El Segundo Middle Schooler with Medical Career Ambitions Organizes Blood Drive

"What do you want to be when you grow up?" This is a common question asked of kids for countless generations. Yet when one is only 13 years old, it's understandable not to have a definitive answer. Regardless, the response will oftentimes change over time. But for El Segundo Middle School eighth-grade student Siena Patten, her future career goal already seems set in stone, and she has begun the strategic initial steps to reach her ultimate objective. "I want to become a surgeon because it has been a lifelong dream of mine to help people and even save their lives," she said. She also narrowed down her preferred area of specialization. "To be a heart surgeon takes a lot of work and to achieve that, I plan to work hard to get outstanding grades that hopefully get me into college and end later med school."

Siena's ambitious aspirations prompted her to organize a blood drive for her class community service project. The event will take place on Friday, April 18, from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. in the Middle School gym. "The idea for the blood drive came from my interest in medicine and wanting to make a real impact in the community," she explained. "Blood donations save lives, and I wanted to encourage more people to donate by organizing this event. Our goal is to have at least 45 participants to make a meaningful contribution." For the program that takes place on Good Friday, the American Red Cross will be present to oversee the donation process and ensure the proceedings move along seamlessly.

All of Siena's eighth-grade classmates undertake their own community service project, typically chosen at the beginning of the school year in September. The planning to completion stages can span over seven months. "These are organized by my middle school principal, Mrs. Davlantis, but my supervisor is my teacher, Mr. Lee," Siena noted. Projects can be anything from beach cleanups to local homeless shelters."

Siena welcomed the challenge of taking on her first community service project and feels it will help her as she moves on to the next level in her education. "This one will help prepare me for senior year of high school when we have to do a sort of end-of-the-year project," she explained.

That Edison Bill Might Be a Fake

A Manhattan Beach resident recently received an email about her Southern California Edison bill, and she was stunned by the contents. "Your Past Balance is due now," the email read, advising her to pay \$400-plus without delay.

"Please do not wait any longer as you may be at risk of disconnection of service," read the email bearing the familiar Edison logo. It was a scam, and several South Bay people said it came their way in February. Because this email looks authentic and offers the recipient payment options, it would be easy to believe.

According to the power company, scammers have targeted Southern California Edison customers in the new year with phone calls and emails designed to sound

and read like the real deal. Fraudsters have already tried hundreds of times to fool customers into paying bills they don't owe, and while convincing, these schemes often put people in a panic and deliberately rush them into making a bad decision.

The Manhattan Beach woman took her time and noticed some errors on the so-called late bill. Her last name was missing, and the four digits on her account number weren't right either, she said. Most importantly, she didn't click on a link marked "Manage My Account" in the email. Instead, she paused.

For good measure, she shared an image of the fake bill and let her online neighbors know they could be next. "This

Charmion (Char) Jean Van Drie

Charmion (Char) Jean Van Drie, 96, passed away peacefully at her home on March 31, 2025. In the days before her sudden passing, she was with friends, family, and the Church Bell Choir which she loved so dearly.

Char was born on October 13, 1928, near Greeley, Iowa, to Harlan and Edith Lou Luense. She grew up on the family farm with her sisters, filling her child-

hood with music, basketball, and adventures on the farm which she always carried in her heart. After graduating from Greeley High School in 1945, where she played clarinet in the band and won the state free throw championship, she earned her teaching degree from the University of Dubuque and began a 67-year journey as a teacher and mentor.

On June 15, 1950, Char married Gerhardt "Dutch" Van Drie. They built a rich and full life together, moving from Iowa to Arizona to California, eventually settling in El Segundo in 1968. Though she spent most of her life in sunny California, Char was always a proud Iowan who loved peonies, lilacs, and red cardinals.

Char's love language was thoughtful correspondence — clipping articles, mailing handwritten letters and potluck recipes, and never missing the chance to send the perfect card for just the right occasion. She was a welcoming hostess who made sure no one ever left her home hungry, and her mischievous sense of humor lit up every gathering. (Family legend has it she only swore once in her life — during a particularly competitive game of Hearts.)

She cherished flowers, sports (especially women's basketball and the LA Angels), big books, potlucks, and spirited conversations about the world. She loved her family and friends fiercely and deeply, no matter the distance or time apart. Most of all, Char loved the Lord, walking faithfully with Him every day of her life.

Char is preceded in death by her parents, her husband Dutch,

and her daughter Jeanine. She is survived by her children Gary, Mary, and Alan; her grandchildren Jamie, Kyle, LX, and Christy; her great-grandchildren Rae, Sophia, and Layne; and her dear sisters Joann Ackman and Wanda Wilson, along with many beloved nieces, nephews, and extended family.


<u>Check It Out</u>

Murtagh by Christopher Paolini

Are you a fan of fantasy? Do you like thrilling tales of power and betrayal, of dragons and magic? Then be sure to check out the novel, *Murtagh*, the fifth installment in the Inheritance Cycle by Christopher Paolini, detailing the travels and travails of Murtagh, a young Dragon Rider.

While the first four books in the series focus on the adventures of Eragon, Murtagh, Eragon's half-brother, is the protagonist in this book. The story unfolds in a small town where Murtagh discovers a clue to a powerful new enemy. He is faced with many choices and challenges as he adventures between

bustling cities to the towering mountains of the Spine of the World. He unravels a great conspiracy and must face powerful foes who stand in his way. Paolini's detailed descriptions of the people and battles really make you feel like you are right there, fighting alongside him as mountains are toppled and the earth erupts with fire. Murtagh is a bit more confident than Eragon, and at times is downright arrogant, but he's still a compelling main character. He can also be kind and courageous and a good friend. He won't back down or give up in the face of danger.

If you're a fan of Eragon and the other books in the Inheritance Cycle, you'll love this newest chapter in the series. If you've never picked up Eragon, then I highly recommend you check it out from the library and get yourself started on this five book journey, which culminates in the fun and fantastic Murtagh. •

The Luckiest Man in America Review: Get Rich, Scam Trying


An underdog story is usually an easy crowd favorite. Throw in a large cash prize, like Slumdog Millionaire, and you'll no doubt have a box office winner. Director Samir Oliveros doesn't stray far from this tried and true formula in *The Luckiest Man in America*. The result is an enjoyable yet mediocre historical dramatization that doesn't move the needle much one way or the other. The film is now playing in theaters nationwide.

Based on actual events from 1984, *The Luckiest Man in America* stars Paul Walter Hauser as Michael Larson, an unemployed ice cream truck driver from Ohio. A huge

fan of the "Press Your Luck" game show, he is ultimately selected to compete in an upcoming episode. This marks a life-changing moment for Michael, who makes it known that any prize money will be going towards ensuring his daughter's wellbeing. Michael's initial game show debut is rocky. He quickly loses any acquired amount of money due to his poor judgment, as well as curses on TV. Michael Larson is the epitome of an underdog engaging in a losing public battle.

However, after a quick commercial break, Michael's luck begins to change. His bets start paying off big time, and he quickly racks up



El Segundo's Eagles are in Control

With spring break upon us for high school sports it marks the halfway point of the season. The El Segundo Eagles' softball, baseball, golf and volleyball teams have lived up to their preseason hype. The softball team is in control of the Pioneer League and the baseball team flexed their muscles in their quest for a league title. The boy's golf team is dominating the Ocean League while the volleyball team competes in an arduous Bay League.

Softball Team Aims for First

The Eagles have played a demanding schedule to date. Of their twenty games played, they have faced sixteen teams with winning records. Five of those teams are highly touted CIF-SS Division 1 teams. The Eagles ran their Pioneer League record to 3-0 with a pair of wins over North Torrance and Torrance


The win over North Torrance was a one-sided 15-3 win. The Eagles benefitted from nine walks along with fourteen hits to defeat the Saxons. Sophomore catcher Marilyn McCaverty led the Eagles with three hits and four RBIs. Kacey Ekstrom had the only extra base hit for the Eagles and four RBIs. Jacy Lindsay gave up one hit while striking out seven to pick up her thirteenth win of the season.

The 1-0 win over Torrance was a pitcher's duel between the Tartar's Emma Hayashida and the Eagle's Jacy Lindsay. Hayashida and Lindsay battled each other all game long, but Lindsay came out on top, scattering four hits and striking out five. The Tartars had scoring opportunities but Lindsay pitched out of a few tight jams. In the sixth inning, Torrance had two runners on with no out, and Lindsay got a pop fly and two strikeouts to end the threat. The Eagles' only run came in the third inning when Sienna Mayer singled and later scored on a bases-loaded walk to Jaz Ramos.

The Eagles control their own destiny and are 3-0 in the Pioneer League. They will enjoy the

Baseball Team on Top of Pioneer League Standings

The Eagles played host to the Da Vincci Wolves in the first game of a home-and-home Pioneer League series. The first game was a marathon game in which the Eagles had 12 hits, walked eight times, and stole eight bases. However, they stranded eleven runners and lost 11-5.

The loss left a bitter taste, and the Eagles rebounded in the next game to manhandle the Wolves 18-7. The Eagles pounded out seventeen hits and benefited from eight walks and three hit batters. With the score 4-4, the Eagles scored seven runs in the sixth inning and seven more in the seventh inning to take an 18-4 lead. The Wolves' short-lived three-run seventh-inning rally came up short, and the Eagles won 18-7.

A nonleague match up with the Torrance Tartars was another long three-hour game. The Eagles took advantage of five walks, three balks, and two hits in the first inning to score six runs and go on to win 13-7.

The win pushed the Eagles' season record to 14-3-1, including a first-place 5-2 record in the Pioneer League.

Kemer Brett Memorial Golf Tournament

The annual Kemer Brett Golf Tournament is set for Friday, May 9, with a shotgun start time at 1 p.m. The tournament, named after El Segundo baseball great and former Major League pitcher Ken Brett, benefits the El Segundo American Legion baseball program. It will be played at the refurbished Chester L. Washington Golf Course, with the after-party at the Old Town Patio, which is under new ownership.

Golf Team Poised for Fantastic Finish

The Eagles have run their team match record to 16-0 overall including an 8-0 record

in Ocean League play. Also on their resume is a win over Chaminade, the ninth-ranked team in the CIF's latest polls. The Eagles placed second in the South Bay Invitational behind Loyola, the top-ranked CIF team and ranked tenth nationally. So, the Eagles are looking for a strong second half of the season which includes two high-profile tournaments.

Head coach David March says he is impressed with the team's overall progress. "Our individual and team scores are trending in the right direction. My goal was always to peak as a group as we enter our tournament portion of the match season." He says the time they spent in the weight room and the early season matches have put them in a position to be successful later in the season. "We are prepared both physically and mentally to compete with some of the country's best high school golf teams as our season comes to a close." Coach March says their best golf, as a team, is still ahead of them. He added that to the player's credit they have consistently performed at their best when it matters the most.

The Eagles' win over Chaminade provided insight into how well the Eagles have been playing. It was a big win versus the ninthranked team in CIF. The team score was 323-353(the team par score is 320), so the Eagles were only three over par as a team combined. The Eagles were led by Lukas Da Silva 62 (-2), Jack Harris 63 (-1), and Shaan Ty Patel 65 (+1).

The Eagles faced West Torrance in a couple of league matches and took care of the Warriors 188-225 in the first match and 160-190 in the second one. Lukas Da Silva 36(E) and Joey Schobel 37(+1)led their team in the first match, while Jack Harris 30(-2), Lukas Da Silva 31(-1), and Shaan Ty Patel 32(E) shined in the second match.

The South Bay Invitational, hosted by Peninsula High School and played at Lakewood

Country Club, is an 18-hole tournament team format. It brings together some of the Southland's top seven programs, including Loyola, Mira Costa, Calabasas, Peninsula, Arcadia, and Quartz Hill. Four players scored in the 70s, led by Shaan Ty Patel 73 (+1), Lukas Da Silva 74 (+2), Jack Harris 76 (+4), and Remy Romero 78 (+6). The Eagles finished second out of seven high-profile schools.

El Segundo's dominance in league play was apparent with their sweep of North Torrance. The nine-hole team score was 161-200 (team par is 160, so they were an impressive one over as a team). Jack Harris 30(-2), Shaan Ty Patel 30(-2) and Remy Romero 32(E) led the Eagles

The second match at Alondra Golf Course was another impressive showing. The team score was 184-226; the team par is 180. Shaan Ty Patel 35 (-1), Jack Harris 36(E), and Lukas Da Silva 37 (+1) were impressive.

This week, the Eagles are entered in the Champions Invitational Tournament in Palm Springs. The tournament hosts some of the top high school teams in the nation and includes teams from Canada. It will push the Eagles to their limits in the three rounds played at the demanding Tahquitz Golf Course. It is one of the country's top high school golf tournaments covered by Yahoo Sports and SI.

Next week, the Eagles will be tested in the Walnut Tournament, where twenty of the top Division teams in the CIF-SS will compete. The Eagles are looking to improve on their third-place finish from last season, and this should be a preview of what to expect in team CIF post-season play.

Eagles Push Redondo to Five Games in Volleyball

The Eagles are in the Bay League, one of the most competitive leagues in the CIF. Mira Costa is the top-ranked team in the nation,



thousands of dollars in winnings. The game show host (White Lotus star Walton Goggins) is in disbelief, as are the other contestants and studio audience. Michael's winning streak also catches the attention of the control room, who are quick to act. What they discover about Michael is beyond their wildest dreams. Behind the dopey small-town facade is a calculated mastermind who is using mental tricks and memory patterns to beat the system at their

The Luckiest Man in America is an enjoyable movie for those who want surface-level entertainment. The film's billing as a "thriller" does feel a bit misleading though, as "drama" feels more accurate. The story itself is a fascinating one and filmmaker Samir Oliveros' instincts to bring this to the screen are applauded. Even if the film feels flat due to the lack of character development, there is no question that Paul Walter Hauser makes for a compelling leading man. Had the film delved deeper into Michael's psychological development to truly get a dynamic portrait of this complicated man, it would have been more satisfying. If you're looking for a fun and lighthearted watch, The Luckiest Man in America may be the film for you. One has to wonder though if a documentary would have been more compelling than this scripted version. Neverthe-



less, it's an enjoyable cinematic escape that

clocks in at a sharp 90 minutes. The Luckiest



chosen career in medicine by taking biomedical sciences classes in high school. She also plans to sign up for CPR courses and learn the Heimlich maneuver over the summer. She realizes these are key first steps of a lengthy process she hopes will ultimately result in her earning the esteemed title of Dr. Siena Patten.

Siena's parents, Kimberly and Blake, are both architects who brought the family to town about eight years ago. "They decided to move to El Segundo because they wanted to raise me in an environment with people I already knew," Siena said. "It seemed like a great place to raise a family, and because it has a great school district. I also have a younger brother, Asher, who's in fifth grade. I like living and going to school here because of our amazing small-town community, the great people here, and because the beach is so close to us."

Siena noted that those interested in donating blood on April 18 can sign up in advance via one of her flyers or through her social media posts. Said flyer features a photo of youngsters with the headline "Future Blood Donor: Hope begins with you." Donors may also reserve an appointment time by going to RedCrossBlood. org and entering: ElSegundo MS. To further

streamline the process and to save time, participants can log into RedCrossBloos.org/ RapidPass to complete a pre-donation reading and answer health history questions. The Red Cross website lists the various health factors that can disqualify potential donors, how often one can donate, and the blood types accepted, among other key points. The organization collects nearly 4.5 million blood donations and over one million platelet donations annually.

Upon arrival at the Middle School gym, donors will get their temperature, blood pressure, and hemoglobin checked. All information revealed during the interview will be private and confidential. Donors must be 17 or older (16 with parental consent), weigh at least 110 pounds, and be in good health.

Siena hopes she can do her part in raising awareness about the importance of giving blood, as there isn't always enough of it to go around. Despite the aforementioned Red Cross collection numbers, only three percent of age-eligible people actually donate. Thus, the supply often does not meet overall demand.

"This drive is important because donated blood can help accident victims, surgery patients and people with medical conditions who rely on transfusions," Siena emphasized. •

was a really good fake. Glad you reminded people," a neighbor replied in an online chat.

People say scammers have pretended to be the Gas Company, Verizon, Spectrum, Chase, PG&E and iCloud. A Lawndale woman wrote, "I'm glad I saw this. I probably would have paid it."

There are a number of schemes going around that utility customers and their families should know about, says staff writer Taylor Hillo with Edison. It's exhausting to keep track of all the scams, but here's a start:

Fake website: This fraud uses a fake email or a text message to trick someone into clicking and paying online. Best defense: Use only a trusted website and consider bookmarking SCE.com for safety.

Urgency phone scam: A caller says money is owned and must be paid. Edison agents don't pressure customers or discourage them from verifying that Edison is calling. And they don't ask for credit card information over the phone.

Discount phone scam: If a caller offers you a discount if you pay over the phone, it's a scam. Hang up!

Prepaid cards: Silence is golden when a scammer calls and gives a person directions to go in a store and buy a prepaid card, but adds "don't tell the clerk it's to pay a utility bill." Edison does not accept prepaid cards, Zelle or bitcoin as payment, and many retailers know this and train their employees to detect fraud.

Barcode scams: Never ever send money using a barcode that someone emails or texts.

Other telltale signs that a criminal is pulling a fast one: Edison does not have a disconnection department, and it's a lie that the utility removes electric meters for late or non-payments.

Slow down fraudsters from rushing you into falling for their con with this simple move. Claim to be busy and ask for a callback number, then hang up. The pause allows a person to verify the number is legitimate.

The FBI's Elder Fraud Report warned that scams that bilked Americans 60 and older were up 11 percent in 2023. Criminals stole more than \$3.4 billion from older Americans

that year. The Los Angeles office of the FBI said that complaints filed by elderly victims jumped by double digits, 14 percent, in one year, indicating "cybercriminals continue to

seek ways to profit from our dependence

on technology by launching a variety of attacks."


As Baby Boomers grow more tech-savvy, their lexicon of cyber schemes must grow, too, or they risk being scammed by phishing, spoofing, or extortion, the L.A. FBI office warned. Tech support fraud was the No. 1 type of crime that seniors reported to authorities. Call center schemes overwhelmingly target older adults, to devastating effect, according to the FBI. Almost half of the victims who contacted police or the FBI were over 60, and they incurred almost \$770 million in losses.

"Complainants over the age of 60 lost more to these scams than all other age groups combined, and reportedly remortgaged/foreclosed homes, emptied retirement accounts, and borrowed from family and friends to cover losses in these scams. Some victims have reportedly taken their own lives because of shame or loss of sustainable income," the L.A. FBI office said last year.

In January, the El Segundo Police Department warned residents that identity thieves are posing as the Internal Revenue Service and using phone calls, emails, texts, and social media messages to trap unsuspecting people. Watch for spelling errors or incorrect grammar, a link with a misspelled URL, or one like IRS.com. The Internal Revenue Service only sends links that go to irs.gov., warns the ESPD.

Disregard any threatening or urgent requests for pay now with a link to a pay site. The IRS does not leave pre-recorded messages or send messages that threaten or are marked "urgent." To verify a message or a request from a person claiming to work for the IRS, call the IRS customer service number at 800-829-1040 for individuals and 800-829-4933 for businesses.




