I went online and looked up the 15 best things to do in Hawthorne, California. The choices are pretty interesting, but nowhere is there mention of the Hawthorne Library. The list should be modified to include the Hawthorne Library. Please go – that's my suggestion. But, you may well ask: A Hawthorne Library? The place where I have to whisper? A whole bunch of books? What's the big deal?

The Hawthorne Library is located at 12700 Grevillea Avenue in Hawthorne. It has nearly 17,000 square feet and is part of the Los Angeles County Hawthorne Library system. The Hawthorne Library was founded in 1913, has been at its present location since 1962, remodeled in 1978, and is now renovated with new carpeting and flooring, paint, LED lighting, furniture, and a new group study room. The hours are also ample: Tuesday and Wednesday, Noon to 8 pm, Thursday through Saturday, 10 am to 8 pm.

The Hawthorne Library was closed since 2020 when it re-opened on July 12 this year. Undaunted and to continue to serve the community, the Hawthorne Library provided Sidewalk Service during the Pandemic. In addition, the Hawthorne Library staff participated in several tasks, including contact tracing, Project Roomkey, and food distribution.

a Bookmark!" to "Story Time" to a Free Vaccine Clinic.

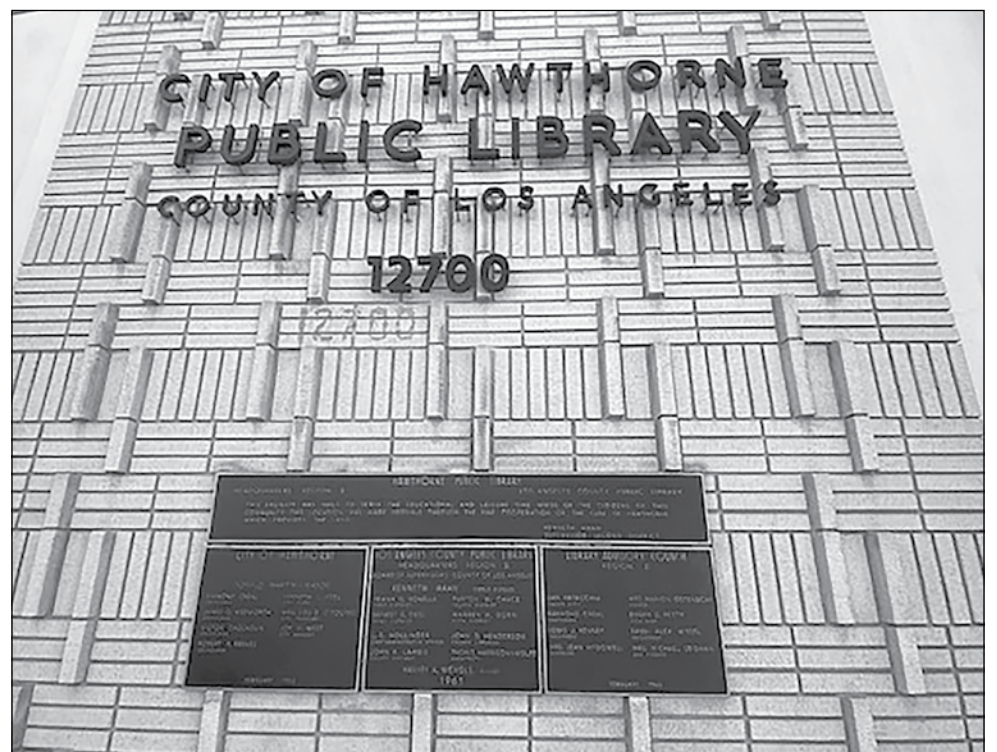
The Hawthorne Library is dedicated to reducing barriers and increasing access to and equity of public services for all; this is not a mere platitude.

One of the reasons is Daniel Granados, the Hawthorne Library's Manager for ten years. Daniel is instrumental in Hawthorne Library policy policies and procedures, overseeing staff and promoting the Hawthorne Library's services. He is also a real gentleman who

takes great pride in the benefits the Hawthorne Library offers. One example: If you are concerned that you might not know where to look for something or what all you can even look for, there is an "Ask Us" desk at the Hawthorne Library.

The Hawthorne Library also offers a group study room, three individual study rooms, four early learning computers, six homework center computers, 18 general access computers, and eight chrome books.

## Film Review

### The Banshees of Inisherin is a Striking Achievement, Among The Year's Best

The meaning of life is hidden within *The Banshees of Inisherin*, I just know it. How we spend our days – our very limited time on this planet – is the crux of writer/director Martin McDonagh's buddy comedy that also doubles as a cinematic spiritual awakening. On the surface, this is a forlorn story about

into making autonomous decisions that may or may not align with other people's expectations – much like Colm. Seemingly overnight, he has reached a new level of self-awareness and decides to prioritize what matters most in life: time. In an effort to stop wasting what precious time he has left, Colm has decided that he will no longer put

a friendship breakup between the well-meaning but dim-witted Pádraic Súilleabháin (Colin Farrell) and his longtime friend Colm Doherty (Brendan Gleeson), a stoic man a couple of decades his senior. But this isn't just a story about ex-BFFs. Filmed on location on the idyllic Irish coast, *The Banshees of Inisherin*, in theaters this Friday, is a quiet masterpiece that tackles the rhetorical question of how to live a reverential, more conscious life.

Colm's sudden ex-communication is a mystery to Pádraic, who cannot comprehend why he would abruptly end their relationship. His stubbornness and refusal to talk only confuses Pádraic further and with no understanding of social cues or personal space, he continues to bother Colm for answers, much like a mosquito buzzing in your ear that you swat at but it still won't leave you alone. Pádraic's sister Siobhan (Kerry Condon) and his acquaintance Dominic Kearney (Barry Keoghan) do the best they can to help Pádraic move on, but he can't. He needs to know why. And finally, Colm tells him.

As we get older, we realize that we have control over what we choose to tolerate in our lives. The people-pleasing default that many grew up with slowly morphs

up with Pádraic's small talk, benign chatter, and fleeting thoughts. Colm has found that playing the fiddle – creating something with permanence like music – is a better use of his time. And so he exchanges Pádraic for a fiddle. The fascinating observation here is that both men, confident in their opposing wants, are both right. And, one could argue, both are completely wrong. Colm wants to be left alone; Pádraic wants company. Who deserves to get what they want?

### Ask The Experts About Alzheimer's

(BPT) - Alzheimer's is a progressive medical condition, and one of the deadliest diseases in the United States. That's why it is important to learn about the disease along with some simple steps that can help delay the potential onset, or help facilitate an early diagnosis.

That means roughly 5.8 million people are living with the disease. However, Alzheimer's will only become more prevalent - around 14 million people are estimated to be living with Alzheimer's by 2050.

Alzheimer's disease is commonly diagnosed after conducting a memory screening and ruling out other reasons for cognitive decline. It is important to have a memory screening done each year, as having a historical record can increase your health care practitioner's ability to accurately diagnose memory disorders earlier.

Memory screenings can be performed during your annual wellness visit, which is free to anyone on Medicare. Make sure to ask your

Alzheimer's from normal, fleeting memory loss, sometimes associated with aging - Alzheimer's is marked by serious memory loss and confusion.

Examples of serious memory loss might be having to ask for the same information repeatedly or requiring memory aids, such as notes, to remember basic information. If you feel like you or a loved one is suffering from serious memory loss, contact your health care provider.

Staying physically and mentally active is key, regardless of age. That may mean taking a brisk walk, playing online brain games or participating in other activities that can improve circulation and challenge your mind.

Additionally, it is important to keep your blood pressure, cholesterol and blood sugar levels in check. If you are a smoker, quitting is important, as it increases your chances of developing Alzheimer's.

Taking these steps to help prevent Alzheimer's is key, as there is currently no cure for the disease. •

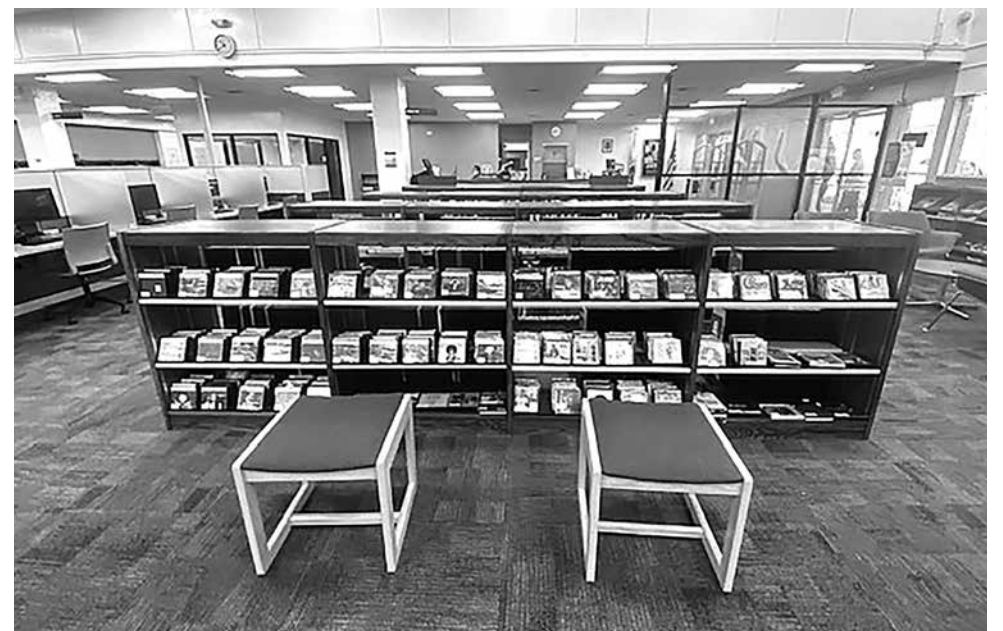
well as personalized online career coaching).

### Get Started with a DIY Financial Plan

Did you know that 78 percent of people with a financial plan pay their bills on time vs. only 38 percent of people who don't have a plan? Or that 68 percent of planners have an emergency fund while only 26 percent of non-planners are prepared to cover an unexpected cost?

Here's how to get started with a DIY plan.

- Write down your goals — Start by asking yourself what you want your money to accomplish. What are your short-term needs? What do you want to accomplish in the next 5 to 10 years?

- Create a net worth statement — Achieving your goals requires understanding where you stand today. So start by listing your assets — bank and investment accounts, real estate and valuable personal property. Now list all your debts: mortgage, credit cards, student loans — everything. Subtract your liabilities from your assets and you have your net worth. Use this number as a benchmark to measure your progress.

- Review your cash flow — Cash flow simply means money in (your income) and money out (your expenses). How much money do you earn each month? Be sure to include all sources of income. Now look at your expenses, including any that may only come up once or twice a year.

- Zero in on your budget — Your cash-flow analysis will let you know how much you're spending. Focusing on your budget will let you know where that money is going. Write down your essential expenses such as mortgage, insurance, food, transportation, utilities and loan payments. Don't forget periodic payments and be sure to include savings. Then write down nonessentials — restaurants, entertainment, even clothes.

- Focus on debt management — Debt can derail you, but not all debt is bad. It's high-interest consumer debt like credit cards that you want to avoid. Try to follow the 28/36 guideline that no more than 28 percent of pre-tax income goes toward home debt, no more than 36 percent toward all debt.

- Get your retirement savings on track — Whatever your age, retirement saving needs to be part of your financial plan. Calculate

how much you will need to comfortably retire and contribute to a 401(k) or other employer-sponsored plan or an IRA. The earlier you start, the less you'll have to save each year.

- Review your insurance — Insurance is an important part of protecting your finances. Health insurance is a given, and most of us also need car and homeowner's or renter's insurance. While you're working, disability insurance is a smart move. Finally, you should consider life insurance, especially if you have dependents.

- Know your income tax situation — To make sure you're prepared, review your withholding and estimated taxes, and explore potential tax credits.

- Create or update your estate plan — At a minimum, have a will to name a guardian for minor children. Check that beneficiaries are up to date on all retirement accounts and insurance policies. Complete an advance healthcare directive and assign powers of attorney for both finances and healthcare.

A financial plan can be especially important if you don't have a lot of money because it can help you get on the path to greater financial strength. Whether you need to reduce spending and debt, up your savings, or just refine the details, once you have a plan you'll be on the road to success. •

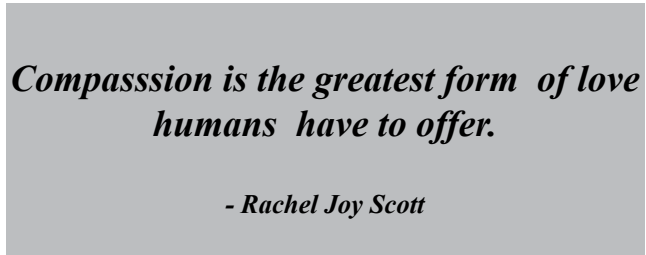

*The Banshees of Inisherin* caught me completely off guard. I thought I was walking into a standard, period-set drama about a complicated relationship between two grown men, but my premature assumptions were quickly proven to be wrong. What we have here is

an unforgettably dazzling achievement – both onscreen and off – with some of the year’s most phenomenal performances, original dialogue, and affecting score. Colin Farrell channels a Larry David-type unawareness that gives this dark comedy a more contemporary feel.

His sweet demeanor is at odds with Brendan Gleeson’s boorish ignorance and watching these two celebrated actors play out his dynamic on screen together is something special.

The tonal bait and switch from dark comedy to introspective, sensitive drama is

what makes *The Banshees of Inisherin* such a powerful film. It hints at the meaning of life in a delicate way and leaves audiences with some food for thought as the credits roll. It’s also a film that I’m already looking forward to rewatching again, and again. •
