City Preps for Hall of Fame, Good Neighbors Day

Nothing says "summertime" quite like The Beach Boys; and this year, the iconic surf rock band will be inducted into the Hawthorne Hall of Fame. It is just one of many events the Hawthorne Historical Society has planned for the community this summer.

In addition to the Beach Boys, daredevil BASE jumper Carl Beonish, community servant Reese Walton, and "The World's Greatest Athlete" Jim Thorpe will also be honored at a banquet held at the Memorial Center on July 17. Tickets for the event are \$30 per person and are available via the Hawthorne Museum.

"We have a list of roughly 90 people and we pick about five a year," Hawthorne Historical Society president Thierry Lubenec said of the banquet which began last year. "We chose the people that we felt had the most impact to the city of Hawthorne. We have so many people to choose from that have done something for the city to help benefit it."

The Beach Boys have long held a place of reverence in the city, with the former location of Brian Wilson's childhood home on 119th Street designated as a state landmark. The actual home was demolished in 2003 in order to make way for construction of the 105 Freeway.

Meanwhile, Thorpe's legacy with the South Bay and Hawthorne in particular are deeply rooted. The two-time gold medal winning Olympic decathlon athlete and football great lived in Hawthorne from 1946-1949 while working with a paint crew for Standard Oil. As Thorpe put it then, "Can't keep the wife and kids in food on ancient glory."

Thorpe, a member of the Sac and Fox Native American tribe, also played professional baseball and basketball and remained active in the Native American community by playing a lead role in a 1935 celebration and parade in Hawthorne that attracted members from more than 100 different tribes.

"I think Jim Thorpe is just more a celebration

of the fact that he lived and let everybody know that he hung out here for a few years," city clerk and Historical Society member Norb Huber said.

In 1974, two decades after his death, the city of Hawthorne named a park on Prairie Avenue just north of Rosecrans in his honor. At the time of the park naming, Thorpe's wife was working at City Hall.

Among the other two inductees, Boenish is considered by many as the father of modern BASE jumping and was also a freefall cinematographer.

"I don't know if too many people know that he was pretty famous," Huber said. "We had a friend who alerted us that Carl was a pretty well-known guy. We hadn't selected him at first."

Boenish was killed in a BASE jump off the Troll Wall in Norway in 1984 and is the subject of the critically acclaimed 2014 documentary movie *Sunshine Superman*.

"Carl was unique in what he did and he comes from Hawthorne," Lubenec said as he explained why the society ended up adding him to the list of this year's inductees.

The fourth member of the Hall of Fame induction, Reese Walton, was designated by the Hawthorne City Council in 1983 to be their ambassador to the 1984 Summer Olympic Games in Los Angeles. An estimated 50,000 people cheered Walton on as he carried the Olympic Torch down Hawthorne Boulevard just hours before the opening ceremony for the games in the L.A. Coliseum.

"Reese fit the role model we look for probably more than the other inductees," Huber said. "He may not be world famous, like the Beach Boys, but he was a true part of the community."

In addition to the human inductees, the Historical Society also includes one business each year. This year's inductee will be Seers Lumber, which began in Hawthorne in the 1930s and has been family owned and operated

ever since.

Located on El Segundo Boulevard and Cordary Avenue, the business has been operating in the same location for three generations and, as the Historical Society puts it, "have kept the same customer friendly and community oriented spirit going for close to 80 years."

The day after the Hall of Fame induction will be the annual Good Neighbors Day street fair. Now in its fifth year, the community event held at the civic center will take place on July 18 and feature three bands performing as well as the annual car show early in the morning.

"About the same time I came on as city clerk, this idea generated a bit from the annual parade that the city had," Huber said. "When Walt Dixon passed away, this Historical Society formed and we were looking for an event that we could put on and do it totally away from the city funds."

The event began when one of the original Beach Boys, David Marks, reached out to say that he wanted to do a guitar seminar over at Hawthorne High School.

"It went well enough the first time that we been able to continue to do it," Huber said. "Now, instead of having it at Hawthorne High, we've moved it over to here."

While the event is free for the community to attend, the Historical Society raises funds through vendor booths and a car show entry fee. Owners of cars from 1975 or older are invited to participate in the show which includes trophies and a goodie bag for the first 50 entrants.

Interested car owners may pick up an entry form from the Historical Society (located across the parking lot from the Hawthorne Library). The building is open Tuesdays and Saturdays from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m.

"We have a celebration, people show up, we have good entertainment, a car show, a decent dinner, and time to enjoy the community," Huber said. •

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<u>Film Review</u>

Cartel Land is a Chilling, Visceral Look At Seeking Justice in the Face of Evil

A great argument in favor of nonfiction storytelling is that often times the truth is even stranger than anything conjured in

Autodefensas start out as a small uprising of citizens who know that they can't rely on the police to stop the cartels, so they take matters into their own hands. As we watch the

fiction. Sundance alum Cartel Land, executive produced by Kathryn Bigelow (The Hurt Locker, Zero Dark Thirty), is one such documentary as it follows two different sides of the undeniably crooked war on drugs in Mexico.

The film's first few minutes show images and situations that seem unbelievable; a mass funeral for an entire group of innocent people who were murdered by the elusive cartels is a harsh reality check of the casualties of this endless war. This also serves as a signal to the audience that we are in for an education unlike anything we knew before.

The cartels are introduced as powerful outsiders and are seldom shown onscreen. Instead, the focus of the film will be on groups of people who are taking matters into their own hands: when the government can't protect the people, who will?

We get two different answers from both sides of the US-Mexico border. The first is an American vigilante border patrol organization called Arizona Border Recon, who is full of bigotry and misguided law. Their leader Tim Foley, known as "Nailer," is hardly a representation of good morals, yet is the tamest in this terrifyingly bloodthirsty group of American self-proclaimed soldiers.

On the Mexican side (though over 1,000 miles from the border, deep into its own country of Michoacán) is an anti-cartel volunteer group known as the Autodefensas, led by a charismatic, spirited leader named Jose Manuel Mireles, or "El Doctor." The organization expand and gain power, inevitably it becomes more difficult to maintain and corruption naturally cracks into all levels.

The reason these stories are so compelling is because of the level of access that director Matthew Heineman has gained. Many documentaries lose attention when the most dramatic moments are happening off-screen. Heineman has miraculously managed to be right alongside numerous firefights, protests, and intimate conversations that immerse the viewer into the tense situation at hand.

The primary characters are shown onscreen without us being told who is trustworthy and who isn't, and as we see more information, it becomes even clearer how impossible it is to trust anyone involved in this situation.

By the time the film is over, you will have a new understanding of just how deep-seated the corruption in these wars has become. What is more baffling, and another reason why this is essential viewing, is that these stories (like many of global importance) are being ignored by mainstream media in all likelihood because of how unbelievable they are.

Cartel Land is a movie that inspires the viewer to think a little more carefully about what types of leaders are trustworthy, and exposes a horrific truth with humane precision that would otherwise by brushed over by mainstream media.

New Horizons Spacecraft Prepares for Encounter

In a long series of images obtained by New Horizons' telescopic Long Range Reconnaissance Imager (LORRI) between May 29 and June 19, Pluto and its largest moon, Charon, appear to more than double in size. From this rapidly improving imagery, scientists on the New Horizons team have found that the "close approach hemisphere" on Pluto that New Horizons will fly over has the greatest variety of terrain types seen on the planet so far. They have also discovered that Charon has a "dark pole"—a mysterious dark region that forms a kind of anti-polar cap.

"This system is just amazing," said Alan Stern, New Horizons Principal Investigator, from the Southwest Research Institute, Boulder, Colorado. "The science team is just ecstatic with what we see on Pluto's close approach hemisphere: Every terrain type we see on the planet—including both the brightest and darkest surface areas—are represented there, it's a wonderland!

"And about Charon—wow—I don't think anyone expected Charon to reveal a mystery like dark terrains at its pole," he continued. "Who ordered that?"

"The unambiguous detection of bright and dark terrain units on both Pluto and Charon indicates a wide range of diverse landscapes across the pair," said science team co-investigator and imaging lead Jeff Moore, of NASA Ames Research Center, Mountain View, California. "For example, the bright fringe we see on Pluto may represent frost deposited from an evaporating polar cap, which is now in summer sun."

Griffith Observatory to Celebrate First Encounter With Pluto

On July 14, after a journey of 10 years and three billion miles, NASA's New Horizons

spacecraft will make the first-ever close encounter with Pluto. What can we expect from New Horizons as it ventures past the mysterious dwarf planet? A good way to find out is to come to Los Angeles' Griffith Observatory, which will host several activities to celebrate the New Horizons encounter with Pluto. All events are free and open to the public.

Tuesday, July 14, 2015 – Live Pluto Flyby. Includes twenty-minute talks on Pluto and New Horizons, presented hourly (1:00 - 5:00 p.m. PDT); NASA-TV coverage of the New Horizons flyby with commentary by Griffith Observatory staff (5:00 - 7:00 p.m. PDT); signal from New Horizons confirms the spacecraft's safe passage through the Pluto system (6:02 p.m. PDT); a presentation by Griffith Observatory staff about the New Horizons mission and recap of the evening's events (7:30 - 8:30 p.m. PDT, streamed live on GriffithTV); and the Observatory and Griffith Park close as usual (10:00 p.m. PDT).

Friday, July 17, 2015 – All Pluto Considered. Griffith Observatory Curator Dr. Laura Danly and Griffith Observatory Director Dr. E. C. Krupp show the latest images of Pluto from New Horizons and illustrate Pluto's impact on culture from its discovery until now. (7:30 - 8:45 p.m. PDT; streamed live on GriffithTV)

English skill levels and set up on-site training. Since September, the affected employees have been attending Business English classes three days a week with several of those individuals now being considered for promotions.

Recruitment assistance, pre-screening of applicants, On-The-Job training and Transitional Subsidized Employment (TSE) are other programs available to local companies and small businesses.

The SBWIB also prepares youth for entry into the workforce by emphasizing education and services that promote relevant workplace skills and experiences leading to industry-recognized credentials and career pathway employment, including apprenticeships. Special emphasis is aimed at the reengagement of disconnected youth through intervention and prevention services.

The SBWIB is one of the highest performing Workforce Investment Boards (WIB) in the state and is often recognized by the California Workforce Investment Board (CWIB) for its achievements.

Continuous collaborations with business, economic development, education, government, labor and community organizations, helps the SBWIB provide a dynamic, efficient and effective workforce development system, ensuring a skilled workforce and vibrant economy in the South Bay Area.

Dropped Fly Ball, Walk-off Homer Sink Holly Park

Last Sunday's winner's bracket semifinal of the District 37 Major Little League Baseball featured a match-up between two teams that blew away the rest of the field by mercy rules in earlier games.

Holly Park was pitted against a host Westchester team that outscored its first three opponents by a combined total score of 70-6, an average of more than 23 runs per game and two of those went a minimum four innings and another in five last Sunday at Carl Nielsen Youth Sports Park in Westchester. Holly Park, though, outscored its first two opponents (Lawndale and Hawthorne Wiseburn) by a combined total score of 36-3, an average of 18 runs.

With Paco Orozc on the mound, he surrendered two hits, then Myles Smith slapped a fly ball over the right field fence for a walk-off three-run home run and Westchester moved on to the championship round, which started on Wednesday at Nielsen Park, with a 5-2 win.

Looking back to the bottom of the third inning with Holly Park ahead 1-0, a dropped fly ball by the center fielder after seemingly making a good catch enabled Westchester to score two runs and take a 2-1 lead.

Holly Park came back to tie the game at two when Julian Francious hit a sacrifice fly to score Martin Palazo from third base.

"They (Westchester) haven't seen good pitching," Holly Park manager Kail Rouston said. "We hope to have another shot at them on Wednesday. Our defense was solid but the dropped fly ball was the ball game."

Orozc singled home Palazo to give Holly Park the lead in the first. Holly Park played Del Rey in the loser's bracket final on Tuesday in quest for a rematch with Westchester a day later. If Holly Park won both of those games, a second game will be played at Nielsen Park today at 7 p.m.

PIERCE SIGNS WITH CLIPPERS

Former Inglewood High boys' basketball standout Paul Pierce returns to Los Angeles as he signed a three-year, \$10.5 million deal with the Clippers on July 1.

Pierce will re-unite with his long time former head coach Doc Rivers, who he played 14 seasons with when they were with the Boston Celtics, beginning the following season.

After a blockbuster trade, the Clippers had that sent coach Rivers from the Celtics, who he coached and Pierce played on their 2007-08 season that saw Boston win the National Basketball Association championship over the L.A. Lakers, following the 2012-13 season, Pierce was traded with teammate Kevin Garnett to the Brooklyn Nets. Pierce played two seasons with Brooklyn before being playing last year with the Washington Wizards.

At 37 years old, Pierce helped the Wizards to their best season in several years although he averaged a career-low 11.9 points and playing a career-low average of 26.2 minutes. Throughout his 17-year career, Pierce averaged 20.7 points and 5.8 rebounds per contest. He was known very well for his strong defensive plays.

Pierce is a 10-time NBA all-star. He graduated from Inglewood High in 1995 and

played three seasons with the University of Kansas before being drafted by the Celtics in 1998.

As a junior at Inglewood in the 1993-94 season, Pierce, who turns 38 before the start of next season in late October, he keyed the Sentinels to the CIF-Southern Section Division IIAA championship and the Southern California Regional Division II semifinals where they fell to East Bakersfield. As a senior in 1994-95, Pierce keyed Inglewood to the Division IIAA semifinals where it fell to Compton Dominguez.


Pierce had his number 34 at Inglewood retired a few years ago.
