

Chevron: Energizing the Future

As one of the largest refineries on the West Coast, Chevron is a city within a city. Stretching from Vista del Mar to El Segundo Boulevard, the refinery is identifiable by large columns and scaffolded towers, a stream of workers heading toward Main Street around 11:00 a.m. for lunch in navy blue coveralls.

"This particular refinery is unique in that our neighbors are not industrial parks. We do not sit beside other refineries. We sit beside one of the most beautiful beaches in the U.S., right off the Pacific Ocean. We sit beside prestigious communities like El Segundo and Manhattan Beach. We sit beside some of the most welltraveled highways and airways," said Fredrick Walker, General Manager of the El Segundo Refinery, when asked about El Segundo as the home base for the refinery's general operations. Chevron currently provides around 40% of the jet fuel for planes flying in and out of LAX, a significant undertaking for the refinery for various reasons, given the facility's key role in providing energy supplies to the region. "When our operations confront challenges, it's not just about what happens inside this fence. It impacts people trying to travel domestically and internationally. It's a big responsibility, but it's one we're proud of because we literally are fueling progress and innovation," Walker explained. As the world's largest transportation fuel market, Chevron's sizable role comes with a significant degree of visibility. They are responsible for producing and developing products that are not only environmentally conscious, but also safe and increasingly sustainable, as many people rely on them to get where they need to go, sometimes without even recognizing it. Walker explained that it is hard to find a consumer product or other industry that doesn't



Jesse Eisenberg's *When You Finish Saving the World* is a Charming Look at Dysfunctional Family

In his first feature film, *When You Finish Saving the World* (now playing in select theaters), actor-turned-director Jesse Eisenberg adapts the story he originally wrote: an Audible spoken-word story of the same name centered around the idea of the discord between commercialism and activism. Here, he creates a story in which two characters – a very waspy, humorously self-centered mother and son – pursue their passions while also being preoccupied with their own narcissism – enough to fail to see that they're unable to connect with the outside world, and each other.

Finn Wolfhard and Julianne Moore star as headstrong mother and son, each separated by generational gaps and naturally narcissistic tendencies. Ziggy (Wolfhard) is a popular live-streamer, playing his original bedroom guitar jams for his devoted internet fanbase (20,000 of them, which he proudly shares with all who will listen). Evelyn (Moore) is Ziggy's mother, a woman who works at a social services center helping women and their families get back on their feet.

Each lives their own life: Ziggy becomes interested in a cute activist (Alisha Boe) at school – inspiring him to want to become more politically aware (which he struggles to grasp). Evelyn takes to a young boy at her shelter (Billy Bryk) whose respect and tenderness – compared to her own immature son – has her admiring, and overstepping by wanting to help with his college applications and even delivering a plate of dinner.

Moore and Wolfhard are perfectly cast here. In fact, Wolfhard performed the same role in the Audible story. Nasily whined bedroom emo jams about the pains of being a young person, Wolfhard knows how to make Ziggy sympathetic – an achievement for a kid who wears his own merch. Playing to Ziggy's more immature development keeps him from being a malicious brat. And as **See Film Review, page 4**

When Dementia Says, "I Need Some Space"

Caring for loved ones who are battling dementia or Alzheimer's can be very stressful and often incredibly challenging. Each stage of the process comes with new questions and new difficulties that require new answers and new solutions, especially as cognitive function continues to decline, the personality of the person with dementia changes, or if they are not be able to recall the names and faces of the people they hold dearest.

As frustrating and confusing as this can be for those caring for the person, it is even more frustrating and confusing for the person going through it. In the later stages of Alzheimer's, people suffering from the disease may lash out for what appears to be no obvious reason. This upset can manifest itself in the form of screaming, cursing, insults, pushing, hitting, and throwing things. As much as the attack may seem to be directed at the person caring for them, typically it is not personal and is the most effective form of communication they have available to them in that moment.

There are many different reasons a person with dementia may feel upset and lash out, but trying to explain those reasons to others will likely be difficult. Dementia-related aggression can be linked to both internal and external factors. Internal factors can include things like depression, pain, and confusion. External factors involve anything that affects the person about their environment, like their relationship with their caregiver, their social stimulation, the activities they partake in, or the environment itself.

To better understand where this behavior is coming from, try taking an objective look at their experiences and environment. They may be feeling isolated, ignored, or misunderstood. They may be experiencing changes in their environment or may not be able to make sense of their surroundings, which could make them feel confused or unsafe. They may even be dealing with physical frustrations like being in pain, hot, cold, or feeling hungry or thirsty. All of these frustrations come down to a lack of control over the situation and is compounded even further by not being able to communicate one's needs.

When a person with dementia is agitated or combative, our first instinct is often to try to calm the person down. However, attempting to calm them down does not solve the problem they are facing, and may even increase their level of agitation. This is because they are not being given the agency to react to their experiences, in addition to the original feeling of not having control over the experience. Although it may seem counter-intuitive, sometimes the best course of action is to back away and give the person some space while still keeping a close eye out to ensure the safety of themselves and those around them.

As long as the upset person and others around them are safe, giving the person space is a great way to provide them with agency and control. It is reasonable and common to feel stifled and uncomfortable when there are too many stimulants, including people, around. By providing space, we allow the person to navigate their problems on their terms, calm themselves down, and regulate their own emotions. This sense of control not only helps the immediate outburst, but it can also help them avoid future outbursts and improve their quality of life.

It can be nerve-wracking to step away from our loved ones when they are upset, because we care about them and want to solve their problems as quickly and efficiently as possible. However, there are some problems that are not easily fixed, and the loss of freedom that comes with dementia is one of them. We can give our loved ones as much control as is safe, but there comes a point where all we can do is understand and empathize. Losing the agency that one holds over one's own circumstances would be scary and upsetting for anyone, and people battling dementia are no different. Even through the hard times though, we all want to do our best to help our loved ones to find comfort, happiness, and peace, even if that means doing the tough thing and giving them the space and agency they need. •

ORDINANCE Measure BT amends various sections of the El Segundo Municipal Code ("ESMC") dealing with business license taxes ("BLTs"). The measure limits the BLT credit for certain businesses to a three-year period and an overall cap of \$25,000. It also increases the BLT for apartment operators and hotels/motels to \$150 for the first three units and \$150 for each additional unit, and increases the BLT to \$150 for up to the first three rooms and \$150 for each additional room. It also adjusts the BLT rates for approximately 50 business types listed in the ESMC at a base of \$150 per year. Some of the classified businesses currently pay a BLT less than \$150 and some pay more than \$150. Therefore, the measure increases taxes for some businesses and decrease taxes for others. It also increases the rates for unclassified businesses (those not specifically listed in the ESMC) to \$150 per year for the first five employees and

measure also transitions to progressive tax rates on floor area, ranging from \$0.26 per square foot for businesses between 2.001 and 5.000 square feet to \$0.30 per square foot for businesses occupying more than 250,000 square feet. It also eliminates the exemption for nonprofit/charitable organizations and instead imposes a flat BLT of \$150 per year and changes the annual adjustment to a rate equivalent to the most recent five-year average annual increase in the CPI. The tax rates set forth in the measure are maximum rates. The City Council may, by resolution, suspend or reduce any of the BLTs. The BLT is a general tax, the proceeds of which are placed in the general fund to be used for any lawful City purpose.

Measure Y established a Cannabis Business Tax in the City of El Segundo. The measure gives the City discretion to tax both outside legal deliveries and any type of illegal commercial cannabis, and although, commercial cannabis businesses are currently prohibited in the City, the measure would apply to any regulation of cannabis businesses

the City may approve in the future. Under Measure Y, every person who engages in cannabis or industrial hemp business operations within the City must pay a maximum tax on the gross receipts of their operation's business activities as follows: for testing, 2%; for retail sales, retail delivery, or microbusiness retail, 10%; for distribution, 10%, for manufacturing, processing, or any other type of cannabis business not otherwise specified, 10%. Commercial cannabis cultivation businesses must pay a tax ranging from \$4.00 to \$20.00 per square foot of space occupied by cannabis plants, depending on the type of lighting used (natural, artificial, or a combination of both).



The tax rates set forth in the Ordinance are maximum rates. The City Council may increase or decrease the rate of the cannabis business tax established by the Ordinance so long as the adjusted rate does not exceed the

maximum rate. Any business that sells industrial hemp products (e.g., CBD products) is exempt from the cannabis business tax provided that such business does not derive more than 50% of its total gross receipts from the industrial hemp activities. The measure authorizes the City Council to increase or decrease that percentage threshold by any amount it chooses. 

on a fitness career that led him to El Segundo.
