# Thanks for the Memories, Hawthorne

The city of Hawthorne boasts of historical moments, discoveries, firsts, famous and infamous people, and many pieces of memorabilia. Since 1922, when the city incorporated, the strawberry fields and acres of farmland morphed into an airport, a mall, a main Los Angeles County thoroughfare, shops, parks, a civic center, many schools and playing fields, neighborhoods of treelined streets, and a freeway (105) all its own that divided the city for many years before it was built. The 93 years since the city got its own pin on a map have been rife with good, and some not so good, memories. Much is preserved in photos, trinkets, coins, watches, and so much more in the Hawthorne Historical Museum.

Housed at 12622 Grevillea Avenue, in what was once the Hawthorne Police Department Headquarters, the Hawthorne Historical Museum opened in July 2012 after approval by the City Council to establish a home for the Hawthorne Historical Society. The collection of photos, narratives, and years of memorabilia were inherited from Walt Dixon, the city's unofficial historian who passed away in 2010. Dixon had researched Hawthorne's history for many years and was the co-author of a chronicled history entitled "Hawthorne," published by Arcadia Publishing Company in 2005. With Dixon's death Hawthorne lost all the knowledge he had of the city. He lived in the city from the time he was nine months old and grew up as the city did. Other than his stint in the US Navy, Dixon knew Hawthorne better than anyone. To have Walt Dixon as the historian, however, seemed to preclude any establishment of a Hawthorne Historical Society.

In 2011, Hawthorne Historical Society was founded and then the search was on for a place to display all the inherited Dixon memorabilia. But as the members of the historical society soon found out, Dixon

wasn't the only resident who had things to put on display. There is no way to count how many pieces currently are on display in the museum.

Historical Society President, Thierry Lubenec, said, "I have found so many pieces at local yard sales that are now on display. We have coins from the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the city that were just in a cigar box at a sale. I bought what might be the smallest item, a guitar pick from the Melody Music Store, with the store name on it, also found at a rummage sale on a Saturday morning. People who have lived in Hawthorne for many years, who went to school here, raised their families here, have so much pride in the city. It's so fun to find these treasures and bring them to the museum.

"We have a great letterman's sweater from Hawthorne High (HHS), and they don't give those out any longer. The quality is amazing. Also, a woman who was a member of the HHS Drill Team donated her entire uniform, white tasseled boots, the pom-poms, the hat, shirt, and skirt," he continued as he pointed all of it out in the nearby display case.

Some of the photos on the walls or suspended from the ceiling depict Hawthorne in the very early days when original Craftsmanstyle houses were part of the developing landscape, with residents enjoying the porch and the acreage surrounding the home. Several photos show Hawthorne before the mall was built, when the Red Car Trolleys ran on the tracks up and down the boulevard, when every storefront was occupied by a different business.

Many of the photos in the collection depict the aerospace industry, established in Hawthorne by Jack Northrop (Hawthorne Hall of Fame inductee 2014), and the newest phase of aerospace with SpaceX establishing their headquarters in the city in the last few years. There are photos of the first Flying Tigers aircraft, with the pin and patch issued when they first flew. And a photo depicts the Black Widow building before it became a top secret facility where the plane of the same name was constructed, as well as when the windows were boarded and the building looked deceptively "abandoned."

## **Three Hawthorne Officers Received Medals of Valor**

Hawthorne PD officers Shaun Kemp, Michael Murray, and Gustavo Rubio received the Medal of Valor "Life Saving Award" by a committee of the joint South Bay Chambers of Commerce. The awards were presented at a luncheon on May 20th, and the guest presenter was 0 KTLA anchor Glen Walker.

Officer Shaun Kemp has been with the

Hawthorne PD for five years and is a certified EMT and Tactical Medical Instructor. In 2014, Officer Kemp responded to a radio call and found a non-responsive baby girl at the scene. When Officer Kemp ascertained that the baby was not breathing, he began infant CPR and "mouth-to-mouth" breathing for several minutes until the fire personnel arrived. The ambulance personnel were able to regain a pulse during the ambulance ride, and the baby recovered. Officer Kemp received the Life Saving Award for his quick response and actions.

Officer Murray, an EMT and Tactical Medical Instructor who has been with Hawthorne PD for seven years, also responded to a call in 2014 of a child barely breathing and blue around the mouth. Office Murray found the child in dire respiratory distress and used his "Bag Valve Mask" to provide lifesaving breaths for the child. When paramedics arrived, they were able to take the child to the hospital for treatment and recovery. Office Murray was awarded the Life Saving Award for his fast decisive actions.

Officer Rubio is a 14-year member of the City of Hawthorne, and has worked in the Patrol Officer, Motor Officer, and SWAT

departments. In February 2014, Officer Rubio was attending his daughter's volleyball game when the mother of a player collapsed in the bleachers. Officer Rubio quickly assessed the woman and determined that her condition was critical. He quickly began administering CPR

and continued with the help of the woman's husband until another person arrived with an Automated External Defibrillator (AED). Officer Rubio used the AED to regain the woman's pulse, and then the fire department personnel were able to transport her to the hospital. Officer Rubio's extensive training and knowledge prepared him for this important task and he also received a Life Saving Award. •

#### A REAL AMERICAN HERO

I had the privilege to visit with a very special veteran recently. His name is Bob Farner. He lives in Vista and just happens to be my brother-in-law's father. I had heard a few stories about his military service, but until I sat down in his living room to converse with him, I didn't realize what a great American story his life has been. After running away from his Colorado home at age 15, he hitched a ride on a freight train ending up in San Francisco. He sold flowers to make some



money. He lied about being 18 to enlist in the Marines and was sent to China during WWII. He was transferred to Manila when the Pacific Theater heated up and was assigned to help guard General MacArthur. The Japanese army overran the island and took him to the worst of the worst prison camps in the Philippines. In that prison he had

both of his arms broken and his head smashed against the brick walls numerous times. After more than a year of torture Bob was loaded onto a slow barge of a boat and taken to mainland Japan where he found the prison work and treatment much easier to tolerate. Later he found out from a US submarine commander that they decided not to waste a torpedo on his rickety old boat. After the Japanese surrender, Bob and his POW buddies boarded trains to begin their trip back to the States. Bob loved the action. He loved his service to his country. He reenlisted several times after WWII and served his country in the Korean War. Bob came very close to signing up again to go to Viet Nam. In his retirement, he started an animal rescue farm in his large back yard of his home on a hill in Vista. For two decades he had mountain lions, coyotes, cougars, exotic birds, and even an alligator roaming around the caged area of his property. I only sat down for 30 minutes or so to talk with Bob. I told him we need to write a book. He told me I would have to sit for a week to recount everything. We honor Bob and all of the veterans who served their country so proudly this Memorial Day Weekend.

# St. Mary's Seeks Division Title

St. Mary's Academy's girls' track and field team had a good showing in last Saturday's CIF-Southern Section Division IV Prelims at Carpinteria High in South Santa Barbara County. With some top times and marks, the Belles hope to be challenge for the Division IV crown at the Southern Section Divisional Championships starting at 11 a.m. Saturday at Cerritos College. St. Mary's had the top overall time of 15.09 by senior Kyra Anderson in the 100 hurdles.

St. Mary's 4x100-meter relay team of sophomore Alex Sanford, junior Aliyah Grissett, sophomore Mya Fabien and Brooklin Johnson had the third best overall time of 47.21 to advance to the finals. Oaks Christian from Westlake Village, who most observers tab as the team favorite for the Division IV title, won the race at 46.76 followed by rival Gardena Serra (47.2), which defeated the Belles by just .01 of a second.

Senior Alijah Hale finished second overall in the 400-meter dash timing 57.6 and was third overall in the 300-meter hurdles in 45.2. In the 100-meter dash, seniors Brianna Shufford and Anaiah Brown were fifth and sixth clocking 12.3 and 12.36, in order.

The Belles' 4x400 relay squad of Grissett, Johnson, Fabien and Sanford took second, behind Oaks Christian, at 3:59.38. The Lions clearly had the meet's top time of 3:55.41. Serra (4:07.39) was a qualifying third. St. Mary's field events were led by Treasure May who placed seventh overall in the triple jump at 34 feet, one inch.

In the Southern Section Division II Prelims Saturday at Moorpark High, Lawndale had just one automatic finals qualifier in Bryant Perkinson in the triple jump at 42-10, good for seventh place overall. Perkinson did qualify as an alternate in the long jump with a leap of 20-10.5.

D'lano Beckles, who helped the Cardinals' boys' basketball team to runner-up finishes in the CIF-Southern Section Division IIAA and Southern California Regional Division II playoffs this past season, also was an alternate qualifier in the high jump, tying for 10th place at 5-11.

Despite not making the finals in the 300-meter intermediate hurdles, Lawndale's Kiyaan Cooksey took 14th with a personal best time of 40.96. Cooksey was the Ocean League champion in the 300 intermediates and the 110 highs, as well as being on the Cardinals' league champion 4x400 relay team, which failed to move on after placing 14th overall in 3:27.61.

No athletes from Hawthorne, Leuzinger, Inglewood or Morningside advanced to the divisional finals. The top nine finishers from the four divisions, combined, advance to the Southern Section Masters Championships on May 29 at Cerritos College, with, at least, the top five overall plus at-large competitors with

California state qualifying marks and times, moving on to the state championships on June 5 and 6 at Buchanan High's Memorial Stadium.

#### **HAWTHORNE SOFTBALLERS FINISH THIRD**

Hawthorne High's softball team finished third in the Ocean League at 5-4 and advanced to the CIF-Southern Section Division III playoffs, which began this week. The Cougars clinched a playoff spot by downing host Culver City 8-4 on May 12.

Sophomore Vanessa Perez sparked Hawthorne by going three-for-four with one run batted in and two runs scored. Junior Alyssa Casillas had a three-run double and scored a run. Last Thursday, the Cougars' home game with rival Lawndale was canceled due to rain.

Hawthorne ended its regular season at 15-8-1 and finished behind champion Santa Monica and second place El Segundo, which rolled over the Cougars 9-2 on May 7 at El Segundo's Richmond Field.

#### **ANIMO ADVANCES TO PLAYOFFS**

Despite closing the Harbor League with an 8-1 home loss to Sage Hill Prep from Newport Beach on May 12, the Animo Leadership High baseball team from Inglewood finished third in league and move on to the CIF-Southern Section Division VII playoffs, which began on Wednesday.

Sage Hill is ranked third in Division VII. Sage Hill scored twice in the top of the second

inning, then added three more apiece in the fifth and seventh innings to put the game out of reach in the contest held at the Urban Baseball Academy in Compton.

The Aztec-Eagles had only two hits as they scored their only run in the bottom of the sixth. At Jane Addam Park in Lawndale on May 7, the Aztec-Eagles rolled over Lawndale Environmental Charter 14-3.

Saul Gutierrez sparked Animo going threefor-three with four runs batted in and three runs scored. Angel Barron was three-for-three with three RBI's and three runs scored. Winning pitcher Cesar Rocha pitched two scoreless innings allowing two hits and striking out four batters. Sergio Orejel and Erik Lopez also pitched for Animo. The Aztec-Eagles are 14-6 overall.

#### HAWTHORNE EDGES LAWNDALE

Hawthorne High's baseball team won its first Ocean League game over host Lawndale 4-3 on May 12. The Cougars ended league at 1-8 due to their home game against the Cardinals being canceled due to rain.

Hawthorne's win also ended any playoff hope for Lawndale, which upset El Segundo 1-0 on May 7 at Lawndale. On May 12, Chris Phelps went one-for-three and scored a run. Max Riley drove in a run with a double. Neither team made the playoffs in a league where El Segundo and Santa Monica tied for the league championship and Culver City placed third. •





# Sea Salt on Europa; Sunset on Mars



NASA laboratory experiments suggest the dark material coating some geological features of Jupiter's moon Europa is likely sea salt from a subsurface ocean, discolored by exposure to radiation. The presence of sea salt on Europa's surface suggests the ocean is interacting with its rocky seafloor—an important consideration in determining whether the icy moon could support life.

"We have many questions about Europa, the most important and most difficult to answer being is there life? Research like this is important because it focuses on questions we can definitively answer, like whether or not Europa is inhabitable," said Curt Niebur, Outer Planets Program scientist at NASA Headquarters in Washington. "Once we have those answers, we can tackle the bigger question about life in the ocean beneath Europa's ice shell."

"If it's just salt from the ocean below, that would be a simple and elegant solution for what the dark, mysterious material is," said research lead Kevin Hand, a planetary scientist at NASA's Jet Propulsion Laboratory in Pasadena, California.

One certainty is that Europa is bathed in radiation created by Jupiter's powerful magnetic field. Electrons and ions slam into the moon's surface with the intensity of a particle accelerator. To identify the dark material, Hand and his co-author Robert Carlson, also at JPL, created a simulated patch of Europa's

surface in a laboratory test apparatus for testing possible candidate substances. For each material, they collected spectra -- which are like chemical fingerprints -- encoded in the light reflected by the compounds.

"We call it our 'Europa in a can," Hand said. "The lab setup mimics conditions on Europa's surface in terms of temperature, pressure and radiation exposure. The spectra of these materials can then be compared to

those collected by spacecraft and telescopes."

For this particular research, the scientists tested samples of common salt—sodium chloride—along with mixtures of salt and water, in their vacuum chamber at Europa's chilly surface temperature of minus 280 degrees Fahrenheit. They then bombarded the salty samples with an electron beam to simulate the intense radiation on the moon's surface.

After a few tens of hours of exposure to

this harsh environment, which corresponds to as long as a century on Europa, the salt samples, which were initially white just like table salt, turned a yellowish-brown color similar to features on the icy moon. The researchers found the color of these samples, as measured in their spectra, showed a strong resemblance to the color within fractures on Europa that were imaged by NASA's Galileo mission.

#### **Curiosity Records Martian Sunset**

The sun dips to a Martian horizon in a blue-tinged sky in images sent home to Earth this week from NASA's Curiosity Mars rover. Curiosity used its Mast Camera (Mastcam) to record the sunset during an evening of skywatching on April 15, 2015. The imaging was done between dust storms, but some dust remained suspended high in the atmosphere. The sunset observations help researchers assess the vertical distribution of dust in the atmosphere.

"The colors come from the fact that the very fine dust is the right size so that blue light penetrates the atmosphere slightly more efficiently," said Mark Lemmon of Texas A&M University, College Station, the Curiosity science-team member who planned the observations. "When the blue light scatters off the dust, it stays closer to the direction of the sun than light of other colors does. The rest of the sky is yellow to orange, as yellow and red light scatter all over the sky instead of being absorbed or staying close to the sun." •
