Erin Fagerlind Gives Children and Parents a Community

Have you heard of diastasis recti? When was the last time you talked about cracked nipples, postpartum depression, incontinence, or partner relationships after the birth of a child? If you have kids or are thinking about having kids, these are things you’ll want to know. At Happy Baby here in El Segundo, Erin Fagerlind guides parents on their journey from prenatal classes to parent/child yoga, fitness, and dance classes. Originally a business/intellectual property attorney, Fagerlind began to realize how precious her time was when she had her first baby. She sought an accessible place for parents to talk to each other and nurture their minds and bodies. In the absence of such a place, Erin decided to create her own, leading to what is now Happy Baby. “Part of these groups,” says Fagerlind, “is having a group of women who are in the same place in their motherhood journey come together each week and use each other as a sounding board...in a very nonjudgemental and informative way.” Week to week, experts are brought in, and discussion groups are formed to help teach new mothers what to expect and how to cope with this big life change.

For example, diastasis recti is the separation of the abdominal wall to make room for the baby, and doing the wrong kind of ab workouts after birth can actually prevent it from rejoining, something most women don’t hear about because it is considered less of a medical issue and more of a physical therapy issue. In these classes, both with instructors and guest speakers, she goes through topics like stages of development, breastfeeding and bottle-feeding, pelvic floor exercises, CPR and car seat safety, and baby socialization. Most of all, she explains, these groups are about community. “Trust your intuition, and don’t be afraid to ask for help. Community is everything,” she says of new mothers. She explains that your “life tribe” is different from your “mommy tribe” and that while both are equally important, they’re very different. For better or worse, those without children or with older children often give advice, which isn’t always what a new mom is looking for. Sometimes it’s just to vent, to hear from people going through the same thing at the same time, and to talk about the current difficulties of parenting. These classes offer the opportunity to meet other moms going through the same stages. Part of what Erin champions in her

practice is the ability to sift through information. “Knowledge can be power, but you need to be able to filter it,” she says. Anyone with even a little anxiety who decides to have a child can easily be overwhelmed by the amount and range of information out there. Something she tries to provide with her business is a place where this information has been filtered through for her clients and can give them peace of mind as they find their own parenting path. Beyond new parents, she also offers parent/child yoga and dance classes. Toddler yoga classes look very different than adult yoga classes, as she describes them as being much more playful. She explains her classes as “noncompetitive” and “process oriented.” “I think to have an activity that isn’t at all rooted in competition, but more learning how to improve themselves and manage their emotions provides balance,” says Fagerlind. Though she acknowledges the importance of competitive activities for children, her program provides an alternative. “Mindful parenting is the core philosophy,” she says of her practice. In addition to these classes, she says they have events every year

The Magical Retirement Community, And Fantasy Masking Darkness, in ‘Some Kind of Heaven’

Fulfillment, satisfaction, completion, contentment, peace. It’s what we’re all striving to achieve in our lives.

Yet life is hard, and we don’t always stay on this track. Our flaws and insecurities, measured against our boundless imaginations, can make for a hard reality to adjust to if we’re not content with where we’re at in life. Especially living in present-day America, where reality has been proven to be whatever personal construction we make it to be.

And as we make it into the twilight of our lives, our shortcomings become even more magnified. So, wouldn’t a place that offered aging seniors the opportunities to pursue those fantasies be a good thing?

van-living man seeking to get close enough into The Villages to find stability (and a sugar mama); and Barbara Lochiatto, a widowed woman looking to step back into romantic life.

Oppenheim crafts *Some Kind of Heaven* into a wonderfully off-kilter experience, in which the dreamy surrealism of The Villages is seen as being in a magical trance. Captured in 4:3 aspect ratio, the cinematography by David Bloen captures the oddity in the manufactured synchronicity. And it very much captures the illusion of fantasy making our darkness.

Some Kind of Heaven is a must-watch. Its sharp observations make for a documentary that plays like a comedy and a dark drama. And underneath it all is a film about identity.

I’m reminded by a quote from Shantideva:

A new documentary, directed by Lance Oppenheim and executive produced by Darren Aronofsky and The New York Times, shows retired living at The Villages, America’s largest retirement community. This magical oasis offers its local community an unlimited number of recreational activities to do and, with that, an infinite amount of people you can be.

Home to 130,000 residents, the Florida-set retirement community is shown as a place where the aged have escaped to live out their final years, experiencing the fountain of youth (which is what The Villages founder Harold S. Schwartz advertised to baby boomers).

Some of the gray-haired are clearly okay with having a good time, living out their hedonistic pleasures of “nightclubbing” and meeting new singles. But others, who Oppenheim centers the film around, see the falsehood in the proscenium and grapple with the darkness that lingers at bay.

The characters who Oppenheim follows are strong and distinct: there’s married couple Reggi & Ann, who are trying to maintain a marriage under Reggi’s cratering mental state (tai chi and drugs assisting). There’s Dennis Dean, a

Orbits and Awe: The NASA Mars Student Challenge

Many an academically-sapped student might find themselves straining their corneas on insipid worksheet after worksheet and staring dead-eyed at hours of zombified Zoom lesson plans. But break away from that monotony momentarily and cast that gaze upwards at the wonders of space swirling above.

Ring in the scientific achievement of the Perseverance Rover making landfall on the unspoiled surface of the Red Planet on February 18th with NASA’s Mars Student Challenge. This nifty and hands-on teachable moment provides space-starved students everywhere fun and engaging activities to celebrate this momentous occasion. Students will have an opportunity to design, build, and land a Mars missions of their very own making. And NASA will be there to lend a guiding hand throughout.

The Perseverance Rover is a scientific achievement to behold. The craft is equipped with the experimental Ingenuity Mars Helicopter and, harkening to the significance of

the Wright Brothers’ first extraordinary ascension, will be the first attempt at a powered and controlled flight on another planet. One of the Rover’s primary mission objectives is to further our understanding of astrobiology. This includes the search for residual signs of ancient microbial life and the study of the planet’s geology to draw conclusions about past climates and the potential for habitability to help prepare NASA for human expeditions to Mars. Perseverance has the distinction of being the first mission charged with drilling and collecting core samples of Martian rocks, soil, and dust for future intensive laboratory analyses. The craft will also test methods to explore the possibility of potentially producing oxygen in the noxious Martian atmosphere and strive to identify other useful planetary features such as subsurface water.

Landing the craft intact will prove to be a daunting challenge. Successful landings have only been accomplished half the time which includes the Curiosity Rover that touched down on the surface unscathed back in 2012.

Perseverance will be the biggest and heaviest craft to attempt a landing to date. And a slew of newly developed technologies will finally be put to the test. The sojourn seems to defy all odds and meticulous calculations and navigational telemetries must be painstakingly pored over. The perilous journey includes a seven-minute fiery dive barreling through the Red Planet’s inhospitable atmosphere at a speed of fifty thousand miles per hour. The craft careens through the inferno safely using a combination of heat shields, parachutes, and rockets. The craft’s guided entry process culminates in a sky crane maneuver that allows the Rover to descend gingerly onto the Red Planet’s surface with a system of tethered nylon cables.

Educators, families, and just plum propulsion enthusiasts can draft, assemble, and land their own spacecraft. 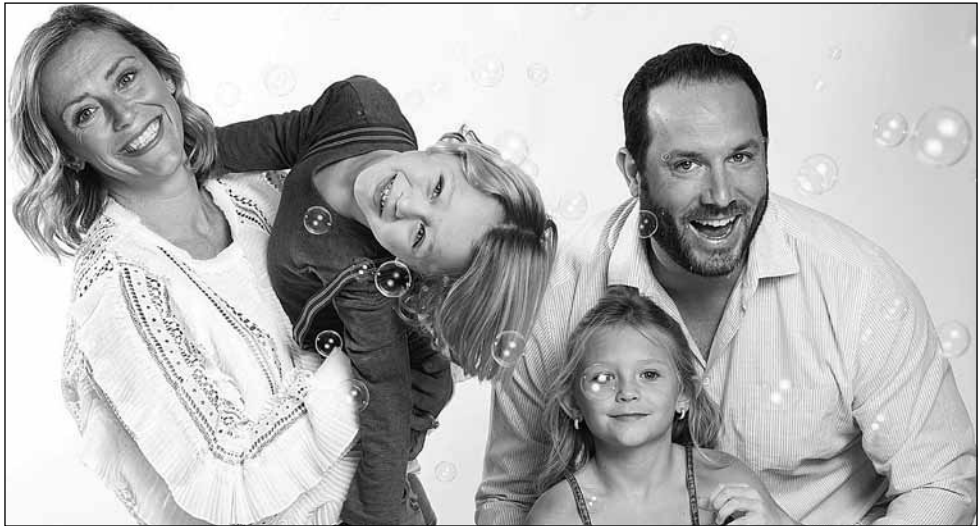

like the annual father-daughter dance, to which moms are not invited, and local professional photographers are hired to cover the dance. She also brings in music teachers to play guitar and teach music to the children, which tends to be popular with dads. Parents get a community of other parents, children get important socialization and emo-

tional tools, but what does Erin get out of all this? "I get so much fulfillment out of building community, connecting women, watching kids grow," she says, though she says that these days, that fulfillment is harder to get without seeing everyone in her studio all day. Last year, when Covid hit, she, like so many businesses, was forced to close their doors.

Wanting to keep her clients' health and safety as her top priority, she began thinking about how she could adapt to keep her program and keep this community available to parents and children, especially now that mental health is being challenged by pandemic isolation. Though it's not her ideal situation, Happy Baby now offers outdoor classes with groups

of limited size, as well as virtual options. Her studio is now being used as an educational pod space for her children, and she hopes to reopen its doors to indoor classes as soon as it is safe. For now, she has created a space where her clients can feel safe to come and can tell soon to be mothers about this amazing group. •
