# City Council Reluctantly Raises Customer's Water-Utility Rates

Property owners can expect higher waterutility bills starting in April after the City Council concluded Tuesday there was no way to dodge a huge increase from the city of Los Angeles for handling El Segundo's wastewater. Hyperion charges nearly doubled over the past three years as the plant made upgrades and the flow from the residential and business customers changed, officials said.

Faced with data showing a recent 91 percent jump in charges to El Segundo, council members reluctantly agreed to pass along the increase. Property owners will pay nine percent more annually in 2021 and 2022 for wastewater treatment and another 9.5 percent per year through 2025. At Tuesday's public hearing, officials stressed that El Segundo customers hadn't experienced a water-utility rate increase in five years. Councilwoman Carol Pirsztuk said the timing of the rate increase was unfortunate, adding that property owners can't raise rents by more than five percent under the law.

El Segundo utility customers will pay three percent more each year for West Basin water, too, starting in January 2022, the council decided. The Water Department is passing along the modest increase because West Basin Metropolitan Water District upped its wholesale price to El Segundo's Water Department. The water agency is the source

of all of El Segundo's water.

West Basin board member Scott Houston opposed the rate hike, citing the battered economy and loss of employment due to the COVID-19 epidemic. In a split decision, the West Basin board voted 3-2 last summer to pass through higher costs for state water to its customers - 2.4 percent next year and

3.5 percent in 2023. State law allows El Segundo to charge for the actual cost of providing water services, including salaries, operations and maintenance, and any capital improvements.

Mayor Drew Boyles stressed before the council voted on the five-year pricing cycle

# **Andy Beem's Love for Hang Gliding is Infectious**

In 1982, Andy Beem ran to the edge of a ledge and started to fly. Though he'd never done it before, the feeling was familiar, instinctive. He'd learned how to do this already, in his dreams. No engine, no propellors, just the sound of the wind blowing through his hair and over his wings. This was Andy's first time hang gliding.

In the mid-1940s, a man named Francis Rogallo wondered what it would be like to drive out to the edge of town, unfurl a wing, and fly over the countryside. He began developing some prototypes that would make aviation more accessible and

commercially viable. In 1948, made from recycled kitchen curtains sewn by his wife, Gertrude, they had created a successful flexible wing and were awarded a patent in 1951 under the name "Flexible Kite." Dismissed as a hobbyist activity and child's play by major aviation engineers, Rogallo worked on his design on his own time.

Fast forward about a decade, and America was deep in the throes of a space race with Russia. Interest in space travel was increasingly growing, and both countries vied for the title of first in space and first on the moon. Enter Francis Rogallo.

## **What If One Blood Test Could Detect More Than 50 Types Of Cancers?**

(BPT) - Everyone has been touched by cancer in some way, whether it's a friend or family member facing a diagnosis, or their own worry about susceptibility to the disease. This year alone, roughly 1.8 million people will be diagnosed with cancer in the United States, according to the National Cancer Institute. Nearly 1,700 lives are lost to cancer every day.

Despite numerous advances in oncology - the field of medicine that treats cancer - cancer is the second-leading cause of death in the U.S., according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, and is projected to become the first. That's in large part because most cancers go undetected until it is too late because there is no early screening available today for the majority of deadly cancers. The current guideline-recommended screenings in the U.S., while critical, test for five cancers and screen for one cancer at a time. Cancers without available screening tests account for 71% of all cancer deaths in the U.S.

#### The Importance of **Early Detection**

Medical experts agree that early detection of cancer saves lives and correlates with the ability to treat the disease successfully. Because screenings exist for five types of cancer when there are more than 100 types in total, the most pressing unmet need in cancer early detection is to identify cancers for which there are no existing recommended screening tests.

"Late-stage cancer detection is deadly," says Dr. Joshua Ofman, chief medical officer and external affairs at GRAIL, a company whose mission is to detect cancer early, when it can be cured. "The five-year survival rate of a person diagnosed with cancer once it has already spread is just 21%, compared to an 89% survival rate of someone whose cancer is found in early stages. There is a significant opportunity to reduce cancer deaths through early detection."

# Film Review

# Minari Stands Tall as a Sentimental **Story of the American Dream**

Despite awards shows that miscategorize and claim otherwise (looking at you Golden Globes), Minari is an American film. The soul of its story is the textbook definition of the American Dream. Directed with heartfelt empathy by Lee Isaac Chung, Minari-now available to watch on A24's virtual screening room-is an intimate story about expectation vs reality, and the calculated risks that some are forced to take when pinning the future and well-being of their family on nothing more than hope.

so many life changes, cultural and otherwise, David isn't mature enough to articulate his feelings, so he ends up taking his frustrations out on Soonja via cheeky pranks. It's a familiar story of testing boundaries and the way Lee Isaac Chung captures David's spitfire precociousness and childhood innocence feels extremely personal. From there, the film builds and swirls with emotional tension, coming to a crescendo on the night an accidental fire breaks out and threatens everything Jacob has worked so hard for. It's in this moment when he has an epiphany:

The old adage "grow where you're planted" is a familiar one-it's what Jacob (Steven Yeun) plans to do, with abundance. Having immigrated from Korea with his wife Monica (Yeri Han) and two young children, Anne (Noel Cho) and David (Alan Kim), Jacob and his family settle into the outskirts of a small Arkansas town, where he plans to start a farm. Jacob's vision is to harvest and sell local Korean produce to small markets, and his DIY "can-do" attitude propels its rocky start.

Jacob views his newly acquired acres of land as his personal "Garden of Eden" and a ticket to generational success. However, his expectation of the farm's promise vs the reality of it-which drains resources and money away from his family-is far from ideal. The family dynamic is put in flux as Jacob's attention becomes predominately set on work, causing Monica to grow more isolated and resentful. To ease the tension, it's decided that her mother Soonja (Yuh-jung Youn) will come from Korea to live with them and help raise the children, much to David's initial detest.

Where Minari really finds its emotional weight is the time we spend with the family and their home life, specifically the relationship between David and his grandma. Faced with is "financial success" worth more than his well-being and safety, or has greed been masquerading as his relentless work ethic?

Like the Minari, or crops of any kind, Lee Isaac Chung uses this beautiful cinematic vessel to show us that we grow where we're planted; we can flourish anywhere so long as we nurture ourselves. This sentiment is the thesis statement of *Minari*, embracing cultural differences is the only way to create a richly symbiotic tapestry of American life. Now, someone tell that to the HFPA. •



# El Segundo's Jim Fenton Is Not Only an Ironman, but Also a Community-Oriented Man

El Segundo resident Jim Fenton keeps a hectic schedule. He is a private banker, continually active in his church, as well as the local Kiwanis Club, serves as an advisor to the El Segundo High School Key Club, and, when not helping make his clients' money, or giving back to his community, finds time to train for high-level triathlons and Ironman competitions.

The Fenton family moved to El Segundo nearly 12 years ago from North Carolina, which is where the fictional town of Mayberry was made famous by the iconic Andy Griffith Show six decades ago. Why the crosscountry move to a city often referred to by its proponents as Mayberry, he was asked?

He said that he and his wife of, currently 26 years, Donna, and their four young kids (Gabriella, Noah, Jana, and Jack) and had moved to North Carolina because he and his wife thought that the "Tar Heel" state would be a great place to raise a family. He and his wife lived in New York City and in Europe and had "certain expectations" regarding "quality of life, and what our kids would be exposed to." Fenton said that the area they lived in North Carolina did not meet the family expectations, so the Fentons explored other options, having friends who had been in their wedding and, at that time, were residing in El Segundo.

That prompted a visit to El Segundo back in 2009. "We absolutely loved it," he said of his experiences in what was to become his new hometown. After the kids wrapped-up their schooling that summer, the Fentons loaded-up the U-Haul, the four kids, and the dog and made the 3,000-mile (Durham to El Segundo) drive across the country.

A private banker by trade, Fenton also serves as the Kiwanis Advisor to the El Segundo High School Key Club. He conducts weekly Wednesday Zoom calls with the students, motivating them to become immersed in community service. Not too long ago, the Key Club members built "the Great Pumpkin" float that, in consort with the El Segundo Police Department, motored through town, delivering candy during the 2020 Halloween season.

Christian Church, he holds weekly Zoom adult bible-study sessions for an average of 25 parishioners. He also built a program called LifeSkills through a partnership with the organization Mercy Worldwide that aims to teach young people important skills, such as balancing a checkbook, adroitly using credit cards, and being cognizant of the pitfalls of accrued interest payments. He said that it is important that once young adults jump through the hoops to acquire a job, they take that seriously, show up on time for work and interviews, and manage their money effectively. "It is really about building-up their financial knowledge," he said and providing career development advice.

In the Summer of 2018, Fenton was preparing to participate in his first Ironman competition, which was around the time he became the executive director of the LifeSkills program. He was able to secure funding for the program, brand the entity, and develop what he called "the five pillars" of the program, which are "Integrity, well-being, time management and goal setting, personal finance, and career development."

Fenton said he estimates that the program has impacted the lives of more than 300 young adults who participate in what is typically a five-week, two-hour program. Currently, Fenton said, there are about 25 enrollees in the program, who are advised by five mentors, who follow-up with the participants later to keep them engaged in what they are learning.

Fenton also supports the local Red Cross, partnering for the installation of fire alarms, and drumming-up blood donations.

So how does one go from receiving an educational certificate from the American Musical and Dramatic Academy and a bachelor's degree from the International College of Christian Ministries to becoming a private banker? "I have no idea," he said, pondering the answer to that question. "They say better lucky than good. I have had a blessed life in that regard." After the 2001 financial crisis, Fenton said he was introduced to a player in the financial industry and began seeking his career pathway. Fenton said he had a little background in the field of finance, working

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

cancer can be detected. Researchers have been working hard on a single blood test capable of finding many cancers.

The novel multi-cancer early detection blood test, called Galleri, is developed by GRAIL and expected to be commercially available for the first time in 2021. In a clinical validation study, an earlier version of the test demonstrated the ability to detect more than 50 types of cancers - over 45 of which have no recommended screening today - including at early stages, with a very low false positive rate of less than 1%. When a cancer signal is detected, the test can determine where in the body the cancer signal is located with high accuracy.

"A simple blood test capable of detecting more than 50 types of cancer is a ground-breaking and potentially life-saving advancement that could have a tremendous human and economic benefit," explains Dr. Minetta Liu, research chair and professor, Department of Oncology, Mayo Clinic. "Recent modeling data suggests if all cancers currently diagnosed at stage IV could be detected earlier, evenly distributed across stages I-III, cancer deaths could fall by 24%."

#### A New Era in Early **Cancer Detection**

"With the introduction of Galleri, we are approaching a long-awaited and pivotal moment in cancer care, and we are dedicated to bringing this potentially life-saving technology into the hands of patients, providers, and communities," Ofman says. "We are thrilled to be making a blood test that can detect multiple deadly cancers early a reality."

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

a paraglider (a combination of the words parachute and glider) instead of a parachute, spacecraft could be returned to earth more accurately and piloted to land on a runway instead of splashing into the ocean. Despite being dismissed before, scientists now took great interest in his work, and NASA began developing a program to implement the idea on their missions.

With the clock running down and both countries growing closer every day to a manned space flight, the U.S. decided to scratch Rogallo's wings under the pressure of time. The first few space flights were returned to earth using a parachute with a large margin of error on its splash landing.

By this time, though NASA didn't use his design, the idea of attaching this device to a person had spread rapidly. Names like sky surfing and sky sailing promised pilots a chance to glide through the air with their pair of wings, sans motor. In the late sixties, Moyes Delta Gliders, named for founder Bill Moyes, began manufacturing wings for direct to consumer consumption. Many companies followed, growing to over thirty manufacturers in the seventies.

Around 1982, Andy Beem's best friend in high school asked if he would accompany

him and his father on a hang gliding trip as their "chase driver," meaning he would drive them to the top of the mountain and then drive down to meet them when they landed.

"When I would see them flying off the mountains," says Beem, "I thought 'oh that just looks so beautiful, so wonderful,' but there's no way I saw myself doing that." With a fear of heights, he couldn't imagine jumping off the edge of a mountain and gliding down to the bottom. One day, he

was invited down to the Playa del Rey site, now the Dockweiler Beach site. Seeing pilots jump off the thirty-foot landing and fly seven feet off the ground for about a hundred yards, he saw his opportunity. For the thirty-eight years, he flew, perfecting his skills and building his confidence.

Today, Andy teaches hang gliding lessons at Windsports located at Dockweiler State Beach. Every now and then, you can see Andy and a handful of students from all over the world gliding off the thirty-foot ledge and landing in the sand.

This location is ideal, he explains, because the wind coming off the ocean is smooth, with very little turbulence. That, paired with the soft landing, makes it a great place for beginners to learn the ropes. Another advantage, he says, is that the general public can see the flights. In most other situations, hang gliding takes place in the mountains or remote locations, so the average person doesn't get to see what it looks like. So riding down the bike path, there's a better chance that someone will see the short flight as he did in 1982 and decide to give it a try.

Beem has become friends with many of his former students, going with them on trips to hang glide in places like Yosemite, Yellowstone, and even Mexico. Though the sport isn't as trendy as it once was, Beem says that for every pilot that leaves the sport, a new one arrives. Over the years, it's maintained a firm level of interest and size of community.

"To this day, after thirty-eight years of flying, there's still nothing more fun than flying a hang glider," he says. It's this joy in the sport that he hopes to give to his students. Seeing the light go on in a beginner's eyes, he says, is really what keeps him teaching, and the joy of flying keeps him hang gliding.

"Most teachers that teach anything don't do it because they're trying to get richer and make a lot of money," says Beem, "they enjoy the process of teaching people." He says that nearly all of his students are really fun and enjoyable people to work with, and many eventually become good flying buddies. He describes the hang gliding community as a group of fabulous individuals with a lot of camaraderie.

Whether it's racing against time from landmark to landmark, flying through a vast valley, or just jumping safely down to the beach, Andy's life has revolved around hang gliding, and he wants everyone to try it. •

(Retirement Law), pursuant to a contract, as amended from time to time, it has entered into with the California Public Employees Retirement System (CalPERS,

and the CalPERS Contract). The City has established three pension plans for its employees, a Miscellaneous Plan (the 'Miscellaneous Plan"), a Safety Police First Tier Plan (the "Policy First Tier Plan"), and a Safety Fire Plan (the "Fire Plan") pursuant to the CalPERS Contract. The Retirement Law obligates the City, among other things, to: (1) make annual contributions to CalPERS to fund pension and other retirement benefits for its members and their beneficiaries; (2) amortize the unfunded accrued actuarial liability of the City under the Retirement Law, which is the liability for retirement benefits that has accrued under the Retirement Law and the CalPERS Contract but which the City has not yet paid to CalPERS; and (3) appropriate funds to pay these obligations.
As of June 30, 2019, based upon the

actuarial reports of pension liability as calculated by CalPERS with respect to the Miscellaneous Plan, the Police First Tier Plan, and the Fire Plan (together, the "Actuarial Reports"), the City had an aggregate obligation for its Unfunded of amount of \$151,299,753 (consisting of \$34,576,384 for the Miscellaneous Plan, \$61,384,985 for the Police First Tier Plan, and \$55,338,384 for the Fire Plan) pursuant value of assets. in the 1990s, but did not have the educational background in the industry.

"It is very rare," he said, "to have a private banker without a formal education...most of them have MBA's" or other impressive letters of the alphabet embossed on their business cards.

Jim was born in Oswego, New York, and spent his youth moving about the East-Coast with his family. His Dad was "good at fixing-up retail stores," so the family moved around quite a bit following his father's work opportunities.

Now that he is firmly ensconced in relatively compact El Segundo, like many residents, he cherishes the fact that his kids could walk to school and walk to the local ballfield. He also noted the strong parental involvement in local activities as a selling point for the town. And, as a triathlete, the proximity to the Pacific Ocean doesn't hurt.

Fenton competed in his first triathlon in 2017. He went down that path because he had broken his foot while running at the high school track, so to get exercise, he took to riding his bike and swimming at the Plunge. When he told his wife he was training to participate in a "Half Ironman" competition, she apparently quipped, "half Ironman? Sounds like half-a-man," wife Donna said. So, Fenton decided to use that comment to motivate him to train to participate in a full Ironman competition, which he did for the first time in 2018, in Madison, Wisconsin.

Brother Sean Fenton, the oldest of six siblings, related how Jim has served as an inspiration to him; a couple of years ago, when Jim announced that he was going to participate in the Madison Ironman competition, Sean said he made plans to travel from his North Carolina home to Wisconsin to support his brothers blossoming athletic endeavors.

"It was a spectacular experience that I had with my brother," Sean said. Sean said he was a bit leery when Jim announced his Ironman participation plans. "I was so astounded," Sean related, who admitted that he didn't have a clue to what the Ironman competition entailed. "There was no way that I was going to miss this."

After watching Jim complete the grueling Ironman competition, Sean said he was so overwhelmed and inspired that he decided to begin training to compete in Ironman festivities and hopes to join Jim this December at the La Quinta, California competition, dubbed the "70.3" because the miles traversed are one-half of the miles Ironman's 140+ miles that participants endure.

Of course, currently, a COVID effect question must be asked. Fenton said he tested positive for COVID but was fortunate only to have what he termed "mild symptoms" for two weeks. He said that the biggest impact on the Fenton's of the virus was that youngest son Jack; currently, a freshman at El Segundo High School has not been able to attend class in person, calling remote learning "very challenging." Jim Fenton noted the expanded screen-time currently facing students, with the subsequent extreme diminishment of social interaction for students. "As an incoming freshman," Fenton said, "he misses that experience of being in high school with his friends. We are proponents of getting the kids back in the classroom as much as possible when the state guidelines are met. Let's go!" he said, about the return to the classrooms.

So now you know a little about Jim Fenton and family: Relocating from North Carolina, the state made famous by the fictional town of Mayberry, to the town many refer to as the West Coast Mayberry by the sea. North Carolina's loss has turned out to be El Segundo's gain. •

that El Segundo is not the one raising its rates. It's passing along the inflationary costs of the city of Los Angeles and West Basin Metropolitan Water District. Proceeds from the higher city Water Department bills will be used to rebuild the city's depleted wastewater fund and make needed repairs to the outflow meters that determine how much the Hyperion charges the city to accept effluent and food waste.

The Hyperion accepts effluent and solid waste from properties east of Pacific Coast Highway. The east side of El Segundo is serviced by Los Angeles County.

Roughly one-fourth of the affected property owners objected to higher water-utility bills at this time, City Clerk Tracy Weaver reported. That was not enough to block the City Council from setting higher new waterutility rates through 2025. Protests ballots were mailed to 4,206 water customers and 4,155 wastewater customers, Weaver said.

A total of 1,092 water customers objected to a three percent annual increase. A smaller number - 989 - opposed raising the wastewater portion of local utility bills, she reported. The public hearing was held in accordance with Prop. 218, and it takes a majority vote by property owners to stop certain tax and utility rate increases by local governments.

The three-year spike in Hyperion costs to El Segundo forced the city repeatedly to dip into the wastewater fund, according to Chief Financial Officer Joe Lillio. The fund should only be tapped for one-time use, City Manager Scott Mitnick told the council on Tuesday. That impression a city isn't managing its finances well is especially important because El Segundo is preparing to issue pension-obligation bonds to cover its \$151 million obligation to CalPERS. Any sign of financial weakness could lower the city's bond rating and hurt its ability to raise the necessary capital.

Resigned to the fact that El Segundo could not subsidize the rising water-treatment rates coming from Los Angeles, Councilwoman Pirsztuk suggested El Segundo band together with other South Bay cities and created a Hyperion oversight committee. The goal: to compare notes about the Hyperion's pricing and be ready should water-treatment rates continue to skyrocket. City Manager Mitnick was tasked with making that happen.

The quality of the effluent leaving El Segundo is getting worse and costing more to treat, the city's Public Works Director Elias Sassoon said. Low-flow toilets would seem to be the obvious cause; however, he pointed to the opening of more restaurants on the city's westside and higher density in Smoky Hollow as bigger contributors to the degradation.

Environmental impacts of businesses also factored into the council's decision to welcome the California Green Business Network to the city. Using a \$30,000 grant from the state, the Public Works Department will recruit local businesses to join the program. The council agreed to a one-year pilot program on the condition that El Segundo can withdraw if not enough local companies show an interest or if the funding dries up.

The push for a green-business rewards program came from the city's Environmental Committee. The advisory panel to the council would rather that companies voluntarily adopt sustainable practices that reduce the carbon footprint, including waste and emissions, than being forced by the city to do it. Tracey Miller-Zarneke, who heads the Environmental Committee, urged the council to grab the opportunity offered by California Green Business Network. It certifies member businesses and allows them to market their sustainable energy, waste, and water practices and attract like-minded customers, it says.

The funding from Sacramento isn't guaranteed, and the network organizers won't know until May if money will be available for El Segundo to participate. The grant will pay for half of the first-year program costs. City staff time and outreach will be required.

#### In Other Action

The Lakes at El Segundo officially changed hands on Monday, when the city turned over the property to TopGolf for planned improvements. The course and driving range will remain closed for 14 months, with a planned reopening date of May 2022. Demolition begins this month, and work on the golf course is set to start in June.

The developer on the project, CenterCal, informed the city it plans to make additional improvements to the course and needs more time to finalize the construction contract with TopGolf. The council agreed to the request, giving CenterCal, more time.

Monday was the last day golfers could play The Lakes. Topgolf's long-awaited entrance into the Southern California market began on Tuesday. The nine-hole course is being redesigned, and a three-level driving range will be built at the Pacific Coast Highway site. With a restaurant and entertainment venue on-site, the golf property will bring 400 jobs and generate up to \$2 million per year in new revenues for El Segundo, it estimates.

El Segundo will use Many Mansions to develop and manage affordable-housing projects, the council decided. The city currently has \$5 million set aside to increase the number of affordable units, either through the purchase of a multi-family unit or construction. Many Mansion is an affordable-housing services provider that contracts with Southern California cities under orders from the state to meet lower-cost housing goals.

Mayor Boyles has urged Gov. Gavin Newsom and the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors to allow youth sports to resume. In a letter to the governor and county leaders, Boyles cited the emotional trauma children are experiencing from being isolated for nearly a year from their teammates and friends. Allowing sports leagues and competition again is "exactly what our students need to weather the pandemic," the mayor wrote.

Parents and league organizers gathered at City Hall before Tuesday's council meeting to raise awareness about the mental-health effects that children are beginning to exhibit because of the prolonged restrictions on close-contact sports and social-distancing requirements implemented by the state and county to slow the spread of COVID-19. •


