EARTHQUAKE UPDATE

At 8:40 PM last night (May 17, 2009) we experienced a 4.7 earthquake centered in the Lennox area. This quake occurred on the Newport/Inglewood fault. This fault is approximately four miles east of Manhattan Beach and is capable of earthquakes in the magnitude range of 6.5. The 1933 Long Beach earthquake magnitude 6.2 also occurred along this fault. In that quake 150 people died and Long Beach suffered significant structural damage and fires.

The earthquake last night caused minor damage in our local communities ranging from items knocked off shelves, broken windows, natural gas and water leaks and falling ceiling tiles. Only 1 minor injury was reported from a person who cut their foot on broken glass from the quake.

This earthquake should serve as an important reminder that we must be vigilant in our efforts to continue to improve our emergency preparedness at home and in our communities. The lessons we have learned over the last year in our exercises and training were implemented last night. The Fire and Police Departments were immediately in the community last night conducting a damage assessment and coordinating that information with Los Angeles County. Fortunately our City did not receive any major damage

We all need to remember, "We Live in Earthquake Country" and Manhattan Beach is between two significant faults, the Newport/ Inglewood fault to the east and the Palos Verdes/Redondo fault to the west.

Additional aftershocks in the magnitude range of the mid 3's can be expected over the next couple of days.
