Shadbehr Hosts Event on Hawthorne Blvd. Improvements



City Manager and Public Works Director Arnie Shadbehr (in front in orange and yellow) held an event on Oct. 23 to review the progress made on the Hawthorne Boulevard Improvement Project funded by Measure R. This project will improve Hawthorne Boulevard, north of El Segundo Boulevard to north of Imperial Highway and will include: repaving of asphalt, traffic signal upgrades, installation of a new traffic signal at 126th Street, extension of bike lane to Imperial, ADA ramps improvements, sewer relocation, and adjustment of utilities.

Wiseburn Board Gets Dashboard Update, Aquatics Center Numbers

Last Thursday evening, the Wiseburn Unified School District was privy to one special presentation regarding the mandated implementation of the California Dashboard Local Indicator Report, which attempts to give accountability to how districts track continuous improvement. It also provides information about how local educational agencies and schools are meeting the needs of the state's diverse student population, based on a "concise set of measures."

The Dashboard is in year two of utilization and is considered an efficient way of reviewing the performance of school districts by displaying state and local measures to assist in identifying strengths, challenges and areas in need of improvement.

District Assistant Superintendent, Educational Services Dr. Aileen Harbeck's presentation, required to be reported to the Board at this time in the school year, featured seven local indicators of how Wiseburn serves student needs. Speaking of implementing the data culled from the Dashboard, Superintendent Dr. Blake Silvers had said that "what we are trying to do is to figure out where our gaps are, figure out which areas are strengths, which areas are challenges. We are doing a lot of work right now. The teachers are working hard -- working on certain curricular issues that we have." Harbeck said that surveys were taken by leadership teams at each District campus to help with the acquisition of the required Dashboard information. Said Superintendent Silvers: "We are responding to areas that we need to help support...including principal work groups, to provide and strengthen goals for the year, with the idea of promoting continuous improvement." He emphasized that from the District to the site level, the Dashboard is utilized as the framework, but is not the "nitty gritty" of the numbers.

student safety and learning as well as the continuing need to promote parent participation and student connectedness on all campuses."

Board comments were brief, with members Roger Banuelos and Nelson Martinez unable to attend. Dr. Neil Goldman mentioned that he planned to make school site visits, a sentiment echoed by member Israel Mora. Board President JoAnne Kaneda said that no news is good news, because that meant there was no bad news, adding, "Everything is going well, and I appreciate the efforts on everyone's part."

Chief Business Official David Wilson reported that the new Aquatics Center is tracking to come in under budget. Post-meeting, he emailed that the numbers were as follows: Wiseburn had pledged to invest up to \$6 million and approximately two acres of land; the City of El Segundo pledged \$1.8 million; the group South Bay Sports and Health and Recreation were pledging up to \$6 million; and El Segundo Unified School District also pledged significant financial support towards the joint project. Director of Facilities Planning Vince Madsen, who had his contract extended until the middle of November, made his report and gave kudos to City of El Segundo officials for helping bring the Aquatics Center project come to fruition and talked about the moving parts that have been fine-tuned to parry down the stakeholder costs. "We believe that we are going to come in under budget," Madsen said. He added, "We did something that no one has done in California" and did so with "really good numbers." Goldman had noted how Wiseburn was responsible for implementing financial resources for the Aquatics Center. "What this means, for the community, is our commitment was \$6 million, and our highest priority was to be fiscally prudent," he said.

surrounding the pool, and ramping up facility landscaping -- as well as the Nov. 15 date for the beginning of the project architect "punch list," which is a document that is prepared near the end of a construction project listing work not conforming to project specifications that the general contractor must complete before receiving final payment. Emailed Madsen after the meeting: "We are very hopeful to have City staff onsite Nov.15 for equipment training, staff orientation trainings and other prep activities getting ready for the opening of the pool."

In his comments, Silvers talked about safety and traffic challenges as students enter and exit the new Wiseburn High School. Madsen added that the District is working with the City of El Segundo to develop plans to increase safety around school sites. Silvers also spoke about revamping Wiseburn's website saying. "We are pretty much there, almost at 100 percent," he said. He also mentioned that the District was conducting interviews with master plan specialists as it forges ahead in developing the document. He said he was confident that whatever group is selected would engage with the community, seeking their input. Prior to the meeting, Silvers expressed that he is eagerly awaiting the opening of the sports complex, with the crown jewel being the gymnasium facilities that could possibly debut in December. "The gym is just such an unbelievable structure," he said. It is just beautiful." The Oct. 25 meeting was the final regularly scheduled session prior to the Nov. 6 mid-term elections, which should prove to be a low-key affair in Wiseburn. The District floated a \$29 million bond ask in June, but the measure did not receive the necessary 55 percent of yes votes. And while three School Board seats are up for election (Mora, Banuelos and Martinez), the incumbents are running unopposed for their next terms.

Congresswoman Waters on GOP Plan to Cut Social Security, Medicare & Medicaid

Roosevelt in 1935, the Social Security Act has provided economic stability and retirement security to millions of hard working Americans. Prior to the passage of this landmark law, many American seniors were forced to live in abject poverty, and many slept on the streets. Social Security is financed by the payroll taxes seniors paid during their working years, and it provides financial security to more than 50 million seniors and disabled workers. Social Security keeps a roof over their heads and food on their tables.

"Like Social Security, Medicare and Medicaid are landmark programs that changed millions of lives since they were created by legislation signed into law by President Lyndon Johnson in 1965. Today, Medicare serves more than 55 million seniors and disabled workers, ensuring that they can see a doctor and pay for prescription drugs and costly medical procedures. Medicaid serves more than 70 million Americans, including more than 5 million low-income seniors, 10 million people with disabilities, and 28 million children. Medicare and Medicaid save lives, help people live longer, and provide the peace of mind that comes with affordable health care that is there when you need it.

"Republicans have tried cutting Social Security, Medicare and Medicaid before, and the American people have always stood up to oppose them. In 2005, President George W. Bush proposed to privatize Social Security and allow Social Security funds to be invested in the stock market. If this plan had succeeded, seniors would have lost millions in the stock market crash a few years later. One would think by now that Republicans would have learned that the American people will not tolerate cuts to these essential programs. Yet most Republicans still care more about their wealthy friends and campaign donors than the middle class families that depend upon the benefits they have earned.

"Last year, Donald Trump and Congressional Republicans slashed taxes for the wealthiest one percent and large corporations knowing full well that doing so would explode the federal deficit, cause millions of Americans to lose their health insurance, and jeopardize the economic well-being of hard working Americans. After the tax scam became the law of the land, Trump and his allies paraded around the country peddling false promises of more jobs that have not been created, raises that have not materialized, and tax cuts for working families that are modest at best and were temporary from the onset of this scheme.

"Senate Majority Leader Mitch McConnell even had the audacity to predict that the tax cuts did not need to be paid for because they would pay for themselves. However, ten months later, the federal deficit has skyrocketed 17 percent to an astonishing \$779 billion – due in large part to the GOP tax scam – and Majority Leader McConnell has stated that the rising federal debt is 'very disturbing,' but is 'driven by the three biggest entitlement programs that are very popular: Medicare, Social Security and Medicaid,' implying a need for sharp budget cuts to these vital programs.

"This is a shameful and unconscionable proposition from one of the so-called leaders of a Republican-controlled Congress that has repeatedly sold out working families to do the bidding of Donald Trump.

"I am outraged by McConnell's announcement, and I intend to fight with every breath I have to protect seniors, veterans, children, and working families across our country. When the President of the United States, Mitch McConnell, and their Republican allies decide to risk the lives, health, and well-being of millions of hard working Americans and their families in order to subsidize the extravagant lifestyles of millionaires, billionaires, and powerful corporations with a tax scam, they must be held accountable." •

Film Review

The Manic, Feminine Mystique of *Suspiria*

A remake of the 1977 technicolor art house horror flick *Suspiria* follows an all-female dance academy where mysterious things are thought to occur inside the compound's walls. There's certainly danger in the politicallycharged 1980s in East Berlin where this movie takes place, with the compound itself film, where powerful thrusts and quick choreographed moves are set to the ebb and flow of inhalations and exhalations, building to a symphony of senses and an orchestration of evil. But it's the time in between these moments– a politically uninteresting side story and a barely motivated Dr. Josef Klemperer (look closer at "his" makeup and re-look at

sitting just on the other side of the oppressive Berlin Wall. The dance academy has been around for decades and is run by Madame Blanc (Tilda Swinton) and her legion of ladies. The women not only maintain order in violent and unstable times, but also run one of the most prestigious dance academies in the world. It's where American transplant Susie (Dakota Johnson) arrives from her small town in Ohio – coincidentally, as several lead girls crumble under the academy's pressure (imagined or real?) – and impresses them all by dancing the lead solo on her first day of auditions, which results in everyone questioning who she is.

As Susie rises higher and higher, fellow dancer Sara (Mia Goth) grows highly suspicious of the oddities that seem to occur during the former's lead performances. Luca Guadagnino, who last year directed Timotheé Chalamet in Call Me by Your Name, makes this movie an art house exercise that operates with more mystery than on pure horror. He builds an atmosphere of unease into the academy's walls, not unlike the eeriness of The Shining. Because of this, at best Suspiria will be polarizing and at worst underwhelming. What separates this remake from the 1977 version directed by Dario Argento is Guadagnino's filming of the dance at the center of the movie. Guadagnino is certainly one for understanding how senses play to the audience. Here, he fully orchestrates evil with a primal and animalistic expression compared to the ballet scene of the original

Tilda Swinton's credits in the film) -- that had me wishing *Suspiria* would've left me even more breathless.

Suspiria is an overall fascination for the senses with its details and artful moments, but it lacks some of the core ingredients that make horror movies fun. It's undeniably expertly crafted, and when it goes off the rails in the film's head-spinning (or head-exploding) ending, it's quite simply one of the most bizarre moments in movies this year. But even with that, *Suspiria* is not as shocking as it could be, making me think these ladies may not be entirely satisfied.

Recipe provided by Brandpoint Servings: 6

Ingredients

- 6 Eggland's Best Eggs (Large)
- 1/2 teaspoon black pepper
- 1/2 teaspoon dried oregano
- 1 teaspoon sea salt
- 3 tablespoons extra virgin olive oil
- 1 orange bell pepper
- 1 red bell pepper
- 1 cup grape tomatoes
- 1 cup radishes, halved
- 2 carrots, peeled
- 1 yellow pepper
- 1 yellow squash
- 1 zucchini

- 1 cup broccoli florets
- 1 cup radicchio, chopped





Preparation

- 1. Preheat oven to 400 F.
- 2. While the oven is preheating, chop all of the vegetables into bite-size pieces to ensure they will roast quickly and evenly in the oven.
- 3. Arrange the chopped vegetables in a single layer onto the sheet pan in rainbow order: red bell pepper, grape tomatoes, radishes, carrots, orange bell pepper, yellow squash, yellow bell pepper, broccoli, zucchini, radicchio.
- 4. Drizzle the olive oil over the vegetables and sprinkle the salt, pepper and oregano evenly on top.
- 5. Using your hands, lightly toss the vegetables on the sheet pan while keeping the rainbow order intact until they are all evenly coated.
- 6. Place the sheet pan in the oven and roast for 15 minutes or until all vegetables are slightly tender.
- 7. Remove baking sheet from oven but leave oven on. Create room throughout the sheet pan for six eggs and then crack the eggs over the vegetables.
- 8. Return sheet pan to oven and bake until whites are set and yolks are still runny, about 10 minutes.
- 9. Remove from oven and scoop vegetables and one egg into bowl or on top of your choice of rice, quinoa or greens.

3 Steps to Help Manage Depression

(BPT) - Sadness and grief are normal human emotions. These feelings can often last for a short period of time. However, when these emotions last for many days or weeks, depression becomes a concern.

According to the American Psychiatric Association, depression is a common and serious medical illness that negatively affects how you feel, the way you think and how you act. - Loss of interest or pleasure in hobbies
- Decreased energy
- Difficulty concentrating, remembering or

making decisions

- · Insomnia, early-morning awakening or oversleeping
- · Low appetite and weight loss, or, overeating and weight gain
- Thoughts of death or suicide
- Persistent physical symptoms that do not respond to treatment (such as headaches, digestive disorders and pain for which no other cause can be diagnosed)

Step 3: Follow a treatment plan closely and take medications as prescribed. Abruptly stopping medications may cause withdrawal symptoms that could worsen depression. If you are uninsured or your health insurance doesn't cover the medications you need, there are programs that can help. For example, the Inside Rx program is a free prescription savings program that could save an average of 40 percent off select brandname medications and 80 percent off retail price on generic medications. You can check the price of medications, and terms and restrictions like eligibility requirements, at InsideRx.com.
