Local Police Become Secret Santa Messengers

It didn't seem like holiday cheer at all at first when a couple of El Segundo Police officers pulled over a Dial-a-Ride bus with 10 female senior citizens in tow entering Plaza El Segundo the morning of December 12. Lieutenant Ray Garcia stepped onto the bus to inform the passengers that the vehicle was "targeted for law enforcement." He and Officer Kurt Rasmusson escorted all but one of the passengers (who was in a wheelchair fastened to the bus) outside to explain the situation. Confused and frightened as to what they possibly could have done wrong, the women soon breathed a collective sigh of relief. "I advised them that Secret Santa in the City of El Segundo is alive and well and that he asked us to look for El Segundo residents deserving of a very special gift for Christmas," Garcia said. "I told them that we value them as residents, feel they are an important part of the community and to please accept a gift from Secret Santa." With that, the officers handed each of them a \$100 gift card at Target along with a \$100 bill to spend however way they wished. Garcia continued, "They were shocked, surprised and thanked us. One of them was brought to tears and gave both me and Officer Rasmusson a kiss before we sent them on their merry way."

To make sure things went smoothly, the Police Department briefed the shuttle bus driver in advance as well as staff at the Joslyn

Center. Rasmusson later paid a visit to a woman who had to cancel her bus ride last-minute because her leg was bothering her. He presented her with the same gifts. Two more seniors who signed up to for a shopping trip in the afternoon also benefited from Secret Santa's generosity.

A more comprehensive community-wide Secret Santa outreach took place on Wednesday, December 16 and also over the weekend (for the officers who only work during this period) to allow all 57 sworn personnel take part in the giving process unbeknownst to unsuspecting citizens. "Our directive was to drive around town and find people in need," Officer Chris Cameron said, using as an example those in cars with expired registration tags (who in most cases can't afford to pay the bill). As a result, dozens of random citizens became the lucky recipients of cash, Ralphs gift cards, movie tickets, car wash vouchers, free lunches and more.

The morning of the 16th, the Police Department held a briefing during which each of the division commanders received a supply of cash and gift cards to hand out to personnel for distribution to people in town. "We told the officers that when they make contact and provide a gift to please say this came from a community of Secret Santas and we are acting as their elves," Garcia explained, noting that the benefactors are actually a combination of local residents and businesspeople looking to

brighten up the holidays for those who could use a little extra support. "It could be done through traffic or pedestrian stops, approaching someone in the service industry like in a restaurant or hotel, a shopper in line at a grocery store... We asked the officers to be creative and pick who they think deserves a random act of kindness."

While the vast majority of the stops were spontaneous, the department identified nine individuals in advance for special attention. "There were specific cases of families in real need that we learned about from a local church and we targeted them for a more substantial monetary gift," Garcia said. The residents in question had suffered through catastrophic illness, injuries from an auto accident, and severe financial hardship, among other issues. "Some of the stories were heartbreaking," Garcia added.

The El Segundo Secret Santa was the brainchild of local Police Captain Bob Turnbull, who had watched coverage of a similar campaign on the news one evening. It seems that after coordinating all the handouts on his own for several years, the anonymous businessman acting as Secret Santa decided to deputize a local law enforcement agency in Missouri to expand the reach. This got the wheels turning for Turnbull, who provided some additional background. "For the past several years, I have worked on Christmas Day in order to

Chevron's Fuel Your School Program

Benefits 40,089 Students in Select Cities in and around the South Bay Area of Los Angeles County

Chevron U.S.A. Inc. announced today that its 2015 Fuel Your School program generated \$500,000 to help fund 538 classroom projects, including 223 focused on science, technology, engineering and math (STEM), to help connect real world experiences to classroom learning for 40,089 students at 151 public schools in select cities in and around the South Bay Area of Los Angeles County.

Students at the Da Vinci Innovation Academy received a Physics Fun Park Electronics Discovery Kit. The kit will be used to help students gain a better understanding of the laws of physics and how these concepts are used to create and run an amusement park.

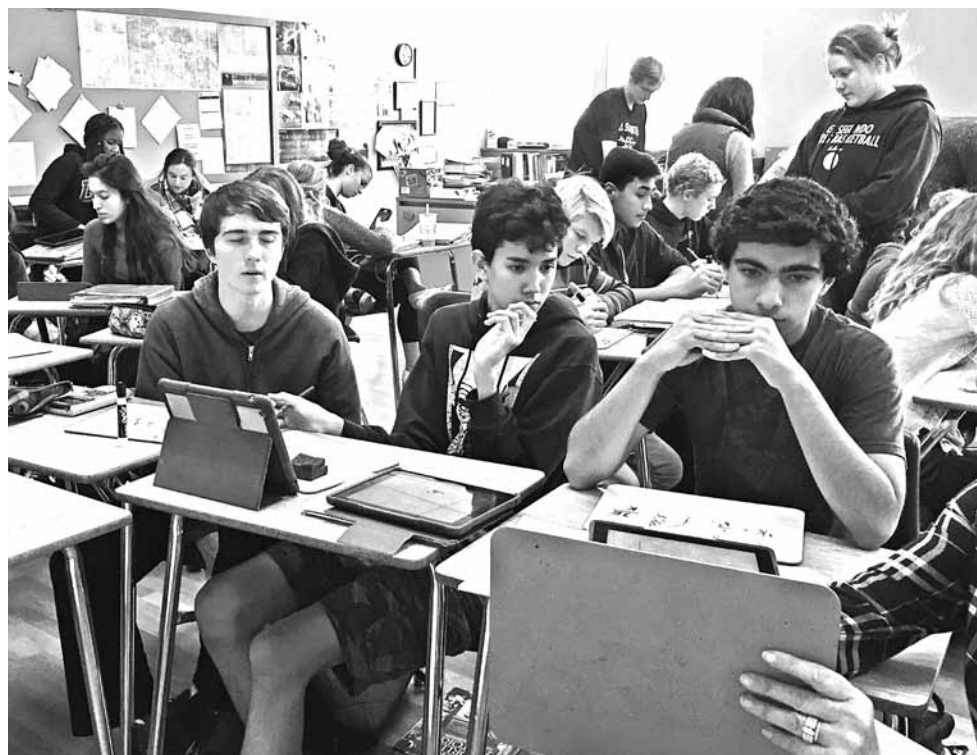

Predicting the Super Bowl

It's amazing how quickly the football season comes and goes every year. This year has seemingly been no different. It appears like just days ago that we were talking about Pete Carroll ignoring his star running back, Marshawn Lynch, to pass the ball over the middle of the field and lose Super Bowl XLIX on an interception. It's been almost an entire year since then and while both the Seahawks and the Patriots seem to be headed back for a playoff push, other teams have emerged as possible Super Bowl 50 front-runners. Heading into final weeks of regular season play, a record 23 teams have still been alive in the playoff hunt. Despite all of the talk, however, there are only a handful that actually have the chance to make it to the big dance.

The Carolina Panthers have lasted longer than any other team in the league without getting a loss. Even still, fans and analysts everywhere are looking for reasons to eliminate Cam Newton and company from Super Bowl contention. The NFC is, of course, and extremely tough conference. In order to get there, the Panthers will have to get past the likes of the Seattle Seahawks, Green Bay Packers, and Arizona Cardinals, to name a few. Perhaps that's why unless you're a Carolina fan, you don't believe the trek to Santa Clara for this year's championship game is possible. Newton, however, leads the NFL in touchdown percentage. He's the leading quarterback rusher in the league, has one of the best tight ends in Greg Olson, a much improved offensive line, a great running game and a defense that leads the league in turnovers, interceptions and time of possession. It's tough to see a flaw in the Panthers. Maybe that's why they've spent so much of this year undefeated. Maybe it's also time to start believing in the Panthers.

The Arizona Cardinals are a team that the Panthers will almost certainly have to beat if they want to make it to Super Bowl 50. It doesn't get much more high-powered than this Cardinals offense. Carson Palmer was 23-4 in games started as a Cardinal heading into last week's action. With a quarterback that somehow seems to be aging, yet still in his prime, a group of wide receivers (featuring Larry Fitzgerald) that can catch anything Palmer throws in the air, and a defense that just might be better than Carolina's, Arizona's got a real shot at it this year. The only thing that makes the Cardinals a tough team to predict is what they'll have to go through to win it all. A probable first-round bye is obviously a good thing, but after that, likely matchups with both Seattle and Carolina will certainly make Arizona earn it should they get to this year's championship game.

To round out the NFC challengers, there is, of course, the Seahawks and the Green Bay Packers. The Seahawks have recently looked like the NFL's best team. Russell Wilson has been passing the ball like nobody's business, the defense that has consistently been the best in the NFL seems to be back, and wide receivers are coming out of the woodworks to step up and seize games. Seattle's only drawback is its running game. Marshawn Lynch has been

sidelined for the last quarter of the season due to sports hernia surgery and his backup, Thomas Rawls, who filled in nicely, just went out for the year with a fractured ankle. It'll be interesting to see how the team compensates to keep their newly acquired high-powered offense churning. When speaking of high-powered offenses, the Packers always come to mind. Aaron Rodgers has seemed to hit a snag in the road, however, and the absence of Jordy Nelson in the receiving corps has clearly made itself evident. While running back Eddie Lacy has been up and down, he seems to be back on track, but the defense, unlike other NFC opponents, certainly doesn't scare anyone. The Packers were the preseason hot pick to take it all this year. As often happens throughout the course of a year, though, facts change and with that so do opinions. The Packers currently seem to be on the outside looking in.

So what about the AFC? The excitement comes there when looking at certain division races. For instance, what have the Jacksonville Jaguars still been doing alive this late in the season? While they, the Houston Texans and even the Colts are all stories in their own right, they're not making it to this year's Super Bowl. The real story lies in the front-runners like the Denver Broncos, Patriots and even the Pittsburgh Steelers.

The Broncos have been one of the best teams in the league all season long but there is, naturally, one big question with that team. What are they going to do with Peyton Manning? Brock Osweiler has been good in his stead, but it's unlikely that he will lead a team, even with the best defense in the league, to a championship. New England was a great pick all year to get to the Super Bowl but have you seen that team lately? Their defense is decimated by injuries, they just lost their running back LeGarrette Blount for the year, Julian Edelman has been out with a broken foot and every week seems to reveal yet another player to put on injured reserve. You should never rule out Tom Brady. Oh, and there's Rob Gronkowski. Never forget about Gronk. The Steelers, on the other hand, are the one team nobody wants to see at any point or time during the playoffs. They still, believe it or not, need help to actually make it into the playoffs, but if they do, watch out. Perhaps the best receiving corps in the league led by "Big Ben" Roethlisberger and a great running game to boot should have the Steelers putting a scare into any opponent they might face this postseason. All it takes is one 80-yard pass and Pittsburgh's right back in the game and also still in this year's Super Bowl hunt.

Honorable mentions? Of course the Cincinnati Bengals, who just lost their starting quarterback, Andy Dalton to injury. The New York Jets, who have a revived Ryan Fitzpatrick leading Brandon Marshall, Eric Decker and Chris Ivory. The Kansas City Chiefs, who always seem to hover around where they currently sit, and the Minnesota Vikings. With Adrian Peterson, all things are possible. My Super Bowl Prediction? Recalling Another Great Year in Sports

As 2015 comes to a close in a week this gives me the opportunity to look back a recall the ups and the downs, the winning teams and some heartbreak losses. We cheered and we supported the hard luck results. Another year of close calls, heartbreaks and a time to reflect and remember. Youth sports, once again, took center stage and we celebrated milestones and legends of our community's past. We sadly said goodbye to one of our community's baseball pioneers. There were league champions, a CIF championship and a state champion.

So with that in mind lets revisit the first six months of 2015 and relive the excitement of some very special and precious memories

that had our community buzzing and the outside communities in envy.

The 2014-15 marked the first high school season the Eagles would move from the Pioneer League to the Ocean League. The boys' soccer team was making noise and was coming off their championship win in the South Torrance Tournament. That winning formula catapulted the Eagles on the national and state scene and being ranked. The girls' soccer season was full of injured players but it took a huge hit when Rhianna Rich injured her knee. It ended not only her season but also any chance of her returning for her final softball season. The boys' and girls' basketball teams also dealt with injuries but somehow muddled through the Ocean League.

Speaking of the Ocean League each of the winter sports teams did well enough in league play to advance to the CIF-Southern Section playoffs. The boys' soccer team

ended up making school history for wins in a season (18), sharing a league title, a streak of 17 consecutive games without a defeat and advancing to the CIF-SS Division 4 quarter-finals in front of 500 fans. The girls' soccer team had a respectable 10-5-7 record even with all their sidelined players, due to injuries. They bowed to St. Margret's in the first round of the playoffs but considered this a successful season after not getting to the playoffs the season before.

The girls basketball team finished behind Culver City the defending CIF champions. The Eagles who defeated Santa Monica, to secure second place, entered the CIF-SS Division 3A playoffs as the ninth seed. They defeated Santa Ana Valley in the first round

and La Canada in the second round. They gave Orange Lutheran all they could handle in the quarter-finals before losing. The Lady Eagles finished with an 18-11 record easily one of the program's best season under first year coach Randy Kiehm.

Coach Jason Ito challenged his team all season long by playing some of Southern California's top teams. The Ocean League was filled with top Division I college prospects. The Eagles caught the eye of the bracket makers and the Eagles entered the CIF-SS Division 4A playoffs with another uphill climb. In the first round the Eagles took care of Malibu the Frontier League champion before losing to Campbell Hall, the eventual CIF champions.

The girls' water polo team finished in second place behind three-year Ocean League champion Santa Monica. The Eagles finished their season (15-12, 5-3) and advanced to the

allow an officer or a supervisor the day off to be with their young family since my children are grown,” he explained. “Additionally, as a resident, I have the ability to stop by my home during my Christmas patrol shift and take lunch to enjoy gift giving and present

opening.” Last Christmas, Turnbull bought gift cards to give to employees working on Christmas and also movie passes they could hand out during traffic stops in lieu of moving citations. “As you know, on a day-to-day basis police officers

are rarely the bearers of good news,” he said. “Plus, the past few years have been troubling in our profession with all the negative publicity police officers are getting on a national and local level. So I decided that I wanted to do something special to engage our officers with our community in a positive light.”

To get the ball rolling for this holiday season, Turnbull first met with a community member whom he greatly admires and respects. “I sought his opinion on the idea to start a Secret Santa here and within minutes, this amazing individual assured me that he would pledge a significant contribution to support our campaign without any recognition and remaining completely anonymous,” he said. Turnbull followed up with emails to several other trusted citizens in town, attaching a link of the CBS video he had seen depicting the success of the Secret Santa campaign in Kansas City. The contacts paid dividends and Turnbull received adequate contributions to fund the effort. “I also managed to get in touch with the ‘true Secret Santa’ who has a history of more than 20 years paying it forward,” he said, adding that the most recent “sleigh ride” received national exposure on Steve Hartman’s “On the Road” segment shown on CBS on December 11.

“The Secret Santa utilized various agencies in the Allegheny, Pennsylvania region to carry out his random acts of kindness. And in his response to me, he offered me encouragement as well as useful materials and tips that helped make our program even a bigger success.”

The extent of anonymous giving has reached global proportions. The website secretsanta-world.net is a resource for the “Society of Secret Santas” who use “their own financial resources, without a tax deduction and without soliciting funds from others... to share their wealth with those in need.”

Garcia, who helped coordinate El Segundo’s campaign, said the goal was to get every police officer in the department involved. “We wanted all our officers to go out and experience the act of giving in some form,” he said. “So we started on the day shift and carried it through graveyard all the way to Thursday morning and into the weekend. We gave everything away.”

El Segundo TV filmed some of the Secret Santa proceedings for eventual viewing on Community Cable, with footage also earmarked for telecast on Channel 5. Officer Cameron added, “It’s really special around the holidays to help a family in need and to do so on a greater scale that we already do.”•

David Thewlis, Jennifer Jason Leigh, and Tom Noonan to be his principal, and only, actors. With growing interest of turning this “sound play” into a film, Kaufman hesitated, afraid that the movie adaptation would lose authenticity. Those who backed the film’s production on Kickstarter had other thoughts, however, as the film raised over \$400,000 of its \$200,000 goal and proved that the interest was there and ready. With support from Starburns Industries and co-director Duke Johnson, Kaufman recruited his original cast of three to create the film.

Anomalisa is a transfixing, thoughtful, and touching film that goes deep into the viewer’s psyche and stirs up emotions of introspective thought. Critics are highly praising the film’s ability to transcend reality. *Anomalisa* has been nominated for an Oscar for Best Animated Feature Film, and there is no doubt that Kaufman’s latest masterpiece stands out as one of the year’s best.

Anomalisa opens with a limited release at The Landmark on December 30. Rated R for strong sexual content, graphic nudity and language. •

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- 4 lake-raised tilapia fillets
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- 8 small carrots
- 1 sweet onion
- 3 parsnips
- 2 cups washed baby spinach
- 1 lemon
- 1 lime
- 1 orange
- 4 tablespoons extra virgin olive oil
- 1 teaspoon honey
- sea salt
- fresh pepper

Preparation

THE VEGETABLES
Preheat oven to 375 degrees Fahrenheit. Peel turnips, carrots, onion and parsnips; cut roughly the same size as a halved fingerling potato. Halve potatoes. Place vegetables on oiled sheet pan. Season with salt, pepper and extra virgin olive oil (EVOO). Roast 25 minutes or until fork tender.

THE DRESSING
Juice lemon and lime. Peel orange and segment; add juice from the pulp to the lemon and lime juice. In a metal mixing bowl, use a metal wire whisk to whisk honey, salt, pepper and 1 tablespoon citrus juice. Slowly drizzle 4 tablespoons of EVOO. Fully emulsify the dressing.

THE FISH
Brush lake-raised tilapia fillets with EVOO, season each side with salt and pepper. Place on oiled sheet pan. Roast at 375 degrees Fahrenheit for 20 minutes.

TO PLATE
Place one quarter of the roasted vegetables in the center of each of four plates. Top with the roasted tilapia. Toss spinach and orange in the dressing using tongs. Place small amount of salad alongside fish and vegetables, and serve.
Keep in mind that the vegetables will take longer to cook than the fish. For the best flavor, time the fish to come out of the oven last, and enjoy! •

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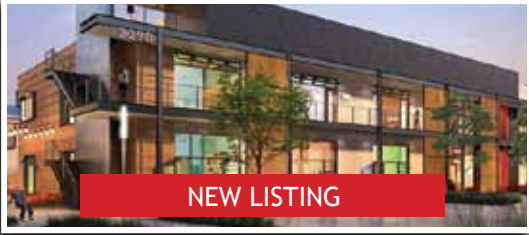

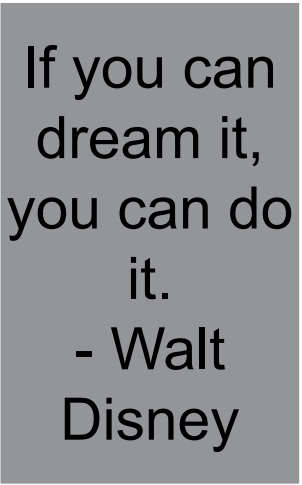
