Beginning in June and July, Breeze Airways will expand service for LAX passengers with direct flights on three brand-new routes from LAX to Providence, R.I., Norfolk, Va., and Savannah, Ga. Breeze will begin operations out of the Tom Bradley International Terminal to pilot a new technologically driven check-in process without the use of a ticket counter. SBWIB Highlights New Programs

Apprenticeship Initiative Grant will Train Underserved Populations for Critical Healthcare Occupations

An innovative Healthcare apprenticeship program will be created to provide opportunities to underserved individuals with employment barriers to gain training and fill urgently needed positions including dental and nursing assistant occupations in the greater South Bay area over the next two years. Thanks to the awarding of a California Apprenticeship Initiative grant of \$500,000 to West Los Angeles College, a partnership will be formed that will include the South Bay Workforce Investment Board (SBWIB) and El Camino College.

The Health-Flex apprenticeship program, modeled after the highly successful Aero-Flex apprentice program for aerospace manufacturing, will connect future workers to employers sooner than after college graduation. Built on commonly accepted core skills defined by healthcare employers, Health-Flex will allow employers to tailor the curriculum and on-the-job experiences of each apprentice to prepare them for their chosen occupation.

West Los Angeles College (WLAC) and El Camino College (ECC) are the primary health training partners. WLAC has a dental assistant and certified nursing assistant program with partners willing to host apprentices and provide them paid apprenticeships. ECC has a nursing program as well as respiratory care and radiologic technician programs, providing Health-Flex with tremendous capability to meet the needs of employers.

The SBWIB's involvement includes operating an online portal so Los Angeles County community college students can apply for paid apprenticeships while completing their certificate or degree. The SBWIB will also recruit and outreach to participants and employers utilizing its network of career service providers,

America's Job Centers, co-located partners, agency partners and other community-based partners to perform outreach and recruitments.

Irvine Foundation Awards \$250,000 Grant to Train Low-Income Women, Women of Color and Underserved Populations

The Irvine Foundation has awarded a \$250,000 grant to the South Bay Workforce Investment Board (SBWIB) to help fund a new program to identify and train 50 low-income women, women of color and other individuals with barriers to employment that prevent them from gaining access to entry-level positions in advanced manufacturing sectors of the aerospace and bioscience industries.

The SBWIB will partner with community-based organizations to create new training models (including pre-apprenticeship, ap-

prenticeship, and customized training) that reflect current advanced manufacturing industry occupational demand (e.g., in IT, cyber, big data, AI/VR, additive manufacturing), while also expanding existing aerospace and bioscience apprenticeship programs.

The program will strive to enable participants to increase their qualifications for advanced manufacturing careers, with the intent to pursue post-secondary education, obtain employment and/or obtain access to entrepreneurial opportunities in advanced manufacturing.

Partners with El Camino College and West Los Angeles College to Prepare Job Seekers for Careers in Information Technology

A new nontraditional apprenticeship earn and learn program called, IT-Flex is being

AAA Travel Offers Tips for First-Time and Repeat Visitors to The Aloha State

The Hawaiian Islands are welcoming visitors back just in time for the spring and summer travel seasons. Now that Omicron cases are on the decline worldwide and fears of the variant are easing up, the State of Hawaii is inviting travelers from the mainland United States, as well as international travelers, to return to the island chain's colorful sandy beaches, jagged coastline, lush forest reserves, and majestic volcanoes.

Hawaii Entry Requirements:

Hawaiian state officials recently announced that travelers are not required to have a COVID-19 booster shot to enter the state.

U.S. citizens traveling to any of the islands, who wish to bypass the state's

5-day quarantine mandate, must be fully vaccinated at least 14 days prior to arrival or have had a *Nucleic Acid Amplification Test (NAAT)* no more than 72 hours prior to arrival.

Before your departure for Hawaii, if you are an adult (age 18 years or older) you will need to create an online user account and register with the State of Hawaii Safe Travels Hawaii program. This applies only for domestic passengers from the U.S. and its territories.

Once you create your Safe Travels Hawaii account, you will then need to enter your traveler information and trip details on the program's application form. It is important to get the correct test

Film Review

In *FRESH*, Sebastian Stan Takes a Deliciously Twisted Turn

Recently debuting in the Midnight category at the Sundance Film Festival, *FRESH* is a campy thriller set in the contemporary dating scene that will make any young woman think twice about trusting a tall, dark, and handsome stranger with their life. Noa (Daisy Edgar-Jones) is a frustrated twenty-something whose dating life is on life support. After a truly unbelievable awkward date, she is hesitant to fall for the charms of Steve (Sebastian Stan), the handsome doctor she serendipitously meets at the local grocery store.

comfortability. Daisy Edgar-Jones holds it down as our vulnerable turned empowered heroine. So much of her performance is dependent on her body language, and if awards were given for best non-verbal performance, Edgar-Jones would take the gold.

Director Mimi Cave built up quite the reputation as someone to watch in the music video space, working with artists like Sleigh Bells and Sylvan Esso. Using her experience of marrying sound to picture, Cave relies heavily on chart-toppers and deep cuts to help guide the characters throughout the film, the

Steve makes Noa feel special, important, beautiful, and his suave moves cause Noa to lose any sense of caution as she agrees to take an extended trip out of town to a “surprise” location with this man who she’s only known for a few days.

Of course, things don’t go well for Noa, who slowly realizes that the drink Steve handed her is making her slowly lose consciousness. In the classic “wolf in sheep’s clothing” reveal, Noa awakens, chained. It’s now when Steve admits that he kidnaps and dismembers young women to sell their body meat on the black market. And Noa is for sale next.

If you’re one who keeps up with Hollywood gossip, you might have immediately thought “Armie Hammer!” (which is where my mind went too). *FRESH* benefits from this real-life correlation, making the absurd seem, actually, not so farfetched (which is the real horror here!). Sebastian Stan is captivating to watch on screen as the charming narcissist. It’s easy to see how he was able to win Noa over so quickly with his sultry stare and quick

music almost acting like a secondary character. Furthering the film’s ominous disposition is the sweepingly tense score by composer Alex Somers.

Now streaming on Hulu FRESH is a satiating watch if you’re looking to whet your horror palate. •

My Tree by Hope Lim, Illustrated by Il Sung Na





formed through a partnership with El Camino College, the South Bay Workforce Investment Board (SBWIB) and West LA College. The new program will generate a talent pipeline that supports the Information Technology (IT) sector. Thanks to the awarding of a California Apprenticeship Initiative Grant of \$500,000 to El Camino College, the initial focus of IT-Flex will be to prepare candidates for apprenticeship positions in programming, coding, software development and information security analytics.

The IT-Flex partnership will reach out to socio-economic populations disproportionately left out of the IT field and to employers wanting to diversify their workforce under a structured plan that helps meet their talent needs.

Based on the successful apprenticeship programs the SBWIB has pioneered for the aerospace and bioscience industries, Aero-Flex and Bio-Flex, IT-Flex will create an additional training model that is flexible and able to meet the needs of employers and provide opportunities for job seekers throughout the region.

In addition to providing a resume portal for those interested in an apprenticeship opportunity, the SBWIB will handle employer engagement and manage a recruitment effort over the course of the project with a goal of enrolling 80 participants into an IT-Flex apprenticeship, utilizing classroom-based training, employer led on- the-job training, online learning and academic and career coaching. •

Summary of Adoption of Ordinance 2230 Amending Sections 8.50.010, 8.50.140, 8.50.150, 8.50.160, And 8.50.170 and 8.50.200 of Chapter 8.50 (Stormwater And Urban Runoff Pollution Control) of the Hawthorne Municipal Code

8.50 is to ensure the City has legal authority to enforce provisions of the LA Water Board's 2021 Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Permit (MS4 Permit). The purpose of the MS4 Permit is protect local waterways from polluted discharges from the MS4 (i.e., storm drain system). The amendment is necessary to comply with new state-required provisions in the MS4 Permit which must be implemented by March 2022.

- 1) Update definitions in Chapter 8.50.010 to match updated definitions in the 2021 MS4 Permit.
2) Remove the requirement for a local stormwater pollution prevention plan in Chapter 8.50.040, as it is not a requirement of the 2021 MS4 Permit.
3) Require in Chapter 8.50.150 that all construction projects implement the minimum Best Management Practices (BMPs) listed in Tables 7 and 8 of the 2021 MS4 Permit.
4) Update the list of development projects that must adhere to the LID provisions in Chapter 8.50.170 to match updates in the 2021 MS4 Permit. In addition, various references to the prior 2012 MS4 Permit have been removed from Chapter 8.50.

there is no possibility that the adoption of this Ordinance will have a significant effect on the environment. Completing the State of Hawaii's Safe Travels Hawaii program application form, uploading COVID-19 test results or vaccination record document (if applicable) and obtaining your QR code PRIOR TO departure will significantly reduce your airport screening and processing time at arrival.
