will be even more budget problems for the 2010/2011 school year. "Next year it's going to be difficult, it's going to be tough," Yantz said. "We are looking at some serious, serious challenges in public education."

Although the state's cash flow problems are becoming increasingly grave, Yantz said the district has enough cash on hand for now and probably next year. He said right now the state is expected to give the district about \$1.3 in federal stimulus money, but said the amount is tentative and will probably change. "It could be more, it could be less, it could be the same," Yantz said. "We just don't know how it's going to play out. And again, it's one-time money."

Yantz said the state is giving federal stimulus money to the district with the expectation it spreads the money over several years. "You have three years to spend it," Yantz said. "Every superintendent I talk to say they're going to spend every dime they get to offset the cuts next year."

MEASURE M

Tim Truax, Chairman of the Citizens Advisory Committee for School District Facilities gave the council and update on the auditorium and athletic facility renovation projects funded under Bond Measure M.

He said designs are still being drawn up for the athletic fields and that the committee was able to revise the scope of the project to bring its projected costs down. "We got the cost in shooting distance of where we think it needs to be," Truax said.

Truax said he expects designs for El Segundo High School's athletic fields and auditorium to be completed by June. Regarding the auditorium, he said the project is less than \$1 million over budget, and that a key area of focus for the committee was to make the stage functional and safe. "We think we are going to get to there and do what was promised, which was to make the

auditorium a safe, usable and well lit facility," Truax said.

One way the committee was able to trim down the costs was to focus on the basics and worry about the details later. Truax said the committee also consulted with the drama teacher to make sure they weren't missing anything important, and received good feedback. "As time goes by we can always add more lights and speakers," Truax said. "We are trying to do the sort of basic infrastructure things, but we want to get the basic bones of the facility up to standards, given that the building's eighty-years old."

Truax said the committee also saved money by cutting costs associated with steam-cleaning seats in the auditorium. "That's not really what we were trying to focus on," Truax said. "At some point if the seats need to be cleaned, we can find that money somewhere."

Another challenge for the committee was to keep costs down while complying with stringent fire and safety standards. They also had to comply with regulations set forth by the Americans with Disabilities Act, also known as ADA. "I know the meetings seem never-ending but we really appreciate it," School Board President Ann Coles said.

Truax said the school Board, if it chooses, could try reaching out to the city for financial help. He said that a new auditorium would be of great benefit to the city and that part of the field renovation project is actually on city property. Truax also had some news regarding the committee's meeting hours. "For those who want to attend our meetings, we will try to schedule them so they don't coincide with the Laker games any more," Truax said.
