Catch The Holiday Tamale Trolley



Ask anyone of Latin American descent "Who makes the best tamales in L.A.?" and the answer is always, "Mom." Ask where the second best tamales are found and be prepared for a litany of conflicting answers. Everyone is an expert and everyone has an opinion. The good news is that many of the best tamale sources are in East L.A. and many can be reached by the new Metro Gold Line. Add a couple of buses and you can find a whole bunch more.

Tamale hunting becomes sport this time of year because tamales are a Christmas Eve tradition for thousands of Latin Americans in Los Angeles, as well as others with good taste and imagination.

Typical options include pork in red or green chile sauce, chicken, cheese with strips of

chile and a sweet tamale containing raisins and pineapple.

Order tamales now or face the possibility of disappointment. Lines form at the most popular places and as Christmas draws near and outlets are overbooked, orders are rejected. Two weeks in advance can be cutting it close for advance orders.

If buying more than a few days before serving, wrap the tamales in air-tight, resealable plastic bags and freeze.

Here is a list of Eastside tamales places that are accessible via Metro. They are well regarded, if not unanimously supported, although as we said there is no such thing as unanimous when it comes to the topic: best tamales.
