed over 400 yards of total offense. Junior quarterback Ryan Wiacek completed seven passes for 147 yards and one touchdown, an eight-yard strike to Roman Aytur .

It was the ground game that highlighted the offense. Brian Everett led the attack, rushing 15 times for 91 yards and touchdown runs of 10, 9, and 7 yards. Cameron Nelson picked up 50 yards on just seven carries while Wiacek picked up 66 yards on five carries. Overall, the Eagles rushed forty times for 272 yards for an average of 6.8 per attempt.

On defense, the Eagles flexed their muscles, limiting the Conquistadores to 67 yards of total offense in the first half and 95 yards for the game. Lucas Jennings had two interceptions, while Isaiah Rodriguez had a fourth-quarter interception. Rodriguez and Hunter Sprick each had two quarterback sacks, and Justin

Castellanos caught Don Lugo QB quarterback Brandon Pinon behind the line of scrimmage for a five-yard loss.

The downside to an otherwise impressive victory over a solid opponent was the number of mistakes in penalties the Eagles committed. They will need to correct those mistakes when they host the South Torrance Spartans on Friday at 7 p.m.

Eagle Flag Team Splits Their Games

The Eagles defeated the West Torrance Warriors 21-14 in overtime and fell to the North Torrance Saxons 20-6 to drop to 2-2 in league play.

The overtime win over West Torrance was an exciting ending to a game the Eagles earned. They missed out on several opportunities on offense and missed flags on defense, making it frustrating for the Eagles.

Trailing 6-0 in the second quarter, the Eagles drove deep into West Torrance territory before turning the ball over on downs. It led to a Warrior quarterback safety, and

the Eagles were in business with good field position after the Warriors were forced to kick. Junior quarterback Sullivan McLaughlin marched the team into Warrior territory and found Elissa Campos open in the end zone for a three-yard touchdown pass and an 8-6 lead.

In the third quarter, the Eagles trailed 14-8 when McLaughlin connected with Ava King for a three-yard TD pass to tie the game at 14-14. The game went scoreless in the fourth quarter, forcing overtime. In the OT period, each team gets four plays from the opponent’s 20-yard line. On the third play, McLaughlin scrambled 13 yards for a touchdown and then hooked up with King for the PAT. On defense, the Warriors threatened to punch it in, but Emma Rubio intercepted the pass in the end zone, preserving the victory.

Unfortunately, the Eagles dropped a 20-6 loss to North Torrance on the road. They’ll host the Palos Verdes Sea Kings next Tuesday at 3:30 p.m. and South Torrance next Thursday, September 18, at 6 p.m. •

added. “In addition, managing the aftermath while preserving evidence and supporting the community’s recovery process.”

Active shooter incidents involve armed individuals engaged or attempting to kill people in populated areas. “The training emphasizes rapid response tactics, typically focusing on immediate deployment using single-officer or small team entry techniques,” Sistoni said. “Officers learn building-clearing procedures, systematic searches, and coordinated movement techniques where one officer engages threats while another provides overwatch. Our training includes extensive scenario-based training in simulated environments such as schools, workplaces, and public venues, often utilizing force-on-force exercises to create realistic stress conditions for decision-making practice.”

Sistoni continued: “Beyond tactical response, the training covers incident command structure and inter-agency coordination, teaching officers how to establish unified command with fire/EMS personnel and facility officials. Officers learn perimeter management techniques, including establishing inner and outer perimeters, managing evacuation routes, and coordinating family reunification areas.”

Medical integration is also a key component, with training in Tactical Emergency Casualty Care (TECC) teaching officers how to provide basic life-saving interventions and participate in Rescue Task Force operations alongside Emergency Medical Services personnel for victim extraction and treatment.

The training also addresses post-incident procedures. This includes preserving potential evidence during the operations, managing witnesses, and interviewing survivors.

Up until now, ESPD has never had permission to conduct this level of training at ESHS. But discussions with El Segundo Unified School District (ESUSD) Superintendent Jason Johnson and Principal Steven Gebhart resulted in agreement that the program would benefit all and provide peace of mind for staff, parents,

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students, and the community at large. In addition to Sistoni, the instructors for the active shooter team included Sergeant Jeremy Glunt, Sergeant Anthony Sanchez, Sergeant Jonathon Chavez, Officer Joshua Gilberts, Officer Brandon Mendoza, Officer Zack Conteras, and Officer Lucas Montero. Police Chief Saul Rodriguez was also involved throughout the process. On the District side, Chief Business Official Kimberlie Linz and Director of Maintenance & Operations Marni Harmon helped coordinate and support the event. Next up, the District and ESPD will review successes and challenges to ensure best practices are in place if a critical incident of this nature ever occurs. “We are currently reviewing additional joint training sessions with our neighboring agencies in the South Bay,” Sistoni said. “This is beneficial because when we respond to an active shooter, the response would be from all agencies in the South Bay area.”

Meanwhile, Gebhart spoke to the importance of the training and the successful collaboration between school staff and public safety personnel. He also addressed the recent tragedy in Minnesota. “My heart and thoughts go out to Minnesota and the tragic events that happened there,” he said. “For this reason and more, I applaud ESPD for initiating this training exercise...and am grateful for the close partnership between ESPD, ESFD, and ESUSD. It is every educator’s worst nightmare to have a violent emergency situation occur on campus, but the possibility is also one of the unfortunate realities of our time, so I appreciate ESPD taking steps to ensure they are prepared. The importance and value of first responders training to have knowledge not only of emergency response tactics and strategies, but also knowledge of applying those tactics to the specific layout of ESHS cannot be overstated. I know that the teachers, staff, and students feel better knowing that those who provide support and response are better prepared to keep them safe in the event of an emergency.” •



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
