City Honors Airship Pilots as Officers of the Month

Hawthorne Police Chief Robert Fager presented two airship pilots with Police Officers of the Month honors and also introduced the newest captain to the force at the Hawthorne City Council Meeting on May 24.

Pilots Matthew Manley and Athanasios Megas were honored by the department for their part in helping lead to the capture of three robbery suspects.

On Jan. 13, detectives from the Hawthorne Police Department's Narcotics Unit worked a joint narcotics investigation with members of the Asuza Police Department, the DEA, and other members in the city of Corona. Also assisting in the operation were Manley and Megas who piloted Airship 55.

During the evening hours of the investigation, detectives were led to a shopping center at the intersection on Citrus Avenue and Foothill Boulevard in the city of Fontana. While undercover detectives were monitoring the shopping center as part of the narcotics investigation, an Asuza police department detective notified officers that he was witnessing three people running through an adjacent parking lot.

The three subjects were wearing masks and one of them was carrying a large bag. The detective also said that he believed one of them was carrying a handgun. Airship 55 which was overhead monitoring the narcotics investigation, also witnessed the three subjects running and diverted their attention to them.

"Air 55 monitored the subjects as they ran through an adjacent neighborhood and into an awaiting getaway car," Fager said. "It was soon learned from arriving Fontana police that a takeover robbery of a pharmacy had just occurred and the three were responsible."

After tracking the vehicle for several miles, Megas was able to make contact with another law enforcement helicopter in the area and relay the circumstances. As Megas was communicating with that air unit, Manley was broadcasting the direction of travel and road conditions to

arriving police units on the ground.

Eventually, the tracking responsibilities were handed off to a Fontana airship that arrived on scene.

"The accuracy of both Megas' and Manley's radio transmissions of where the suspect vehicle was located allowed the Fontana PD to locate and stop the vehicle," Fager said.

The suspects failed to stop and led Fontana police officers on a high speed chase ultimately ending in the city of San Bernardino with the suspect vehicle ramming a Fontana police car.

While the three suspects attempted to flee on foot, two of them were arrested immediately and one remained outstanding inside a containment area. A search of the crash that night netted a handgun as well as miscellaneous items from the business that was robbed.

"Fontana officers that were at the scene as well as the detectives following up the investigation praised the work that Air 55 did in this investigation and acknowledged that it would have been unlikely to capture any of the suspects had it not been for their quick response and work," Fager said. "This incident showcases the professionalism of the Air 55 flight crew and highlights the value of the eyes in the sky."

Fager stated that he wanted to emphasize that, "crime knows no borders. So to some of the community members hearing this, some first reaction might be, 'Why were they so far away?' and 'Why were they in Fontana?' and that's kind of the reality that from time to time gets lost in television shows. There is no perimeter to criminal nature, so a lot of the narcotics trafficking and street level abuses in criminalities that occur in our region have roots to multiple counties as well as different national borders."

Manley has been with the police department for 19 years. He started out in 1996 in the Traffic Bureau as a parking enforcement officer. In 1999, he was hired on as a police officer and worked on patrol for five years. He is a recipient of the South Bay Distinguished Service Award in 2004 for his performance during an

incident involving an armed suspect who was firing upon him and fellow officers.

After five years on patrol, Manley took a position as a Field Training Officer where he trained numerous Hawthorne police recruits. In 2007, he took a job in the air unit as a tactical flight officer and a year later was honored as Officer of the Month. In 2014, Manley became Hawthorne's first, full-time, sworn pilot and has also been a member of the city's SWAT team for the past four years.

"During his time in air support he has been a part of a team that has built a successful, safe, and efficient unit," Fager said.

Megas has been a helicopter pilot for the Hawthorne Police Department for 11 years however he was a full-time police officer for the Long Beach Police Department for 24 years and retired from there last year. During his time at Long Beach, Megas was a tactical flight officer and pilot in their air support for more than 18 years. Prior to his police career, Megas served in the U.S. Marine Corps where he was a graduate from Army Ranger School.

Fager also introduced the newest captain to the Hawthorne Police Department, Julian Catano. Catano has been with the Hawthorne Police Department since 1993.

"I've had the honor, privilege, and fun of working with Julian over the years in many capacities," Fager said. "His experience ranges from patrol services and investigations with a high degree of competency in narcotics investigations. He has experience running task force operations for us and was a K-9 handler at one point for narcotic detection."

Catano has also run various units with the department on his rise to his new rank.

"Our focus in the police department is to always put a high degree of what I call, 'civic value.' It's really getting a police department that is not just going to be an expected public safety component but it's going to give something to our community that makes them want to rally around the men and women who do a very, very difficult." •

In the southbound direction for the construction of additional right turn lane toward Marine Ave. The work consists of excavation and removal of existing pavement, concrete and asphalt paving, construction of curb and gutter, sidewalks, driveways, retaining walls, storm drain, raised medians and ADA ramps. Looking Up

Planet 1,200 Light-Years Away Is Good Prospect for a Habitable World

A distant planet known as Kepler-62f could be habitable, a team of astronomers reports.

The planet, which is about 1,200 light-years from Earth in the direction of the constellation Lyra, is approximately 40 percent larger than Earth. At that size, Kepler-62f is within the range of planets that are likely to be rocky and possibly could have oceans, said Aomawa Shields, the study's lead author and a National Science Foundation astronomy and astrophysics postdoctoral fellow in UCLA's department of physics and astronomy.

NASA's Kepler mission discovered the planetary system that includes Kepler-62f in 2013, and it identified Kepler-62f as the outermost of five planets orbiting a star that is smaller and cooler than the sun. But the mission didn't produce information about Kepler-62f's composition or atmosphere or the shape of its orbit.

Shields collaborated on the study with astronomers Rory Barnes, Eric Agol, Benjamin Charnay, Cecilia Bitz and Victoria Meadows, all of the University of Washington, where Shields earned her doctorate. To determine whether the planet could sustain life, the team came up with possible scenarios about what its atmosphere might be like and what the shape of its orbit might be.

"We found there are multiple atmospheric compositions that allow it to be warm enough to have surface liquid water," Shields said. "This makes it a strong candidate for a habitable planet."

On Earth, carbon dioxide makes up 0.04 percent of the atmosphere. Because Kepler-62f is much farther away from its star than Earth is from the Sun, it would need to have dramatically more carbon dioxide to be warm enough to maintain liquid water

on its surface.

The team ran computer simulations based on Kepler-62f having:

An atmosphere that ranges in thickness from the same as Earth's all the way up to 12 times thicker.

Various concentrations of carbon dioxide in its atmosphere, ranging from the same amount as is in the Earth's atmosphere up to 2,500 times that level. Several different possible orbital paths.

Shields said that for the planet to be habitable throughout its entire year, it would require an atmosphere that is three to five times thicker than Earth's and composed entirely of carbon dioxide. (This would be analogous to replacing every molecule in Earth's atmosphere with carbon dioxide, which means that the planet would have 2,500 times more carbon dioxide than we have.)

"But if it doesn't have a mechanism to generate lots of carbon dioxide in its atmosphere to keep temperatures warm, and all it had was an Earth-like amount of carbon dioxide, certain orbital configurations could allow Kepler-62f's surface temperatures to temporarily get above freezing during a portion of its year," she said. "And this might help melt ice sheets formed at other times in the planet's orbit."

The research is published online in the journal *Astrobiology*.

Shields earned a master's degree in acting from UCLA and worked as an actor. In January 2015, she founded Rising Stargirls, a program that teaches middle school-aged girls of color about astronomy and astrobiology using theater, writing and visual art. Working hard is nothing new for Hawthorne Math & Science Academy seniors Johann Webb and Isaac Gorgy: 4.0 GPAs, Advanced Placement courses and volunteering for various activities are just some of the accolades on their high school record. Recently added to that list are recipients of the Gates Millennium Scholarship.

"I wasn't expecting to get it at all; I had a certain percent chance that I wasn't going to get this scholarship," Gorgy said. "There are so many people that applied, so why would they chose me? It is hard to describe but it was something that I never imagine getting it."

Funded through a \$1.6 billion donation from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, the GMS was awarded to 1,000 high school seniors throughout the United States. The scholarship, which aims to promote "academic excellence and to provide an opportunity for outstanding minority students with significant financial need to reach their highest potential" funds the undergraduate, graduate and even Ph.D education of the recipients. The demanding application process was something that Gorgy and Webb expected but admit that applying for this scholarship was unlike applying for any other scholarship.

"It [GMS] was not something that was unknown to us but our counselor, Ms. Bui, brought it to us and said that we should really

apply," Webb said. "She mentioned how they really stressed volunteering so we had to make sure to prepare for that, as well as the eight essays that they required: there were eight essays and I had probably written that many applying to colleges."

With the help of their counselor Julia Bui, the two young academics went step-by-step through the application process, multiple times, ensuring that no detail was missed while simultaneously encouraging the two seniors to keep pushing forward.

"Before speaking to Ms. Bui I didn't think this scholarship was something tangible for people like us, but she stressed it, she gave us the prompts and vetted us through it," said Gorgy. "It was definitely overwhelming. Looking at the prompt you realize how much they require of you and at one time I did think it was too much and that I probably wouldn't get it but I had so many people supporting me that I kept me going."

After submitting the application in January both students went on with other senior-year activities, including applying for additional scholarships for financial assistance. It wasn't until March that they learned they had been selected as finalist to receive the scholarship.

"That is when I thought I really had a chance at this and that I could be set for life," Webb said.

In April the two busy teens received the package that would change their lives in the mail.

"I was at home and I don't remember if I had a good or bad day but I had a really bad headache," Webb, who is planning to attend UC San Diego to major in engineering, said. "I was lying down in bed and was trying to go to sleep but my sister was bugging me. She then said 'some mail from the gates millennial scholarship came' to which I said okay but she told me it was a package. At that point my headache started to go away."

Both students were spending time and energy applying for other scholarships but now that's over.

"I was walking home from school. My parents saw the envelope and didn't want to open it so they left it for me on the table to see when I walked in," Gorgy, who will attend UCLA to major in Biology, said. "I think they had a feeling what it was since it was a fancy and very professional envelope. Opening it was the ultimate ecstasy. It was a feeling you can't describe. I thought I would scream at the top of my lungs but I was speechless."

In addition to the financial amenities, the scholarship connects the students to a community of scholars so that they do not just become college students going through the motions. The network of fellow academics

that they are connected to is expected to tailor leaders that engage in activities beyond academics.

"It [GMS] lets you focus on your education because now you don't have to worry about money, a job; your focus is on your goal," Gorgy said. "That is the most incredible part about this scholarship."

Both students acknowledged that without the impact of HMSA, its teachers and counselors, their accomplishments would not have been possible.

"You could teach yourself if you have that inner motivation and it can take you far but there is no substitute for a good teacher," Webb said. "This school is full of great teachers. They are inspirational themselves and come with great backgrounds."

In order to apply for the scholarship a student must have a nominator and recommender who are asked extensive questions, with much detail.

"Without my nominator and recommender, I would not have applied at all. Ms. Bui, our counselor, and Ms. Sharp, my world history teacher, were my biggest influences in participating," Gorgy said. "I genuinely would not have applied if it weren't for them and their constant encouragement. The spotlight is on us but the credit is all theirs because I owe it all to them." •

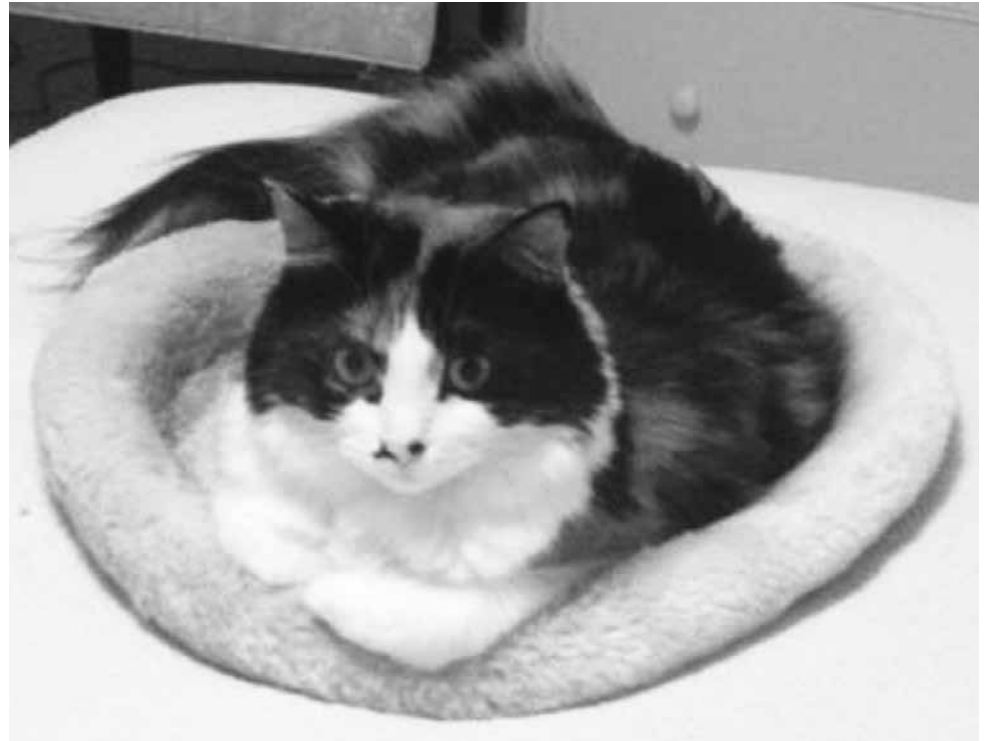
foster mother picked up off the street. Dolly is a sweetheart and very entertaining as well as being a wonderful companion and playmate to her foster kitty sisters.
