Council Proceeds With Multi-Use Complex, Transit System Plans

The Inglewood City Council continued its focus on community development and revitalization, taking action at recent meetings to advance a multi-use development at Florence and La Brea avenues and a transit system for the burgeoning Inglewood entertainment district. At a special meeting last month, the City of Inglewood completed contractual agreements for the mixed-use development on Market Street between Florence Avenue and Queen Street. Thomas Safran & Associates will manage the residential component of the development.

Mayor James T. Butts said in a later interview that the project is scheduled to start construction within six months and be finished in late 2020. Butts confirmed that 90 percent of the residential units are to be offered at market rate.

The Council also adopted a proposal for an LED billboard at the mixed-use complex. The 800-square foot display will generate revenue for the City via a one-time payment of \$12,500, plus regular monthly fees once construction and lighting of the sign is complete. It will be attached to the uppermost façade of the six-story complex, facing the southeast corner of North La Brea and Florence.

After one year, the City will also receive a percentage of the owners’ yearly net advertising revenue. The Council agreed to exempt the LED project from the California

Environmental Quality Act. CEQA, section 15303, exempts certain new, smaller facilities and accessory facilities from environmental review.

The Council agreed to increase budget allocations for the Inglewood transit connector (ITC) project, currently in phase three of environmental impact reporting. The project, known as the “city last-mile transit connector,” would provide connecting transport to the Inglewood entertainment district. Under current plans, public transportation would end at the Los Angeles Metro Greenline Station, currently under construction at Florence Avenue and Market Street.

Mayor Butts noted, “Plans are in the exploratory phase.” Engineering and design firms Pacifica Services, Inc. and Willdan Engineering are reported to be ahead of schedule in delivering final projections and EIRs for the massive project. Butts has said he hopes Inglewood’s transit vision will be a catalyst for future mass transit throughout the region.

At the meeting of August 20, a public hearing was opened to discuss extending a moratorium on self-storage facilities in the city. Chris Jackson, director of economic and community development, said staff has looked at market trends in other localities, and was requesting additional time to conclude research and bring back a proposal to allow storage facilities in Inglewood.

The Council adopted the initial 45-day moratorium on July 7, banning new storage facilities. Municipal code allows storage in areas zoned for industrial and non-commercial use, with approximately 4 percent of the City’s land falling under that zone. Butts noted a concern regarding oversaturation, as there are eight self-storage units already in town. “Storage doesn’t generate jobs,” said Butts, explaining that a balanced land-use policy will consider industrial land use against jobs on site. “They take up a lot of land and don’t provide jobs.” A staff report cited an average 3.5 jobs per facility, which is far below the number of employees for typical manufacturing uses. No public comment was offered on the issue. The new action will continue the ban until March 2020.

The month of September will see a host of City events, including Councilmember George Dotson’s annual shredding event at 4901 Manchester, and Councilmember Alex Padilla’s 6th Annual Picnic and Chili Cookoff, at North Park from noon until 4 p.m. Both events take place this weekend, on Saturday, Sept. 7. The following Saturday, Padilla will host a Hispanic Heritage event on the City Hall campus. The Sept. 14 event will feature a classic car show.

The Inglewood City Council meets every Tuesday, unless otherwise noted, at 2 p.m. in the council chambers on the 9th floor, Inglewood City Hall. •

This week’s review, *Shake the Tree!*, was written by Chiara Vignocchi and Paolo Chiarinotti, and illustrated by Silvia Borando. This fun picture book begins with a mouse that has its eye on a nut that is stuck up high in a tree. Mouse decides to shake the tree a little to the right and a little to the left, but is surprised to see it’s not a nut that he wants to eat that falls down. It is a fox instead.

Fox, however, doesn’t find the nut that is in the tree appetizing. He takes one look at Mouse and thinks he looks scrumptious. Mouse then scurries up the tree, but that does not stop fox. Fox is determined to get Mouse down from the tree -- and as he continues to shake the tree, a new animal comes falling down. This time, an even larger animal falls out of the

tree and Fox decides to do what Mouse did and climbs up the tree.

At this point, you might be catching on to how this story goes. The animals that fall from the tree after the powerful shakes keep getting larger and scarier. Film Review

Jawline is a #NoFilter Look at Influencer Culture

In today’s very real and very bizarre social economy, social media “followers” are a source of currency and an “influencer” is a profession. My first introduction to Instagram was in my early twenties, barely post-college and dating a guy who was obsessed with popularity (surprise: the relationship didn’t last long). My initial impression of Instagram – an app driven by attention-seeking individuals who crave the envy of others – hasn’t changed much in the seven years since I created my first username. In fact, things have only amplified since then. In director Liza Mandelup’s engrossing documentary *Jawline*, now streaming on Hulu, she explores the extreme highs and lows of fame through the

with low follower growth and confusing contract negotiations as well as a potentially sketchy talent manager, Michael Weist.

Jawline doesn’t judge Austyn for his wide-eyed ambitions. Mandelup delicately documents this quest for fame without drumming up additional drama for the film’s sake, and this patience gives the movie its bittersweet authenticity. You root for Austyn throughout the film. It’s impossible not to, even though you know full well that his road to stardom is nearly impossible.

Jawline should be required viewing for parents with young children who are growing up in this social media dystopia. May it serve as a cautionary tale for those who crave Internet fame, as well as those who obsess over these

eyes of a 16-year-old boy whose only ambition in life is to be “Internet-famous.”

Austyn Tester isn’t a household name to most, but to his tens of thousands of online fans, he is the next best thing. His room is covered in “I Love Austyn” posters sent to him from teenage girls across the country, giving him hope that a more exciting and prosperous life outside of his hometown of rural Kingsport, Tennessee is very possible. Austyn is a cute kid -- there’s no denying that. His southern drawl and boyish good looks are the initial hooks, but it is his continual message of positivity and love he shares with his followers that set him apart from his competition (other teenage boys with newly formed abs and side-swept bangs).

Navigating the online ecosystem IRL proves much more difficult for Austyn than he anticipated. He joins his first Influencer tour, which is supposed to be his “made it” moment. However, he struggles amid issues

IF YOU ARE A CREDITOR or a contingent creditor of the decedent, you must file your claim with the court and mail a copy to the personal representative appointed by the court within the later of either (1) four months from the date of first issuance of letters to a general personal representative, as defined in section 58(b) of the California Probate Code, or (2) 60 days from the date of mailing or personal delivery to you of a notice under section 9052 of the California Probate Code.
Other California statutes and legal authority may affect your rights as a creditor. You may want to consult with an attorney knowledgeable in California law.
YOU MAY EXAMINE the file kept by the court. If you are a person interested in the estate, you may file with the court a Request for Special Notice (form DE-154) of the filing of an inventory and appraisal of estate assets or of any petition or account as provided in Probate Code section 1250. A Request for Special Notice form is available from the court clerk.

Summary of Ordinance 2189 Amending Chapter 222.125 (Smoking Prohibited in Public Park, Park and Recreation Areas) to the Hawthorne Municipal Code.
Pursuant to Government Code section 36933(c), the following constitutes a summary of Ordinance No. 2189 which will be considered for adoption by the City Council at its regular meeting on September 10, 2019 at 6:00 p.m. Pursuant to California Government Code section 36933(c) (1), the City Council has directed the City Attorney to prepare and publish a summary of Ordinance Nos. 2189 which seeks to designate a smoking area adjacent to the Memorial Center. Ordinance 2187 is an amendment to the Hawthorne Municipal Code (HMC) which prohibits all smoking in any public park within the City of Hawthorne, and shall include:
The purpose of Ordinance No. 2187 is to designate certain smoking areas at the Hawthorne Memorial Center, 3901 West El Segundo Blvd, Hawthorne, CA. Generally, smoking is prohibited at the park.
The City Council finds and determines that there is no possibility that the adoption of this Ordinance will have a significant effect on the environment. Accordingly, this Ordinance is not subject to the requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Sections 15061(b)(3) and 15378 of Division 6 of Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations A certified copy of the entirety of the text of Ordinance No. 2187 is available both on the City's website and also in the office of the City Clerk, 4455 West 126th Street, Hawthorne, California, and is open for public inspection. Pursuant to Government Code section 36933(c), the summary Ordinance No. 2187 was published at least five (5) days before the ordinance is to be adopted on September 10, 2019, a duly convened regular meeting of the Hawthorne City Council.
