And To Set the Standard

The police have a motto, "To Protect and To Serve." With the Hawthorne Police Department, that could be modified a bit: "And, to Set the Standard."

The Hawthorne PD has a fierce dedication to community safety, but also to innovation. It is not enough that Hawthorne residents benefit from their services. Hawthorne PD, for years, has sought to make things work better. For example:

Coffee with a Cop: This program was launched by Hawthorne Blue in 2011 to interact more successfully with the citizens they serve daily. Sergeant Chris Cognac, now retired, was a co-founder along with Officer John Dixon, who remains a National Instructor today. Hawthorne's Chief of Police, Michael Ishii, is the Administrator, which includes maintaining the website <https://coffeewithacop.com/>.

Coffee with Cop events are now held in all 50 states, and the program has expanded outside the United States to Canada, Europe, Australia, Africa and Latin America. To be sure, Hawthorne's motto "The City of Good Neighbors" is not mere words.

A Therapy Dog: Hawthorne PD, like other law enforcement, has a K9 division. These dogs can help pursue a suspect, protect personnel, and sniff out narcotics. Today, after a three-year relationship with Canine Companions for Independence, Hawthorne Police has a fully trained facility dog named Scottie who provides therapy and support to victims. Scottie also helps with department morale, including assisting officers and families experiencing difficulties. As with the Coffee with a Cop program, this program has since expanded to some 50 to 75 dogs across the state so far.

Ride to Live: This is an excellent training class sponsored by the Hawthorne Police Department for any motorcycle rider who seeks to improve their riding skills, enhance their safety and control, and learn techniques taught at law enforcement motor schools. It is "hands-on". This innovative program came about from two very sad days, in 2011 and 2013 when two Hawthorne officers were killed in line-of-duty motorcycle crashes.

The Interview Workshop: The Hawthorne Police Department conducts rigorous, diligent interviews to seek the best and brightest. In turn, the Department realized that given how tenacious its interviews are, staff could help those who are interviewing for other jobs. Hawthorne P.D. strives not just to be

respected for working to keep citizens safe. The Hawthorne Police Department wants to enhance its relationship with the community.

These are some examples only. In the midst of it is Chief of Police Michael Ishii, who has 30 years with the Department and has been "the CEO" since 2018. Married with kids, the Chief is pretty much on call 24/7. He sums it up well:

"At this time, there are upheavals in the criminal justice system along with the homeless/mental health crisis. We have many challenges, but we continue to address them with an organizational culture based on humility, compassion, and operational competency."

Ship Ahoy: 40% of Americans Just as Likely to Take a Cruise as Before the Pandemic

Spending Quality Time with Loved Ones and the All-Inclusive Experience of Cruising is Driving Interest

Cruise vacations are still a favorite choice among Americans, according to new consumer research from AAA. Forty-one percent say they are considering a cruise in the future, with over half (52%) of millennials saying they are ready to return to the open seas. AAA Travel booking data shows that cruising is making a strong comeback, with 2022 bookings nearing pre-pandemic levels.

Of those Americans who say they are likely to cruise again, 41% cite a better understanding of the risks presented by COVID-19 as influencing their decision.

"The cruise industry has done an excellent job of prioritizing the health and safety of its guests while still creating a memorable onboard experience that makes cruising so special. This includes every major cruise line continuing to exceed CDC guidance, even though it is now voluntary," said Paula Twidale, senior vice president, AAA Travel. "As things

Film Review

Official Competition hilariously parodies actors, artists, and their egos

Where to watch: 'Official Competition' is now playing in select theaters.

A Spanish film with English subtitles, *Official Competition* is a movie about making a movie. While most great show biz satires tend to mine comedy from comically disastrous on-set events that occur during filmmaking, here, the comedy is all taken from pre-production. Table reads, acting exercises, and ongoing talent demands get center stage spotlight. Not only are all of these moments played out with hilariously observed detail, they're also quite fun to see played out, as we can probably assume it mirrors the real process with A-list actors closer than we know.

Official Competition is aware of all of the egos involved in filmmaking, starting from the top: the financier. Here, that's somber billionaire Humberto Suárez (José Luis Gómez), who, after questioning his grand empire and legacy (looking out his high-rise skyscraper's large window—because, how else would you do so?) decides to make a movie to be remembered by. It doesn't matter that he hasn't read the novel that he's paid a fortune to adapt; that's for eccentric director Lola Cuevas (Penélope Cruz) to figure out, whose constantly lit clove cigarettes and tuft of comically wild red hair mirrors her own wild artistic spirit and uncompromising vision.

For the film at the center of it all—*Rivalidad* (*Rivalry*, in English), about two competing brothers—Cuevas casts two accomplished actors of equal acclaim and talent, but whose approaches could not be more opposite. The role of wiser older brother "Pedro" is to be played by Iván Torres (Oscar Martínez), a theater actor and

acting teacher who's more studied, intellectually composed. A-list popcorn actor Félix Rivero (Antonio Banderas) is to play the self-destructive younger brother "Manuel," is cast. Suffice it to

say, the actors and their methods differ wildly, which the film has great fun with. Especially when Lola introduces her own wild ways of rehearsing for the film.

The film consists mostly of escalating sketches between these three comically insufferable artists. They are constantly topping each other with their obnoxiousness (but importantly, unconsciously so). It's a hilarious three-hander between Cruz, Banderas, and Martínez, who are all perfectly cast and exceptionally hilarious here. While Martínez the actual actor was a revelation to me—his composed, intellectual

performance being finely constructed—it really is Cruz and Banderas who steal the show here, who have never been funnier. Cruz's manic, laser-eyed drive towards exacting her vision

and visual comedy.

Surprisingly, *Official Competition* is even more than just a silly, one-note send up of show biz. Really, the story touches on the hypocrisy in human behavior, and the inherent conflict that arises in how we may wish to be, and how our more basic, impulsive, egotistically-driven selves stunt that. The film shows that all three actors are secretly yearning for the thing they pretend to be above (validation, commercial success, relevancy on TikTok), and a few lines on art gave me pause in thinking how prescient they are.

Once I was attuned to the film's comic style (which is accomplished in the opening scene), I was all-in. I was either smiling or laughing out loud watching the whole way through (save for an ending that's designed to disrupt the fun). For my money, so far, *Official Competition* is the funniest film of the year. It's a pitch-perfect comedy with smart writing and direction and some of my new favorite performances from some of film's best talents. This film is a true winner. Not that it's a competition, or anything.

Dionne Faulk: Knowing Where You're Going and Where You Came From

Councilwoman Dionne Faulk remembers what got her inspired to pursue politics and how she uses that memory as inspiration in her future endeavors.

With increasing gas and rent prices, it can be easy to overlook certain services that allow residents in and around Los Angeles County to move about. One of these being the metro, specifically Commuter Express 422, making its way around Hollywood, San Fernando Valley, Agoura Hills, Thousand Oaks, and the Downtown area all in a day's work.

Longtime Inglewood resident and City Councilmember Dionne Faulk cites Commuter Express 422 as her first 'fight' that interested her in politics.

It was around 2006 when Faulk remembered using 442, as it serviced the inner cities of Hawthorne, Lawndale, and Inglewood. The bus went to a stop in Downtown Los Angeles, and the line had another bus that took residents from the beach cities. One day, she was informed that the commuter bus line had been cut. After doing some digging, she realized that the city had cut the inner-city services, but not the beach cities. She remembers talking the issue over with some friends and family, saying, "This doesn't seem fair. Why are you cutting our service and not other services in other areas?"

Faulk and other angered community members began asking questions, going directly to the Metro organization, and seeking advice from elected officials in the area. At the time, Yvonne Brathwaite Burke represented the 2nd District on the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors.

Faulk recalled meeting with Burke and working together to see what could be done. And after some pushback from the city and Metro officials, she was able to convince the city to keep Commuter Express 422 running. To this day, Commuter Express 422 still services inner-city residents, something Faulk is eternally proud of.

She remembers this moment as the time she realized she had to get involved in sparking change. "It makes a world of difference when you get hands-on, and you fight the battles," she said.

Faulk grew up in the greater Los Angeles area. Both of her parents were union workers in the food industry. "We didn't have a lot of money, but we had a lot of love," she recalled. After graduating from Hawthorne High, Faulk attended California State University, Dominguez Hills, where she graduated with a BA in

Economics and a minor in Political Science. She went on to attend the University of West Los Angeles to earn a law degree. She credits her parents with pushing her to get where she is today, both in terms of her perseverance and willingness to serve the community.

"My parents have really influenced my viewpoints and how I reflect on things and have allowed me to stay humble in so many ways. And I think that's so important as an elected official not to forget where you come from and have that as influencing where you're going," she said.

After her success with the bus line, Faulk felt inspired to get more involved in serving her community. She was appointed to the Advisory Board for the Department of Consumer Affairs by Burke, who recognized her passion for public service and delegation. She held that position for around six years, servicing the greater Los Angeles area. Not long after, she took a position on the California State Employee Association (SEIU 1000) Foundation Board, where she worked to provide scholarships to hard-working college students in need. In 2013, Faulk first became active with the 62nd District as an Appointed Assembly Delegate, where she still serves today.

However, after working with college students on the Foundation Board, Faulk immediately found her niche in helping the youth in the community. She became an elected official for Inglewood Unified School District (IUSD) in 2017, where she served under Assemblymember Autumn Burke, Yvonne Brathwaite Burke's daughter. Faulk cited Autumn Burke as one of her biggest political influences. "She got me active really early on and guided me."

In addition to budget planning and management, Faulk was most passionate about making a difference in the eyes of the youth in the community. Remembering what got her into politics in the first place, she wanted to ensure that students in Inglewood had equal access to classes, scholarships, and educational resources. "I fought to ensure they have the same opportunities as other kids in more affluent areas," she said.

Faulk's last year serving on the school board was in 2020. She remembers running into a few students who recognized her from her time on the board, explaining that they told her how she had made such an impact on their lives. "The kids are the future," she explained, "and whatever I can do to support them, guide them, and be the wind beneath their wings is something I want to continue doing."

Faulk currently serves on the Inglewood City Council. Beginning the position in 2020, Faulk is the first African-American woman to be elected for the position. "It's a real honor to be able to have that title," she said. Having worked for the state of California for over fifteen years, Faulk is excited to see where her job takes her next.

"This is a listening time for me, so I can be a strong leader as I continue to work on my career," she said. But above all, she acknowledges the need for hard work to make progress. "If you want to make a difference, you have to participate in the battle," Faulk explained. She is prepared and excited for anything and everything coming her way, always mindful of where she is going, but more importantly, where she came from. •
