April showers bring kittens in May flowers. Take a look at a cuddly kittie for your new companion...

Shadow and his brother Midnight were dumped at Kitten Rescue's Casitas facility April 14 at only seven weeks old. They are two healthy boys with short/medium black coats (as they still have baby fur, it is hard to tell how long their coats will ultimately be) and beautiful green eyes (they only recently began to lose their baby blue eyes, so their eye color may end up more yellow as they reach maturity). A little smaller than his brother, Shadow is best told apart by the little "freckle" on his nose. The twins are incredibly sweet and affectionate. They love to frolic and snuggle with people and each other. They are very gentle and tolerate children well (they have been docile and receptive to the unrelenting attention of the two nineyear-old daughters for the last two weeks in their foster home). They immediately purr at first touch and run to greet people. Shadow and Midnight are very social and would do best with a companion or companions. If it is possible for you, please consider adopting Shadow and Midnight as a pair. They share a strong bond. Inseparable and unbelievably cute together, they are truly a matched set in both temperament and appearance!

**Buddy** is a sweet young kitty with "cowcat" black/white markings. He is so proud of his tail because it's particularly fancy! Buddy gets along very well with people, other cats and possibly dogs. He is quite playful and enjoys a good game. But Buddy is also a "cool dude" who can be mellow and just hang out watching TV with you. Buddy would love to be your pal and companion.

Ollie is a two-year-old sweetie who was just rescued out of a Shakey's Pizza parking lot. He was sleeping in a plastic container, set up as shelter by some generous souls who had been feeding him for the last month. A group of us pulled it together this week to take him away from all that, and of course the first thing we did was to get him fixed, as whoever dumped him had *not*. We know Ollie was dumped by an owner and was not a feral kitty cat because he exhibits all the signs of a domestic cat. He loves to cuddle,

purrs up a storm and loves to play with his new gray mouse! He weighs a whopping 13.5 pounds and is solid muscle, but is as sweet as a little lamb! Ollie has tested positive for FIV (feline AIDS). FIV is not a big deal; given proper care and attention, an FIV+ cat will live the same lifespan as an FIV negative cat. The disease is extremely hard to transmit from cat to cat, requiring direct blood contact (typically from a deep puncture wound). It is not transmittable to humans. (There is an excellent link on our website about FIV). Please consider giving this handsome, lovable boy the comfort of your arms and the shelter of your home. He deserves a second chance after being thrown away like garbage! He will bring only joy and happiness to your life!

Suzie is a Lynx Point Siamese mix who was found wandering on a busy street. It was estimated that she was five months old and extremely scared. She was so frightened, her tail seemed like it was glued to her stomach. After a few months, she has come a long way. Suzie is still timid, but she is learning to trust and allows herself to be approached for petting and head scratches. Suzie is becoming a sweet and affectionate kitty as she will even come to you and demand some attention. She still needs to be handled carefully as she will sometimes panic when something (like a loud noise) scares her. Suzie has beautiful markings and alluring blue eyes. With your love and patience, she will be the cat of your dreams.
