Mustangs Will Travel to Thessaloniki and Athens, Greece

The Mira Costa High School water polo team has long been established as one of the premier high school teams in the South Bay, if not the CIF Southern Section. The aquatics program that includes the swim team and water polo teams do well annually for both the boys' and girls' teams. With a great coaching staff and a great aquatics center to play and train in, it's easy to see why the Mustangs have been so successful over a number of years. For the past couple of years though, to help prepare for the upcoming season, the Mustangs have traveled to Europe to play against some of the top teams in their age group in a tournament-style format. Last year, a team of Mustangs traveled to Italy to play in a tournament, and this year a group of Mustangs will travel to Thessaloniki and Athens, Greece to train and play under the watchful eye of their coach Jon Reichardt.

The Mustangs have benefited from their overseas training in the past by playing against some pretty heady competition. This year they'll be playing against three different Greek teams, a German squad and one from Serbia. According to Reichardt, this is a great opportunity for the players to train, compete and play against some top notch athletes and develop new frienships. "They'll build lasting relationships with the players from other countries and I'm sure one day the friends they make might one day come to visit our players here," said

The Mustangs slated to make the trip with Reichardt are Evan Bronner, Travis Elliot, Conner Davidge, Spencer Neste, Devon Norris, Deven Ram and Jason Veris. To subsidize the trip, the players have raised money through some fundraising events as well as receiving support from community businesses. Body Glove stepped up in a big way by donating clothing.

Taking a group of athletes on the road can always be challenging. But when these athletes are together for a couple of weeks like these seven water polo team members are going to be, it can lead to a special union between themselves and could quite possibly lead to a successful season in the fall. The 2008/09 team that went to Italy last summer bonded so well during the season that they reached the CIF Southern Section semifinals. The Mustangs will embark on their trek to Greece starting June 21 and will return July 6. Reichardt believes this will be a very special 15 days for these players. "They aren't just representing Mira Costa or their own families--they're also representing our country and this should be a lasting memory for all of them I know it will be for me," he said.

Playing overseas will also broaden the scope of the players' education and insight of another culture by being in another country for over two weeks. These players will return with a better understanding of the country they have visited, a sense of understanding athletes their own age from other nations, and an appreciation for culinary delights while being in Greece. This is a win-win situation for everyone involved according to Reichardt, and he views this as much more than just some high school athletes going across the Atlantic Ocean to play some games. "This is an opportunity for these players to do something special and something they'll long remember after they graduate from high school," he said.

The team is still raising funds for their trip according to Irene Bronner, one of the parents helping to organize the excursion, and is still in need of corporate sponsorships. "We're hopeful that someone or organization will step in and help defray some of the costs." She added, "This is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity for some of these players and it's more than just playing some games or doing some sightseeing. This is also an opportunity to learn other traditions."
