An Bhfuil Béarla Agat?

You probably won't need to ask the question in the title ("Do you speak English?"), except in Bretagne, where the answer will most likely be "Non!" Centuries of argument and assimilation have ensured that the citizens of the six Celtic Nations—Breizh (Brittany), Kernow (Cornwall), Cymru (Wales), Mannin (Isle of Man), Éire (Ireland), and Alba (the Scottish Highlands)—speak the languages of their Anglo-Saxon and Frankish conquerors. Two of the group, in fact—Kernow and Mannin—have lost their mother tongues altogether. But even as they subsist at the remote western edges of the Old World, the story of these related communities takes us straight to the heart of European civilization.

The Celts (pronounced with a "K" sound) were the first wanderers of Europe. They spread out from the center of the continent in all directions, from Anatolia to Sicily, to Scandinavia, to the British Isles. Clumsy and inaccurate as the term is, they were Europe's First Nation, but with none of the organized life or self-identification that the name mistakenly implies. They weren't ignorant and they weren't unaware of the world—samples of Chinese silks have been found with their remains—but they just existed, everywhere.

The rest of European history is a tale of a thousand migrations and invasions, mostly from the south (Romans) and later from the east (Mongols, Huns, Goths, Slavs, and Franks) and the north (Magyars, Jutes, Angles, and Saxons). There were no sovereign nations per se, but ever increasing clans, tribes, and trading centers linked to an individual leader or family based on conquest,

language, and the safety of their lives and food sources.

Nationalism as we know it—with hard borders, ethnic identification, and common languages—was a creation of the 19th century and the Napoleonic Wars. But long before that, the Anglo-Saxons and Danes in Great Britain and the Franks in France pushed the Celtic peoples out of the rich farmlands and pastures of their lowlands into the inaccessible wildernesses that fronted the Atlantic Ocean and the Irish Sea.

As in the Basque country of Spain and France, or the Romansch center of Switzerland, isolation caused the Celtic communities to drift apart from each other and from the outside world. Today's Celtic speakers can barely understand each other, although genetically, their chromosomes are as mixed up with the rest of Europe as any American's. But in the aftermath of the worst century of warfare and ethnic cleansing the world has ever seen,

the European Union now celebrates the Celts as never before.

Breizh (Bretagne):

Technically, Breizh—or Bretagne to the French and Brittany to the English—was united with France in 1491, but it didn't truly sign up as the final province of the nation until the 1793 French Revolution and the beheading of Louis XVI. In the intervening three centuries of struggle, one event that stands out, at least for the traveling gourmand, is Louis XIV's Ordinance of 1787. The court of Versailles had developed a taste for the oysters of Cancale and the Bélon River, and the King wanted to ensure the quality of his supply. As far as we're concerned, he succeeded.

Kernow (Cornwall):

Butting up against Devon and the ancient Anglo-Saxon kingdom of Wessex, Kernow was bound to attract attention, if only for its huge deposits of the tin needed to turn cop-


Check It Out

Film Review

In The Unbearable Weight of Massive Talent, Nicolas Cage is a Meta Movie Star

Where to watch: *The Unbearable Weight of Massive Talent* is now playing in theaters nationwide.

In *The Unbearable Weight of Massive Talent*, Nicolas Cage stars as "Nick Cage"—a Hollywood actor who's scrambling to land his next big hit. Although he's a movie star, he's also not above giving impromptu auditions to directors in line at the valet of the Chateau Marmont. Here, he's equal parts passionate

It's a fun twist that gives Cage a role to play: undercover spy. But Javi is so earnest and kind to Cage that a bromance ensues (he agrees to read a script that Javi wrote). The story deepens as Cage gets closer to Javi, conflicted about his new friend who he's agreed to trap—if Javi really is the crime lord that the CIA thinks they're after.

Directed by Tom Gormican (*That Awkward Moment*), *The Unbearable Weight of Massive Talent* is a crowd-pleasing comedy that I very

student of the craft, as well as obnoxiously ego-centric A-lister.

This "Nick Cage" is a star that's driven by his love of show biz and his own star power, but with insecurities as well. But he's got his ego in his corner to pop up and give him pep talks: a leather jacket-wearing bad boy-era version of Cage named "Nicky" (fun fact: Cage is double-credited in the film for "Nicky" as Nicolas Kim Coppola, his real birth name). Nicky constantly fuels Nick's ego that the next hit film will bring him (them) back; while reassuring him, "Not that we ever left."

Cage's drive for his career has made him succeed but it's driven his family away. His ex-wife (Sharon Horgan) and daughter (Lily Mo Sheen) are clearly past the point of tolerating Cage's self-interest, leaving Cage more alone on most fronts. He thinks landing the next big film will bring his family together, while his family thinks that would only keep them apart.

And so, a now-desperate (and cash-strapped) Cage takes the next gig that lands from his agent (Neil Patrick Harris): a birthday appearance for a wealthy superfan Javi (Pedro Pascal). A reluctant Cage agrees but not before he's intercepted by CIA agents Vivian (Tiffany Haddish) and Martin (Ike Barinholtz) who inform him that Javi's also a Spanish crime lord who kidnapped a rival's family member.

much enjoyed watching on the big screen with a packed audience. Gormican's script (which he co-wrote with Kevin Etten) succeeds as both an entertaining action-comedy as well as a Hollywood satire where broad comedy and inside jokes that call back to Cage's career are fun throughout.

The Unbearable Weight of Massive Talent is a fun time at the movies that will make you remember the greatness of Nicolas Cage.

How You Can Help Find a Cure For Parkinson's

(BPT) - Did you know, whether you have Parkinson's or not, you can make a difference in the future of brain health? Michael J. Fox, award-winning actor, author and founder of The Michael J. Fox Foundation for Parkinson's Research (MJFF), who himself has lived with the disease since 1991 at age 29, has issued a call to action - seeking 100,000 individuals both with and without Parkinson's to participate in the expansion of an unprecedented scientific study.

The Parkinson's Progression Markers Initiative (PPMI), first launched by MJFF in 2010, aims to rewrite the future of Parkinson's disease, and brain health in general. And the more people who take part in the study, the better: More data gathered from over 100,000 volunteers globally will help

improve researchers' ability to predict who's at risk for Parkinson's, who gets the disease, who doesn't and why.

Today there are an estimated six million people worldwide living with Parkinson's disease, including one million in the U.S., and that number is expected to double by 2040. If you know anyone who has Parkinson's, or other brain diseases such as Alzheimer's, you may be aware how devastating the effects can be.

While monetary donations toward MJFF's aggressively funded and highly targeted research programs are always appreciated, donating your time to this study - regardless of whether you have a connection to Parkinson's - has the potential to more directly contribute to the "holy grail" of medical

research: developing a cure.

So far, PPMI scientists have studied the test results and brain scans of 1,400 people with and without Parkinson's disease at more than 50 clinical sites across 12 countries to discover patterns related to the development of the disease.

"The large-scale expansion of PPMI promises to change our understanding of Parkinson's and enable the development of new therapeutics," said PPMI's principal investigator Ken Marek, MD, scientific advisor to The Michael J. Fox Foundation and president and senior scientist of the Institute for Neurodegenerative Disorders. "PPMI data will provide researchers tools to uncover key biological and clinical changes that occur both once Parkinson's disease

has begun, and more importantly even before symptoms arise, with the ultimate goal of disease prevention." Anyone over age 18 in the U.S. can participate through the study's online platform, and some volunteers will be invited to enroll in person at a site near them.

While anyone can participate, researchers are looking for volunteers who:

- Have a close family member with Parkinson's (parents, brother or sister, or child with Parkinson's) and are over age 60
- Act out your dreams while asleep
- Have a known genetic mutation linked to Parkinson's disease (especially in people of Ashkenazi Jewish descent)
- Are a veteran



A Scammer In Bank's Clothing

With technology and mobile apps, consumers can virtually do anything from managing finances, health and schedules to dating. However, scammers now have more opportunities to tap into these virtual places, take our information and, worse, our money.

So how do you protect yourselves from this? You may be thinking it's obvious to spot a scam. For example, you probably know by now that no one wants to speak to us about our car's extended warranty. However, a recent Zelle® survey found that 53% of people have been more confident and aware of scams since the beginning of the pandemic, but this leaves a large portion that could still use help.

What if someone pretends to be a trustworthy source, and they call and text you in a way that looks and sounds legit? This uncertainty becomes more prevalent with more sophisticated scams. According to the FTC, consumers lost \$547 million to scams in 2021. Many of these scams pretend to be from an organization you know like your bank. Here are some of the tactics scammers use and how you can protect yourself.

1. You get a text pretending to notice odd activity: A text pops up in your phone from your bank saying, "FRAUD ALERT Your account has been suspended due to fraudulent activity. Please login through this secure link and verify your account (LINK)". Pause, this is not right.

What you need to know: Your bank would never ask you to click on an external link and

provide a pin. Therefore, do not click the link - go directly into your mobile banking account or call the bank immediately to confirm.

2. Following the text, the scammer calls you pretending to be your bank while trying to disorient you further. The first instinct is to give them all the information. They texted and followed up with a call, so it seems legit. Take a breath - there is no reason to rush no matter how dire the situation seems.

What you need to know: Your bank will never call you and then ask you for your one-time verification code, PIN, password or other personal identification details. They do this only when you call them. If something feels strange, hang up immediately and call the phone number on the back of your credit or debit card.

3. On the phone or text, scammers create a sense of urgency for you to pay them, threatening to lock or close your account.

What you need to know: This scenario will never happen over one message or for a specific time. Anytime any "organization" is telling you they need payment immediately it's a red flag. No one will pressure you to pay immediately.

While scammers are becoming more sophisticated, one rule of thumb always rings true - if it feels fishy or something feels off, it probably is. Listen to your instincts to save you from so much financial heartache.

Summary of Adoption of Ordinance 2233 Adding Chapter 15.71 of Title 15 to the Hawthorne Municipal Code ("HMC") Re. Expedited & Streamlined Permitting Process for EV Charging Systems.

Pursuant to Government Code section 36933(c), the following constitutes a summary of Ordinance No. 2233 which will be considered for adoption by the City Council at its regular meeting on May 10, 2022 at 6:00 p.m. Pursuant to California Government Code section 36933(c) (1), the City Council has previously directed the preparation and publication of a summary of Ordinance Nos. 2233 which will set the expedited and streamlined permitting process for Electric Vehicle Charging Systems ("EVCS"). Ordinance No. 2233 adds Chapter 15.71 by providing a Short Title, Purpose and Definitions then specified process for expedited EVCS permitting as follows:

15.71.040. Pursuant to Government Code section 65850.7, the Building Official shall implement an expedited, streamlined permitting process for EVCS, and adopt a checklist of all requirements thereof.

15.71.050 A. Requires the applicant to verify that installation of the EVCS will not have an adverse impact to public health and safety.

B. A permit application that satisfies the information requirements in the city's adopted checklist shall be deemed complete and be promptly processed.

C. The electronic submittal of the permit application and electronic signature shall be allowed

15.71.060 A. If there is substantial evidence

of adverse impact upon the public health or safety, the city may require the applicant to apply for a use permit.

B. The approval of EVCS permit cannot be conditioned by an approval of an association.

15.71.070 A. EVCS equipment must meet requirements of the California Electrical Code ("CEC"), Society of Automotive Engineers, National Electrical Manufacturers Assoc., accredited testing laboratories and rules of the Public Utilities Commission or a Municipal Electric Utility Company.

B. The wiring, bonding, disconnecting means and overcurrent protective devices shall meet the requirements of Article 625 and the CEC.

C. The installation of EVCS shall be incorporated into the load calculations and meet the requirements of the CEC.

D. Anchorage of floor-mount or wall-mount shall meet CA Building or Residential Code and manufacturer's requirements

When they aligned with the English Crown, the Highlanders became the fearsome shock troops of the British Empire. But at home, their bitter feuds made them relatively easy pickings for the machinations of perfidious Albion. Nevertheless, they do know their way around a distillery.

smuggling of the islanders. With the 19th century British holiday craze, the island's ethnic majority evolved into English, as it stands today. Cheerful hotels like the Claremont on the Douglas Promenade could be found just as easily in Margate, Blackpool, or any seaside English resort. But the locally born Bee Gees are no more, and the last native Manx-speaker died in 1976.

You might have noticed that we've failed to mention the cuisine in these parts—and yes, that about covers it. Cymru (Wales):

Apart from their still functioning language, North and South Wales represent two distinct trajectories through their history. North Wales turned from slate mining into one of the scenic playgrounds of Europe, with Snowdonia and the legendary hiking trails along its rugged coast. South Wales worked the coal deposits as long as they could and produced an entire generation of impoverished and unemployed, but full-throated baritone miners (think Dylan Thomas, Tom Jones, and Engelbart Humperdinck). The Celtic heritage runs thick—road signs and directions are a serious challenge for the driving traveler—but there is less stridency around here in the exercise of their culture. Just ask Charles, the current Prince of Wales.

Éire (Ireland):
Éire never fully submitted to the Anglo-Saxon invasion, not least because the Catholic country despised the Protestantism of the English and their Crown. The British tried everything, from subsidies to ferocious warfare and suppression, to neglect and starvation, to moving in an entire aristocracy and a colony of Scots. With independence barely a hundred years in the rearview mirror, you can still sense an uneasy undercurrent in Anglo-Irish relations, both in governing circles and at the pub down the road. Éire is by far the most successful Celtic Nation at preserving its Gaelic language and culture, even enshrining the words in its founding Constitution.
