City Council Recap: Audit Shows City Financial Statements to be Sound

In a verbal report to the El Segundo City Council on Tuesday night, Mark Davis from Mayer Hoffman McCann recapped the results of his firm's recent independent audit of the City's comprehensive annual financial report and its fund financial statements, schedules and agreements. Financial audits are reviews of a company's or other organization's financial statements resulting in the release of an independent opinion on the accuracy and relevancy of those statements. Other than identifying a few minor issues, the opinion of the firm was that the City's financial statements are "sound and based on good rationale."

Davis noted that the only difficulty in the process was that City staff hadn't pulled all its information together on time and that it took three attempts before the audit could start. Mayer Hoffman McCann completed its field work in March. The firm recommended a couple of adjustments that were considered "immaterial," so City staff opted not to record those. Otherwise, Davis reported "no disagreements with management" and that there was no need "to seek a second opinion on how certain financial transactions should be recorded." Meanwhile, the firm plans to send staff a separate communication to identify potential internal control issue and opportunities for improvement.

Beauty and the Beach Set for June 13

During a proclamation accepted by El Segundo Power, LLC representative Steve Odabashian and family, Mayor Pro Tem Eric Busch announced Saturday, June 13 as Beauty and the Beach Day in El Segundo. The event, which will take place from 10 a.m. to noon that morning, provides an opportunity for community volunteers to join El Segundo Power employees and El Segundo Kiwanis Club members in cleaning up all the debris along the shore from Grand Avenue south to 45th Street. Calling the quality of Santa Monica Bay beaches of "paramount concern" to El Segundo residents

for "economic, aesthetic and environmental reasons," Busch encouraged local citizens to stop by, "do a good thing," and enjoy lunch afterwards provided by power plant staff. Participants will also receive T-shirts.

Consent Agenda Highlights

The Council unanimously approved all consent agenda items on Tuesday, including official adoption of the new downtown ordinance allowing temporary outdoor dining and special event sale retail uses for businesses that lease permit spaces in the structure at Richmond Street and Grand Avenue, as well as payment plans for property/business owners who buy into the downtown in-lieu parking program. The payment plans allow the costs of the spaces (priced at \$17,500, with standard interest rates tacked on) to be spread out over a 20-year period. City officials hope downtown property owners who were previously reluctant to pay lump sum in-lieu fees or could not provide on-site parking will now be more apt to participate in the program.

Also of note, the Council authorized City Manager Jack Wayt to proceed with a three-year lease agreement to move the City's Residential Sound Insulation (RSI) offices and its five staff members out of cramped quarters in City Hall and across the street to a spacious, 1,600-square foot space at 333 Main Street. The annual cost for the lease will be \$40,000 with a fiscal impact of \$7,000 on the current year's budget. The City has the right to opt out of the agreement after the first year.

On a related note, the Council awarded three construction contracts to Professional Building Contractors, Inc. to move forward with sound insulation work on 84 El Segundo homes. Said homes are in Groups 32, 33 and 36. Total construction costs for all the work will be approximately \$2.3 million. The City's goal is to finish insulation work on 300 homes per year (12 groups of 25 homes). Construction proceeds year-round with the exception of the period between
