Brenda Newman Celebrates 50 Years of Gemology in the City of El Segundo

“You are literally given twenty stones, and you have to get one hundred percent identification on these unknown twenty stones.”
Brenda Newman is a graduate gemologist and the CEO of The Jewelry Source in El Segundo. She discusses getting her education in gemology. “It’s very difficult, but it does set you apart,” she says. Her store is an American Gem Society store, a title for which less than five percent of jewelry stores in the nation qualify.

Newman’s history with El Segundo begins with her grandparents, who moved to the city in the early 1940s for work at Chevron. Her mother graduated class of ’48 and married her father, a firefighter in the area. Growing up in El Segundo, she began to think about potential job prospects.

In her junior year of high school (1974), Brenda got a job at a jewelry store. Every working day of her life since has been spent in the jewelry business. After working for a couple of larger stores, and a small jeweler, she decided she wanted to open her own business. In the 80s, she explains, beading was very in fashion. So she started her own beading and repair business, selling her work at popups in places like Nordstrom and repairing broken jewelry.

This business, which she called The Jewelry Source with her then business partner, grew from an idea into eight square feet, which grew into a 450 square foot brick and mortar, and finally resulted in her buying the entire building and expanding the store into what it is today.

Working with trusted partners, Newman sells pieces that are classic and unique. She sells everything from earrings, to necklaces, to engagement rings. What makes her especially noteworthy is the way that she interacts with her guests.

Newman lives above the store. To walk into the retail space downstairs is to see an eclectic mix of cases, furniture, and a cozy feel. Brenda says she didn’t like the idea of a counter between the jeweler and the customer, because ultimately, each piece is a collaboration.

For example, for an engagement ring, a couple might come in and discuss with her the center stone shape they are most drawn to. “Everything is based around the center stone,” she says. Then the couple will discuss a setting that most interests them, and Newman and her team will come up with a selection of options for stones and settings and metals to fit their unique wants and budget. Before the ring actually gets made with metal, they create a mold of it to show as an example

El Segundo’s Debra Sullivan Will Not Take No for an Answer

El Segundo’s Debra Sullivan’s bio lists her as an “actress/writer/producer.” I guess that in 2021 the term actress has been supplanted by the generic “actor,” so we will go with that.

Sullivan, whose presence has graced the environs of El Segundo for nearing three decades, said she lives by the mantra of “a life lived in fear...is a life half lived,” which is a line from the movie *Strictly Ballroom*, a 1992 Australian film that made a significant impact on the lives of Sullivan and her husband/writing partner Adam Marcus, and was a film that Sullivan and Marcus viewed on one of their initial dates.

As an actor, she has accumulated credits in countless films, plays, television shows, and commercials. Sullivan has notched lead or recurring roles in *Criminal Minds*, *Private Practice*, *Big Love*, *ER*, and *Cold Case*. Her resume also features roles in the daytime soap operas (no longer called soap operas, Sullivan corrected me, now referred to as daytime dramas), where she portrayed, among other roles, a businesswoman, a neighbor, and a hard-working OB/GYN nurse. Among her daytime drama credits are stints on *Days of Our Lives*, *The Bold and the Beautiful*, and *The Young and the Restless*.

In films, she has appeared in *Conspiracy* and *The Long Goodbye*, amongst other

Film Review

'Gunda' Review: A Wordless Film of a Mother Pig Stuns in Black and White

Extreme animals rights activist Joaquin Phoenix has teamed up with director Victor Kossakovsky and NEON to bring the arthouse film *Gunda* to the big screen. Taking on an executive producer role, Phoenix's passion in support of the film is clear, stating, "Kossakovsky has crafted a visceral meditation on existence that transcends the normal barriers that separate species. It is a film of profound importance and artistry."

Shot in black and white and with no dialogue or soundtrack, *Gunda* chronicles the unfiltered lives of a mother pig, a flock of chickens, and a herd of cows with masterful intimacy. This observational documentary sits in a class of its own with its quietly commanding message of animal symbiosis in the natural world.

Nothing pulls at my heartstrings more than a good animal documentary that is authentic in its storytelling and not set up to create

maximum emotional impact. On the contrary, *Gunda's* lack of any narrative whatsoever is what makes the film so devastatingly beautiful. It requires some mental stamina to sit through, at times I had to wonder if the camera was left accidentally rolling for minutes on end before any sort of action or movement appears in frame. Confident in its directorial choices and unique sensibilities, it's no surprise that Viktor Kossakovsky calls *Gunda* his most personal and important film he has made as a filmmaker and as a human being.

Gunda is the definition of an experimental film, and I've never seen anything quite like it. It's not really comparable to the beloved David Attenborough BBC documentaries because there is no dialogue whatsoever here. It stands apart from the nature docs on Disney+ because of its drastic black & white look. *Gunda's* stark beauty resembles

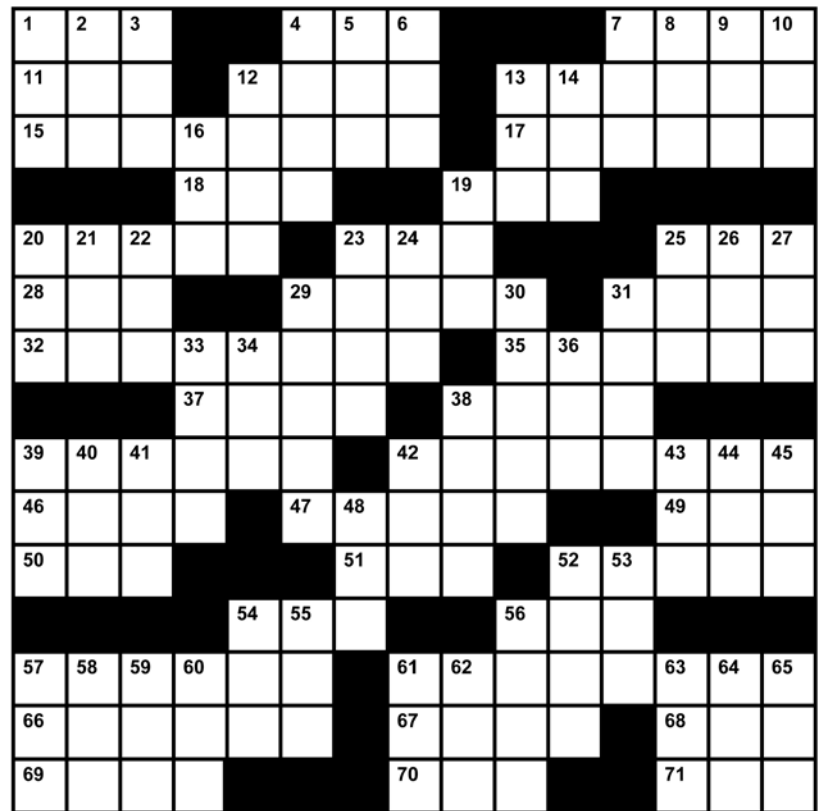

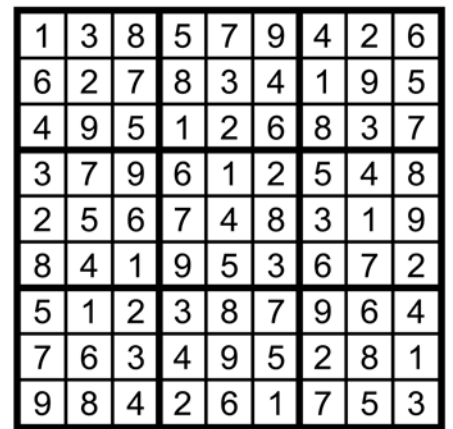
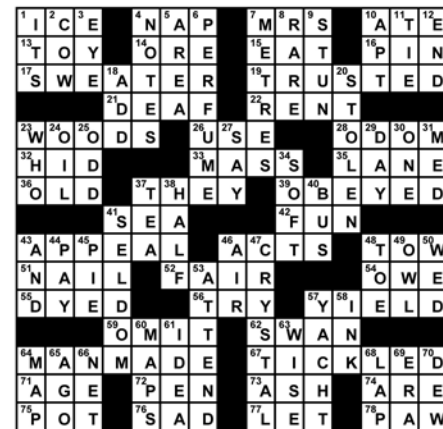

and get final approval. Truly, each experience is custom and a process that fits the specific needs of the customer.

Other times, Newman says, jewelry is brought into her store for repairs or reworking. This could be an inherited gemstone, an old wedding ring, a broken necklace, or something vintage to be recut. "It's all about emotion," she says, an element of jewelry not often considered. The most emotionally difficult project she's worked on was a jewelry assignment in the wake of 9/11. Douglass Mortuary had retrieved items from several victims of the tragedy and asked if Brenda could repair all of the jewelry that they found to be returned to the victims' families.

"I'll never forget, I said, 'Oh my god, this piece of jewelry. This band, it's flat as a pancake,'" she recalls. Among several wedding bands, many had names engraved in them, and many were completely destroyed in the disaster. She got all of the pieces in presentable condition and watched on the news as a

husband's wedding ring was returned to his widow, who would now wear it as a pendant to remember him by.

"The world was in chaos at that time, and

here we're holding a baggie of what remains of Todd Beamer's watch he wore that day," she describes. In her own life, her most personal piece of jewelry is a ring she keeps on

her charm bracelet. After the passing of her father, she inserted an angel into his wedding ring, which her mother wore as a necklace for many years. At the passing of her mother, she combined the stone from her mother's ring with her father's band, and she wears it on her wrist every day.

On May 5th, her store is holding its annual estate sale full of vintage jewelry. From pieces cut back in the 1800s to a 14-carat gold toothpick given to Ryan O'Neal by Farah Fawcett, she sees the full range of jewelry come through her space.

Every piece of jewelry, old or new, has a story. That's what Brenda specializes in. The stones can be learned, the metals can be shaped, but ultimately, each piece tells a story that uniquely belongs to the person wearing it. Brenda Newman uses her gem skills to help shape each story.

offerings. As well as appearing in a couple of films directed by her husband: *Let it Snow* and the cheeky and dark movie *Secret Santa*.

Sullivan said that she is the only one in her family who cultivated a fervent interest in the arts, sharing how some family members consider her "insane." As a child, Sullivan was all about performing, whether it be as a ballet dancer, singer, or budding actor. She would knock on neighbors' doors, she said, and offer to sing for them in exchange for the princely sum of a quarter. And when it rained, she would cloister up and write, which led her to put pen to paper and producing plays and screenplays.

Sullivan said her celluloid turn as "the most horrible mother on the planet" in the 2018 released movie *Secret Santa*, in which she not only starred in, but co-wrote the screenplay, and co-produced the pic, was "the best time of my life, making that movie." She categorized *Secret Santa* as a horror-comedy, which allowed her to "use my comedy chops, and play a part that I am not normally cast in." *Secret Santa* was the initial foray into film production by Skeleton Crew Productions, a company formed by Sullivan, Marcus, and Bryan S. Sexton.

Not one to limit herself, Sullivan has also appeared in theatrical productions, including *One Quarter Cup*, and *One West Wacker*.

An admitted Valley Girl, Sullivan moved to El Segundo more than a quarter century ago and is married to writer/director/producer Marcus of *Friday the 13th* fame. Sullivan said that she settled in El Segundo because her father mandated that, as an 18-year-old living in the Valley, it was time for her to fly the coop and learn to fend for herself while also counseling her to select a city that was "safe."

Sullivan's father's secretary lived in El Segundo and touted the town as a nice, safe city to move to, and Sullivan heeded the advice. She has not regretted her relocation to El Segundo.

"For the most part," she said, "everyone in town is very friendly." She also noted that many of her acquaintances are not exactly sure where

our little town is located, and she is more than happy to keep them guessing. She said that when her friends would query whether El Segundo was in Orange County, she would helpfully, although not truthfully, tell them, "yes, yes, it is!"

Sullivan collaborates with Marcus in multiple

ways. When approached by this scribe to get a few thoughts on his wife, Marcus emailed back that he would be glad to "spill the dirt" on his "brilliant" wife. Alas, no dirt was spilled. He had nothing but glowing comments on his wife of more than 20 years and writing and business partner. Marcus said, commenting on Sullivan's acting skills, "that if she and I were not married, I would still cast her in everything that I am involved in. Debra was an award-winning playwright when I met her. I had read her work and told her that we should join forces. The extraordinary thing about Deb is that she writes men better than I do, and I write women better than she does." Continued Marcus: "We listen to the opposite sex, which is why we have been married so long and are so happy. We are both really good listeners, and that is why our writing styles work so well with each other. I married my best friend." It was Sullivan who decided that the couple would move to El Segundo. "She makes these

incredible, sweeping decisions," Marcus said, "that makes my life so much better."

"She is the single best mother that I have seen," Marcus said of Sullivan, who has two children from a previous marriage. "The day that I met Debra is truly the luckiest day in

my life. Marcus spoke of the "A life lived in fear" quote that drives Sullivan. "It is the way Deb lives her life," he said. "That movie was everything to us, incredibly influential on our romance, but for Deb, that became her mantra. My wife is fearless, which sometimes makes my life a bit of a high-wire act (but) we are a perfectly-matched set."

Mira Delaney has known Debra for five years. Delaney takes acting classes from Adam and Debra. "She is one of the best women that I have ever met in my life...incredibly warm and strong," Delaney said. "She loves El Segundo so much. They are both great ambassadors for the city of El Segundo, because they tell everyone how much they love it." When she visits the city, Delaney feels the vibe of "an incredibly friendly" city. "Debra Sullivan is one of the people who I am most grateful for, because of her humanity, and her humor, and the support of everyone around her. She is such an extraordinary actress, has such depth and

warmness, she listens so deeply. Any chance I have to work with her, I think that I have hit the jackpot." Debra and Adam," continued Delaney, both make this world a better and happier place."

Delaney was familiar with the "life lived in fear" line from the *Strictly Ballroom* film and correlated those words with the actions of Sullivan, calling that mantra "A bar she sets for herself and encourages all the rest of us to examine," which has prompted Delaney, she said, to challenge herself to achieve similar accomplishments.

Melissa Corkern has been friends with Sullivan for more than 20 years. She is a fabulous actor," Corkern said. "A fabulous person, there is a real depth to her. She sees the things outside of her, is very compassionate. She is very empathetic, (which not only) makes her a good actor, but a good friend. Sometimes you need tough love, sometimes you need a shoulder to cry on." She called Sullivan a "surrogate mother" to the actors who take acting classes from Marcus and Sullivan. "She guides everybody and pushes them in the right direction. To know Deb is to be loved by Deb. She is tireless, always going, a miracle to watch."

Debra Sullivan lives the motto, "never take no for an answer." She related a story from back-in-the-day when she was a student at El Camino College and was interested in auditioning for a part in the collegiate production of *The King and I*. She showed up, looking for a part in the production, but soon found out that the show had already been cast. Undeterred, Sullivan approached the powers-that-be and was told that she was out of luck. But she persisted, and soon landed a spot in the production, and even garnered some speaking lines.

Said Sullivan: "You can tell me no, (but) that doesn't mean that I am going to listen to you. If I think that I am right for something and viable, I will let people know. What have I got to lose?"

Not a bad mantra to follow. •

that of a high-fashion Vogue film, but instead of watching waif-like models describe what they eat in a day or give us a tour of their home, we're literally following a pig around a barn. It's not the most daring or visually stimulating film I've ever seen, but what gives *Gunda* its cinematic strength is the commitment to a bold aesthetic.

Gunda was apparently a 25-year project for Kossakowsky, and not once did his dedication to the project, or his vision, waiver. What he's created is an innovative documentary that breaks the traditional rules of making movies, notably to never work with animals to save unnecessary headaches and stress. Any film that relies on a wild animal as its protagonist is indebted with risk, regardless if it's a documentary or not. In *Gunda*, Kossakowsky's entire film rests on the presence of these animals. Plus, the absence of additional music or voice overs leaves so much up to chance, and capturing that unpredictability in its raw, authentic state is the film's biggest strength. The decision to shoot in black and white was intentional for an interesting reason, and seemingly in opposition

to how many filmmakers would have approached a film like this. Kossakowsky states, "I didn't want to show cute pink piglets -and believe me, they are very cute indeed. I didn't want to seduce the viewer in

that way. It felt to me like black and white makes us focus on their soul rather than their appearance."

Unlike some animal rights documentaries that are overly graphic and attention seeking,

the message behind *Gunda* isn't forceful or political. It's a simple message that asks us to slow down and experience life as the animals do. *Gunda* asks us to meditate on the mystery of animal consciousness and think about how we contribute to their way of life. Can we do better?
