

"Hi, Thank you for sending the pictures. We are truly enjoying Murphy (aka Cory) being part of our family. He has been so great with the potty training - not one accident in the house. He is able to be in his kennel at night from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. without any problem and quite happy to have his own space it seems. The first night when we went to put him in the kennel he wasn't real excited, but went right to sleep and slept sound all night. After Murphy went in his kennel that first night Crash laid down and let out a big sigh, we were all laughing. It was definitely an exciting evening for both of them.

Within 24 hours Crash and Murphy were doing much better together - they are having fun playing, the biggest issue is making sure they don't play too hard and get hurt. Murphy has no idea how big Crash really is, or how small he is. Murphy is quite fast in the backyard running around and gives Crash a fun time chasing him thru the obstacle course - under table, swing, tree, etc very entertaining for us to watch. Murphy has

started to roll over and submit to Crash at times when they get playing too rough, the problem is Crash is just clumsy playing and continues playing hard even after Murphy is on his back. We are often getting in the middle to try and keep Murphy safe. Murphy hasn't yelped at all and keeps going back for more, I figure he is more durable than we realize. He has been better at not nipping at Crash except for when they get really rough. Because of their rough playing and feeling like we need to keep

a close eye on them, we haven't encouraged the doggie door use yet, it is sort of nice that we control when Murphy is outside, and I think Crash sometimes goes outside through the doggie door to get a little break. He did jump right through the door to come inside when Shane held the doggie door open for him, so I am sure when we encourage him to use the doggie door it won't be a problem.

Murphy and Shane are already best buds and Murphy chooses him over anyone else. He waits by the door for a couple of minutes after Shane leaves hoping he's coming right back. Shane can't wait until Murphy is house safe and can sleep in his room at night. He already hangs out with him in there during day. I can't believe he has only been with our family for three days. It seems like he has been a part of our family for much longer. Thank you so much for all you do, and to the fostering family too. We are so grateful to all of you that have made it possible for Murphy to join our family. We will stay in contact and will plan on seeing you in a few weeks for his next shots.
