Pullen-Miles Takes His Role as Mentor Like a True Father Figure

Lawndale Mayor Robert Pullen-Miles books a casual photo shoot and makes plans to take along his youngest daughter, a budding photographer. Sienna, 10, will get to snap a few shots under the watchful eye of a professional photographer, who just happens to be the mayor's neighbor.

The mayor is big on this type of mentoring. In fact, he has emerged as a go-to advisor for a number of local women in their political careers. Pullen-Miles says this penchant for mentoring female candidates developed organically. "When I first started in politics, most of the people who helped me along the way were women," said Pullen-Miles. He mentions Gardena civic leaders Laverne Knight and Ethel Barnes as early advisors.

He spent seven years under the tutelage of the late Jenny Oropeza, a beloved local leader. "I had the opportunity to work for her in the assembly and the senate," he said. "I was on her staff when I ran for Lawndale [City Council].

He says moving from staff to an elected office widened his perspective. "A lot of my support came from women... so when other people came on the scene, I gravitated to them naturally," said Pullen-Miles. I didn't come into it saying, 'I'm going to help women.' It just shaped up that way."

Indeed, Pullen-Miles' influence has helped shape the careers of a number of local women in all facets of political engagement. Melissa Ramoso, a councilmember in the city of Artesia, says his friendship was really inspiring in her early campaign. "When I first ran five years ago, he came to my kick-off," she said.

It's very supportive to have a colleague come out for you like that."

"She's a go-getter," said Pullen-Miles. Ramoso was unsuccessful in her first council bid, but Pullen-Miles had her back. "We knew she just needed to hang in there. What I admired about her, she's a fighter. She didn't give up."

Ramoso was elected to the Artesia City Council last year in an historic bid, as the first woman on the board. After a career spanning 14 years at the federal and state level, Pullen-Miles said he always knew Ramoso would be an elected official.

Ramoso added that Pullen-Miles is always available when she needs advice. "I have known him to be personable and knowledgeable in our field of public service," she said. "He is always willing to help you find a solution to any issue at hand."

Christina Carroll, a recent Lawndale transplant, is just beginning her civic career. A true "military brat," she was born on a naval base in Portsmouth, Virginia. Pullen-Miles appointed Carroll to Lawndale's Parks and Recreation Commission after seeing her at community events. He said Carroll's energy and personality are a perfect fit for that committee. "It puts you directly into the community," he said.

Pullen-Miles believes Carrol has the right composure to eventually hold public office. "She's another young woman who is very tenacious," he said. "She's taken a leadership role on the commission. While she's figuring out what she wants to do, I've told her to just enjoy the journey."

City commissioners in Lawndale serve in volunteer positions, as does the mayor. Carroll juggles various paying gigs around the South Bay, including hosting duties at several restaurants.

Pullen-Miles holds a full-time staff position as the district director for Assemblywoman Autumn Burke. It's in this capacity that he met yet another mentee, Inglewood School Board member Dionne Faulk. Ms. Faulk was working with Burke's staff when she met Pullen-Miles. They've been friends ever since, he said, consulting back and forth on special projects and important events to attend.

Already super engaged in the community, Faulk had experience working with unions, sororities and the national education organization, Jack and Jill of America, Inc. She sat on the advisory board for Measure GG. That successful initiative brought \$90 million in state funded new construction and modernization projects for Inglewood schools. Prior to that, Faulk was employed for over 13 years at the Consumer Affairs Department, in the Bureau of Real Estate.

Having lost her first election for Inglewood School Board, Ms. Faulk had something in common with Ms. Ramoso. She also turned to Mayor Pullen-Miles for advice. "The mayor recommended events, activities and to-do tasks to enhance my political knowledge and experience," said Faulk. "He walked the district with me when I was campaigning. He has always been very supportive."

With her two children attending Inglewood schools, Faulk knew she wanted to be in a position to make change. "I wanted to help make the schools better. I thought, what better way to get involved with the district," said Faulk.

Facing the Music in David Crosby: Remember My Name


How is David Crosby still alive? The mystery of how the singer has conquered drug addiction, multiple health scares, jail time and heartbreak will undoubtedly draw fans to *David Crosby: Remember My Name*. Confronting his mortality, Crosby, 77 – previously part of two supergroups The Byrds and Crosby, Stills & Nash (and sometimes Young) – is here to make peace and offer something of a mea culpa.

Director A.J. Eaton's documentary opens with Crosby sprawled on the couch, therapystyle, humorously recounting a drug-addled encounter with legendary jazz musician John Coltrane in the bathroom at one of the saxophonist's gigs. But Crosby isn't here to dish about his famous friends.Instead, he focuses on making amends to his family, both biological and musical.

On the receiving end of Crosby's warts-and-all confessions is *Almost Famous* writer, director, and rock journalist Cameron Crowe, who was drafted by Eaton to coax the talkative Crosby into baring his soul. There is a lot to cover besides

Crosby's rock 'n roll stardom, including his arrest on weapons and drug charges in the 1980s, and his 32-year marriage to adoring wife Jan Dance -- also a recovering addict.

One foot in the past and the other in the present, the time not with Crowe is spent on a road trip with Crosby driving to pivotal places along his musical superhighway.

These include stops on the Sunset Strip, a reluctant trip up Laurel Canyon, and to Kent State, Ohio.

Despite all the fertile material, *Remember My Name* may disappoint some by what's omitted: Major life events don't even garner a mention, including Crosby's liver transplant in 1994 that occurred within months of his reunion with a son who was given up for adoption 32 years prior. Crosby also served as the sperm donor for singer Melissa Etheridge, resulting in two more children. Crosby's complicated family tree could be a movie itself.

At the film's end, you're left to decide how you feel about Crosby and whether he's sufficiently made amends. Indeed, of all the recent music films that came out this year capturing the 1970s musical landscape -- from Amazing Grace to Echo in the Canyon -- the one that Remember My Name shares a common lineage is, bear with me, the over-the-top biopic Rocketman. Crosby and Elton John burned bright in the 1970s and went down strikingly similar paths. Both speak of their loveless fathers and find solace and redemption through music. Both men achieve massive stardom and succumb to drug addiction before coming out the other side.

These films ask us to either empathize with or at the very least better tolerate the havoc their subjects wreaked (on themselves and others.) Whereas *Rocketman* concludes with a montage of John's triumphs since sobriety, we're just grateful at the end of *Remember My Name* that Crosby is alive to sing another day. That, the filmmakers seem to say, is enough. •

Now known as the Hahn Co., the San Diego-based firm owns and operates 53 shopping malls totaling 40 million square feet of retail space. Half of the Hahn centers are located in California and include Palm Desert Town Center in Palm Desert, Fox Hills Mall in Culver City, The Oaks in Thousand Oaks, Los Cerritos Center in Cerritos and Horton Plaza in San Diego. Ernest was the best at selling his projects to prospective tenants and civic leaders. He was a hard man to say no to. As we know too well, some malls have not changed with the times and some have closed. We all have been hoping for the past twenty years that someone like Mr. Hahn would come along with a vision and a passion to make things happen at the site of our Hawthorne Mall. Council Preps for National Night Out, Announces Trash Program

During a brief meeting Tuesday night, the Hawthorne City Council began gearing up for National Night Out in two weeks. National Night Out will take place on Aug. 6 from 6 p.m. to 9 p.m. at Memorial Park. The annual event is a community-building campaign that promotes police-community partnerships and neighborhood camaraderie. The goal of the event is to enhance the relationship between neighbors and law enforcement while also fostering a true sense of community. "I want to thank the Hawthorne Police Department," Mayor Pro Tem Olivia Valentine, who spearheaded the event, said. "They are the stars of the show."

The event takes place nationally in all 50 states on the first Tuesday of every August when neighborhoods host block parties, festivals, parades, cookouts and other various community events with safety demonstrations, youth seminars and visits from emergency personnel. "Our city's event will include food, music, games and prizes," City Clerk Dr. Paul Jimenez said.

The Hawthorne Police Department also received a grant from local businesses for serving the community. The money, which was presented by Councilman Alex Monteiro to Police Chief Mike Ishii, will be put to use in the department's K-9 Unit and community outreach programs.

Hawthorne skipped National Night Out last year to focus on budget issues, among other things. With the future of Hawthorne looking much brighter, the City is once again participating in the community-building event. Sponsors for the event include Republic Services, Courtyard by Marriott, Townplace Suites by Marriott, the various neighborhood associations throughout

Hawthorne, and the Recreation and Community Services Department.

"I also want to thank all of the communities that have come out and expressed an interest in having National Night Out again," Valentine said. "It looks like we're going to have quite a large contingent of communities participating." Memorial Park is located at 3901 West El Segundo Boulevard.

Another new program that the City began on July 1 was for the new bulky trash pickup. Each multi-family building that has more than five units and each residential customer is entitled to the collection of up to 20 total bulky items per calendar year for free. Bulky trash includes furniture, trash and electronic waste. Customers will still need to provide the City's contracted hauler Republic Services with one calendar day's advanced notice to schedule a pickup and are asked to schedule pickups in groups of a maximum of five items at a time.

There are a couple of other additional conditions to the bulky trash program. No single item that cannot be handled by two workers will be accepted. Items will also not be removed from car ports, parking lots or subterranean parking structures and there will be no pickup for hazardous materials such as motor oil or anti-freeze.

Those customers who exceed the number of free pickups may still receive bulky item pickup, but there will be a fee charged. Residents may call Republic Services at 1-888-742-5234 for more information and also to schedule their bulky trash pickup. Per Hawthorne municipal code, it is against the law to allow waste to collect on or in front of your property and failure to comply may result in fines.

Pullen-Miles

Ms. Faulk had to get engaged with the community even more. "I had all the makings of a great campaign, including the support of local officials," she said. "But I needed to focus on engaging the voters." That made the difference. She was elected to the board in 2017.

Pullen-Miles describes Faulk as "focused." He says she is especially in tune with the community. "She has the children of Inglewood at heart and wants to do other things in the community," he said. "I definitely see her in elected office, at the city council or state level."

Praise for the mayor and his leadership style is equally magnanimous. Faulk says the mayor surprises people. "He appears to be unassuming, but he is strategic and all of his moves are calculated," said Faulk. "His personality is to quietly work hard to accomplish his goals and when no one is paying attention, he surprises everyone."

Faulk says the mayor's support makes a difference navigating the political terrain of a historically male-dominated field. "There is a double standard; it's a challenge for a strong and assertive woman. If you smile a lot, you're too nice," said Faulk.

Ramoso describes some of her challenges. "The biggest challenge I have faced is being a young woman of color in politics," she said. "It has been my experience where I was always seen first as an assistant, a secretary or my boss' wife and never as a senior staff member or director of an office."

Pullen-Miles notes that there are real challenges for female leaders. "One of the inherent challenges, obviously, is there are not as many [women] in office, elected or appointed," he said. "That is a disadvantage from the start."

But the mayor says his role as a mentor only helps elevate women to positions in which they naturally excel. "People gravitate to males, so it can be a challenge -- but people recognize females as viable candidates when they do step out," he said. "They can be just as successful as their male counterparts."

Assemblywoman Autumn Burke had this to say about Mayor Pullen-Miles: "Robert has served as an invaluable mentor and coach to a number of young professionals who have interned in my district office. My staff and interns have benefited greatly from his career guidance and assistance with their professional development."

The mayor's mindset of female empowerment may well be homegrown. With three daughters at home, he and Lawndale First Lady Lena are fulltime mentors to photographer Sienna, high schooler Samara and college sophomore Sade.

There's one quality Pullen-Miles points out that he observes in his protegees, which he believes may be a wholly female trait: "Women tend to follow up," he said. "I know the investment in time and advice is going to yield results." •


