State of the City: Mayor Looks to Future After Positive Recent Year

As he concluded his address to a packed room of attendees during last Wednesday's State of the City 2019 luncheon, El Segundo Mayor Drew Boyles was effusive in his description of this community, describing it as the "most important five square miles" economically in all of Southern California. Judging by the long list of accomplishments over the past year as well as what's in store for the future, he made a compelling case for the assertion.

The event, held at Los Angeles Air Force Base and presented by the El Segundo Chamber of Commerce, brought together business luminaries, elected officials and other local leaders. Before the mayor took to the stage, Space and Missile Systems Center Commander Colonel Ann Igl spoke of the Base's history in town and noted, "El Segundo has been with us since the beginning." She went on to mention the economic impact of the facility -- \$2 billion annually -- along with its 6,000 employees and 12,000 indirect jobs.

Veering from the format of past events, Boyles began his portion of the program by showing a newly produced 15-minute video featuring comments from City Council colleagues and the various department heads on the recent -year achievements with El Segundo identified as the "hub of innovation" and "where big ideas take off." Each of the items tied in with the five major objectives outlined in the City's three-year strategic plan.

In the video, Councilmember Chris Pimentel spoke of the priority to receive community feedback and improve communication as part of the overall goal to enhance customer service and engagement. Deputy City Manager Barbara Voss highlighted the citywide communication program now in place to make interaction more "consistent, proactive and collaborative."

Finance Director Joe Lillio discussed the implementation of online business license renewals and a second year of surveys now using the Net Promoter Score system to measure the City's services. Recreation and Parks Director Meredith Petit reported major increases in summer camp participation as well as social media followers, plus a new motto/logo and an online registration system.

Library Director Melissa McCollum talked about improved WiFi access, remodel of a main section of the library, online services and the Living Library program that debuted last year in conjunction with the El Segundo Museum of Art (ESMoA).

City Clerk Tracy Weaver reported on training programs for employees and that El Segundo will move to a new election format in 2020 to align with LA County. Planning and Building Safety Director Sam Lee emphasized the goal to "improve the overall customer experience."

Regarding the goal to support community safety and preparedness, Mayor Pro Tem Carol Pirsztuk noted that one of El Segundo's strengths is that it is "an extremely safe city." Police Chief Bill Whalen then listed his department highlights – including the new crime analyst position, a department reorganization that included creation of the new Command Engagement Division, and 39 community outreach efforts in the past year.

Fire Chief Chris Donovan detailed continued advances in technology and training, a pre-alert dispatch system to improve response times, the City passing its environmental safety audit without a single hitch, and two hazardous materials sessions conducted free of charge.

On the goal to develop as a choice employer and workforce, Human Resources Director David Serrano said the City launched a leadership development academy, held a mid-manager retreat, and hired 23 new personnel with eight internal promotions.

Whalen lauded ESPD's new recruitment campaign, which includes a \$25 million bonus for lateral officers who choose to move here from other agencies. "We want the best of the best," Whalen said.

Looking at the goal to develop quality infrastructure and technology, Councilmember Scot Nicol talked about the recently opened City of El Segundo/Wiseburn Aquatics Center (which Boyles later singled out as a shining example of a major project that can happen in a small town, thanks to collaboration between multiple stakeholders).

Information Systems Director Charles Mallory said his new department launched of a series of projects to improve services and communications. Public Works Director Ken Berkman (who at one humorous point in the video emerged out of a trash bin) listed his department highlights from last year – with a hefty amount of sidewalk, curb/gutter repair and repaving, not to mention completion of a major portion of the sewage master plan. And he did discuss the new automated solid waste and recycling contract (kicking in next month) that will save the City \$1.8 million over 10 years.

Of the final goal to champion economic development and fiscal sustainability, Boyles described the City's success in balancing its budget and reducing pension liability. Crediting the Economic Development Advisory Council (EDAC) with helping the cause, Boyles proclaimed, "El Segundo is now on the map more than ever." Voss supported the notion with stats of more than 2.5 million square feet of commercial space occupied here over the past decade. She also elaborated on the







Wiseburn Board Views Anza **STEAM Presentation**

Anza Elementary Principal Alberto Paredes and Anza instructor Suzanne Guidi were front and center at last Thursday's meeting of the Wiseburn School Board, extolling the virtues of their school's Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Math (STEAM) program.

Their presentation began with a slide showing how the Anza Elementary mission statement dovetails with that of the Wiseburn Unified School District (WUSD) as well as the California Science Framework. The WUSD mission statement touts that students will acquire the necessary skills to become "capable lifelong learners and productive citizens." Anza's mission statement aims to help students with developing a "positive self-image, achieve academic excellence and become responsible citizens." The California Science standards stress the need for students to become "informed citizens and future scientists.

As the presentation continued, it noted the goal to achieve "anytime, anywhere collaboration" for teachers and students, utilizing all tech options to support highlevel instruction and implement personalized learning strategies."

Stakeholder interactions were briefly detailed, with the delineation of the "mystery science" license that was on-boarded in the fall of 2018, allowing students to explore "ready-made" science mysteries. Project Lead the Way training was noted, with a dozen Anza teachers taking part in the recent District-wide professional development training opportunity.

The presentation concluded with Anza Elementary Engineering lessons and the import of Arts learning to the program, as well as "coding" opportunities that are being made available at Wiseburn.

Upcoming Anza Elementary events include the April 10 Open House, the April 25 Family Math Night and the May 21 Around-the-World Multi-Cultural Night.

Paredes talked about educational "flashlights" aimed specifically at the STEAM program, and action plans to make the program a success. "But we didn't stop there," he said. He talked of development of the action plan, and how all District stakeholders were given a chance to be involved, making sure "everything was connected, so that we can move in the right path."

Guidi, in her comments, spoke about the focus of the "flashlight" and how she realized that she needed to be in-tune to the necessity to incorporate all stakeholders' inputs to make the program successful. She also noted the import of taking the time to listen and learn, pointing out the strong core of teachers currently working at Anza. She, as well as Paredes, fully embraced the "Ok to fail," mantra, deemed "fail forward," which encourages students to not be afraid to espouse an idea that may not be currently feasible, but "as long as you find something that you learned and moved forward, that was success." Paredes spoke of the benefits of "failing forward," which he said allows students to "revise" their thinking and postulations.

Superintendent Dr. Blake Silvers lauded the efforts being made at Anza to integrate STEAM into the curriculum. He spoke of the "phenomenal work at Anza" and the District-wide embracement of "working through challenging tasks, and to fail forward," noting how these lessons will be integral to how students will learn to operate in their future endeavors.

Silvers said Guidi has taken on a leadership role at Anza, tasking students with solving tech-related conundrums. "She has been awesome, with her commitment to tech," he said, adding that she helps students to be bold enough to make mistakes and learn from those.

Siobhan Scott of Wiseburn Watch next addressed the Board, citing her concerns about the need for a proposed District traffic light on Douglas Street where, she said, multiple accidents have occurred. She also mentioned the dearth of baseball fields available in the District. "We don't have one," she said, speaking of any baseball field.

Board reports followed, with Dr. Neil Goldman touting the work of the Wiseburn Education Foundation. Vice President Roger Banuelos recognized District retiring teachers, adding that he was also heartened to see the involvement of young ladies in the STEAM program that indicates a "broader culture of inclusion."

In her comments, Board President JoAnne Kaneda was "disturbed" by District retirements, but thanked the retirees for their years of service and how their work has been so valuable.

During his comments, Silvers shared that he was happy to attend the recent Anza Elementary Variety Show. He also spoke of the recent State of the City with El Segundo, and the fact that he was looking forward to his stint in the dunk tank at the April 6 Rock Around the Block festivities.

At the tail-end of the 55-minute meeting, the District honored retiring long-time employee Edgar Sanchez after 23 years of service. He worked in multiple positions with Wiseburn's maintenance division. He saves the day," Silvers said. "He goes out there always, with a smile. One of those go-to-guys who takes pride in what he does. A wonderful human being..."

District resignations on the agenda included teachers Mary Nies and Karen Rafalski-Fraser. Silvers said their resignations were a "great loss to the District." Noting how he had personally worked with Nies, he called her "an incredible person, innovative, forwardthinking and intuitive. She is such a model and tech guru, helping to bring the District into the 21st Century."

In other news, Silvers reported his attendance at the Anza Elementary Variety Show and that he was blown away with the talents that he saw demonstrated during the

The Eighth Annual Beach City Baseball Academy International Tournament was won for the eighth consecutive year by a Little League team from Kitasuna, Japan. The team, which is made up of 12-year-olds from a Kitasuna baseball academy, demonstrated why its successful history has included three Little League World Series titles in the past six years. Kitasuna rolled through the tournament by defeating the Torrance Samuari 12-1, the South Bay Pony from Manhattan Beach 8-0, the Torrance Tsunami 5-0 and the Beach City Red team 12-0.

Kitasuna annually puts on a clinic on how baseball is played, along with its respect for opponents, sportsmanship and discipline. The key ingredient to these successes on and off the diamond starts with discipline and that element of success starts in each player's home. It continues when the players arrive at the field and culminates when they bow in respect to their opponents after they soundly defeat them.

When you watch the team on the field or away, you see their devotion to each other and their teamwork that is second to none. When they play the game, it is poetry in motion that puts opposing coaches from our continent in awe. Their precision during pre-game extends into their game. Giving 100 percent is not an option: it is a way of life that also stretches far beyond baseball. 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


Check It Out The Lucifer Chord by F.G. Cottam

I have always been intrigued by the unknown. I have grown up watching "scary" movies, both theatrically and on television. But, one of the ways to truly experience terror is to read about it as written by a talented and subtle author. The images in your mind can be much more frightening than those on the screen.

F.G. Cottam is one of the few writers who understands the ghost story. He also understands character, dialogue and mood. He

doesn't condescend to his audience. Instead, he invites them in quietly. Before you know it, you're hooked and you find yourself looking over your shoulder! I discovered him through his book The House of Lost Souls, which is a great introduction into his work.

In The Lucifer Chord. he finds a new twist in the mixing of the supernatural with rock music. Ruthie Gillespie is hired to write the liner notes to the upcoming remastered special edition recordings of '70s legends Ghost Legion, led by the late guitarist Martin Mear, who died mysteriously. In fact, members of the group are all dead, and questions keep popping up about them and a strange cult-like group called the Jericho Society. Is there a connection? Was Martin Mear involved in a Faustian deal -- fame that came with a deadly price?

Cottam has a light touch when chronicling Ruthie's meetings with Carter Melville, Ghost Legion's former manager and the Big Man orchestrating the resurrection of Martin Mear and his bandmates. He puts her in touch with several people who knew Martin, including his lover and his daughter. There's even a psychic medium who foretells eerie circumstances that will cause Ruthie's research to turn into dangerous territory. There's more to the story of Martin Mears and company: His diehard fans are convinced they can bring him back by means of a ritual they will perform, known as "The Clamouring," which is an experience Ruthie wishes she could forget.

Cottam reveals on his website that The Lucifer Chord "...provided me with the most enjoyable writing experience of my entire life." I think that translates into the enjoyment one feels in the reading of his story. Horror tales don't necessarily have to drip with gore for one to get the message. A reader can still imagine a cold draft or a shadow in the hall of a decrepit mansion and feel a frisson of terror. The description of a tune from the 1920s coming from an unused (and perhaps broken) gramophone in the rotting Fischer House was lodged in my mind for a while -- as well as the accompanying disembodied voice addressing Ruthie as she explores the ruins.

F.G. Cottam favorably compares with another favorite author, Phil Rickman. Both are based in the UK and Rickman was known for a series of ghostly novels that told of ley lines and Celtic legend that blooms into dread and fear. In fact, Rickman wrote a "rock & roll horror story" of his own called December, which is an unforgettable book. I wonder if Cottam was influenced by Phil Rickman. Read The Lucifer Chord and if you like that, you might want to try December. We offer interlibrary loan services for books owned by other libraries so you can explore more otherworldly tales. •





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
Film Review Native Son Review: A Classic Gets a Modern Punk Adaptation

Native Son is the story of a young African American from low-income circumstances, who, after securing employment in the world of a wealthy white family, finds himself at the center of an accidental death that puts him directly in the crosshairs of cultural tensions. Adapted from the classic 1940 novel, first-time feature film director Rashid Johnson (along with Pulitzer Prize-winning screenwriter Suzan-Lori Parks) has made this updated version entirely his own: by highlighting the story's underlying social issues and wrapping them up in a polished punk aesthetic.

Dalton (an always impressive Bill Camp). They, along with the rest of the actors, are so perfectly cast together that - to put it in art terms - it feels like the right mixture of harmonious colors in Johnson's artistic palette.

It's undeniable that Rashid Johnson is a flourishing artist and one whom we should all be watching to see what he does next. The biggest obstacle holding Native Son back from being even more impactful is in the tonal shift jumps, which happen when the story continues to play on and the stakes are raised. The story's pivotal and climactic plot point is surprising, but this hard crank of the wheel feels a bit disorienting. The fallout

Visual contemporary artist Rashid Johnson's previous work is diverse in mediums such as painting and sculpting. With Native Son, he brings an experienced visual eye to the project, which is the film's most seductive and impactful quality. Where Johnson most noticeably swerves from the source novel is in the depiction of our protagonist, Bigger (Ashton Sanders), or "Big," as the neighborhood calls him. With his cropped green buzz cut and decorated leather jacket, Big is the epitome of visual identity exploded. He challenges both personal and racial expectations of what "blackness" should be by listening to such diverse and non-hip-hop music as Bad Brains and Beethoven. You'll remember Ashton Sanders as teenage Chiron from last year's Best Picture winner Moonlight, and here again, Sanders plays a cryptically reserved character. But as he slinks his way around the streets of North Chicago, he brings a new level of magnetism and menace to his acting range.

KiKi Lane, who most recently gained name recognition by starring in the acclaimed If Beale Street Could Talk, plays Big's girlfriend Bessie. Nick Robinson plays Jan, an impoverished young activist; and the captivating Margaret Qualley plays Mary Dalton, the alluring daughter of Big's new employer, Mr.

of this moment leads the movie to make a statement that we didn't know it would have to make. Yet for this slight distraction, it would be wrong to not also acknowledge the number of complex ideas, all stylized through Johnson's artistic formats.

Native Son is well worth the 104 minute investment. It's no wonder why HBO bought the film from A24 just hours before making its world premiere at the Sundance festival.

Native Son will be available to stream on HBO on Saturday April 6. •

rebuilt economic development website, new hospitality/tourism website and Sepulveda's name change to Pacific Coast Highway to increase awareness that El Segundo is indeed a beach city.

Lee mentioned \$200 million in construction projects, with over two million square feet of improvements and many major projects especially in the Aviation Corridor, such as Frank Gehry's new building. Of the adoption last year of the Smoky Hollow Master Plan, Lee said, "Smoky Hollow is now ready to take off" and that the city "will reap its benefits for years to come."

Also on fiscal stewardship, City Treasurer Crista Binder's portion of the video confirmed investments of over \$78 million and \$1.2 million in interest income earned last year. Lillio wrapped up by talking about Measure C, which El Segundo voters passed last year. Under the terms of the preemptive initiative, should LA County pass a sales tax increase in the future, the extra revenues collected will go to the City of El Segundo instead of the County.

After the video presentation (with kudos given to El Segundo TV), Boyles began his live address with some interesting data from the first-ever creative economy report: El Segundo is home to 262 creative firms and that number continues to grow annually. Those employees earn 40 percent more than the county average for creative workers. More than half the jobs are in entertainment and digital media. Also, 1.4 percent of all creative workers in the county are in El Segundo (even though only 0.2 percent of the total people are here).

Looking at the strategic plan goals one by one, Boyles said the City intends to be "more nimble, more responsible" and "anticipate better than before" in order to get the message out to the constituency before the latter hears about it elsewhere. Plans include leveraging technology via a new website and a strong social media presence while also "migrating online" any chance the City can to create more efficiencies. Boyles also spoke of the library's continued evolution and the City's current strong engagement with commissions, committees and boards (whose members are mostly local residents).

In regards to public safety and the goal to reduce crime, Boyles elaborated on the benefit of the new crime analyst position. As example, officers recently made an arrest after a prediction that an incident would take place in town during a certain time frame. Other new implementations include a drone program, installation of automatic license plate readers, a security data platform to ensure communication even if all networks are down, and a new radio network in conjunction with six other cities. Boyles additionally touched upon the disaster preparedness strategic plan as well as moves in place to measure the number of people trained for the Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) as well as those signed up on Nixle and Everbridge. The City will also look at the percentage of its own staff members who are trained and there will be both announced and unannounced drills to determine who will be reachable in the event of an emergency.

To bolster a "performance-based culture," Boyles emphasized the implementation of "metrics in all departments" and reported that an employee engagement survey is in progress with benchmarks in place to compare to other agencies. He also mentioned the search for a new city manager with the upcoming retirement of Greg Carpenter, whom Boyles referred to as "a walking encyclopedia of El Segundo."

For local infrastructure, Boyles lamented that capital improvement projects in past years got "kicked down the road" due to financial limitations. But with healthier reserves in place, the City funded many projects as part of a 20-year road map that will ultimately cost at least \$50 million. Examples of such projects include park playground renovations, a new entryway sign at Imperial and Main, and downtown lighting installation. The mayor also promised, "We will be renovating The Plunge."

Other key upcoming projects include the Teen Center redesign (with the help of El Segundo High School), restoration of multi-sport athletic fields, and Partners in Park improvements: LA Kings inline hockey rinks, AYSO shade structures at Center Street Elementary School, and El Segundo Unified site improvements (parking lot) at Richmond Street Field. Boyles also said evaluation is underway for enhanced fiber connection in Smoky Hollow. Meanwhile, El Segundo Boulevard is pegged for pothole repairs and a pilot parking program on the west side of the artery near Main.

Major commercial projects highlighted included the Continental Development Corporation/Mar Ventures creative office, retail, restaurant and medical complex on Raytheon property; and Torrance Memorial's plan to take 40,000 square feet of space in town.

Looking at congestion issues, Boyles reported on the Nash Street/Park Place project to connect to Hughes Parkway with potential for adjacent land development. Funding could come from multiple sources.

Boyles additionally mentioned Hackman Capital Partners' 350,000 square feet of creative office space, which also promises some "major anchor tenants." He noted that negotiations are in progress to complete the deal to bring TopGolf to town and lauded the arrival of the new AC Hotel complete with a rooftop deck. Also in the works are the EVA Air property across from Campus El Segundo, creative space at the Wyle Laboratories site and Smoky Hollow Industries' project. Boyles added that the City is "considering residential on the west side of PCH" for the first time - specifically in the area of the former Hacienda property and unused parking lots.

The mayor also singled out the Lakers' and Kings' efforts in launching e-sports and praised LA Times owner and entrepreneur Dr. Patrick Soon-Shiong who is building an e-sports arena in town and is involved in numerous projects and properties here. Boyles additionally announced that "Barbie just turned 60" and that "El Segundo is hip," pointing to the unprecedented

number of waiting lists at local restaurants. Boyles was pleased to report that the City currently has its largest reserves in history. "We want to be prepared," he said for when (not if) the next recession happens. On that note, he spoke of arbitration agreements with local bargaining units to come out with fair outcomes for both sides. He also said the City continues to explore ways to increase El Segundo's meager portion of each property tax dollar collected. He reminded the audience that over 95 percent of general fund monies come from businesses – not residential property tax.

Looking at the harsh specter of increasing pension liability costs, Boyles said the City saved \$6.2 million through steps such as prepayments to reduce interest. He also noted the ongoing "head count freeze" that requires any new hires must be offset elsewhere. "We are being fiscal stewards of our taxpayer dollars," he said.

On the defense side, Boyles said that LA Air Force Base is "working on really good stuff" and explained that long acquisition cycles can't keep up with the latest technologies. With that in mind, he praised the work of local business Starburst Accelerator for bringing in "so many fledgling aerospace companies" in its role as the world's first space-based start-up accelerator.

Another unique piece of data: Ten percent of the region's co-work space inventory is in El Segundo. "We've got young, hungry, innovative companies coming to town," Boyles said.


