In the second quarter, the Eagles defense continued to stop Mary Star both on the ground and through the air. Defensive coordinator Dan Heck said the key to stopping Mary Star was taking them out of their game plan, and he thought his defensive unit had done its job. "We get after it and we were probably a little quicker than they (Mary Star) thought we would be," said Heck.

While the defense continued to stop the Stars, the Eagles' offense scored one more touchdown before halftime. Once again El Segundo went to the air to pick up big yardage, as Bundy was 5-for-5 during the drive for 100 yards. It culminated with a 16-yard TD pass from Bundy to Palmer to make it 28-0. During the nine-play series, the Eagles committed three penalties for 40 yards. That hampered the drive but didn't stop it. The Eagles were penalized a total of 17 times for 149 yards during the game. "We have to cut down on all of the penalties if this team is going to be successful," said Eagle head coach Steve Shevlin.

In the second half, El Segundo turned the ball over on its first two possessions with a lost fumble and an interception, but the Stars were unable to convert either time. The defense, led by linebacker Brandon Jimenez, forced Mary Star out of rhythm, and the Stars had to punt after a short series of downs each time. The Eagles used another long drive that consumed just shy of six minutes of the third quarter to settle for a 39-yard field goal by Adam Hobbs. The junior place-kicker handled the kickoff duties too, and four of his seven kickoffs were for touchbacks.

In the fourth quarter and holding a comfortable 31-0 lead, the second team offensive players displayed their talents. Junior running


