When El Segundo's longtime City Clerk Tracy Weaver opted not to seek a fourth term, either voters could elect a potential write-in candidate, or the City Council would have to interview and appoint someone to fill the position. When local resident Tim Truax read about the vacancy in the Herald, he strongly encouraged his wife, Susan, to pursue the write-in route. After some additional goading, she decided to throw her hat in the ring. "I received calls about the open position from several friends and acquaintances, and when I ran into my former neighbor at the hair salon-and she pretty much insisted I pull papers-I went



Students Get an Education in AI Since 'It's Here to Stay'

El Segundo parents viewed a tutorial last week about artificial intelligence and its use in the classroom. The short answer is that AI prepares students to live and work in an increasingly digital society.

District officials began thinking in 2023 about how AI could be introduced into El Segundo classrooms in a manner that promotes "responsible and effective Al use, with an emphasis on digital citizenship and enhancing the learning experience," they announced in December of that year. ESUSD partnered with an AI educational safety alliance and developed policies and rules so teachers and students are in lockstep.


Generative AI, a narrow type of technology that can solve a specific problem and gain language skills, is now in use in El Segundo public schools, according to Phuong Uzoff, the El Segundo Unified District instructional technology coach. On an Aug. 16 Zoom session for district parents, she explained that the AI platform the district selected, called MagicSchool, acts like a tutor.

She added that teachers' jobs are safe, and MagicSchool aims to build criticalthinking skills, which is a question that comes up frequently from parents. Teachers bring creativity, humor, and empathy to a classroom-qualities that See AI, page 9



Raymond Gen September 25, 1958 – April 17, 2025

Beloved teacher, writer, and educational leader Dr. Raymond Gen died unexpectedly on April 17, 2025. He was known by family, friends, and students as a dedicated and caring educator with sharp sense of humor and a love for good food.

Ray was born in Oakland, California in 1958, the first of four sons of Andrew and Corine

Gen, immigrants from the Guangdong Province of China. In 1968, the family moved to Turlock, California, where his parents started their restaurant, and the boys all worked and developed their cooking skills. Ray attended Turlock High School, where he played football and was by his own admission a mediocre student. Still, he graduated in 1976.

He found his academic identity while an undergraduate at California State University Stanislaus. At the same time, he began dating Joanne Swanson, who had been his classmate since junior high school. They married in 1979 and each continued their studies.

Ray's insatiable curiosity would eventually lead him to earn four degrees: a bachelor's degree in sociology from CSU Stanislaus, two master's degrees in theology and divinity from Fuller Theological Seminary, and a doctorate in education from Pepperdine University.

Ray and Joanne purchased their first home in Culver City, where they welcomed their son Andrew in 1991. Shortly afterwards, the family moved to El Segundo, where Ray



and Joanne became a teacher and librarian, respectively, in the city's school district.

Ray was a tireless educator for over three decades. He taught thousands of students for 31 years in English, social studies, journalism, and computer science at El Segundo High School. He also served as the chair of the English department for 16 years and was the district's

curriculum specialist in education technology for 20 years. On the side, he was an adjunct professor for 16 years in the education departments of Loyola Marymount University, Chapman University, Azusa Pacific University, and Pepperdine University. Additionally, Ray was elected to and served for 8 years on the Board of Trustees of El Camino Community College.

Ray retired in 2022 and devoted himself to his writing, which had already included published academic articles and resource books for teachers. Shortly before his death, he published his non-fiction book, The Golden Hour: Recipes and Stories from a Chinese American Restaurant, which includes memories from his childhood spent working in his parents' business. He had also completed three books of fiction, with another two in progress.

Ray is survived by his wife Joanne; his son Andrew and his fiancée Bronte Goessler; his brothers and their spouses Sherman (Bonnie) Holmes-Gen, Justin Gen, and Sheldon (Laine) Gen; Joanne's siblings Gary (Linda) Swanson and Diane (Keith) Landmeier; and ten nieces and nephews. •




A Good Girl's Guide to Murder by Holly Jackson

A school project. A closed murder case from five years ago. One determined teenager. What could go wrong, right? Well, readers find out as they follow seventeen-year-old Pippa Fitz-Amobi's deep dive into the neverending mysteries of the 2012 Andie Bell case. Author Holly Jackson paints a vivid and layered portrait of the unsettling disappearance and alleged death of Andie Bell, a beloved teenager, in her book A Good Girl's Guide To Murder. This book contains many secrets, and requires the reader to take the back seat and follow along as the characters navigate the tangled web of lies and buried secrets.

Set in Little Kilton, Buckinghamshire, Jackson's novel follows Pippa as she investigates the disappearance and possible murder of Andie Bell. The case itself was simple: Seventeen-year-old Sal Singh murdered his

girlfriend, Andie Bell, then took his own life afterward. Pip had always thought something was off about this case from five years prior, so she chose it as her topic for her Capstone Project and teamed up with Sal's younger brother to uncover the truth or at least convince the police to reopen the case.

As the investigation goes deeper and deeper, Pip finds herself becoming obsessed and soon discovers that she's become so tangled in the case that her own life is now in danger. A Good Girl's Guide To Murder has an interesting aspect to it; the clues to solve the mystery are rooted in the secrets Little Kilton>s residents tried so hard to bury. Because of this, we as readers are more like the audience in the situation, forced to sit back and watch the chaos unfold. A good analogy for the readers> awareness is Pip>s Evidence Log. As she catalogs more information, so do we, and we are made to change our predictions at every other twist. 


ESHS Tennis Team **Celebrates Its Seniors**

Ryan: Suspicion (1941)

The festival opened with a film I had never seen before: Suspicion (1941), Alfred Hitchcock's fourth feature. True to its title, the film delivered suspense in the director's signature style-a pulpy, romantic mystery starring Joan Fontaine and Cary Grant. The story follows a shy young heiress who marries a charming gentleman, only to suspect he may be plotting to kill her. 



Best of luck to these three seniors as they help carve out their niche in life, knowing that the tennis program will be better due to their contributions.


Softball Team Splits Pioneer League Games

don't come across on a small screen in a computer lab.

"It will never replace humans. We're in control," Uzoff said, addressing a major concern that some people express about computers that can get smarter. AI's not perfect, but "It's here to stay," she added.

MagicSchool is used across all grade levels in the El Segundo district. However, children under 13 must get parental permission and be properly trained to use the site. Participation is encouraged but not mandatory.

According to Uzoff, the best practices for using AI in the classroom start with spotting bias and inaccurate information. Al literacy is the ability to recognize credible sources of information that can be shared in class or cited in a research or writing assignment. For students whose careers will require AI skills, MagicSchool is teaching another valuable lesson. It's only as good as its programming, so keep a guard up.

The district uses an 80-20 rule for students to follow when using AI on their writing and research assignments: Use AI for initial work, then for the last 20 percent, "add your final touch," which includes a review for bias and accuracy. Another rule, "Your Judgement Matters," advises students to use AI content as a starting point, not the final word on a topic.

Knowing that an AI-learning system has limits — back to its last training update means news articles and podcasts about recent events may be outdated. And finally, students are reminded never to include personal information, including their names, ages or home addresses, when interacting with the school's AI system. As a security feature, the district can take down any personal information that is shared accidentally.

Uzoff explained how the MagicSchool AI platform the district selected works. The program acts like a tutor, helping students to develop critical-thinking skills with their

writing assignments and presentations. However, MagicSchool does not calculate math problems well, so it's not a part of the math curriculum.

Digital assistance isn't permitted on every school assignment, nor is it 100% trustworthy. "We're still learning it's ok to use it and when it's not," Uzoff said.

As anyone who uses the popular digital assistants Siri and Alexa knows, they can be a huge help. Yet they make mistakes and get confused about what they're being asked to do. Both phone apps were created using AI to teach a computer to mimic human behavior, including listening and speaking.

AI is new and tempting for students looking for a shortcut, so the district set rules that range from No AI use to full AI use with oversight. A Level 1 1 assignment allows students to generate ideas and structure an essay or paper with the computerized learning tool. Level 2 permits editing only with AI, while Level 3 allows AI but only on certain tasks that the teacher makes known. Level 4 is full use with human oversight.

MagicSchool allows teachers to track how much a student uses the program to disincentivize cheating. The AI platform says it has no age limit for users, unlike ChatGPT, which requires its users to be at least 13 years old.

With teachers and students now up to speed on using MagicSchool, the district plans to involve parents and families, too. "Part of our intent with the recent Parent Info Session was to begin including families in this learning process, with more resources planned for the future," said Marisa Janicek, assistant superintendent of educational services.

A 2024 study from the University of Southern California found that many parents couldn't say if their child's school was using AI. USC's Center for Applied Research in Education surveyed 1,800 U.S. households and found school districts that launched AI learning in classrooms hadn't communicated that fact to families. Almost 75 percent of the families were left in the dark; many learned about it from their kids, the authors said.

According to Janicek, assistant superintendent of educational services, the technology being used to improve writing and develop critical thinking has the potential to give El Segundo students a competitive advantage. She said 75 percent of employers ask for AI knowledge from their job candidates. "AI is really transforming the workforce," she added, and "we want to make our students successful and employable."

Uzoff pointed out that the public uses AI technology every day in cell phones, home electronics, self-driving cars, and face-recognition technology to access their online accounts. However, because AI is new to classrooms and education, parents naturally have questions and doubts about whether their kids need more screen time during the school day.

Maria Ott, a professor of clinical education at USC Rossier School of Education and a former superintendent, said the apprehension is normal. Like many academics in the AI field, she believes that AI will be around for a long time. Leaders should figure out how to use it to improve society.

Uzoff told parents last week that AI is loosely defined as the ability for a computer to learn and mimic human behavior. District teachers are using ChatGPT and MagicSchool for lesson planning, writing 30-40 student assessments per class at the high school, and drafting individualized educational plans for students who need them. The developer says its AI product saves teachers hours and can help them avoid burnout.

A native of Tiburon, California, Truax graduated from San Jose State University with a bachelor's degree in Public Relations. She met her husband in college and the couple got married while he was in law school at USC. An El Segundo resident since 1991 with three children who all matriculated through the local school system, she wasn't initially happy with the move to Southern California. "I often tell people Tim dragged me away from Northern California kicking and screaming, but truth be told, I cannot think of any place I'd rather live than El Segundo," she noted. "That said, we did realize early on that in choosing to raise our family here, there was a strong chance our kids would grow up to be Dodgers fans, but it was a risk worth taking. Go, Giants." Career-wise, Truax represented technology clients handling media and analyst relations for the majority of her work life. "As anyone in tech will tell you, going to the Consumer Electronics Show in Las Vegas is always a highlight, as was successfully pitching a client's product or service to a national media outlet," she said. Looking at her vision for the office, Truax has an immediate goal to continue learning the facets of her job to become more of a "utility player" in the future. "Right now, I know what our Assistant City Clerk and our Records Tech do, but not how they do it," she admitted. "I look forward to learning more about the department's processes and workflow."

As is the case with all Clerk's office staff, continuing education is paramount. Truax plans to take classes offered by the California Municipal Clerks Association and the International Institute of Municipal Clerks with the goal of becoming a Certified Municipal Clerk. "These classes help clerks hone their craft and keep us informed about new laws and how they may impact how we do our jobs," she explained.

Truax was quick to praise the city's move to a near-paperless system to maximize efficiency. "The innovative use of technology really is something to behold and saves both



residents during the 4th of July weekend, *Jaws* stars Roy Scheider as the town's new police chief, Richard Dreyfuss as an ichthyologist, and Robert Shaw as a shark-hunter. Personally, as a certified scuba diver and animal empath, I have my own opinions on the ethics of *Jaws* and how the story does a huge disservice to sharks. However, there is no denying the cultural impact of Steven Spielberg's masterpiece, which became the top-grossing film of 1975. This fact is even more impressive considering he was only 26 years old when he directed it.

Ryan: The Lady Eve (1941)

One of my favorite discoveries and firsttime watches at the festival was *The Lady Eve*, a hilarious screwball comedy starring Barbara Stanwyck and Henry Fonda, directed by Preston Sturges. Stanwyck plays a con artist who sets out to swindle a wealthy heir, only to unexpectedly fall in love with her mark. What stuck with me most—besides the rapid-fire dialogue and the incredible on-screen chemistry—is Henry Fonda's brilliant physical comedy. His endless pratfalls, delivered with perfect deadpan timing, are pure slapstick gold. *The Lady Eve* is exactly the kind of hidden gem you hope to stumble upon at a TCM festival.

Morgan: *Blade Runner* (1982, the 2007 Final Cut)

When Ridley Scott's *Blade Runner* premiered in 1982, the idea of a robot uprising was considered sci-fi. Watching the film now, with rapidly evolving AI and the like, *Blade Runner* feels much more like a horror film set in our current reality than it does imaginative fiction. Based on Philip K. Dick's novel Do Androids Dream of Electric Sheep?, Harrison Ford plays the protagonist "Blade Runner" Rick Deckard. Deckard is a proven LAPD affiliate tasked with "retiring" four rogue replicants (bioengineered humanoids) who have infiltrated society. Rutger Hauer makes an unforgettable turn as replicant leader Roy Batty, as does Daryl Hannah as replicant Pris. Sean Young, who was in attendance, plays opposite Ford as Rachael, a replicant who believes she is human.


