third woman's Ford Escape, which officers later confirmed.

When officers arrived on scene two women, Amanda and Daphne, were still fighting and officers had to separate them from each other. Daphne was uninjured, although Amanda had minor scrapes on her face and a bruised wrist. An officer reported Amanda also had watery and bloodshot eyes and that a "moderate odor of an alcoholic beverage emitted" from the woman's "breath and person." Amanda said she was drinking throughout the evening.

The third woman, Allison, owned the car which was vandalized but was uninjured in the fracas. Allison told police that Amanda and Daphne were yelling at each other inside her car. She said Amanda called Daphne a name, telling her to get out of the car before she herself exited the vehicle and vandalized it, before engaging Daphne in a fight that included wrestling, punching and hair pulling.

Daphne told police she had been arguing with Amanda because she believed Amanda slept with her boyfriend. She corroborated Allison's story regarding the fighting and vandalism.

Amanda said she had been arguing with an unknown person whose name was censored from the police report. (The police department says it censors records in accordance with state law for reasons such as protecting the privacy of victims and in some cases of ongoing investigations or criminal charges). Amanda said she and an unknown person were arguing throughout the evening and that

the unknown person was accompanied by friends who called her ugly and also called her slurs referring to prostitution. Amanda said she was spat on by someone in the car and that she was attacked by an unknown person. Amanda admitted that her reaction to the alleged abuse was to kick the vehicle.

Neither woman wanted to press charges although officers arrested Amanda on unknown charges. It is unclear as to whether Allison wanted to press charges on Amanda for allegedly damaging her car.

DUDE WHERE'S MY (DAD'S) CAR MONDAY, DECEMBER 7

A nosy Sun reporter was compiling crime reports in the police station lobby early Monday morning when a man came to the station and approached the front desk. The man was overheard asking the front desk attendant if his car was towed sometime between Sunday, December 6th and Monday December 7th in the downtown area. He said he parked it on the street that evening and then "got drunk," leaving it overnight on Manhattan Avenue near Manhattan Beach Boulevard rather than irresponsibly driving home. "I parked my car last night and I came down to get it and its not there," he said. The man said he couldn't remember the exact location where he parked the vehicle but said that it was near "a market" and that his dad owned the car. It is unclear what the person at the front desk told him, but the young man was heard breathing an audible sigh of dismay as he left the station shortly after.
