Inglewood Gets FAA Grant for LAX Residential Sound Insulation

The Inglewood City Council made quick work of a light agenda at yesterday’s meeting, finishing up business in less than 20 minutes, with all members present. Beyond the usual housekeeping items to approve previous minutes and public works projects, pay bills and receive and file reports, the Council approved receipt of a Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) grant. The whopping \$4.4 million dollar grant will be specifically earmarked to provide sound insulation for some 150 residential units.

The meeting was sparsely attended and there were no comments from the public regarding agenda items or other matters. Also, atypically, City Manager Artie Fields and Treasurer Wanda M. Brown were absent from the meeting.

Assistant City Manager David Esparza reported on a closed session item regarding a workers’ compensation claim from Evonne Jones. Esparza’s request for authority to settle the claim for an amount not over \$40,000 passed with four aye votes, with Councilmember Alex Padilla abstaining, saying he was not present at closed session.

City Clerk Yvonne Horton noted the continuing rollout of the new voting system for LA County. The Voting Solutions for All People (VSAP) system will hold a demo in Inglewood the first week of December, said Horton. Representatives will also address the Council to talk about the system, which will debut during the March 2020 presidential primaries.

Los Angeles County recently conducted a mock election using the VSAP system. The

two-day event took place Sept. 28-29, and was deemed a success. Close to 6,000 Los Angeles residents participated in the mock election, and more than 1,200 of the new VSAP devices were operated at 50 sites around the county. More demonstrations are planned prior to the State of California’s certification of the system.

Councilmember Herbert Dotson reported on a surprise party celebrating the 90th birthday of Willie Agee. Referring to the longtime resident and Council advocate as “our biggest fan,” Dotson said Agee was “truly surprised and appreciative.”

Councilmember Alex Padilla shared pictures from the Día de los Muertos event Saturday, and thanked the community for coming out. He acknowledged the Inglewood Park flower shop for a donation of 300 monarch butterflies released at the event.

Councilmember Ralph Franklin acknowledged The LA Rams for their philanthropy and sponsorship of Inglewood schools and youth sports teams. He also thanked Connie Turner, representative of Southern California Edison, for a tour and presentation on wild-fire mitigation and areas of possible power

Parents Discover How to Detect the Signs that Their Teen Is Vaping

Hundreds of South Bay parents turned out last week to a town hall meeting to learn about what’s in e-cigarettes and why they’re so popular in youth culture. Speaker after speaker pounded home a message: Don’t be fooled again by the tobacco industry.

Electronic cigarettes comprise a \$9 billion-a-year business that grew almost overnight. Sales increased by 78 percent in one year, and the companies behind the trendy smoking habit use social media to target minors, panelists revealed Oct. 14 at the teen vaping town hall gathering in Manhattan Beach.

While the smoking craze is safer than cigarettes, that doesn’t mean teens should take up the habit, said pediatrician Dr. Alice

Kuo with UCLA Health Sciences. It’s never a good idea to put chemicals in the lungs, she said, adding she has seen lung damage in a few cases at the Redondo Beach clinic where she practices. She hears a lot from teens who think vaping is safe. “Oh Dr. Kuo, you don’t know. It’s just water vapor,” her young patients tell her.

However, new data from the U.S. Centers for Disease Control indicates that e-cigarettes have caused lung damage and even deaths across the country. There were 1,299 reported cases of lung injury and 26 confirmed U.S. deaths as of Oct. 11, the CDC reported. Not all of the smokers were young and a majority of the injured smokers used their

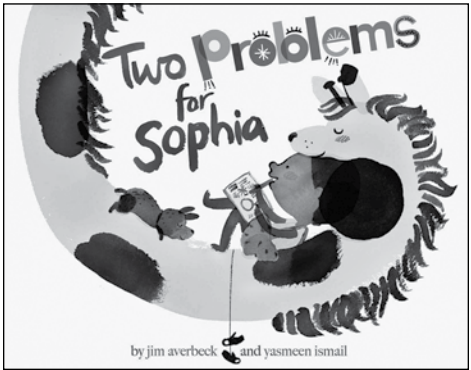


Check It Out

Sophia has her One True Desire, her very own pet giraffe named Noodle! Sophia is surprised that having a pet giraffe is a little more complicated than she anticipated. She defines Noodle's two main problem areas: his tongue and his snoring.

Sophia's grandma, known as Grand-mamá, happens to be one of Noodle's favorite people. However the feeling is not mutual. Grand-mamá, does not enjoy receiving sloppy kisses from Noodle's long, wet tongue. The biggest problem in the family, though, seems to be Noodle's snoring. It is difficult for anyone to get any sleep when Noodle sleeps because of his incredibly loud snoring. One morning, Sophia's mother orders her to find a perdurable solution to Noodle's problems. Sophia must do everything she can to stop Noodle from being sent back to where he came from, as Grand- mamá suggests.

Sophia then begins her journey to design a snoring solution for Noodle. She begins with research and consults with Ms. Canticle, an acoustical engineer, who offers an explanation

and potential solution to improve his condition. Sophia is unsuccessful in her first attempt to eliminate Noodle's snoring, so she calls Ms. Canticle once more. She works on prototypes, draws up a blueprint, and gathers the right supplies from her family to come up with a new sleeping mask for Noodle. You'll have to check out this book from the library yourself to see if Sophia's creation ends up being the permanent solution her parents ordered!

I thought this book did a wonderful job of introducing new vocabulary to children, especially those interested in science. I also appreciated the inclusive nature of this book, which includes Sophia's multigenerational and diverse family. Children will appreciate Sophia's imagination and wish they too could have their own pet giraffe after reading this book! Film Review

In The Kill Team, Not All Soldiers are Saints

In 2013, writer/director Dan Krauss's *The Kill Team* won Best Documentary Feature at the Tribeca Film Festival. Six years later, Krauss returned to Tribeca to debut his cinematic interpretation of the documentary's jarring events – the execution of innocent Afghan civilians by a group of U.S. Military soldiers – in his narrative feature film of the

the trust of his military brothers. Briggman questions should he do the right thing and put himself in danger or shut up and deal with it. This hypothetical question further illustrates that the effects of war aren't just from physical battles, but mental ones as well.

Wolff's portrayal of a young soldier fighting through his worst-case scenario creates an emotionally deft performance. His vulnerability

same name. *The Kill Team*, opening in theaters and VOD this Friday, may not uncover new information about these horrific stains on our military's past, but the star power attached may help this story reach new audiences in hopes that history doesn't repeat itself.

Impending deployment to Afghanistan, Andrew Briggman (Nat Wolff) is a born leader ready to join the front lines. Shortly after arriving at base camp, his squad is introduced to Sergeant Deeks (Alexander Skarsgård), a commanding figure who makes his goal very clear: "We kill people, that's what we do." Deeks is blunt when it comes to stating his position, riling up the soldiers and creating a tense, testosterone-filled atmosphere. This is far beyond fraternity bullying as the squad members unleash their aggression by killing innocent civilians with actions that were encouraged by Deeks himself. Troubled by his association with the murders and burdened by guilt, Briggman begins to have second thoughts about the intentions of his commander and the purpose of the mission at large.

The idea of the "hero soldier" that Briggman once aspired to be turns into an illusion before his eyes. Instead, he now finds himself in a moral tug of war between what he knows is right vs. the consequences of betraying

remains at the surface throughout the film's entirety, making him easy to root for despite his conflicting behavior. Alexander Skarsgård's dark charisma is frightening, as we can easily understand how these impressionable soldiers fell under his macho spell. *The Kill Team* is not just another war movie. This time, the enemy is the home team. The biggest takeaway here is an awareness of the awful, yet real-life events, that took place not that long ago, and the harsh realization that not all soldiers are saints. •

vapes to smoke tetrahydrocannabinol, otherwise known as THC, found in cannabis.

And, it can be vaped without being obvious to the untrained eye. There is a black market for vaping products that is contributing to the health problems reported by physicians and emergency room staff nationwide, the CDC says. Juice bought on the street or from family, friends, dealers or other informal sources “are linked to most of the cases and play a major role in the outbreak,” the CDC announced this month.

Vaping is wildly popular with high school students, some teens told the packed auditorium of parents who came looking for information about the smoking craze. Vapes, as they are commonly known, are battery-powered devices that heat a nicotine-infused liquid called juice. When heated, the juice forms a steamy white cloud that teens inhale. Though it may look harmless, there is nicotine and other chemicals in the wispy vapor.

A huge challenge for parents is how easy it is for minors to buy vape products. Local stores carry the popular flavored vape juices and the battery-powered devices into a breathable cloud. Because they are tobacco products, clerks are required by law to verify that a buyer is of age to buy e-cigarettes. However, teens use online websites to bypass the age restriction of 21 and older. And, online advertising directs teens to these retail sites.

Teens who spoke at last week’s meeting revealed that vape companies, including Juul, reach their demographic using social media and websites. They post online ads that feature models who make e-cigarettes look and sound glamorous, according to student volunteers with the Beach Cities Health District. Teens who post images of themselves vaping on Snapchat and Instagram also perpetuate the image that vaping is what friends do together.

When asked ahead of the town hall meeting why teens use vapes, high schoolers from the beach cities said they smoke for depression, stress and peer pressure. The nicotine in the smoke stimulates the brain and body when ingested, but what follows is fatigue and eventually addiction. Teens who vape for two to three months start chasing that feeling again, said Jennifer Harris who coordinates

tobacco and drug prevention in the South Bay cities through the nonprofit Behavioral Health Services in Gardena.

Vapes can be bought on eBay or borrowed, so a teen can be smoking even if he or she doesn’t own a pocket-sized pen, USB drive or a lipstick tube, the young people said. The heating elements are disguised as a box of Altoids breath mints, a can of Coke, car keys or an Apple watch. Parents should especially be on the lookout for any Suorin brand being carried by their child, Harris said. “Suorin is really popular for people in the South Bay,” Harris noted. “A lot of parents don’t know that.” She also pointed out that Suorin products are less expensive than Juul.

The Pax brand is used primarily for vaping marijuana, another good tip for parents. The makers of vapes are helping teens and young adults conceal their habit by hiding smoke-delivering tubing inside of hoodies and backpacks, Harris revealed.

Vaping ads surprisingly show up on study websites that students use, according to the teen leaders with Beach Cities Health District. There is some vaping that goes on during school hours in the campus bathrooms, and some of their peers said it makes students uncomfortable to see it. However, peer pressure prevents them from saying anything negative to the students who are vaping or reporting it to teachers or campus security.

Restricting access to vaping cartridges and flavored juices is the most effective way to reduce their use of e-cigarettes, said Dr. Donnie Watson with the Thelma McMillen Center for Alcohol and Drug Treatment at Torrance Memorial. He urges parents to push back against the marketing by tobacco companies to turn teens into lifelong nicotine users.

The explosive 78 percent growth of e-cigarettes between 2017 and 2018 can be attributed to the marketing to minors, the speakers said. Until the federal government regulates the new-generation tobacco products, parents are the first line of defense. “We’re 10 years behind in this,” Dr. Watson told parents. “Be vigilant, just hang in there. They [teens] need your support.”
