Capriotti's Owner Brings Lifelong Love of Restaurants to the Table

It's not easy to make it in the restaurant business. In fact, 60 percent of new establishments fail within the first year, according to the National Restaurant Association. It's a complicated and competitive industry that requires several factors to go just right—especially for a first-time franchise operator in the Los Angeles region. The components include sufficient start-up capital to combat the inflated labor, equipment, food, and rent costs that sap profits early on. You also need savvy marketing, ample staffing, consistently good food, and top-notch customer service. And, of course, location is key. It also helps if the proprietor has a background in the business and truly enjoys this line of work. Such is the case with Christopher Polk, who opened the El Segundo branch of the popular sandwich haven Capriotti's in May. Originally founded in Wilmington, Delaware, in 1976 by two siblings, the chain has grown to over 100 company-owned and franchise operations in 29 states with a devoted following that craves the brand's distinctive take on cold, grilled, and veggie subs, cheese steaks and salads.

Polk's love affair with food goes back to his roots growing up on the New Jersey shore on a small barrier island (the town of Margate) not far from Atlantic City. His Italian

mother worked as a waitress in his aunt's breakfast and lunch spot, but was also a local legend for her own cooking. "The kids from the neighborhood were always at our house, especially at dinner time," Polk recalled. "We were not wealthy, but we always had food to

share, and that's where the love came from. At that time, I didn't realize my mother's influence and the restaurants's impact on me and that someday I would own a restaurant and serve people as my mom did."

The City of El Segundo is proud to announce the launch of "El Segundo Connect," an upgraded online citizen reporting tool designed to improve access to City services and streamline communication between the community and local government. In a major step forward, El Segundo Connect is available online and as a mobile app, marking the City's first-ever app.

"Our residents are often the first to spot issues in their neighborhoods," shared Councilmember Carol Pirsztuk. "El Segundo Connect makes it incredibly easy for them to report those problems, track its progress, and stay updated. Empowering the community to play an active role in keeping El Segundo a great place to live, work, and visit."

El Segundo Connect is now live and replaces "Report an Issue" on the City's website. With this new user-friendly platform, users can quickly and easily report non-emergency issues from their computer or smartphone at any time. The streamlined process prompts users to select the type of issue, add details, attach photos or documents, and provide a location. With just a few clicks, users can submit service requests directly to City staff for quick action.

Councilmember Ryan Baldino shared his enthusiasm for the launch, "El Segundo Connect represents a significant step forward in making City services more accessible and responsive. We're proud to launch the City's first mobile app as part of our ongoing commitment to transparency

Eagles Look for Success with Young Team

The Eagles were on the verge of a CIF Southern Section Division 3 playoff second-round victory last season when a non-call by the officials in overtime cost them a win. With the painful 1-0 loss seared in the minds of those returning, it makes for a promising

The Other Fab Four: *The Remarkable True Story of the Liverbirds, Britain's First Female Rock Band*, a Memoir by Mary McGlory and Sylvia Saunders

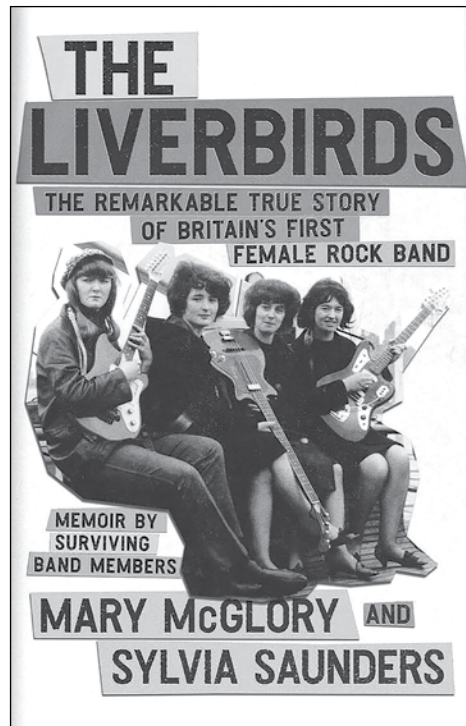
The OTHER Fab Four? What ARE you talking about?

I had no idea that a female rock group called the Liverbirds existed, much less that they were formed around the time the Beatles were beginning to hit with the British teens around

1962! Surviving members of The Liverbirds, Mary McGlory and Sylvia Saunders, have collaborated on this history of their musical odyssey, short-lived as it was, chronicling their unlikely ascent toward stardom. Along the way, the girls met some interesting characters, including some very influential musicians in their extremely formative years.

Mary and Sylvia take turns with chapters, describing their origins, both born into working class families in Liverpool just after World War II. Both of them remember their household members being industrious, since most families didn't have a lot of money. Sylvia's mother worked several jobs, and

WHAT IS PROPOSED: The Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) invites the public to review and comment on the Draft Removal Action Workplan (RAW) for the site located at 128 Maryland Street and 817 E. Franklin Avenue (Lot C location) (Site). DTSC is part of the California Environmental Protection Agency. DTSC regulates the handling and cleanup of hazardous substances.

A RAW is a workplan submitted to DTSC for review and approval which is developed to carry out a removal action, in an effective manner, that is protective of the public health and safety and the environment. The RAW objective is to address potential risks to human health and the environment and present the following:

1. Limited excavation of potentially contaminated soil as needed for construction and the utilization of existing and future pavement and structures as a protective cover to block exposure pathways for building occupants at Lot B.
2. Continuation or expansion of the current Soil Vapor Extraction (SVE) is anticipated to be sufficient to mitigate vapor intrusion in the existing Buildings A, B, and C located on the Site. In addition, a vapor intrusion mitigation system (VIMS) will be installed for any building in which vapor intrusion issues are present despite the SVE system influence and remediation.
3. A land use covenant may be required to limit future use of the property to industrial/commercial use only.

HOW CAN I GET INVOLVED: DTSC will consider written public comments on the draft RAW that are postmarked or emailed by January 17, 2025. CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT (CEQA): DTSC prepared a draft Notice of Exemption (NOE) which states that the proposed cleanup activities will not have an adverse effect on public health and the environment. DTSC will file the NOE with the Office of Planning and Research after the RAW is approved.

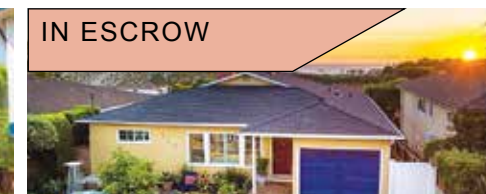

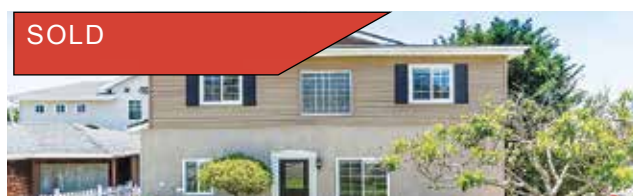

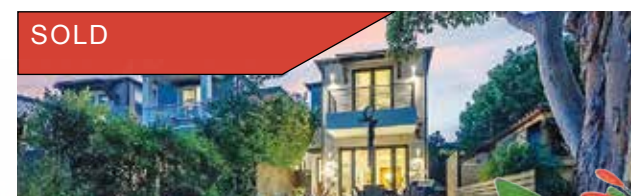

Polk's first memory of restaurants harkens back to early childhood when he remembers waking up in a booth while his mother, who supervised the servers, readied the place to open. "I would rub my eyes, wake up, and see the customers looking at me," he said. "I guess it was cute seeing a toddler rise from the booth. Next, I would be under the counter washing glasses in the sink. My hands were so small, I could clean the inside of the coffee pots." By age 10, he was a "veteran" of the business, though too short for customers to see him. As he entered his teens, his responsibilities grew to dishwashing, bussing and cleaning. After his aunt sold the eatery, Polk handled short order cooking duties at a friend's restaurant and also, notably, at a few cheesesteak shops. "Cheesesteaks are like a food group from where I come from," Polk explained. His resume also included a stint at the renowned Formica's Bakery, which provided the bulk of the bread served in the Atlantic City area. One customer was the White House Sub Shop frequented

by iconic singer/actor Frank Sinatra. "It was across the street, and I would take bread over in a shopping cart," Polk noted.

At 14, Polk began making the rounds at various restaurants during the busy summer months when tourists filled the Atlantic City area. Eventually, his interests moved to photography, where he learned the business from the ground up and ultimately launched a successful career still in progress for 30 years and running. It's a full-time gig, along with Capriotti's. He currently shoots freelance after a decade with the Getty and prior employment with the Associated Press and the Atlantic City Press. "I'm primarily in the entertainment business—not Paparazzi," he emphasized. "I shoot events, concerts, award shows, and anything entertainment-driven. My photography is a passion, but the restaurant is as well. It makes me happy talking to the customers and hearing their stories. When I listen to them compliment the food and service, that's just a bonus."

Polk's return to restaurants after many years away came as a result of the pandemic. When event photography work came to a halt during the early period of COVID-19, he and his childhood friend Micah Paloff (Director of Food and Beverage at the Hotel Bel-Air) banded about the idea of opening a pizza or sandwich shop. "I wasn't sure if the photography event business would return, but I was sure people would need to eat—so it sounded like a great idea," he said. The great idea led to Capriotti's, and Polk thought he made all the right moves in advance of the grand opening. Little did he expect the crowd numbers that showed up that day. "This was my first restaurant, and the employees up to the GM had never worked at Capriotti's before," he said. "We were trained well and Capriotti's did a great job preparing us, but we couldn't be ready for what was coming. It was a disaster. Sandwiches were coming out in 30-40 minutes, incorrectly made and inconsistent from trip to trip."

Luckily for Polk, the initial nightmare was short-lived, and he quickly adapted to the demands of a busy location. Among other adjustments, he purchased a second grill to keep up with the hot sandwiches as well as a cold bay to make salads more efficiently. "It was hard to get under control, but I feel like people may not realize what it takes to get a restaurant working smoothly," he said. "Some customers were unhappy at the very beginning, but now we are streamlined, and things are going great." Polk is certain his Capriotti's will survive the first-year restaurant curse and hopes to thrive in El Segundo for many years to come. "I want to have a great relationship with the community since my hometown shop, Dino's, was such a big part of mine," he said. Only nowadays, you can actually see him when he's standing behind the counter...

PREVENT KITCHEN FIRES IN YOUR HOME

(BPT) - The holidays are just around the corner and for many people, that means big plans. If you're that holiday host, you know a lot of your time is spent in the kitchen. Along with the joy of cooking for friends and family, it's important to keep an eye on fire safety as well.

According to the National Fire Prevention Agency, Thanksgiving Day is ground zero for kitchen fires. More fires happen on that day than any other. Nobody wants those kinds of holiday memories!

—Stay alert and attentive. Always keep an eye on what you're doing

and check the food regularly. Don't wander out of the kitchen to chat with your guests.

—Save the wine for dinner. If you're sleepy or have consumed alcohol, don't use the stove or stovetop. The same goes for any medications that might make you drowsy.

—Watch for sleeves, oven mitts, wooden utensils.

—Be prepared. Keep a fire extinguisher approved for cooking or grease fires nearby and make sure you know how to use it. And, when's the last time you changed the batteries in your smoke alarms?

—Do you really need to fry the turkey? Each year, deep fryer accidents cause 60 injuries, five deaths and \$15 million in property damage. If you're determined to deep fry your bird, never leave it unattended. Do not use the fryer in your garage, wear goggles and protective clothing.

What should you do there's a fire? —Turn off the heat source. Immediately turn off the burner for stovetop fires. For oven fires, turn off the oven and keep the door closed.

—Cover the pan with its lid. Always cook with a lid beside your pan. If you do have a fire in the pan, don't

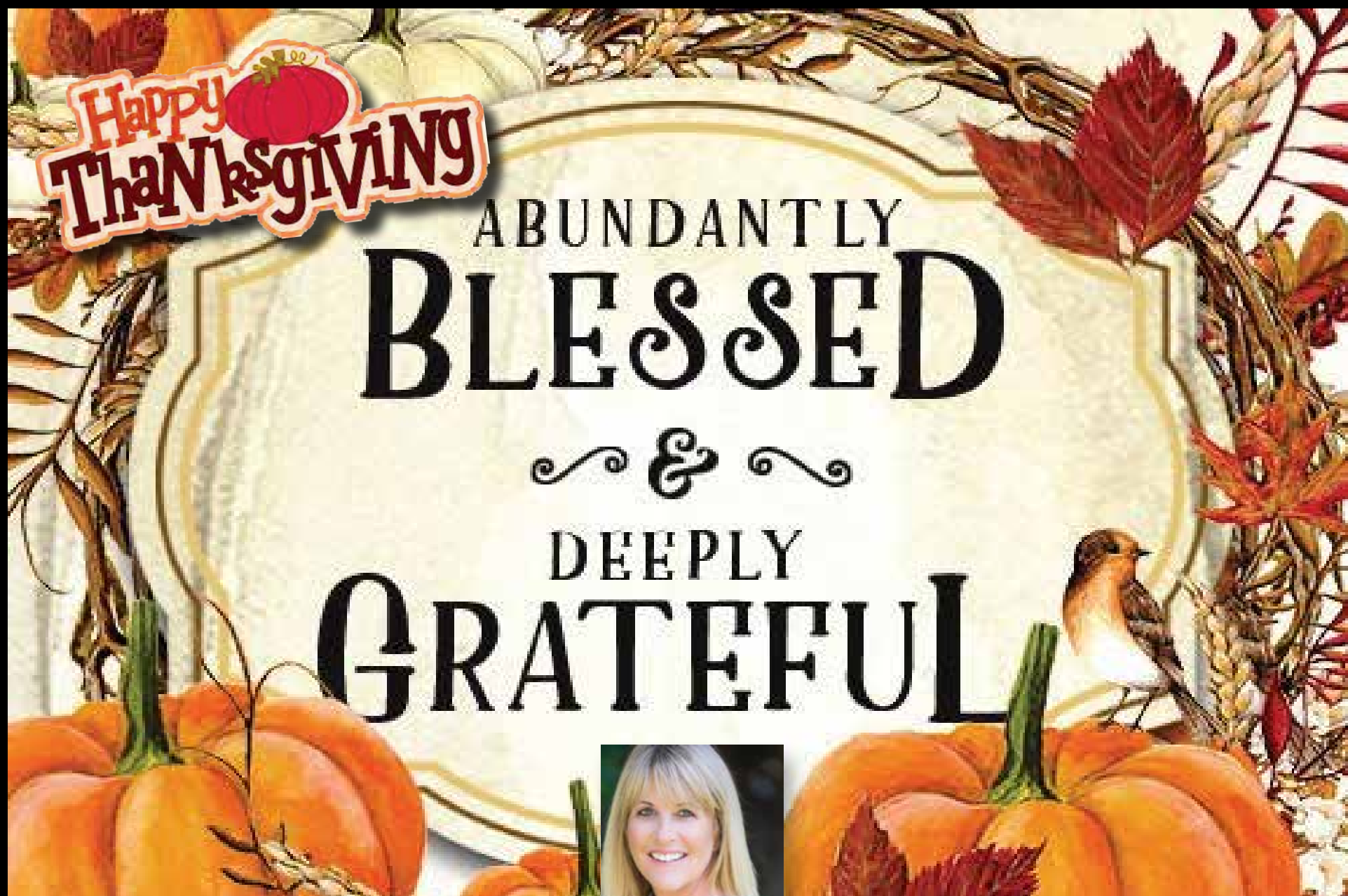
throw water on it. Instead, slide the lid over the pan. Do not remove the cover because the fire could start again.

—Do not move the pan. Moving it could cause the fire to spread.

—Do not try to extinguish it with water.

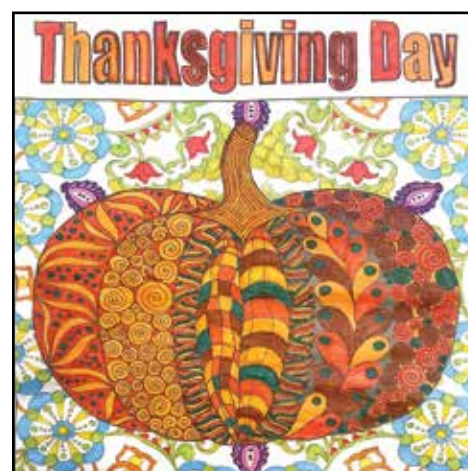

her father grew vegetables and kept chickens. Mary lived in close quarters with many siblings and also grandparents and an uncle. Neither girl could ever imagine how their lives would soon change.

Mary saw the Beatles play at the Cavern Club with her cousin Rita and friends Maggie and Veronica. They were so bowled over by the performance (AND the crowd's reaction to the guys) that they all decided, then and there, to form their own band: "... let's be the first girls to do it!" Off they went to the local music store and picked their instruments: Mary, Veronica and Rita got guitars and Maggie bought a drum kit. Then, instead of learning how to play, they decided that publicity would be the first thing to do. Calling themselves The Squaws, they posed for photos and then looked for someone to write about them. It's hard to imagine, but these plucky girls were able to personally contact the editor of *Mersey Beat* magazine and bluff their way into a published article. But they still couldn't play! They actually carried their EMPTY guitar cases to the Cavern, which were their tickets into the club. But they couldn't do that forever ...

While Mary was inventing The Squaws, Sylvia and her friend Valerie were going to

Irish pub gigs. Six months into their friendship, Sylvia discovered that Val could play the guitar. When Val tried to teach Sylvia some chords (disastrously), Sylvia said, "I'll get a kit of drums instead." Val responded, "Yeah, OK ... And then we'll get an all-girl band together." When the girls saw the article about The Squaws in *Mersey Beat*, it all started to come together. Sylvia and Val tracked Mary & her girls down. When Maggie and Veronica became bored with the whole idea, Sylvia and Val joined up. Rita had soon "had enough," so another cousin of Mary's, Sheila stepped in. Rita did manage to christen the group with a new name --- The Liverbirds, named after the two eighteen-foot metal birds on top of the spires of the Royal Liver Building on the city's waterfront.

The girls were introduced to the Beatles by Bob Wooler, from the Cavern Club. Bob told them, "This is the Liverbirds, they're gonna be the first all-girl group." Paul thought it was a great idea but John said sarcastically, "Girls don't play guitars." This statement was what moved the girls to prove him wrong.

The memoir of their climb includes some personnel changes (Sheila was out, Pam Birch was in!), guitar and drum lessons, a first gig at St. Philomena's Catholic Church followed

by stints at the Cavern plus many wild and wooly memories of the camaraderie between the "boys" in the bands. The Liverbirds caroused and/or performed with Pete Best, Lee Curtis, the Rolling Stones, the Kinks and The Searchers, to name but a few.

And then, it was on to Hamburg, Germany and the Star-Club.

There's much more to the story, of course ... and a sweet ending that tells of the recent

musical play about The Liverbirds AND ... maybe a film is in the works! Look them up on YouTube and you will be amazed (I especially loved watching Sylvia playing drums, her head bobbing up and down!)

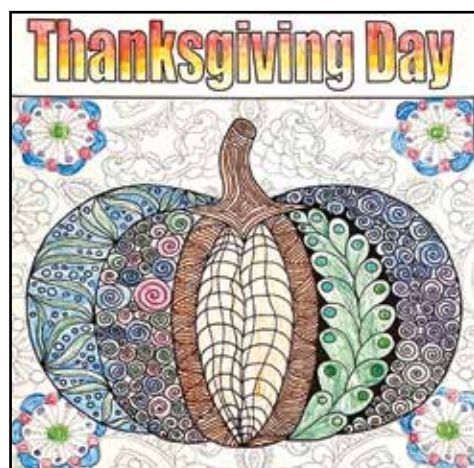

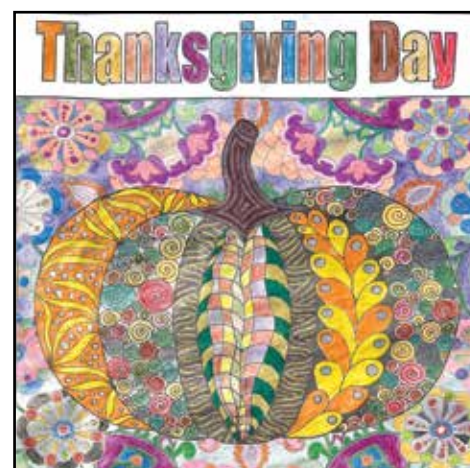
