From Venice to El Segundo: Pat Lennon Goes Full Board

He plays guitar and sings in a band that the late David Crosby dubbed “the best vocal group in the country.” He tours all over the United States and Europe, he once performed in front of 85,000 people, he appeared on albums by a veritable who’s who of musical icons, his older sisters were household names, and oh, by the way, he is a 28-year El Segundo resident who also builds custom surf and skate boards in his home workshop. While the name Pat Lennon might not immediately ring a bell for some folks, the longtime So-Cal band Venice, which he’s a member of, certainly will. And for popular music fans growing up in the ‘50s and ‘60s, the Lennon Sisters will conjure up great memories.

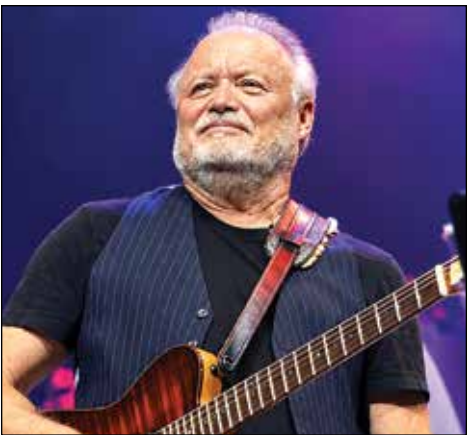
Blending voices was a central theme for Pat Lennon and his 11 siblings. “We just grew up that way, singing in cars and when we went on trips my dad would tell us, ‘Okay you do this harmony part,’ and then, ‘You take that part,’” he recalled. “We loved it, and it was always fun. But it was never, ‘You have to do this for a living, or you have to go sing in church.’”

However, the Lennon Sisters did do this for a living. DeeDee (Dianne), Janet, Kathy and Peggy were regulars on The Lawrence Welk Show from 1955-1968 before co-hosting their own variety program with Jimmy Durante, partnering with Andy Williams in Las Vegas, and appearing on various game shows. A younger sister, Mimi, later replaced Peggy after the latter’s retirement. Kathy, Janet and Mimi, who recently wrapped up their own performing careers, live in Branson, Missouri. “I’m on the phone with them all the time, and they visit here quite a bit,” Pat confirmed.

Meanwhile, back in 1962, Pat and his older brother Danny became infatuated with

the ukuleles their sisters’ boyfriends would leave behind after a visit to the family home in Venice. Soon after, their dad bought the boys their first guitars. “I was 10 years old,” he said. He and Danny eventually formed a band with their younger brother Bill. Then, in 1977, another younger brother, Kipp, started a group with cousins Mike and Mark (two of 13 siblings). “I would go watch them play on the Sunset Strip, and I thought, ‘Oh, how cute they are.’ I was seven to 10 years older. They were in high school, and I’m in my early 20s, so it was a world of difference.”

That world of difference was no longer a factor in 1980 when Pat asked the trio if they’d play at his wedding reception. They agreed under one condition. “They said that

New Principals at ESUSD

El Segundo’s two public elementary schools have new principals. One is a familiar face and the other is a newcomer to the school district.

Sean Brandlin has taken the position as Richmond Street School principal after serving four years as assistant principal at the campus. Known by the students as “Mr. B,” he grew up in El Segundo, attended St. Anthony’s School and El Segundo High School, where he graduated in 2001. He earned an undergraduate degree and teaching credential at Long Beach State University and began his teaching career at St. Jerome School in Westchester.

He joined the ESUSD at the middle school in 2013, where he taught sixth-grade language arts and social studies before

moving to eight-grade design and social studies or U.S. history. He also served as the instructional technology coach and personalized-learning coach for the district until 2022, when he stepped into the assistant principal’s role at Richmond.

“It’s an honor to step into the role of principal at Richmond Street. I am very grateful to the school board, Superintendent Dr. Johnson, and the district for the confidence they placed in me,” said Brandlin on Monday, after finishing a hectic week punctuated by Back to School night. “I am thrilled to help lead this staff and to continue to learn from them,” Brandlin added.

About two months into the job, Brandlin is adjusting to the change in his roles and

Obituaries

Carl Jacobson

Carl Jacobson, a devoted husband, father, grandfather, and lifelong public servant who became the longest-serving member of the El Segundo City Council, passed away peacefully with his family by his side.

Born to Jean and Oliver Jacobson and raised in the South Bay, Carl made El Segundo his home in 1970 and dedicated much of his life to the community he



loved. He served a total of 24 years on the El Segundo City Council across two separate stints (1984–1996/2004–2016, including ten years as Mayor), plus time on the Planning Commission and a board member of the Chamber of Commerce, earning the moniker “Institutional Memory of the City” for his deep knowledge of local issues and history. He was also honored to be the 2007 El Segundo Citizen of the Year.

During his tenure, Carl helped shape the city’s growth and quality of life in lasting ways. He played key roles in major development projects including Plaza El Segundo, The Point, and other commercial/creative office spaces; infrastructure improvements such as the Douglas Street Gap Closure; the successful effort to retain USAF Base during the 1991 BRAC process; the 2005 LAX settlement that brought residential sound insulation and limited gate capacity; fire department enhancements including Fire Station 2 and a second paramedic unit; and

Glentek while balancing his civic responsibilities. In his free time, he enjoyed classic cars as a docent at the Automobile Driving Museum, operating his ham radio, and tackling home improvement projects.

He is survived by his wife, Nancy; his daughters, Jen and Jill; his grandchildren, Owen, Colin, Ellen, Lily, and Nikki; and his sister, Nancy. Family was always Carl’s number one priority, and he cherished every opportunity to spend time with them. He often credited them for their unwavering support throughout his years of public service.

Carl will be remembered as someone who truly loved his family and El Segundo, acted with integrity and fiscal responsibility, and worked tirelessly to preserve and enhance the community assets that make it a special place to live and raise a family.

Private services will be held for the family. Those wishing to honor Carl’s memory may make a donation to El Segundo Education Foundation. •

ESUSD Board Meeting Report

The following information covers the September 8, 2026 ESUSD board meeting and was taken from ESUSD website:

District Goals Update: Strategic Plan Year Two

Superintendent Dr. Jason Johnson shared an update on the 2025-2028 District Goals as the district begins the second year of its Strategic Plan. The district is on track to meet its goals based on the progress made during year one. Dr. Johnson credited students, teachers, and staff for extraordinary achievement results.

Dr. Johnson focused on the objectives marked as at-risk, which will receive additional attention during the 2026-27 school year. These include: K-10 vertical alignment, mental health support, staff wellness, general education access for students with disabilities and environmental and finance programming for students

A board workshop is scheduled for September 14 and a first-quarter progress update will be shared during the October 1 meeting.

Board Hears Presentation on 2025-26 Unaudited Actuals

Chief Business Official Dr. Melissa Gooden

presented the 2025-26 Unaudited Actuals Financial Statement as of June 30, 2026, to the Board of Education.

The district saw anticipated deficit spending in the restricted fund, largely due to spending down one- time COVID-era funding, facilities improvements, and safety upgrades. The ending balance of unrestricted funds was lower than projected due to lower-than-expected funding, the impact of negotiated employee raises, and increased substitute costs. The district remains above the required 3% reserve, but acknowledged that reserves are declining and require close monitoring.

The next steps include submitting the unaudited actuals, once approved by the board, to the Los Angeles County Office of Education (LACOE). Following that, the audited financial report and first interim report are due to LACOE by December 15, 2026, with external auditors presenting the audited actuals in January 2027.

Additional Board Actions

The board approved a Consultant Services Agreement with Carie Oulashian to provide ongoing coaching and mentoring services for

Check It Out

Ode to the Half-Broken by Suzanne Palmer

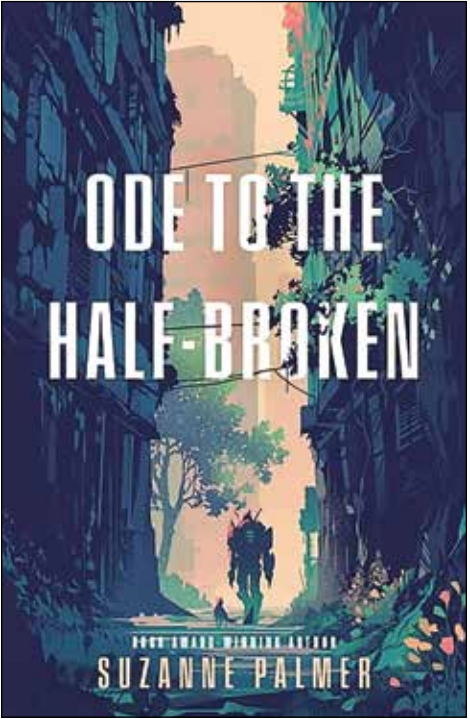

Despite dire circumstances, Ode to the Half-Broken is an optimistic journey where an initially unnamed robot chases down the ones who stole their leg, while accompanied by a human mechanic and cyborg dog. The trio discover how communities of humans and robots alike are rebuilding after a societal collapse, interspersed by flashbacks of the causes of said collapse. Our protagonist emerges from a twenty-year stint of self-imposed isolation and begins a cross-country chase that still finds moments of peace that lead to an almost “cozy” read, interspersed by exciting fight scenes.

The characters are charming and give a reader plenty to root for. We meet machines of all types, from sentient train cars to wise-cracking drones. With robots being more popular than ever in contemporary Sci-Fi, this manages to be a refreshing take on an

alternative AI that cares more for discussions of consciousness and growth than how that consciousness is a danger to humanity. In addition, Palmer does an excellent job of critiquing humanity’s treatment of the planet while still insisting there is a place for humans in this changed environment. Atticus, the wise-cracking cyborg dog, and the human mechanic Murphy help our protagonist along both physical and emotional journeys that make for an evolved version of the “man and his dog” quest that remains timeless for a reason.

If I had a main complaint about the novel, it would be how cleanly certain conflicts resolve themselves. While I appreciated the lack of loose ends, there are moments where a reader can only think to themselves “oh, well that was convenient.” Even still, Palmer’s writing has a lot of heart and there is poignancy in lines that feature both old-school wisdom and modern charm that make for an overall great read. If you were a fan of Automatic Noodle by Annalee Newitz or Psalm for the Wild-Built by Becky Chambers, I absolutely recommend picking up Ode to the Half-Broken by Suzanne Palmer from the El Segundo Public Library when you get the chance! •

Eagles Have a Challenging Week

It was a week to forget for the El Segundo Eagles. The water polo team lost a heartbreaker, then held on for a win. The girls' volleyball team got swept, and the flag team lost two. The football team had a much-needed bye to prepare for the rest of the season.

Eagles Lose Close One and Win Thriller

The El Segundo boys' water polo program has rarely had an easy schedule in the last eighty years the program has been around. The arduous schedule they play is a testament to the Eagles' success over the past nine decades. It all starts with a non-league tilt that recently included facing the La Habra Highlanders and Downey Vikings. The Eagles fell to La Habra 11-8 but held off Downey 11-10.

La Habra is coming off back-to-back twenty-win seasons and had revenge on their mind when they faced the Eagles. It was the Eagles who ended the Highlanders' season two seasons ago in the CIF Southern Section Division 1 playoffs when La Habra came into the match with a 23-2 record. Cooper Albano, Vinny Baldino and Carter Williamson on the perimeter and Austin Miller inside led the Eagles to a 17-10 victory.

This time the matchup was much closer, and the teams were evenly matched. The Eagles turned away the Highlanders' offense on their first four possessions. Luke Griffiths, in goal, turned away three shot attempts while Austin Miller, Bryson Duffaut and Johnny Amaral controlled the interior and perimeter.

The Eagles opened the scoring when Austin Miller took a rebound and fired a shot past Highlander goalie Jude Muci with 3:59 left in the first quarter. La Habra tied the game

two minutes later on a penalty shot by Garrett Carty. The Highlanders used a breakaway counterattack to take a 2-1 lead on a goal by Carty, who worked the ball inside for an easy shot attempt with 29 seconds remaining.

In the second period, the Highlanders took a 3-1 lead when Hayden Flores' high lob pass to Carty inside found the shot attempt to get past Griffiths in goal. After the Eagles stopped the Highlanders on their next possession, Griffiths fed Bryson Duffaut on a long pass. Duffaut drove the rest of the way for an easy shot attempt to make it 3-2. Austin Miller's penalty shot tied the game at 3-3. The Highlanders took advantage of their next two possessions when they scored on consecutive ejection goals to take a 5-3 lead with just under two minutes remaining in the first half. The Eagles countered with a goal that was initiated by a pass from Joshua Rhyu to Austin Miller inside and cut the deficit to 5-4 to end the scoring in the first half.

The third period was another close seven minutes, with three lead changes and three tied scores. Austin Miller scored the equalizer on a shot from inside to make it 5-5. Reid Chrisman scored on a penalty shot after Miller's attempt to give the Eagles a 6-5 lead. The Highlanders used a poised counterattack to score consecutive goals and take a 7-6 lead. But the Eagles scored the last two goals of the quarter, including Chrisman's ejection goal with 55 seconds remaining and Miller's penalty shot with no time showing on the clock.

The Eagles took an 8-7 lead into the fourth quarter, but each possession in the final period ended scoreless. The Highlanders took the lead with 3:18 remaining and held off the Eagles to win it 11-8.

responsibilities on campus. He says being assistant principal was more administrative and behind-the-scenes than being principal. Brandlin, a huge Dodgers fan who collects and displays team merchandise and collectible figures in his office, sees a parallel between being the top administrator at the 620-student campus and the skipper of the 25-man Dodger roster.

“It’s almost like stepping into the role of manager. Rather than being primarily focused on the work behind the scenes, my role is about heading the direction, having the right team, empowering our staff to do their best work, and creating a culture where everyone is working toward that shared purpose,” he said. “Much like Tommy Lasorda or Dave Roberts with the Dodgers.”

The jump from assistant principal was easier because Mr. B was part of the Richmond team of teachers, classroom assistants, and non-teaching staff when he applied for the vacant principal position. “Knowing the staff, knowing the players definitely was helpful, for sure. Knowing how the school operates, all of the things we do so well, kind of where I can support,” has smoothed over some of the bumps a new principal typically encounters.

Brandlin, who holds a master’s degree from Long Beach State, said one of his first-year goals is to strengthen small-group support

for the students who need the extra help. Another is to help children and teachers in grades transitional kindergarten to fifth grade feel connected and supported, he said.

At Center Street School, Michael Bosler is settling in as the new principal. He brings administrative experience to El Segundo Unified, having served as principal at Mark Twain Elementary School in Lawndale and as an assistant principal in Palos Verdes. He credits his mother for his own career path into education, he says.

“My mom was an instructional aide in a special-education classroom when I was in elementary school, so that initially drew my interest to it,” he said. “I knew from an early age that I wanted to go into education. I had no idea there was anything other than teaching,” Bosler said with a chuckle.

He didn’t set out to be an administrator, he says, despite early career obstacles and barriers schools face. It was a mentor who pushed Bosler to become solution-oriented and to think bigger — “systematically,” he calls it — to move those obstacles in his district’s classrooms, according to him.

“I really had people who supported me and put it out there, and I ran with it,” he said.

He was born in Palm Springs and attended schools in La Quinta in Riverside County before attending the University of California, Riverside, where he earned a bachelor’s

degree. He holds a teaching credential from National University, a master’s degree from UCLA, and a doctoral degree from USC. Bosler began teaching in 2009 and worked as a special education resource teacher at a middle school in the desert before moving to Los Angeles County and meeting his wife. They have two young daughters.

While teaching at Culver City Middle School starting in 2013, he also attended UCLA’s Leadership Institute, where he earned his educational administrative credential. Since 2022, he has served as principal at Mark Twain in Lawndale. Since joining El Segundo Unified in the summer, he’s hosted coffee-with-the-principal events for parents, made it a point to work the Center Street front gate for morning arrivals, and been visible to meet students and their parents.

There was the Sept. 29 Back-to-School night, and a Parent-Teacher Association meeting before the campus showcase that served as a low-key meet-and-greet for the district’s new principal. “That’s the name of the game right now, getting to meet more people,” he said. Bosler plans to make a splash — literally — at Saturday’s Main Street Fair hosted by the Kiwanis Club. “I’m making a guest appearance at the dunk tank,” he told the Herald. It’s all part of a larger plan for the 2026-27 school year.

“I want to get to meet people, listen to what the needs are and how I can support,”

he said. His goals at Center Street are to maintain the high-performing track record in the elementary grades and get more students involved in campus activities, including after-school kickball for the fourth- and fifth-grade boys and girls. The winning teams from the two grade levels will meet in a championship game. The sports program will also include wiffle ball and Frisbee in spring, he said.

“I’m excited about that. Also, we’re having Spirit Week and different opportunities to celebrate the diversity within Center Street.

The decision to move on from his former school to join the Center Street family didn’t come easily, he shared. “Just because I loved where I was at, but I was super excited for the opportunity,” he said. “I’m so happy I made the move; it’s been great so far.”

When asked to name one thing that the school parents at Richmond and Center should know about their new school principals, Brandlin and Bosler came in with very similar responses:

“This is heart work. I care passionately about what I do (and) I lead my students how I would want my daughters to be led and taken care of,” Bosler said. For “Mr. B” — now Principal Brandlin — “I’m a parent. On a personal note, having my own children attend Richmond has been an incredible gift, and I get to see the school through their eyes.” •

when I got back from my honeymoon that I had to join their band,” he said. “I said, ‘Yes,’ thinking they would not follow up on it. Sure enough, Michael called a few months later and said rehearsals were starting.” And so the group known as Venice the Band was now complete and has not looked back since. Venice’s sound melds folk, rock and soul with a distinctive 1970s California vibe built on rich, four-part harmony.

Kipp, Mark, and Michael also regularly play in an alter-ego, all-cover-tune side project called The Pine Mountain Logs. Pat opted not to join that configuration, but occasionally sits in as a special guest.

While popular throughout the United States, especially in beach communities, Venice is particularly well known in the Netherlands, where the guys recently performed a series of shows before sizable audiences. “We’ve been going to Holland for about 27 years,” Pat said, noting that a radio personality there heard one of their albums back in the late 1990s and urged them to visit. “It took off from there, and it just built and built. Now when we go back, we’ve got rabid fans who love us, and we’ve become friends with many of them.” In fact, the band won the Netherlands’ Edison Award (similar to a Grammy) for Best International Artist in 2003, besting the likes of U2 and Coldplay for the honor.

Among Pat’s most treasured career highlights are a 2011 benefit concert Venice played at Santa Monica High School with members of the bands America and Mr. Mister as well as Crosby. “He was a really good friend,” he said of the singer/songwriter/guitarist who rose to fame in the 1960s. “David gave me two of my acoustic guitars.” He also performed alongside or recorded with Jackson Browne, Heart, Don Henley, Billy Idol, Dave Mason, Michael McDonald, and Bruce Springsteen, among many others too numerous to mention.

Arguably Venice’s biggest break was a stint from 2010-13 traveling around the globe to

provide background vocals for ex-Pink Floyd’s Roger Waters for The Wall Live Tour. “We had nine sold-out shows in Argentina, which beat the record set by the Rolling Stones,” Pat said. “Those shows with him were amazing. It was like touring with a Beatle.”

With all the glory that comes with hitting all the right notes during a performance, not every gig works out perfectly. Even 46 years in, mishaps occur. “We mess up on lyrics all the time,” Pat admitted. “And just a few weeks ago in Holland with 5,000 people there, I had this solo on my electric guitar and my string somehow got stuck under the pickup. So when I went to do the high part, I didn’t hit it, and it just stopped because my string wasn’t there and I thought, ‘Oh my God.’ But instead of pretending nothing was wrong, we stopped the song. I fixed my guitar, and we went from there.”

Pat was pleased to note his bandmates take these errors in stride. “We just laugh about it because we have so much fun doing this,” he said. That sense of camaraderie continues to fuel the members. While they take painstaking care in crafting their sound, they don’t take themselves so seriously.

Though music was always a constant in Pat’s life, his other career assumed equal if not greater billing. One might not have predicted this would be the case, though. “It’s funny because I took Wood Shop in high school and got a C in it,” he recalled. “I just didn’t care that much.”

Yet after graduating in 1969, Pat, Danny, and Bill launched their business, Venice Restorations, refinishing furniture and selling antiques. During this time, he learned to repair old furniture and then got into framing homes and building finished cabinetry. That skill set led to a period constructing studios for Jackson Browne, Tom Petty, J.D. Souther, and other notables of the popular music scene. He eventually walked away from the business side to focus on crafting custom

Referred to as one of the “El Porto Wallbenders,” he became especially known for his handmade, to-scale miniature recreations of classic Hawaiian and California boards. “I’ve surfed all my life, and I also used to run marathons, but my hips went out,” he lamented. “I’m still down at the beach all the time though.”

Nowadays, Pat spends many hours out in his shop and is a mentor to local teens. “I’m down at the El Porto parking lot every morning with my mini boards displayed in my car, and the El Segundo High Surf Team is there three days a week,” he said. “I’ve developed a great relationship with their coach, Tyler Contrarsy, and for the past six or seven years I’ve made four to six mini boards for the kids who excel in different categories from surfing to sportsmanship. I’ve gotten to know many kids and parents, and it’s very fulfilling to attend the banquet at the end of the year and see my work appreciated so much.”

Pat also opens his house to youngsters interested in learning the art of woodworking. One of his prized students is 26-year-old El Segundo native Dani Daley. “Her husband’s a lifeguard, and she came to me and wanted me to make a tail block and fin for her surfboard,” he said. “She said she wanted to learn how to do this and I said, ‘Well, you gotta help me clean my shop.’ So she did, and she has been working with me for about six years now.”

In addition to his involvement with El Segundo High and the many friends made since settling here in 1998 (he lives in a 1920s Spanish home that he describes as a “perfect little house”), Pat boasts a major community sports connection. He is related to Danny Boehle, who managed the El Segundo baseball team that won the 2023 Little League World Series. “His mom is my first cousin,” he explained, adding that he has a whopping 59 first cousins. “We went to the parade, and it was really exciting for us.” That same night, Venice performed in Hermosa Beach, and the band members invited Boehle’s son Quinn to sing on stage with them.

Though Kipp and Mark handle the lead vocals for Venice, Pat provides the integral “high part” in the harmonies. He was pleased to report that at the age of 74, his voice remains intact. “I can still get up there,” he said of his range. He is also one of the group’s songwriters and often sits down with his guitar developing ideas. Asked if a particular tune resonated the most with fans, he was quick to respond, “We are probably best known for the song ‘The Family Tree,’ which talks about people dying in your family or friends who were really close,” he said. “It’s about dealing with grief and bringing people together, dealing with surviving that and having new people in the family. Every time we play it in the Netherlands, we stay after to sign autographs, and invariably there are always a few people who come up and say that they used ‘The Family Tree’ at their father’s or mother’s funeral. And so, we have become part of their lives.”

As for how much longer he intends to perform, Pat was non-committal. “I don’t know,” he admitted. “When COVID hit, we didn’t play for a few years. In the back of my mind, I was thinking of not doing this anymore. But then I talked to some musical friends from here and in the Netherlands, and they said, ‘You’re so lucky to have what you have.’ And it’s so true...” •
